# AT HOME WITH THE COLLECTOR

## Ray Bintliff And Jon Steinhauser Open Their Doors To Antique Radio Classified

*This month we visit two collectors: Ray Bintliff and Jon Steinhauser*

*Ray Bintliff is a well-know figure in the antique radio community and we're delighted to feature his impressive home workshop. Some of his radios also grace this month's "Photo Review". To add a fresh twist to our new column, we also look at the television collection of Jon Steinhauser. Jon collects TVs and radios but does not do restoration on the items he acquires.*

*We hope you enjoy this peek into the lair of true collectors, one known for his repair and restoration skills and the other for his acquisition abilities. Both are to be admired—and maybe even emulated*

### RAY BINTLIFF

There are no long-time readers of *Antique Radio Classified* who don't know who Ray Bintliff is. Ray worked with *A.R.C.* since 1995 as a member of the editorial staff, and contributed many articles as well.

Ray works repairing and restoring pre-1945 radios, test equipment and most anything that uses vacuum tubes, except TVs.

I recently had the opportunity to visit Ray at his shop, and I must say that his has to be the most organized home repair facility that I've ever seen. It's more organized and cleaner than my home kitchen!

At the work bench, most people (including myself) waste a lot of time looking for parts, adjusting lighting, and moving other projects out of the way. Ray, however, can immediately go to work on his latest project. As you can see in the photographs, Ray's bench is immaculate, with a separate test equipment cart or test equipment strategically placed for easy troubleshooting. His parts, wire spools, etc. are sorted in wall bins and his tools are neatly stored. There's no tripping over junker chassis, wires, or technical literature in this shop. It's truly a dream working environment.

But, naturally, there's more to Ray than a tidy space. In fact, you could write a book on his history in the radio/TV busi-

ness. He first went to work for RCA in Queens, New York, in 1946 as a TV Field Engineer. Among his duties was converting the pre-war RCA TRK TVs to the post-war frequencies. He handled a number of RCA executive accounts, including the TV and audio equipment in General David Sarnoff's home and office. During his time at RCA he also worked in the Color TV Lab, managed an RCA TV repair branch in New Haven, Connecticut, and was involved with the Defense Electronics Product line in Camden, New Jersey and later when the operation was moved to Massachusetts.

Ray's interest in radio goes way back, and he received an amateur license in 1956. Today, he holds the Extra class Amateur call sign W1RY. Upon retiring in 1983 he became interested in antique radios after being invited to a meet in New Hampshire. Since then he's contributed much to the hobby.

Ray is the author of three books for the antique radio collector and restorer: *Practical Radio Repair*; *Philco Condensers and More*; and *Radio Dial Belts*. By the way, *Practical Radio Repair* is the number one selling book in the A.R.C. bookstore!

#### JON STEINHAUSER

Jon has been an avid collector of TVs and radios since the mid 1970s. He's fortunate to have the room to be able to convert his basement into his television showroom. His TV collection includes many nice 5-, 7-, and 10-inch pieces. Some of his rarer sets are the Automatic, Zenith Porchhole, RCA 621, and Philco Predicta(s). There are wood and Bakelite examples as well as table and floor model examples.

Both Jon and his wife Caren are also collectors of Americana and depression glass items.

# MEET & AUCTION REPORT

## Kutztown Radio Show XXIV, Kutztown, PA, May 13 - 14, 2011

What a weekend! Kutztown XXIV, the Delaware Valley Historical Radio Club's ([www.dvhrc.info](http://www.dvhrc.info)) most recent extravaganza, didn't disappoint.

A lot of work goes into putting together a radio meet...and a lot of anxiety! Funny how, in the aftermath of planning and staging an event of this magnitude, in the end, all our pre-meet fears proved to be pretty much unfounded. A few cases in point:

The weather: Not an issue. While it was some-

what cloudy and cool, short of a few insignificant showers, we remained dry.

