

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

On the brink of summer, A.R.C.'s May issue heralds the coming "Big Meet Season." Full-page ads this month for RadioActivity in June and Extravaganza in July list the pleasures to come. Ads for Radiofest and the AWA Conference in August will follow in future issues. Each of these meets has its own unique character, so you can be sure that something new and different is on their agendas. You can pick and choose for location, as well as for a match to your own particular interest. Though some say that radio collecting is a declining hobby, attendance at meets remains strong. Obviously, there's no substitute for the one-on-one contact you find there.

To get you rolling on summer plans, our lead article by Mark Oppat reports on Extravaganza 2009 just in time to get you fired up for Extravaganza 2010 in July. The informal "Radio Reception" that opens this event is a big drawing card. At no extra charge, almost everyone attends, and it's a great opportunity to meet new and old friends, setting the mood for camaraderie throughout the rest of the meet.

In fact, that camaraderie is certainly evident at another happening at the end of this meet — the "Bargain Auction." The proceeds of this auction go to the club and in 2009, the donations were huge — 50 percent more than the previous year. Collectors also benefit from the many bargains they pick up at this auction.

Of course, the main auction conducted by auctioneer Richard Estes was a big draw, but this year there were not many big-ticket items offered. One exception was the hard-to-find Western Electric 2A tuner, which sold for \$800. In all, the combined two auctions made for a happy ending for most attendees.

That same outcome is almost always true for those who have attended auctions conducted by Richard Estes in his own venue. Our faithful contributor Ray Chase reports on the Estes auction of the James Fred collection where many bargains were to be had. At such auctions, there may also be a few surprises like the trio of Grebe items that appeared at this one and sold for \$3,000. Everything from the usual assortment of battery sets to cathedrals and consoles showed up too and totaled over \$30,000.

Ray's report also teaches an important lesson we should all bear in mind. Jim Fred was a well-known old-

timer among radio collectors, but, unfortunately, his collection was not stored well, and the result was the serious deterioration of many items. Most of us are guilty of a degree of procrastination, but this story is a wake-up call to make a plan for the care and disposal of our collections when the time comes. Otherwise, all our work to preserve radio history, as well as the value of our collections, could be greatly diminished.

Joe Curiale has certainly done his bit to preserve radio history in a very personal way. A Silvertone wire recorder followed him from his childhood in his grandmother's kitchen to adulthood and eventually made him into a serious radio collector. Once restored, that wire recorder brought back family voices from the 1940s through the 1960s, not only offering great personal pleasure, but also introducing him to a rewarding new hobby. This is the kind of success story we like to hear.

Perhaps an interesting find on your summer tour of radio events will start you off on a similar successful journey. Better start planning your itinerary now.

MEET REPORT


Extravaganza 2009

Lansing, Michigan — July 9-11, 2009

The Michigan Antique Radio Club (MARC) hosted its 24th Annual Extravaganza on July 9-11 in Lansing, Michigan, at the former Holiday Inn South, now renamed as the "Causeway Bay Inn." Oddly, there is no Causeway or Bay nearby, but the new owners have set out to make improvements, some of which were in progress during the meet. None of this activity was of any real distraction to the eager attendees, of which there were slightly more than in 2008, both in attendance and flea market spaces occupied. This year's theme was "Radio Through the Decades."

To encourage higher general public attendance, MARC does not charge admission to the flea market or auctions, but requires registration for anyone to attend any other events. While most serious collectors register, some do not, so it's hard to say exactly the total attendance. No matter — each year, this event is considered by many to be the pre-

mier USA antique electronics event.

This year the Tube Collectors of America partnered again with MARC to hold its annual convention during this event. This has become an alternating-year partnership and seems to be of benefit to both organizations. MARC is hoping to bring in other groups, such as vintage audio enthusiasts, in the future to broaden the appeal of this already popular event.


