

Like many of you, I have worked with electronics since I was very young (for me it was age 10), and now I'm 55. I was licensed as a Ham in 1970 (don't hold it against me) and have been involved with vintage and antique equipment for about 25 years.

On the other hand, reports on auctions and the many activities at club events are equally important to those who cannot attend. Auction prices can enable you to compare items in your own collections and get a sense of their value. Many interesting, sometimes rare items show up in these auctions, as well as in old equipment contests and displays, and we try to include as many photos of those items as possible.

In fact, we probably have run more photos in this issue than ever before. 



MEET & AUCTION REPORT

Antique Radio Club of Illinois Radiofest 2010 — August 5-7, 2010

The Antique Radio Club of Illinois (ARCI) celebrates its 30th anniversary this year. Some of the radios that were new when ARCI started are now becoming collectibles. This is the fourth year that Radiofest has been held at the Willowbrook Holiday Inn Conference Center near Chicago just north of Interstate 55 on Route 83, the Kingery Highway. The hotel is a few years old, but it is well kept, the staff is great, and the rooms are clean and fresh.

My wife and I arrived on Thursday afternoon about 3 P.M. to check in at the hotel. We are usually unable to be there on Thursday for the auction, but this year was an exception. I brought several items along to sell in the main auction, and I was looking forward to seeing what other items would be alongside them. Sellers were setting up their tables in the parking lot, and a lot of activity was going on.

The main auction registration started on Thursday afternoon just after 4 P.M., and the line formed quickly outside the banquet room where the auction was held. The banquet room was crowded with people and auction lots. Chairs were set up facing a large projection screen, and tables with the items were set up around the perimeter of the room. In the center of the room, a Sony 360° remotely controlled pole camera feeding high definition video to a projection system had been set

up by John Bart, ARCI President, and Rent Com. For years, this company has provided ARCI with AV equipment gratis. The same system was used later during the seminar presentations for graphics, illustrations and recording the presentation.

The total registration for the auction included 215 lots, 56 sellers, and 145 bidders. Frank Rasada was the floor manager directing the placement of lots around the room and generally keeping order. My wife started making a list of what was going to be auctioned, while I started getting photos of the room and the highlights of the items for sale. There were so many interesting things coming in we couldn't keep up. The bidding started about 6:30 P.M.

Harry Blesy called the auction, Art Bilski described the lots, and the bids were recorded by Margaret Coscino. There were well over 200 people in attendance. The camera was panned and zoomed onto each lot so everybody could get a close look at each item as the item went up for bids. When the auction ended just after 10:30 P.M., 132 of the lots had sold for a total of \$17,680.

There were several unusual and desirable items in the auction. The highest bid of the evening went for a beautifully restored 12-tube Zenith 12S232 "Walton" at \$2,200. A Norden-Hauck Super 10 closed at \$1,500, but neither the Zenith nor the Norden-Hauck met the seller's reserve. Two of the other items not reaching their reserve were a Dynaco 79 stereo amplifier at \$325 and a DeForest D-10 at \$570. Total bidding on the unsold lots was \$12,870.

Of the items that were sold there was a green marbled Emerson AU106 Catalin for \$2,000, a West-

em Electric KS-15750-L1 tube tester at \$675, and a Scott Allwave 15 in a Warrington cabinet for \$650. A Belmont Boulevard miniature, pocket tube radio and a pair of Altec Voice of the Theater horn speakers each went for \$575.

Other special items included an Atwater Kent 10C breadboard, Marconi Wireless and DeForest Wireless stock certificates, a Sonotron 3-tube amplifier with tubes in the original cardboard display box, and a very old Thompson DC direct current watt-hour meter. One of the oddities was a regulation football with a Zenith sales promotional message printed on it that sold for \$170.

I think my personal favorite was a United Metal and Stamping Company "Diamond" crystal set, just because it was cute. Most of the crowd hung on until the last lot was sold. Following the auction the club had free pizza delivered.

