



A very personal tradition is certainly an important part of Richard Majestic's collection — Grisby-Grunow Majestic sets. No surprise there, considering Richard's surname. He presents a virtual gallery of photos of his Majestic Art Deco sets, some painstakingly restored, some ready for later work. Thanks to Richard for also reminding us that a lag in restoration efforts doesn't preclude our displaying a set and showing its promise for the future.

Speaking of restoration and future promise, Howard Hood's article on a Knight Kit tube checker tells us that restoration work should not be confined to radios only. Sometimes it pays off to restore a piece of equipment that can, in turn, be invaluable in restoring a radio. Test equipment is always available and cheap, and, as demonstrated by Howard's results, worth restoring. You may want to tack his helpful testing hints and the explanation of the two classes of tube checkers above your workbench.

Again on the subject of restoration, an auction is often a place to pick up not only a great find, but also a candidate begging to be restored. Both can be found at many an Estes auction like the one reported in this issue by our indefatigable reporter Ray Chase. Ray perseveres in rain, snow, even excessive heat, as in this April event.

In contrast to the weather, there were no hot radio items, and radio prices were low at \$425 and under. However, there were surprises elsewhere, such as broadcast equipment selling at \$1,000 plus, two Predicta TVs, and two rebuilt Predicta TV tubes. In short, it

The photo on our cover is a preview of the kind of unusual item that can show up at such an auction. Other interesting items were classic Art Deco and Catalin sets, as well as box lots of parts. There's no question that sometimes lesser known auctions can be a source of bargains for knowledgeable collectors.

Of course, most of us are always in search of bargains, but some collectors may prefer to concentrate on a particular brand or area of collecting. One of the latter, Art Redman continues his research on radios made by Northwest manufacturers. His follow-up article on the Long Radio Works shows that Art would find it hard to resist anything made by a radio company in the Northwest — in this case, fence chargers. We salute Art and "radio historians" wherever they are.

And wherever you are, we hope you are busy in your workshops and revving up for spring radio events.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

I Like Majestic Art Deco Radios

Richard Majestic's first article for A.R.C. was about a Grebe radio. Obviously, we thought that he might also be interested in Majestic radios, and we were not to be disappointed. Here, Richard presents a tour through his collection of Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Art Deco radios from 1933 to mid-1934. (Editor)

My current collection of Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Art Deco table radios, covering the period of January 1933-July 1934, is pictured in this article.

Three good examples of small table radios from the Art Deco period are the Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Models 49-B, 44-B and 194, all from 1934. They each utilize the 440, 4-tube chassis. A superheterodyne utilizing only four tubes, these sets perform as 5-tube superheterodynes since the 6F7 pentode is used in a reflex circuit and functions both as the IF amplifier and first audio.

MODEL 49-B




Figure 1. The Majestic Model 49-B.

My Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 49-B, shown in Figure 1, stands only 11½" tall. The radio was obtained from a friend in California who saw it at a yard sale some years ago, but at that time, it wasn't for sale. Last month the same family had an estate sale, and he bought it for me for only \$100. The condition is original and excellent.

MODEL 44-B




Figure 2. The Majestic Model 44-B is in need of restoration.

My Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 44-B was obtained from a California seller on eBay. It also stands only 11½" tall. As seen in Figure 2, the condition is "as purchased" and in need of rescue. When it is fully restored, I expect the value to be considerably more than the purchase price of \$86.

MODEL 194

The Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 194 miniature Gothic tombstone is only 14" tall and another stunning example from 1934. The radio was obtained from a friend in California. The set was missing the chassis, and the cabinet was in poor condition. I located a working chassis in good condition and I oil-stained the cabinet and knobs. Figure 3 shows the result.

MODEL 59




Figure 4. The Majestic Model 59 "Studio."

The Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 59 "Studio" is raw Art Deco. It is a compact and highly collectible Depression era tombstone radio, as shown in Figure 4. The radio measures 13½" high, 10" wide, 9" deep. With its finely polished aluminum grille bars, twin escutcheons, contrasting two-tone veneers and machine-like knobs, it truly has a majestic appearance that screams "Art Deco," whatever way you look at it!

It covers two bands, standard broadcast (535-1550Kc) and shortwave (1480-4440Kc), selected by using a switch on the chassis at the rear. Precision tuning is achieved through the use of a 5.5:1 planetary

drive on the tuning condenser. It features an interesting and somewhat unconventional 5-tube superheterodyne

chassis that has not one but two IF stages with AVC.