THE FLEA MARKET

Approximately 250 car park spaces were occupied this year, up slightly from 239 in 2008. Moderate weather, ample selling spaces and parking, reasonable room rates at the host hotel, informative seminars and a general fun attitude have been the hallmarks here since day one. The huge tent (now 180' x 40') is the unique feature of this flea market, and it offers nearly 80 protected selling tables as an option to those who might prefer such. Also under this tent the club operates its registration, large hospitality area with chairs and tables for resting, the "Good Buy Affair" bargain auction, and the Thursday evening seminar.

This year, club president John Reinicke opened the meet with a program titled "My Big eBay Adventure." John covered his experiences with selling on eBay and shared several tips and suggestions. The large group also shared some of their experiences as well, so it was good opening for the show.

"WATTS UP, BUDDY!"

On Thursday evening, many sellers set up





their spaces; however, no selling or display of items is allowed until the flea market opens Friday morning at 7 A.M. If the weather is nice, and it usually is, Thursday night is an informal social event where "old pals" greet and gab about the anticipation of buying or selling the following morning. This "face to face" socializing is probably the great feature of this and all the antique radio events — a chance to chat with knowledgeable collectors and experts in many areas of this hobby.

My previous reports on this event have mentioned the many dealers and specialists who make a special effort to attend Extravaganza each year. Parts dealers such as Bob Piekarz of Bob's Antique Radios, Ed Schutz of Renovatedradios.com, or yours truly allow you to see reproductions or rare parts items up close and examine them and ask questions. Nothing

can really match this experience online. If at all possible, get to one or more of the major (or local) radio events each year — it's really fun and educational. Oh, and bring your parts lists or samples of knobs to match!

GREAT DEALS

The Friday morning opened with a temperature in the lower 60s (peaking at 80 in the late afternoon) and a very light breeze. Collectors swarmed the rear parking lot where the flea market is located, walking briskly around so as to see as much as possible and scoop up the best deals, of which there were plenty to be had. Besides radios, there was the usual assortment of related items, including a few vintage TV sets, audio gear, and parts of all kinds.

As an aside, Michigan is located squarely in what I call the "Antique Radio Belt" (ARB). The ARB runs from Illinois to the East Coast, including all areas south of Maine and north of Kentucky. During the "Golden Era of Radio" (1928-1942), these states all had a high level of electrification, good paying jobs, and a density of population. Additionally, the Midwest had a higher percentage of owner-occupied homes where console and larger radios were installed.

Pennsylvania could be considered "the hallowed ground" for antique radio in my opinion. Folks in Pa. seemed to have bought better grade sets and to have held on to them for generations. So, it's natural that you will see more radios at events and dealerships in this region, and my experience traveling around the

USA has proved my theory to be fairly solid.

GREAT SEMINARS

Lansing is well known for interesting seminars and this year was no exception. On Friday, noted tube expert and *Tube Lore* author Ludwell Sibley presented "Recent Discoveries in the Tube World." MARC member Gary Stork of "thevoiceofmusic.com" presented a seminar on "Record Changer Service." Gary bought out the remnants of the Voice of Music Corp. several years ago and now has one of the largest online parts sources for record changer parts, specializing, but not limited to, the VM brand. Both seminars enjoyed standing-room-only attentive audiences.

On Saturday morning, Dave Snow presented "How to Hook Up and Use Early Battery Sets." These early sets contain a lot of "lost art," and Dave showed how to bring these old beauties back

to life to a very appreciative audience.

STRONG "RADIO RECEPTION"

MARC's Friday evening "Radio Reception" is a time for socializing and viewing the contest entries while listening to great acoustic-based music. Usually about 200 folks show up for this informal event. This year was a return of the "Rock Bottom Mining Company" Bluegrass band, including radio collector Jeff Conley. This group has issued several CDs and plays many events each year in and around Ohio.

The contest participation was somewhat smaller this year possibly because some of the enthusiastic exhibitors of previous years were absent. However, there were dozens of really nice and rare sets for all to enjoy and appreciate. On display were rare sets like Michael Feldt's Scott "World Record 10" and Mark Spear's Kennedy 110 and 220 RF and AF units, all of the battery era.

