







EDITOR'S COMMENTS

What's "old" in your personal radio lexicon? Maybe it's nothing after 1950. But, maybe you've made a few concessions to the 1960s. If not, it may be time to reconsider your age categorizations because radios of the late 1960s and 1970s are coming increasingly into play as "old" and collectible.

In our lead article, Andrew Hayden offers two RadioShack Realistic sets as examples. The 1968 FM Concertmaster tabletop with its oiled walnut veneer cabinet has a clean, modern look. It was designed to compete at a lower price with other nearby hi-fi-delivery tabletops, such as the KLH Model 21 and the Scott Model 100. According to Andrew, this FM-only set holds up very well in the competition for over-all fidelity with other more highly regarded sets.

The Realistic Patrolman 9, a 9-band portable, was designed to compete with the Zenith Trans-Oceanic 7000 Series. It joined other look-alikes in the competition of the 1970s. All in all, Andrew reminds us of the popularity of the Realistic brand right up to the 1990s. Maybe rethinking our definition of "old" will take us farther into the 20th century than we imagined possible.

However, "older" or even "very old" is still the most exciting part of the collecting experience for many. Alan Douglas reports on a little-known company, the Boston Scale & Machine Co., and its scarce product, the Type 105 receiving tuner. This 1920s set was lifted from obscurity to collectible status when it appeared years ago in Morgan McMahon's *Vintage Radio* on page 117, and I feel fortunate to have one in my own collection.

Alan's story has the interesting angle of showing how one collector often comes to the aid of another with a surprising result. Alan loaned his Type 105 to Richard Foster who used it as a model in restoring his set, which was in very poor condition. Richard's restored set challenges Alan's set in that the two are virtually indistinguishable in the photo. Another plus for radio preservation!

In the same spirit of helping out a friend — in this case, with cleaning out an attic — Dave Crocker was rewarded with an Amrad 3366 crystal receiver. This set would certainly fall into the "old treasure" category. But, an even more important aspect of finding it in pristine condition in a half-opened box was the ease of determining that it is original and unmodified — and that includes the crystal detector as well.

Usually, a find of any kind can present many challenges — how many parts have been lost, damaged, or replaced; how many versions did the manufacturer make; how many reproduction parts are out there, and so on. Luckily, Dave's Amrad had none of these issues.

It's also possible that Amrad made several ver-

sions of the crystal detector. In fact, Dave's Amrad triggered a memory of an Amrad receiver in my collection that I believe is authentic, and I added a photo of the detector to the article. There could be several additional versions out there, and perhaps someone will contribute an article to expand on this topic. As we all know, "the devil is in the details," and we always welcome more of those.

We also always welcome the auction reports that keep us informed about the ever changing marketplace and allow us to present many photos of the unusual items that show up at these events. So it is with Dale Boyce's Part 2 of the Estes auction of the Dick Bury collection. You won't want to miss the photos of the Globe 2-tube amp, the large Western Electric loop antenna, and Radio Rex in his doghouse, always good for a chuckle from guests.

The top item in this auction was a Marconi 106B (or 106C) selling at \$5,000, a lower price than might be expected. Here again the question of originality comes into play, as there was some question about non-factory modifications on this set. Nevertheless, the proceeds of this auction totaled a solid \$78,000.

As we go to press with this issue, we look forward this weekend to seeing many of you at the Radio XL Meet in Westford, Massachusetts, which A.R.C. manages annually. If you weren't able to make it this year, we hope you will plan for next February on President's Day weekend. Folks say it's the major New England meet of every winter and not to be missed.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Realistic Radios — One for the Home and One More for the Road

Focusing on two models, Andrew Hayden describes how a particular brand can catapult a company into retailing success. He suggests that the RadioShack Realistic brand of radios has become increasingly worthy of collector attention. (Editor)

From the 1950s through the 1990s, RadioShack's Realistic brand of radios helped to build the company into the largest electronics retailer of the 20th century. Hundreds of models were offered through the years, from pocket transistors and portables to table radios. Realistic made a model to suit almost any customer anywhere.

Here I have chosen two of the best radios the company offered — the FM-only, hi-fi Concertmaster tabletop for the home and the Patrolman 9 top-shelf, multiband portable for traveling. Both models were manufactured in Japan, as RadioShack was among the first retailers to outsource production on a large scale going back as early as the late 1950s.