Earlier in the week it had rained, but by Thursday, it cleared off and the weather was perfect for the flea market. Friday morning we started early, and by 7 A.M., things were buzzing. Many of the sellers were already there and set up. Even later in the morning there was quite a bit of activity.

I saw many interesting things in the flea market: some colorful Catalins, a Philco Predicta, a couple of Philco Safaris, and some early DeForest wireless equipment. There was a pair of 1961 vintage Du-Kane DuK-10 Ionovac plasma tweeters in working condition. These are rarely seen at flea markets.

I bought a copy of *A History of Engineering and Science in the Bell System/Electronics Technology 1925-1975*. This is the sixth in a series of seven books published by AT&T on their history that I am

working my way through. I also picked up five old Wollensak portable tape recorders mostly for parts. Several sellers told me that they did very well with enthusiastic sales.


This year there were 208 spaces sold which is considered a sellout. There were visitors from 23 states and several foreign countries. Over 1,000 people attended the 3-day event.

A lot of people took advantage of the hospitality tent. Janet LaVelle provides cold drinks, chips, homemade cookies and light snacks for a donation offering under a large canopy with tables and chairs. The hotel sold breakfast entrées and then lunch later on at a serving area adjacent to the hospitality tent.

The Special Event amateur radio station, using call W30 in honor of the ARCI 30th anniversary, was operating 8 A.M. to 3 P.M. on Friday and 8 A.M. until noon on Saturday. Club member Chris Farley, KC9IEQ, brought several vintage pieces, including a B&W 5100B transmitter dating from the late 1950s, a


National NC-303 receiver from roughly the same era, and a Johnson Matchbox antenna matcher for operation on AM.

Jim Novak, WA9FIH, set up a Hallicrafters FPM-300 for sideband operation. Jim also brought his Kenwood TR-7950 for two meters. The antenna setup was a multi-band dipole for HF and a vertical for two meters. Due to a solar flare earlier in the week, the bands were problematic, but the station made a number of contacts in Europe, Israel, the U.S., and Canada. Special commemorative QSL cards were sent to contacts.

This year's old equipment contest categories were: (1) Made in Illinois, (2) Made in Wisconsin, (3) Made in Indiana, (4) Rare Plastics/Catalin, (5) Art Deco Radios, (6) Radios Pre-1930, (7) Radios 1930-WWII (1945), (8) Radios

Post-WWII (after 1945), (9) Transistors/Novelty, (10) Speakers, and (11) Open Category. Display only entries were also in the contest room.

Olin Shuler displayed his collection of Motorola radios manufactured in the Quincy, Illinois, assembly plant from 1948 until 1968. David and Julia Bart displayed historical documents and collectible items from the establishment of the IEEE Edison Medal in 1909 and the 100th anniversary. This year there were 31 contest entries covering all categories.

Some of the highlights of the entries were a Silver-Marshall "Sargent-Rayment Seven" made in 1928 that I thought bore a similarity and certainly competed with the Golden-Leutz Universal Transoceanic Phantom Type 9 which was also sold in 1928. Another interesting entry was an Andrea portable suitcase radio made for the military for tracking down spies. A really beautiful entry was the 1931 Chronovox clock radio. The intricate wood case was stunning. A rather novel entry was a set of three progressively larger horn speakers made from seashells, one of which was playing.

Outside the contest display room, a fabulous collection of early Atwater Kent radios, advertising items, literature and manuals was displayed in the hotel atrium. Tables of pristine breadboard sets, some of which are extremely rare, were shown. An Atwater Kent crystal set, several table radios, and consoles rounded out the display.

The special presentations this year began at 9 A.M. with Dr. Virginia Utermohlen-Lovelace, the author of *Jack Binns and the First SOS*, a biography about her grandfather Jack Binns. On the foggy morning of January 22, 1909, two ships collided in the waters off the Atlantic coast near the Nantucket lightship. Jack Binns was the shipboard wireless operator aboard the luxury liner "Republic" which had been struck by the "Florida" in the fog. Binns

sent out a distress signal on the newly installed wireless equipment. The faint signal was picked up by the Marconi station at Siasconsett, Massachusetts, with Jack Irwin at the key. Thus began the story of the first use of wireless technology to summon rescue of ships at sea.