MARC's youngest-ever board member, 16 year old Ian Shackelford, won the "Chairman's Trophy" for his restored 1948 GE Model 810 Television that was displayed playing vintage Burns and Allen TV shows. Everyone knows what a challenge it is to restore early TV sets. Ian just made Eagle Scout in March 2010 — perhaps he just needed something easy to do after fixing the GE 810! Our congrats to Ian on both major feats.

SATURDAY WEATHER PROBLEM

A little early rain caused some Saturday sellers

not to set up at the flea market. Others displayed an abbreviated set up, but wind gusts up to 26 mph played havoc with smaller tent tops. Thankfully, activity under the "Big Top" main tent (with attached side curtains) was active through midday. This is the big plus to having a large tent set up for flea markets.

Saturday is also the day the "General Public" tends to show up with their radios in tow for MARC's "Radio Rescue" free evaluation service. Often, items are offered up on site for sale to the highest bidder. You never know what will show up, but the club's extensive print, radio and even television advertising brings in a stream of "fresh to the market" stuff that can make this second day exciting.

THE AUCTION

Noted radio auctioneer Richard Estes conducted the Saturday afternoon "Main Auction." Rich is noted for his encyclopedic knowledge of radios that enables him to conduct a very lively and informative auction.

Michigan uses a "buy back" format for their auctions. This format allows the seller to bid on his own item until his reserve is met. The advantage is that the seller can decide the reserve on the fly, and the auction does not slow down if the reserve is not met. This year's high bid was \$800 for a Western Electric 2A tuner. A working pair of EPI M-100 speakers went to a new owner for \$750. A U.S. Radio 9-tube cathedral changed hands for \$500, and \$450 bought a Burns tortoise shell speaker with a small hairline crack. In all, 220 lots were offered for a total bid of \$18,512. Of the total, only \$3,262.50 was buy-back so, as in the past, just about everything found a new home.

THE BARGAIN AUCTION

One of the surprises this year was the incredible pile of items donated to the club for the grand finale Bargain Auction. Two rather sizable estate contributions contributed to a quantity that came to 50 percent more than last year's record amount!

Table after table was heaped with radios, parts, and boxes of "stuff" containing God knows what — and even He couldn't be sure! Oh, and probably over 30 console radios and other floor-standing audio gear were auctioned using the fastest and most equitable methods.

Usually a "Choice of the Table" bid is sought, with the high bidder getting to select as many items from the lot at that bid. The same bid is done again, sometimes several times, until the table is cleared or a "one bid for all" is received. Most items go for under \$5, so this is a real bargain hunter's paradise. Still, even the remaining console carcasses and other dregs filled a 16' long x 8' wide landscaper's trailer to what could only be described as "heaping" status. If you are

a bargain hunter, do not miss this final auction — it's an amazing opportunity and the proceeds benefit MARC.

MARC extends an invitation to all to attend this great vintage radio and electronics event on July 8-10, 2010, and in following years. This year, MARC will celebrate its 25th Anniversary with a "Michigan Radios" theme. See the ad on page 2 and the club's site www.michiganantiqueradio.org for info on this and other upcoming events.



WITH THE COLLECTORS

The Beginning — A Silvertone Wire Recorder A Journey to Becoming a Collector

Joe Curiale's long journey with a family wire recorder over several decades resulted in his becoming an avid collector. It's never too late to begin could be the moral of his story. (Editor)




Figure 1. The Sears Silvertone 7086, manufactured in 1947 and originally purchased in 1948.

My earliest memory of the Silvertone 7086 wire recorder, shown in Figure 1, was at my grandmother's kitchen table with all of us gathered around listening and talking. The big, black iron fan whirred away on the counter, taking the edge off those hot, humid summer days in Chicago. It was a time when aunts and uncles, cousins, brothers and sisters still gathered together for a Sunday meal — pasta and meatballs, of course. And while the cooking was underway, it was time to fire up the old wire recorder.

