

AUCTION REPORT

Nest Egg Auction Meriden, Connecticut, July 17, 2010

Although the Nest Egg Auction Gallery is not too far from my home, I had heard that this estate and antiques auction house previously had one or two radio auctions I somehow missed. Luckily I did get word of the one held last July

Nest Egg Auctions' website (www.nestegg-auctions.com) pictured a great many radios so this event looked like it would be worthwhile and I put it on my itinerary. Viewing was scheduled for the Friday, July 16 and Saturday July 17 from noon until 5:30 p.m., when a preliminary auction was scheduled to start. The preliminary auction was held in a covered loading dock/warehouse area that was not air-conditioned, while the main auction was held in a comfortable air-conditioned sit-down gallery. This event occurring well into a hot July day, sitting inside the cool gallery was where you wanted to be.

The auction was quite large. There were about 350 cataloged items in the main gallery and the preliminary auction was possibly even larger, although it suffered somewhat from a haphazard arrangement with little rhyme or reason. The auctioneer also could have used some knowledgeable help in sorting goods between the preliminary auction and the main event as on the loading

dock there were Heathkit Apaches, Comanches, Cheyennes, a DX-100, Hallicrafters receivers and transmitters, very good boxes of books, and even a R-390 that sold for \$300.

The preliminary auction was conducted in "walk-around" fashion and was very crowded and hot, making it quite a task to keep track of what was being sold. Scurrying to grab a few goodies for myself, it was impossible to record actual sales. I did, however, count 38 console radios on the dock and many more radios of all sorts. Some of the items would fall more into the "junk" category, but then "one mans junk is another's treasure," as they say. There was a large quantity of Swan gear that appeared to be awaiting repair, so perhaps some of that equipment came straight from a dealer repair shop. Nonetheless these items seemed to command good prices despite possibly needing extensive work. One buyer came with a large utility trailer and nearly filled it! If an item did not draw an opening bid it was combined with additional pieces until a sale was made, so some lots contained much more than a buyer was likely interested in. This part of the auction ended thankfully at about 7:10 p.m. After a 10-minute break to allow buyers to gather their purchases, attendees were able to

retire to the more comfortable gallery.

The main auction was well laid out and cataloged, although goods were not sold in catalog order. There was a large projection screen above and behind the auctioneer's podium, and as each lot was brought up a runner called the lot number and a clerk entered the number to a computer, projecting a large picture of the item on the screen. Runners would also circle behind the auctioneer and stand to the side while displaying the item. I was happy to see this as it addresses a longstanding gripe of mine at many auctions, even some highly rated ones, where the runners congregate in front of the auctioneer waiting their turn while blocking the auctioneer's view. The item being sold is not displayed well and sometimes one is not even sure which item is being sold. This auction was very neat and orderly; others would do well to adopt its approach. The runners were well disciplined and the sale proceeded very rapidly, to the point that I had trouble keeping up, but the catalog and the projected image greatly helped here. The auctioneer was Ryan Brechlin and he processed 350 or so lots in about two hours.

The merchandise itself represented "tube heaven" as there were over 76 boxed tube lots, some containing batches of NOS 201As and 199s in cartons. The radios were a mixed lot of battery and AC sets in various conditions, ranging from very good to fair and poor. Prices seemed quite reasonable, and I assume that most buyers went home happy. As usual, consoles were a drag; someone who waited until the end bought eight of them for \$10.

The auction ended at 9:35 p.m. and the sale total from the main auction alone was about \$17,600. The prices I recorded, which are listed below, are the knock-down ones and do not include the buyer's premium or sales tax. At this gallery the buyer's premium was 17 percent if paying by

credit card and 15 percent if by check or cash. Checks were processed immediately so there was no running home to quickly replenish the checking account!

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Morrow Radio Manufacturing Company

Ray E. Morrow went into business in 1945 when radio and automobile production began again after the end of World War II. He sold and installed Motorola, Clarion, Packard Bell and Philco auto radios from his location at 150 South Liberty Street in Salem, Oregon. Soon, he discovered a more lucrative market installing commercial and custom-made mobile amateur radio equipment. In the Salem city directory for 1945, Morrow advertised, "we can make any radio and electronic equipment to order."

Morrow's first mass-produced radio was the Odel CM-1, AM Conelrad receiver shown in the accompanying photo, which dates from 1953 to 1955 when he assembled it in his Salem home at 577 N. 23rd. This small set is owned by Jay Johnston of the Northwest Vintage Radio Society and measures 4 3/8 x 5 7/8 x by 7 5/16 inches (HWD).

The Morrow Radio Manufacturing Company was incorporated in October 1955 and moved to a Salem factory site at 2794 Market Street NE where the company remained until the late 1980s. The period from 1955 to 1961, when Morrow centered its manufacturing on fixed station and mobile communications equipment, is the most interesting for radio collectors.

The receiver models, with original pricing, include a 13-tube with 20-tube function MBR-5 home station or mobile receiver covering 80 to 10 meters that sold for \$224.50; two Falcon models priced from \$169 to \$189; and the MB-6 receiver (\$239.50). Morrow also manufactured AC power supply units; the FS-1 Field Strength Meter; the MR-2 converter; the MB-560 60-watt transmitter, speakers and, later in the 1960s and 1970s, commercial and CB transceivers, as well as aviation and marine electronic equipment.

The five-band MB-6 receiver was Morrow's top-of-the-line amateur radio offering, and it featured a calibrated S-meter, crystal calibrator, noise-balanced squelch circuit and a rotating



drum dial mechanism, unlike the more common model MBR-5. The compact MB-6 measures 4 x 4 x 7 inches (HWD) with three of the 13 tubes mounted sideways. The set is known for its extraordinary stability, outperforming all its lower priced competitors like the Elmac models PMR-7 and PMR-8.