At 10 A.M., ARCI's own Dan Clark gave us the history of a word we have all heard but maybe never knew much about, "Superheterodyne." He started with some of the key people in radio and told the history of how radio reception evolved from the tuned radio frequency sets of the twenties to the invention and development of advanced radio circuits, such as the regenerative, superregenerative, heterodyne, and superheterodyne methods invented and developed by pioneers, such as Reginald Fessenden and Edwin Armstrong. He described how superheterodyne circuits work and how they evolved into the technology that made radio a household word.


At 11 A.M., Olin Shuler talked about his experience as a Quality Engineer in the Production Engineering Department at the Motorola Consumer Products factory in Quincy, Illinois. Motorola manufactured its line of auto and table radios there from 1948 through 1968. Shuler talked about the history of the manufacturing facility and showed various examples of sets produced. As an adjunct to his presentation, he displayed a large museum quality collection of Motorola radios in the contest room.

The Ladies Luncheon hosted by Janet LaVelle from noon to 1 P.M. in the hotel restaurant dining room was a special time for the ladies to share a few minutes together.

At 1:30 P.M., Bill Ross, W9WR, hosted the Ham Radio Forum. This forum is a chance for Hams to get together to discuss their Amateur equipment, show off favorite pieces and ask questions.

At 2:30 P.M., Felicia Kreuzer and Geoffrey Bourne hosted a joint presentation on the new facility for the Antique Wireless Association museum in Bloomfield, New York, and the Museum of Radio and Technology in Huntington, West Virginia. Both museums have splendid collections of early radio history and even some early computer equipment.

The final presentation of the day was the practical side of radio restoration with Ed Huether and John Stone. These guys have all the answers about

electrical restoration starting with essential safety precautions, troubleshooting, and the use of test equipment. The mysteries of alignment were covered using an actual example.


With a capacity crowd of over 100 people, ARCI President David Bart opened the awards banquet with a moment of silence for our radio collector colleagues Don Arpin, Larry Babcock, Ernie Hite, and Ed Bell, all of whom had passed away in the last 12 months. Bruce DuMont, president of the Chicago-based Museum of Broadcast Communications and host of the syndicated program "Beyond the Beltway," then gave a status report on the museum and accepted a digital collection of photographs and 30-year history of ARCI on CD and DVD.

Closing out the evening the musical quartet "Mississippi Flannigan" played selections from the 1950s through the 1970s.

One of the interesting events at Radiofest doesn't happen until the end. On Saturday morning Tom Kleinschmidt holds the donation auction, an assortment of donated items, parts and box lots that sellers didn't sell or don't have the room to take back home. Just because they didn't sell it doesn't mean that it's useless junk. I have personally picked up more than one treasure out of the stacks, including a GE Porta-Fi speaker in good condition for my dad's old 1960s stereo.

The proceeds this year were \$1,001, which went to the club to help cover expenses. As always ARCI is very grateful for the donation of items and to the buyers who participate.

While other events, hamfests, and flea markets seem to be shrinking, Radiofest is showing itself to be a continuing strong event. ARCI is very grateful for the help of all the sellers, buyers, and volunteer that are so vital to making this event possible. We all look forward to the excitement of the auctions, the


















Antique Wireless Association 2010 World Convention Report Rochester, New York — August 17-21, 2010


The 49th Antique Wireless Association (AWA) World Conference was held at the RIT Inn and Conference Center in Rochester, New York, from August 17 to August 21, 2010. In order to accommodate the additional auction of the late Larry Babcock's collection, registration opened on Tuesday at noon, with a preview of the Babcock collection scheduled at 5:00 P.M. A separate report by Ray Chase on the Babcock auction held on Wednesday at 9:00 A.M. follows this report.

Many of you will remember that Larry Babcock also contributed to these AWA reports in the past. Needless to say, we will miss his input in the future.