In fact, the set wasn't too old in those days — maybe only ten or fifteen years. Just a few years earlier, not long before the United States entered World War II, the Armour Research Foundation had developed the wire recorder as we know it today. During the war, the U.S. military used them to record the audio of battle events and, some say, to record and play back messages of the Navajo code-talkers working with the Marines during the Pacific war. (This information on wire recorders, and much more, can be found on web sites, such as www.videointerchange.com/wire_recorder1.htm.)

The set in grandma's kitchen was built in 1947 under a license granted to Sears, and sold as a Silvertone. It is a large wood-cabinet tabletop, and in 1948, my father and his brother Bennie each bought one. The exterior cabinet dimensions are 22" wide x 11¼" high x 14" deep. The outline of the circular speaker cone can be seen through the grille cloth in the front, behind the three horizontal bars. The finish is original. The Model 7086 has seven tubes and five electrolytics, but back then I didn't know anything about that. What caught my eye was a turntable that played 78 records and a radio that played a single band (AM).

Strangest of all was a vertically reciprocating recording head positioned between a large take-up reel (which doubled as the turntable) and a

small spool of stainless steel wire. The wire, when playing, flew past the head at more than 20 inches per second, or so Uncle Bennie claimed. Figure 2 shows the layout of the interior. (For a color photo of a similar model, take a look at www.west-techservices.com/images/silv7103a.jpg.)

At that time I didn't know how it could record sound on a steel wire and play it back, and I didn't care. What I did know was that it had a very cool, old-style microphone, as shown in Figure 3, connected by a long wire to the back of the set, and we could talk and sing into that mike and hear our voices played back immediately. For a 5-year old kid, it didn't get any better than that.

THE MODEL 7086 IN THE 1960s-1970s

My father's Silvertone stopped working sometime around the mid-'60s. When my uncle's set starting faltering a few years later, both were retired. They ended up sitting on Uncle Bennie's basement workbench for years, along with assorted other radios and TVs and some impressive-looking test equipment. He had a knack for fixing anything, but he never quite got around to those Silvertones.

In 1969, my parents finally got fed up with the cold winters and hot summers of Chicago, and we made tracks west for the one-season climate of southern California. The wire recorder sets were left behind, and life carried on. No more big family get-togethers and no more talking into that

cool microphone on Sunday afternoons.

Then Uncle Bennie decided to make the same move west several years later — I think it was around my mid-college years — and got rid of a bunch of stuff, including that old wire recorder which, he said, probably didn't work. Why I agreed to take it, I don't know, but it ended up underneath a pile of stuff in a neglected closet of my apartment — wire spools inside and microphone stuffed in the cavity at the back of the cabinet. As far as I knew, none of it worked, and I didn't care, at least not then.

Time melted away, and for reasons I still don't recall, I took the Silvertone out one day, blew away 15-plus years of accumulated dust, and took a good hard look. This was the late 1970s and Radio Shack still had tube testers in a few of their stores. I found one, checked all seven tubes in the 7086, replaced the bad ones, fired it up, and guess what? Sound came out! Not great sound. Not even good sound. But it was my first experience bringing an old radio back to life, and I never forgot it.

THE MODEL 7086 IN THE 21ST CENTURY

But before long the Silvertone went back into the closet — various closets, in fact, as I moved from place to place, and another 20-plus years went by. A new century was upon us, and once again I dusted off the old set, placed it in a

conversation-piece location in our home, and fired it up. Sound came out, but nothing you'd recognize — original family recordings from the '40s through the '60s. I thought about all those voices still on the wire spools, many no longer with us. No question about it: I had to get it working, and working well.

Out it went to my garage workbench, which isn't as classy or well-equipped as the one in Uncle Bennie's basement, but it'll do. Out came the chassis for a thorough cleaning. And then two things occurred to me. First, it was 2003, and Radio Shacks didn't have tube testers anymore. And second, I didn't really know what I was doing anyway, so why bother?