Because of its use of "duo" type tubes, its 5-tube lineup is equivalent to many other manufacturers' 6 and 7-tube receivers. The tube complement is the following: 6A7 (local oscillator and mixer), 6F7 (1st IF amp using the pentode section), 6B7 (2nd IF amp using the pentode section, and 2nd detector and AVC using the two diode sections), 42 (AF power amp), and 80 (rectifier). The estimated manufacture of the Studio Model 59 was 400 radios.

MODEL 291

The Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 291 table radio is shown in Figure 5. It is in the Art Moderne design, utilizing carefully matched walnut and sporting a two-tone treatment. The radio is a 9-tube superheterodyne using 2½-volt tubes. It features automatic volume control (new for 1933), automatic synchro-silent tuning using a Type 58 tube, tone control, full-wave duo-diode detector, and an 8" speaker. Every amplifier tube is a pentode.

I purchased this radio from a man in Florida for \$350 on eBay, which was too much considering the radio electronics was in very poor condition. The set required over \$200 in parts and 10 hours of rebuilding. The case had been refinished. The knobs are not original, and I replaced the grille cloth with an exact copy replacement. After restoration, and in this condition, this model is worth considerably more than I have invested in it.

MODEL 411

The Grigsby-Grunow Model 411 Majestic-Six is a very small, compact radio, only 10½" wide and 7" tall. See Figure 6. The set employs a superheterodyne circuit, and has a single pentode as both local oscillator and mixer. The inherent sensitivity, selectivity, and tone quality of the superheterodyne is a feature of this receiver. Majestic called it a "Six," but it's really

a 5-tube circuit.

The entire radio is enclosed in a cabinet of pleasing design with birch wood inlays and wood knobs. I refinished the wood case with ten coats of lacquer and polished the aluminum grille. The grille cloth is original, as are the knobs.

MODEL 461

The Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 461 Master

Six radio is a striking example of the new trend in cabinet design (early 1934). See Figure 7. Its distinct Modernistic lines, together with a center panel of beautiful matched walnut and a glistening chromium bordering grille, make the Master Six a cabinet of unusual beauty.

It is a 6-tube superheterodyne with delayed automatic volume control, tone control, full pentode amplification, and Majestic's colorful tone with a 6½" speaker. The mid-sized radio is 17" tall and heavy because of the large power transformer.

I obtained the 461 on eBay for less than \$100 in 2002. I did a complete electronic restoration but have not refinished the cabinet. This radio performs well and plays loud and strong. The IF transformer, which usually fails, cabinet, chrome grille, grille cloth, and knobs are all original and in good condition.

MODEL 463




Figure 8. The Majestic Model 463 Century Six.

The Grigsby-Grunow Majestic Model 463 Century Six table radio, seen in Figure 8, has a beautiful "waterfall" chrome grille. It is dubbed the "Century Six" in honor of the 1933 World's Fair and "Century of Progress." This set was introduced to the public in June 1933.

The Majestic 463 is a 6-tube radio offering the AM broadcast band. The initial advertising for this radio reads, "Modern design lends new charm to this table model. Note the rich combination of black walnut and lace wood, and the polished chromium grille and escutcheon plate."

The cabinet and the chassis have both been given extensive renovations. The cabinet was refinished and the grille cloth replaced with a period reproduction over a new/old stock Majestic chrome grille. The chassis was restored using two new/old stock replacement IF transformers. The tubes were also replaced using new/old stock Majestic spray shield tubes where applicable. All capacitors and filters were replaced, and the set was properly aligned as well. All veneer along the base perimeter of the cabinet has been firmly re-glued to the cabinet to avoid any future problems. The three unique scalloped, circular wood knobs are original to the radio. The knob on the left side of the cabinet is the on/off tone control knob. The knob above the chrome escutcheon is the volume control, and the tuning knob is below the dial.

With its highly stylized and unique chrome grille and its escutcheon surrounded by Hawaiian Lace wood veneer, this set is sure to become the focal point and center of attention of any room in which it is placed.

The Majestic 463 was even featured in a close-up

after the opening credits of the television show "Dynasty" in the early 1980s. Dimensions of this radio are 12¼" tall, 13¼" wide & 9¼" deep.

I obtained the 463 in February 2009 for \$300 and still need to restore the electronics and chassis condition. The chassis and tuning condenser are very rusty, and the IF transformers were replaced by the previous owner and are black Miller coil replacements that are wrong on this chassis. I'll find new/old stock IF transformers and intend to chrome plate the chassis and refinish the tuning condenser.

In its current condition, the 463 radio plays, but not well. The 5½" speaker appears to have been reconed and that might explain the average tone. The Model 461 sounds like hi-fi in comparison, even though the electronics is the same.