Things were happening in those early days. New stores were popping up daily. There were 500 outlets in 1969, 1000 by 1972, over 2000 by 1974, and the number just kept growing, reaching some 7,000 stores across the country by the 1980s! Though it's just a guess on my part, I'd say it's safe to say that many millions of Realistic brand radios were sold during this time period.

THE REALISTIC FM CONCERTMASTER

For the home, the FM-only radios were the connoisseur's choice for listening to such events as live classical music concerts. However, I believe the FM Concertmaster, shown in Figure 1, was among the very few sets ever offered by RadioShack to receive FM signals only. I've seen a couple of smaller models from the early 1960s.

The Realistic high-fidelity Concertmaster

is a commanding, solid-state, tabletop radio. When introduced in the fall of 1968, it was described in the RadioShack catalog as follows: "Better, bigger, more beautiful than any FM-only radio ever built, the brilliant new Realistic FM Concertmaster is dedicated to people who take their music listening seriously."

Offered in 1969 and 1970 for \$69.95, the Concertmaster was designed to compete against the FM-only KLH Model 21 and the Scott Model 100, but at a cost of about \$20 less. Previously, RadioShack itself had sold the KLH Model 21, but now it had its own hi-fi FM-only radio.

The Concertmaster cabinet construction is 1/8" plywood with oiled walnut veneer trimmed with a thick brushed aluminum faceplate and an extruded horizontal base. It measures some 14" x 10" x 5" and weighs a hefty 10 pounds. The appearance reflects the late 1960s minimalist design, clean and linear — no ornamentation here.

As described in its literature, the Concertmaster has a "Euphonica air suspension speaker system" with a 6-inch woofer and a 3-inch tweeter. An acoustic suspension speaker relies on a cushion of air created within a




Figure 2. A close-up of the Concertmaster controls and dial scale.

sealed cabinet, instead of the standard mechanical spring suspension seen in other speakers. Features include a tuning meter, automatic frequency control, and separate bass and treble adjustments. Figure 2 shows a close-up view of the Concertmaster controls. It is, indeed, one nice radio, having very solid bass response with substantial audio presence.

In fact, I think the Concertmaster actually seems more comfortable reproducing lower frequencies than the highly regarded KLH 21, and the overall fidelity is excellent. It seems as though FM-only radios, while never selling in large numbers, faded into obscurity and were not offered again by RadioShack after the 1970 season, except for a small FM "Deskube" offered in the mid-1970s for \$16.95.

THE REALISTIC PATROLMAN 9

Realistic's prime choice for multiband listening while on the go in 1975 was the Patrolman 9, a 9-band portable. Its advertising proclaimed, "Our finest portable lets you hear it all!" It picks up AM, FM with automatic frequency control, 450-470 MHz UHF, 147-174 MHz VHF high, 30-50 MHz VHF low, 108-135 MHz Aviation, 1.6-4 MHz Marine, 4-12 and




Figure 4. The dial showing the nine frequency bands on the Patrolman 9. From top to bottom: AM, MB, SW1, SW2, FM, VHF-HI, VHF-LO, UHF and VHF-Air.

12-22 MHz shortwave. Figure 4 shows the large slide-rule dial and the front panel controls. Features include twin antennas, one for UHF, one for shortwave, FM and VHF. Controls are side-mounted band selectors, shown in Figure 5, all-band tuning (fast and slow), BFO for code reception, squelch control for silent standby, tone control, dial light and a battery/tuning meter. The radio operates on either its internal AC cord or 4 "C" cell batteries.

The size of the Patrolman 9 seems just right with dimensions of 12" x 11" x 4". The sturdy black plastic case has a stainless steel mesh lower grille and aluminum trim. The fit and finish are very nice. Its appearance, like that of the FM Concertmaster, is clean and crisp with its design based on horizontal and vertical surfaces.

At \$149.95 the Patrolman 9 was a pricey radio when offered by RadioShack from 1975 to 1977. While not in the same league as a Zenith Trans-Oceanic, this Patrolman 9 is very capable, pulling in stations rather well, while its audio quality from a 4-inch speaker is quite good.

In all, Realistic choices for multiband portables was vast and varied, with several in the

\$50 range. The 6-band models at \$100 were popular (see *A.R.C.*, Oct. 2004).