It took a while, but I found nearby one of those oldtime radio/TV places that time seems to have passed by, and it still had a tube-tester. Unfortunately, that's all it had — no N.O.S. tubes were available, and worse yet, the folks there had never even heard of wire recorders!

A quick check indicated that the 50L6 power amp tube was bad. They found an old one that tested okay, I put it in, and it made no difference. And despite my best intentions, two more years went by.

That brings us to the year 2005 when I first developed and scratched the itch to collect and repair antique radios. It started with one-too-many house guests pointing to the wire recorder and asking, "Does that thing work?" So the old Silver-tone finally got dusted off again, and I hit Google hard. I was lucky to find Fred Wuensche of Wireless Workshop (www.wireless-workshop.com) in nearby Houston. Fred recapped the set, including the five electrolytics, all of which were still in their original paper, and checked the tubes in detail. When it came back home, the set sounded great: Stations came in strong, 78s played their old music once again, and most importantly, that old stainless steel wire flew by the recording/play-back head just as it used to, and out came voices from the '40s, '50s and '60s.

There were stories in Italian by grandparents, two of whom I never knew; songs by aunts and uncles, none of whom ever made it to Broadway (for good reason); and "interviews" by my father with brothers, sisters, and cousins, including me, almost 50 years ago. Fred had resurrected more than just a radio.

A SERIOUS COLLECTOR EMERGES

Hearing that dead wire recorder come back to life is what got me started. I found a wealth of information for radio collectors, including magazines like A.R.C., read everything I could, and started to keep an eye out for old radios in antique shops and garage sales. Collecting and repairing antique radios has taken up much of the past half-decade, and will certainly be a big part of the decades to come.

Our place in Texas is now sprinkled with radios ranging from the late 1920s to early 1950s, up to the limits of the house's space and my wife's patience. There are tabletops and chair-sides.

There are consoles, including a beautiful black-dial Zenith and a magnificent Splitdorf Lorenzo. The sets came from as far away as Mexico (including my father-in-law's treasured 1948 tabletop), Norway (a portable from our good friends in Stavanger), and what is now the Czech Republic (it was still Czechoslovakia when the radio was manufactured, just after the war).

They came from auctions, both the live kind and the eBay kind; from antique stores; from family, friends and strangers. One special small Silver-tone tabletop AM/SW set belonged to my Uncle Pete, a former Ham radio enthusiast in Michigan. Brand names range from A (Andrea 3D5, 1937) to Z (Zenith 6-S-254, 1938), with much in between: David Anderson, Hallicrafters, Macys, Philco, Silver-tone, Splitdorf, Stewart-Warner, Tesla. Some came in the door working just fine, but most didn't, and these were learning opportunities.

Tube testing (you can find some great and some not-so-great testers on eBay) and re-capping are now part of my routine these days, and I know there's still a huge amount to learn. There's that Philco 46-350 rolltop portable out on the bench right now — the same model owned by Joe DiMaggio, which stubbornly wants to tune in static rather than stations. And the Zenith 4K2616 set that I couldn't figure out why I had won for such a low bid on eBay until it arrived, and I saw it was a battery-only set! So learning how to build a battery eliminator circuit is on my post-retirement list. And that list is getting longer all the time!

Through it all the Silver-tone 7086 keeps on playing. We spin some old 78s now and then, and run the wire recorder when friends visit. It's amazing how many of our first-time visitors, even those a bit long in the tooth, have never heard of recording on wire.

That set has come a long way since 1948. It's now a family heirloom, with memories that stream from a wire at the flip of a switch. But its importance goes even further, because it opened a window to the magic of oldtime radio, and revealed the joy of a wonderful new hobby.

AUCTION REPORT

Estes Auctions — The James Fred Collection Burbank, Ohio — June 20, 2009

The June Estes auction was a rather low-key event; there being a great deal of merchandise but not much of high value. The bulk of the material came from the James Fred collection slated for auction in winter '09, but delayed until June because of difficult access to an old barn.