MODEL 310-A

Hard to find is the Gothic style Majestic Model 310-A tombstone radio with cathedral window-

shaped grille cutouts. See Figure 9. This is an extremely beautiful design, quality-built, pre-1934 set. It's a 6-tube, one-band superheterodyne radio with what looks like original finish, grille cloth, and knobs. I bought it on eBay from a sell-it store for \$177. Figure 10 shows an ad for a very similar set, the Model 311.

MODEL 370.

Shown in Figure 11 is a pre-June 1933 Majestic Model 370. This is a tabletop 5-tube radio that looks 100 percent complete and is in very good condition. The on/off volume knob is loose but works. The eBay seller says he turned the radio on and was able to get a clear signal. The case shows wear and a couple of larger scratches on the right front. The case measures 12 $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide by 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " deep by 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ " high. This is a complete, not yet restored classic. A bargain — I paid less than \$100.

RESTORATION TOPICS

Knight Kit Model 400A Tube Checker

A couple of dollars and a willingness to do a fair amount of restoration work buys a very satisfactory tube tester, as Howard Hood proves in the following article. (Editor)




Figure 1. The Knight Kit 400A service-type tube tester by Allied Radio purchased at a Ham swap meet for two dollars.

A visit to a local Ham radio swap meet turned up a Knight Kit 400A tube checker, the one shown in Figure 1. The price was certainly right — a whole two dollars. The low "as is" price made me a little suspicious that maybe the meter or some other irreplaceable part was shot, but it was worth a chance at only two dollars.

Allied Radio called the Model 400A an "economy" tube checker kit. It uses the emission-type test circuit which could quickly and accurately test over 1,300 tube types for cathode current flow, shorted elements, and filament continuity. The 400A is capable of testing novistors, novars, 10-pin, octal, and loctal tubes, as well as 7-pin, and 9-pin miniatures.

Tube data is on flip-over cards located in a drawer on the side of the tester. Tube condition for good or bad is read on a two-color meter while an indicator light shows continuity of the filaments and shorts between elements. The 400A is rather small measuring only three inches tall by ten inches wide by eight inches deep. It weighs in at approximately five pounds.

RESTORATION

The outside of the tester did not look too bad. There was a very small amount of rust in a few places, and some hardware had a little corrosion, all easily corrected. Inside was another story. I have purchased many kits over the years at swap meets but the soldering on this tube checker was a new experience. There were cold solder joints, no solder on joints, solder on only half the joint, flux-only joints, blobs of solder shorting socket pins and many burned wires. There is no way this kit could have ever worked correctly.

I decided to get the manual and do a complete check of the entire unit. I ended up




Figure 2. An interior view of the 400A after restoration and the reworking of almost all solder connections was complete.

repairing about 75 percent of the solder joints, correcting two wiring errors, replacing many burned wires, and one out-of-tolerance resistor. Luckily the critical components of the checker, the meter and transformer, tested good. Figure 2 shows the interior of the 400A after restoration.

FINAL TESTING

For the final check-out, I chose a Type 6F5 tube. It checked in the green for emission with a value of 90. The 400A indicated that no shorts were present and that the filaments were good. While the testing was in progress, I decided to check some additional tubes, and then repeat the tests on several other emission testers and get a comparison. For this part of the testing I used another 400A, along with a Heathkit IT-21 and an Eico 655. The test results, based on 100 as the full scale reading, were as follows:

	6F5	12SG7	35L6GT
400A #1 (restored)	90	40	64
400A #2	90	40	64
IT-21	85	45	64
655	80	40	50

The results were quite good. All the testers compared favorably, certainly good enough

for radio service work. No shorted elements were found with any of the test sets. The 12SG7 failed in all four checkers, while the 6F5 passed in all four checkers. The 35L6GT passed on the low side in three checkers, but got a marginal from the Eico 655. In general, the accuracy of an emission type service tester is only about 15 percent.

A LITTLE MORE ON TUBE CHECKERS

Tube checkers fall into two basic classes. The first class tests the ability of the cathode to emit electrons — the emission tester. The second class tests tubes by giving an indication of how efficiently a tube operates as an amplifier — the mutual conductance tester.

The emission tester is a very simple design and tests total emission of the cathode by a DC test with the plate and all grids tied together. It is easy to use, inexpensive, and will locate weak or bad tubes quickly, about all you really need for radio repair work. Most emission testers also include features such as leakage/short testing and filament continuity testing. Emission-type tube checkers can generally be picked up at swap meets in the range of \$25 to \$50.

One caveat here is that tube checkers vary in the type of tubes they will test. If your restoration work deals with radios from the early 1930s, be sure the instrument you are considering will test the 4, 5, 6, or 7-pin tubes you need. The 400A does not test these older type tubes.