THE END OF A BRAND

The two offerings under the Realistic brand name discussed here, and shown side by side in Figure 6, are from what many consider RadioShack's golden era of bringing innovation to market — great products at great prices. The Realistic name was phased out in the early 1990s and appears to have largely disappeared from the company catalog by 1995. Nostalgia for the brand seems to have begun with collector prices on the better radios climbing in recent years, but resourceful collectors can find them for a song. It's worth the search — they are nice radios.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Boston Scale & Machine Co. Type 105 Receiving Tuner

in the name of preservation, one collector loans a set to another as a model for a set in dire need of restoration. Alan Douglas describes the happy results of such a collaboration. (Editor)

When Richard Foster dropped by this morning to return my Boston Scale & Machine tuner, which he had borrowed as a model to restore his set, shown in Figure 1, I couldn't resist snapping a photo of the two side by side. I couldn't tell which was which. See Figure 2. When he got his set, it was missing the entire coil assembly, the back panel, and other mechanical parts. It also had a hole in the panel. Evidently someone had converted it to short waves around 1930.

These tuners, and the companion Type 100 detector-amplifier, turn up in the Boston area from time to time, but I have never seen any advertising, or any mention of the parent company. They are presu-

ably from 1922, when the broadcasting boom began.

Boston Scale spared no expense in designing these sets, using some pretty elaborate metal work.




Figure 3. An interior view of Richard Foster's restored set showing the heavy spiral pigtail connections kept from tangling by metal disks on either side.




Figure 4. The wood inlay banding on the cabinet of the Boston Scale & Machine Co. receiving tuner.

The coil rotor and tuning capacitor, as examples, have heavy spiral pigtail connections kept from tangling by metal disks on either side. See Figure 3. Most of the fabricated parts are unlike those of other makers; for instance, when Richard recreated the binding posts, he had to turn them from hex brass stock and nickel-plate them. The dials seem to be unique too, with black and silver metal skirts. And note the real wood inlay banding on the cabinet in Figure 4. Figure 5 shows the label on the tuner.

Did Boston Scale & Machine Co. return to making scales after testing the wireless waters? I don't know.

Amrad Model 3366 and Its Crystal Detector

Dave Crocker describes his unexpected reward for helping a friend. The moral of the story: never pass up an attic-cleaning project. (Editor)

A West Coast friend visiting here on the Cape called on me to help him empty out his family home, as it was going up for sale. It seems his father and grandfather had been "pack-rats" and the grand old Greek Revival residence was full of items that needed to be sorted out.

In particular, virtually tons of literature consisting of old newspapers, magazines and well over 3,500 books had been stored in the attic and upper attic since 1896. The magazines, *Life* and other forgotten titles, were piled up in the upper attic, whose access was with a ladder through an opening in the ceiling. My friend passed down the hundreds of old magazines to me on the ladder. Part way through the process he reached behind

the piles of magazines and said: "You like old radio stuff — here's something you might be interested in. It's some kind of "tuner" — want it?"

I blew the dust off of it and saw it was an old cardboard box, of which only part of the cover had been opened. Under it I saw the word "Tuner" and that was enough for me. I didn't open it until I got home. It was then I almost fell over, as inside the (factory) box was the most pristine Amrad Model 3366 radio I had ever seen. It had never been used! A few days later I took it apart and studied the insides — perfect!




Figure 2. The detector's metal pointer is held to the crystal mineral by a permanent magnet.




Figure 3. A different view of the permanent magnet holding the metal pointer to the crystal mineral.

The Amrad Model 3366, shown in Figure 1, was marketed in 1922 by the American Radio and Research Corporation of Medford Hillside, near Boston, Massachusetts. It is a 1-tube receiver with a unique magnetic crystal detector designed by Amrad's own woman engineer, Eunice Randall. The detector had a metal pointer held to the

crystal mineral by a permanent magnet, as shown in Figures 2 and 3. These detectors were plug-in units, having two prongs for removal. On the top of the cabinet, the tube opening had a round, aluminum cover with fine mesh screening to observe the filament and release any heat that might accumulate.

Now, over the years I have seen more than a few of these Amrad crystal-reflex sets, and have taken notice of the ones pictured in antique radio magazines — and just about all of them have had some modifications to their detectors by their owners. Many years ago, someone even fabricated reproduction detectors, which were al-

most, but not exact, and the few produced were quickly grabbed-up by radio restorers. I managed to buy the last one made myself. It seems that the original detector units were either lost or were replaced with Amrad's other non-magnetic detector over the years. It, too, was a plug-in type.