Jim Fred was certainly one of the old-timers of radio collecting. Unfortunately, his collection was not stored well and the delay in disposing of it resulted in some damage and deterioration. There is a lesson here for all of us who have amassed a collection of any decent size. Make clear arrangements for its disposal before the time comes when you or someone else will have to do so. Too many times the value of what you have accumulated, perhaps over a lifetime, is seriously diminished if there is not a clear plan to dispose of it when the time comes.

As usual, there was an early sale of low value



goods starting at 8:30 A.M. This sale area was really loaded, and it took until 10:25 to clear it out, thereby delaying the start of the main auction. As mentioned there was a surplus of goods and the areas under the main display tables were loaded with many box lots, parts, etc. There also was a fair amount of paper goods that were disposed of in a side auction that I did not record.

Actually it was a pretty crazy day, as in addition to the paper goods auction, there was a side auction of transistor sets at 1:30 P.M. Then there were more side auctions to deal with lesser value sets and empty radio cases, test equipment, parts, and bulk tube lots, none of which I was able to record. I spent some of my time running back and forth if there was something in a side auction that I wanted; therefore, in the afternoon, I missed quite a few lots in the main auction.

You will note in the listing that



An unusual item, this Lyradion drop-in panel for a phonograph cabinet sold for only \$100.


this auction contained a fair number of phonograph items as well. The highest price radio items were the three Grebe pieces — a CR-5 receiver, a RORK amplifier and the RORQ Clarifier. In total they sold for \$3,000, although they were offered individually. They were the best quality that I have seen, so probably were well worth it for the discriminating collector.

The rest of the sale was pretty average, and at the end of the day, the cars and vans in the parking lot were mostly crammed full. The sale total that I was able to record came to over \$28,000 not counting the 5 percent premium charged here. I'm sure that the total would be well over \$30,000, taking into account the early sale and all the side auctions. Lots of bargains were to be had, and most buyers should be happy with their purchases. I stopped recording at about 5:00 P.M., and the sale actually finished about 5:20 P.M. A long day for all concerned.

Recollections of James Fred


Seems like I've been in this radio collecting/history business/hobby for an awfully long time. Don't remember when I first met Jim Fred, but I'm sure that, long before I met him, I knew of him either through his "Antique Radio Corner," a column during the 1970s in *Elementary Electronics*, or his *Antique Radio Topics*, which he published from 1974 to 1983. I was a lot younger then and eager to find anything related to this, new to me, hobby of radio collecting. In the 1980s, his *Antique Radio Collection Newsletter* ran for about three years, after which its subscribers became A.R.C. subscribers. Then Jim began to write articles for A.R.C., including the six-part series "All You Need to Know about Repairing AC Radios."

I do remember running into Jim at an ARCA meet at Grand Isle, New York, but I do not recall the year. ARCA (Antique Radio Club of America) held annual meets at different locations every year, and this particular year, I had a free airline ticket as a result of being bumped off a recent business trip flight. My wife and I availed ourselves of a quick trip to Grande Isle. Jim was there in the flea market, having traveled from Indiana or Michigan in a rather nondescript pickup truck. In it, he had two large military radio units that I had never seen before and that I really wanted to have.

The price was within reason, and Jim was always a fair guy, certainly to me. However, I surely could not check this equipment as airline luggage. Jim said, "No problem. I'll take them back home with me and send them to you by Greyhound Bus package service." A deal was made, and my wife and I flew home.

Sure enough, a week or two later one package arrived on my doorstep, and the other, being too heavy for home delivery, was available for pickup at the Newark, New Jersey, bus station. Having been well packaged, both survived the trip, and I am grateful that Jim went out of his way to do that for me.

I guess I saw Jim at AWA once or twice, but lost track of him and was not aware of his passing until I saw the first notice of the auction of his collection by Estes. He was truly one of the "old timers" of the radio hobby, and I learned a lot from him and his publications.