Mutual conductance testers for the most part can be considered lab-type equipment, used to test quality, or the specification of new tubes. AC signals are applied to the tube under test which closely simulates actual operation conditions — very useful if you intend to work on communications equipment. Mutual conductance tester cost runs into the hundreds of dollars.

HELPFUL TESTING INFORMATION

Here are a few pointers that may improve your test results with a service type emissions tube checker:

1. Allow tubes to warm up two to three minutes before testing.
2. Test for leakage and shorts first. Stop the test if leakage or shorts are indicated. This will prevent test equipment damage.
3. Tap the tube under test for leakage and shorts gently with your finger. This will reveal

any loose elements.

4. Unless directed otherwise by your manual, hold the test switch for about 15 seconds to allow the meter reading to stabilize.

SUMMARY

For two dollars and a little work, I got a tube checker capable of testing about 1,300 tube types from the late 1930s through the 1960s.

Although emission tube checkers only test for emission and shorts and not how the tube would function in a circuit, they are still a good choice for radio restoration. The majority of tube failures result from low cathode emission, open or shorted heaters. The emission tester is very effective in detecting these types of tube failures.

Long Radio Follow-Up The Long Brothers Fence Charger

The February 2005 issue of A.R.C. had an article by Art Redman covering the Long Radio Works. Art has been fortunate enough to add two Long Radio fence chargers to his collection and shares photos of them in this follow-up article. (Editor)

Some collectors in Oregon believe the Long Radio Works of Cornelius, Oregon, (see *Antique Radio Classified*, February, 2005,) did not make true AC sets. Instead, they assembled kits made by Knight and other companies, and the paper labels on the back of the sets were just repair or assembly labels.




Figure 1. A Long fence charger with the cover off, circa 1940, made when radio parts were no longer available.




Figure 2. An interior view of the Long fence charger. Note the radio parts used. The metal cabinet measures 9 3/4" x 6" x 4".

Examination of two new additions to my collection, fence chargers made by Long Radio, shown in Figures 1 and 2, proves otherwise. In 1940, Leslie Long could no longer get radio parts because there was a shortage, according to a Forest Grove, Oregon, newspaper.

Being a good businessman, Leslie Long used his leftover radio parts to make fence chargers. Figure 2 shows the charger with the cover off revealing a radio power transformer. This proves that Leslie Long and his brother George bought parts separately to assemble their AC sets and did not rely on kits.

After Leslie Long died in 1945, brother George "the radio repairman" continued the business to the early 1950s. George's name can be seen on Long radios he repaired in the early 1950s. In fact, fence chargers were made up to almost the time of George's death in 1953.

I recently was given these two fence chargers made by Long Radio. They had been bought for \$1 each by Robert Campbell from a Hillsboro secondhand store in 2006.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions

Burbank, Ohio — April 24, 2009

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

The earlier February Estes auction had been held in bitter cold weather, and yet here we were only two months later and the weather was steamy hot. On Friday the temperature was 87 degrees. Fortunately, the auction hall held the overnight coolness so it was comfortable on Saturday.

This was a low key auction with some exceptions. There was a large number of parts and a very large pre-auction sale. When Richard Estes takes on an estate, very often it contains a lot of accumulated parts, low value items, and box lots. This auction was stocked with the residue of several estates and would be considered a bargain hunters gold mine. At times, there seemed to be more competitive interest in the low value goods than in the pricier items.

The early sale was especially loaded and started at 8:30 A.M., but it was still going strong at 10 A.M. when it was called in order to start the main auction. It resumed later in the day. Somehow a couple of nice broadcast station items wound up in the early pre-sale, but they were recognized for their value and sold for \$1,050 and \$1,150 respectively. That kind of thing does not happen often in a pre-sale.

After the main sale started, several side auctions were held to deal with phonograph parts, transistor and novelty radios, paper goods, manuals, and so on. I did not record these, but missed quite a few items in the main auction as I tried to grab a few items for myself in several of the side auctions. At times, I did not record many of the box lots and low value items in



the main auction since their value did not seem worth the effort.

The initial crowd of about 80 bidders thinned out fairly soon, leaving mostly the die-hard bargain hunters. I noted that a few bidders scooped up a good many of the low value items; I hope that they had enough room in their vehicles to haul it all away. At 3:30 in the afternoon with bidding decidedly slacking off, Richard took requests from those left in the audience. That lasted until about 4:30 when the auction was declared over. Remaining items would be held for future auctions.

This was an interesting auction, full of good buys for the flea market crowd along with a smattering of quality radios. The sale total of what I recorded amounted to about \$27,000, and I did not list many low value sales or the side auctions.