The convention themes this year included Midget Radios, Sylvania, and the 100th Anniversary of the Radio Club of



The proposed entrance to the new Antique Wireless Museum resembles the Sparton Model 557 blue-mirror radio.




This World War II portable radio station was entered in the old equipment contest. It consists of a BC-654-A transmitter and receiver, and a hand-cranked generator.

America (RCA). This organization, which is totally separate from AWA, was founded by experimenters and inventors who were the pioneers in radio. The members who followed included a list of Who's Who in radio — Goldsmith, Armstrong, Sarnoff, and many others. This RCA, of course, is not to be confused with the Radio Corporation of America.

Registration continued on Wednesday and Thursday, and the registration of 527 was up from 418 last year. In fact, the numbers in general were up from 2009: 137 flea market spaces sold, up from 115, and 147 banquet attendees, up from 104. However according to our tabulation, the auction generated \$24,500 in sales, down from \$28,000 in 2009.

One mystifying factor was that although the number of flea market spaces sold was up, the number occupied after opening on Thursday was down. On your editor's annual tour that day at noon, I counted 82 actual setups. Last year the count was 111, and the year before, 88. Still, the popular big tent was full, and sellers and buyers enjoyed protection from the sun — no rain this year — and brisk sales.




Perhaps some didn't get around to setting up because there were too many other distractions, such as the Babcock auction the day before. (Some auction items appeared in the flea market.) Or perhaps the many excellent seminars, the quality of which is an AWA trademark, were hard to miss. Nevertheless, a lot of good items showed up in the flea market, as indicated by photos on these pages.

The well-attended seminars included such wide-ranging topics as "Macmillian and Don Mix" presented by John Dilks; "Little Midgets for Big Spies" by Bart Lee; "Alaskan Wireless Stations" by Morgan Blanchard; "Moonlight Restorations" by Marc Ellis; "The All Red Line" by Bob Murray and Bruce MacMillan; and "Lee de Forest, Inventor of Sound Movies" by Mike





The AWA Members Forum on Thursday morning focused on the AWA Museum project, which consists of three buildings on approximately three acres adjacent to Rt. 20. The museum was open for viewing on Wednesday from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and anyone not familiar with the developing campus could roam the extensive property and get a sense of its progress. This ambitious project will, no doubt, be a few years in the developing stage, and fundraising is in the cards.

The purpose of any radio museum, of course, is the preservation of radio history, as well to function as an educational tool. The education component is also a part of the conference where an old equipment contest is a featured event. You will see in this report photos of many interesting items in the contest, but very important always is the documentation that accompanies the entries.


An example in this contest was Eric Wenaas's RCA tube tester display which won both the People's Choice Award and the Display Award. Eric's careful research won't be a surprise to readers of his excellent book *Radiola — The Golden Age of RCA, 1919-1929*.

fortunately, this year the meet ended on Saturday, instead of Sunday when there is a better chance of a larger general public participation.

However, this may be due to hotel limitations, as became evident last year regarding the Book Fair's occupancy of the foyer. Unfortunately, last year's sellers had to strike and reset up their tables because of a hotel event Saturday evening. The good news this year was that the Book Fair had uninterrupted occupancy of the foyer, and there was much activity at the sold-out tables.

A good time was had by all in the tent on Wednesday evening at the "Beggar's Ball." Free pizza and a cash bar made for an evening of camaraderie and good radio talk. Live country music, including a slide guitar, meant that your editor could request *Luckenbach Texas*, a tune familiar to all Wayland and Willie fans.

Last year you may recall that AWA failed to schedule the annual Ladies Luncheon. The ladies rose in protest and had one anyway. Needless to say, the same mistake was not made twice, and 28 ladies enjoyed what was billed as "an upscale event" on Wednesday noon.

As mentioned earlier, the banquet too was well attended. It moved along well as hosted by AWA's able new executive director Bob Hob-



THE AUCTION

The general auction closed out the convention activities on Saturday. One might have expected a low entry list and poor prices after the Larry Babcock auction on Wednesday, along with several days of flea market activity. Also, with the struggling economy and three prior days of buying, little money might have been left for this close-out event. But, such was not the case.