The board of directors fired Ray Morrow in 1982 due to a bitter labor dispute that went public. The company reformed with support from his family and became II Morrow. The restructured company centered on avionics and started manufacturing the SL 40 (slimline) airplane radio-intercom (which cost about \$1,300), LORAN units and GPS systems. Oregon newspapers hailed the restructured company as a great success due to its strong entry in the export market.

II Morrow was purchased by UPS in October 1986, because the parcel service company was interested in the mobile tracking and communications systems II Morrow could produce for its many delivery trucks. UPS later sold II Morrow to Garmin GPS. The former Morrow building at 2794 Market NE is now a Community Action Head Start Center.

WITH THE COLLECTORS

Guild: A Leader in Novelty Radios

I've been collecting tube radios for nearly two decades now. I've always possessed a collector's mentality. When I was younger, in my twenties and thirties, I collected baseball cards from my childhood. Today, tube radios of all varieties have replaced those chewing gum cardboard collectibles.

Like so many novice radio collectors, at first I would buy any wooden or bakelite tube radio I could find. After a time, however, I started to specialize and became infatuated with the novelty radio. Let's be clear here: I have no interest in the plethora of transistor-variety novelties, although I do appreciate those who do. My interests are focused on older vintage novelty radios that don't appear to be radios and are dependent on glass vacuum tubes to produce their voice and song.

Some of my favorite novelties include the Majestic Treasure Chest, the Sentinel Library of Books, the Bendix Magic Dial Drop-Leaf table, the Empire Football, and the Trophy Baseball and Bowling Ball.

There is one manufacturer, the Guild Radio and Television Co. of Inglewood, CA, that specialized exclusively in 1950s vacuum-tube novelty sets. For me, they are some of the most underrated gems in the radio collecting hobby.

Take for example one of Guild's most well-known productions: the Country Belle. Housed in a cabinet that mimics an old oak wall telephone of the 1930s, the Model 556 Belle seldom rates favored collect-

ible status, regularly selling for under \$50. It is, however, one of my absolute favorite models.

The set is cleverly designed so that when its user picks up the ear-piece of the "telephone" to


"listen," the on-off switch of the radio is spring-activated and the phone magically evolves into a clear-sounding AM radio. The phone's black metal crank actually serves as the unit's station selector. I cannot tell you how much enjoyment this set has brought to me when friends and family pay my collection a visit and I provide a demonstration.

Guild's Teakettle is yet another example of radio novelty brilliance. Designed to look like a tea kettle, the unit is a battery-operated portable made from cherry wood, solid brass and porcelain.

The radio can be carried from room to room, running on its 9-volt battery, or it can be placed on its trivet, an optional accessory that allows the unit to be electrically operated from standard AC power. Amazingly, the trivet also serves as a trickle-charger for its battery option when it's plugged into AC.

This set is often seen for around \$50, but keep in mind that the trivet accessory is considerably less common and is often not included with the radio. In my estimation, a complete working unit should price easily at \$100-plus. Like most Guild designs, this set is unique and possesses enhanced playability and selectivity.

While the Country Belle and Teakettle are seen relatively of-

ten at auction, several other Guild products may be more difficult to locate, some extremely so.


The Old Timer appears to be a chime clock. The electric clock functions well. The three chimes are for decorative purposes only. The dial indicator is especially unusual. The indicator, usually a metal pointer in most sets of this age, is a tube-like light bulb. The set has unusually good reception and sensitivity on AM and FM bands.

The fairly common Town Crier looks like an antique crier's lantern. It is awkward to showcase while plugged into a socket and so is best for display only.

The New Englander is a very rare roll-top desk unit with AM-FM, phono, and two 12-inch side speakers. I had the opportunity to purchase one of these locally but my space limitations made me pass on the unit. I regret that decision almost daily.

The Spice Chest (Model 484) is a common louvered-door radio found with at least two distinct grill clothes: one is plain and the other is a woven picture of foxhunt-type riders on horseback at a racetrack. It's not my all-time favorite set due to its lackluster boxy design, but the set was probably quite popular on the 1950s kitchen counter.

The Buttons and Bows set, styled to look like a sewing case, is made from walnut. The set is not a real eye-catcher but its relative rar-

The full-size Guild New Englander Radio looks like a roll-top desk.




ity makes it a must-have for the Guild aficionado.

The Grafanola (Model 785) radio/phono designed to look like an old Victrola is very, very cool but hard to find complete. It's rather large so its would-be owner must consider spacing requirements. The metal horn speaker, a replica, is especially desirable and distinctive. This is a rare find.

The very rare Bonnet Box (Model 818) is a rather unattractive set that looks much like a big wooden box! One might suspect that by 1959 those working as Guild designers had jumped ship. The set is AM/FM with a four-speed automatic turntable.

Guild made a few additional sets seldom seen, including a Model 665 Country Belle with an additional smaller wooden box for use as an intercom. I've never seen one of these in person. In the late 1960s, when Spanish provincial furniture was the styling rage—especially in California where Guild was located—the company designed and manufactured the Conquistador and El Tesoro models. Again, I have no direct knowledge of them, but I'm guessing that these sets had a lot of red velvet accessorizing, not my cup of tea. One thing that I have learned about collecting the Guild line of radios is that you should never judge a book by its cover. Seeing a picture of a Guild product will never give you the same emotion and resolve to own one as you'll get by seeing one in person. They are truly an American product of rich design, functionality, and reliability.