Knowing that the detector on my Model 3366 was about as accurate as you can get, I thought it would be interesting to those who have Amrad magnetic detector sets to compare theirs with mine. It appears that Amrad may have made some production changes that include the elimination of the small holding screw. Notice the rather thin Bakelite handle for adjusting the pointer. These handles have usually been replaced by a dry cell battery cap or something similar. Also, notice in Figure 3 the tiny brass screw that holds the pointer strip to the unit, so it won't be lost. However, this minute screw and nut were easily lost as well.



AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — The Bury Collection Part 2 Burbank, Ohio — November 10, 2007

CONTRIBUTED BY DALE BOYCE AND ESTES AUCTIONS

The Dick Bury Estate Auction Part 2 was held on November 10, 2007, at the Expo Auction Center in Burbank, Ohio. It was a cool 47 degrees with a little bit of rain. There were buyers from at least 14 states. According to the tags on items for sale, there were items from about 12 sellers, in addition to the Bury Estate. The auction was conducted by John Estes and the regular Estes Auction staff. Well-known radio collector Frank Rasada was also assisting.

The auction started at 10 A.M. and concluded at approximately 5:15 P.M. It was a fun auction with something for almost everyone. Unfortunately, several items listed in the advertisements were not present.

The most expensive item was a Marconi 106C. The panel was engraved "106B, Catalog No 30496, Serial No 99, 1918." It did not have the double-throw switch as shown on a 106C on page 55 of the new Radiola book by Eric Wenaas. It was said to be modified, and the identity of the seller was not clear. It got only one bid and sold for \$5,000.

There was a nice selection of wireless and battery sets and early vacuum tubes. An Atwater Kent Model 10 breadboard with metal Radiodyne tags on the cans sold for \$1,500. Other breadboards sold for \$725, \$750 and \$950. A Pennsylvania Wireless set marked WCAE sold for \$450.

Other early sets included spark transmitters and Navy type loose couplers, telegraph keys and sounders. A reproduction of a 1913 set with a reproduction spherical Audion sold for \$350. A Deforest Interpanel brought \$2,200.

Among the other high-end items were a Tuska 226 2-tube amp selling at \$1,400, a Norden-Houck Super 10 at \$2,600, a Paragon RA-10 at \$450, and a DA-2 amp at \$750. A Globe Electric 615 2-tube amp sold for \$1,400.

There were several microphones, early motors, crystal sets, horn speaker drivers, Atwater Kent components, and a family of Crosley battery sets. An early Kent motor sold for \$800, while an early microphone, possibly a Western Electric 7-A, sold for \$1,500. A World War I BC-14A crystal

set by Liberty sold for \$2,100.

There were many Western Electric items. A Western Electric 4B receiver sold for \$700, and a Western Electric 2B tuning unit brought \$1,050. A very large Western Electric loop antenna also sold for \$1,050.

Dozens of horn and cone speakers, including most of the family of horns made by Magnavox, were offered. A Burns white petal horn speaker sold for \$1,500. Other notable manufacturers were Amplion, DeForest, Kennedy, Music Master, Shaw and Tower.

There were approximately 20 Zenith Trans-Oceanic radios, including bombers, sailboats, military brown, military green, chrome and transistor type. A Zenith Trans-Oceanic R520 green military version sold for \$750.

An array of consoles, cathedrals, and tombstones, were offered, as well as plastic, wooden, and metal tabletop radios. Many early one and two-transistor radios, a small selection of paper, including several years of *QST* and *IRE Proceedings*, and hundreds of tubes were sold. There were cylinder phonographs, cylinder records, morning glory horns and accessories.

Total proceeds for the major items, not including the side auctions, were approximately \$78,000.

Most of the paper, tube caddies, knobs, earphones, and lots of miscellaneous low-end items were sold at separate side auctions in mid-afternoon. Near the end of the auction, when it was apparent that everything would not be sold, buyers were given the opportunity to select items

from the unsold tables and bring them forward to the selling table. There were several tables of miscellaneous items that were not sold.

There were Balkeit things from Pfanstiehl Products Co where Dick had worked, as well as Balkeit things from the other Pfanstiehl/Balkeit Radio Company. Pfanstiehl was the U.S. licensee for Siemens & Halske, the German manufacturer of speakers, etc.

My thanks to Greg Hunolt from Plymouth, Wisconsin, who recorded some of the information in the following list when I took breaks.