A total of 336 lots was en-

tered for the Saturday sale, not too far off from previous auctions. Surprisingly, some very desirable items were included. To name a few: an unusual 3-tier tube display of most tubes, from 01-A up through most of the big pin tubes, for \$275; a nice spherical Audion that was judged to be authentic for \$775; a large Western Electric bipolar motor, for \$1,300; a strange British H.W. Sullivan 1920 vintage receiver for \$1,200; a very nice, seldom seen Northern Electric R11 superhet, for \$700; several very good British crystal sets; a Pink-A-Tone set, for \$575; a Mercury 10 tube superhet, for \$500; and a restored rare Atwater Kent Model 50, for \$1,500, to name just a few.

On the other hand, there were many good bargains to be had on the more common items. Buyers were very selective, and 48 of the 336 items went unsold when their sellers' reserve prices were not met.

This auction was conducted by Richard Estes with the same crew that toiled through the Wednesday auction. It also started at 9:00 A.M., but this time, stopped for a noon break, resumed at 1:00 P.M., and concluded at 2:10 P.M. The 288 lots that did get sold brought a total of about \$24,500, not bad for the end of such a busy week.









AUCTION REPORT

Antique Wireless Association 2010 World Convention The Larry Babcock Estate Auction Rochester, New York — August 18, 2010

REPORTED BY RAY CHASE

The auction of the late Larry Babcock's collection was the first major event on this year's Antique Wireless Association 2010 World Convention schedule. It took place Wednesday morning at 9:00 A.M. Larry's complete collection was not included since the family had donated some items to the AWA Museum. Nevertheless, this was an extremely large job for the AWA volunteers to undertake, as it involved collecting the items, moving them to the conference site, and then sorting and labeling them. AWA said that there were 682 lots to be auctioned, and I was able to tabulate 658 of them.


Richard Estes conducted the auction, assisted by his brother John, Bob Dobush, Frank Rasada, and many AWA volunteers. Viewing was available on Tuesday evening and also before the auction on Wednesday morning. It truly was a massive collection with many very collectible items that potential buyers pored over with great interest.

Larry collected many Federal radios, as well as other brands from the surrounding Buffalo area. Still it was an eclectic collection with a horde of horn speakers, many novelty radios, an array of late 1940s and 1950s sets, many desirable tubes, books, and paper. Noteworthy were some early mechanical television artifacts and two Baird receivers.

Given the time constraints on moving and sorting the items, there were over 100 box lots of tubes, parts, books and paper. Many of the box lots are not included in the listing here since their contents could not be adequately described. For example, one large box of tubes, each

wrapped in paper went for \$100, whereas another went for \$5.

Other box lots of tubes went for as much as \$900. Likewise, some box lots of paper items went as high as \$700. Box lots often consisted of a mixture of less desirable items along with very collectible ones. Those buyers who did their due diligence during the preview were able to go home happy.

As usual, the top prices were for the rare and unusual items. Two Raytheon television neon tubes went for \$250 and \$275 respectively. And, collectors had a chance to obtain other unusual tubes at reasonable prices, such as Duovac, Moorehead, Ken-O-Lamp, and a Welsh peanut tube.

The two Baird television receivers went for \$2,100 and \$3,600, a Grebe RORQ Clarifier for \$3,600, and an Atwater Kent Model 9 breadboard, the early version with the Type 11 and Coupled Circuit tuners, went for \$1,700.

Even though Larry was known for his interest in Federal, there were only the usual Federal sets in the auction, prices for which ranged from \$275 for a Model 200 5-tube panel set to \$800 for the large Federal 61 receiver.


The auction itself went at a fast pace without a break, as is Richard's normal procedure with his Ohio auctions. However, it was even more necessary here because of the vast number of items to be handled. Bidding was strong and good prices were obtained for most items.

The auction concluded at 4:15 P.M. AWA reported the total sales as \$92,000, while I totaled my listing at \$84,701, but as previously noted I missed some items while taking a short break.