The economy: It was factor perhaps, but you'd hardly know it based on attendance. Everybody talked about how \$4-plus-a-gallon gas was going to affect the turnout. Apparently, it didn't; in fact, there was a marked increase in first-timers and out-of-state attendees, at least through these eyes. Perhaps a few collectors opted out of coming on Saturday due to threatening skies, as the





foot traffic was a bit lighter than at past shows. Friday, on the other hand, was one remarkable blur. Early-arriving vendors had their hands full attempting to unload while anxious shoppers craned their necks to see what was coming out of their trucks next. It's apparent that many have grasped the concept that Friday is truly the premium Kutztown shopping day. There was the typical horde of expensive eye candy for sale in both pavilions, but it appeared what was selling the most were the economical "fixer-uppers" in the \$30-\$45 range. It seemed like every other table had a least a few tubes for sale. Parts and supplies were selling briskly, too.

As dinnertime approached, the crowd had visibly thinned out, some retiring to their tents, campers, or hotels, or venturing up to the food

court where our good friends from Just Grillin' offered up a tasty steak dinner with all the fixin's. As night fell, an occasional bottle rocket would fly by, accented by the bang of Wilbur Gilroy's now-legendary potato gun. The fuel pile for the traditional radio burn was smaller than usual, but as an added attraction, some live musical entertainment from Steve Holota provided a festive new twist to an always-fun evening.

The sun never really came up on Saturday, and clouds, lots of fog, and an occasional sprinkle were the order of the day. The weather was surely the reason there were fewer sellers and buyers in the outdoor flea market. We can always rely on these shoppers to pass through the radio areas wondering, "What's this all about?"



The raffle of the restored Silvertone Model 4565 table radio, along with second and third prizes, netted our best showing in Kutztown history, which was no doubt helped along by Dave Abramson and Stan Saeger "parading" the radio throughout the pavilions and selling tickets on the spot. The lucky winner was Ron Hartman of Norfolk, VA. Second prize went to David Broggi of Conshohocken, Pennsylvania, and third prize went to Jim Burgh all the way from Trenton, North Dakota.

#### AUCTION AND FINANCIALS

Without the benefit of a collection or estate, the Saturday afternoon auction was tame in comparison to others we've had. In fact, since moving the auction from the center of the main pavilion – when auctions could take three-plus hours – to the White Room inside Renninger's, the entire process has streamlined to the point that this one concluded in 45-minutes flat!

On the income side, let's start with the auction sales. The auction had a slightly smaller number of lots than in previous years; however, the total auction grossed \$2,206. Breaking that down, commissions to the club totaled \$172.85 and sales of items donated to the club totaled \$477.50, netting a total of \$650.35 to the club coffers.

There were some membership renewals, too. In all, the club took in \$3,670.35.

I'd like to extend a hearty thanks to the volunteers who helped at the club table, helped transport stuff to the meet, worked readying the raffle radio, and so much more.

The next Kutztown Meet is September 16-17, 2011. Be there.



# WITH THE COLLECTORS

## The New Jersey Antique Radio Club's Radio Technology Museum

When people think about New Jersey, some may conjure up long stretches of picture-perfect shoreline, or maybe equally long stretches of traffic-choked turnpike. Some may associate the state most powerfully with TV shows like *The Sopranos* and *Jersey Shore*. But New Jersey also offers something very special to radio lovers: the Radio Technology Museum, a hidden gem in the southeastern part of the state. The guiding force behind the museum is the New Jersey Antique Radio Club, which has been working on this labor of love for the past six years. The culmination of their efforts is an excellent exhibit of vintage radio, television, and military electronics.

The museum is housed at InfoAge, an Information Age Learning Center, located at the former Camp Evans in Wall Township. Camp Evans had been slated for closure by the government but was preserved through a local grassroots campaign and today serves as a community learning center. It comprises over 30-historic buildings and offers events and exhibitions dedicated to the teaching and preservation of science and industry. Besides the New Jersey Antique Radio Club some of the other organizations using the former Camp Evans facility are:

- National Broadcasters Hall of Fame
- New Jersey Historical Divers Association
- Ocean Monmouth Amateur Radio Club
- Vintage Computer Club

The original facility was constructed in 1914 by Marconi as a transatlantic radio receiver site. Later it served as the home of the former US Army Evans Signal Laboratory.



Today, the museum traces the history of radio from before spark to beyond cell phones. Many of the very interesting sets on display have been restored to working condition. And the museum is even equipped with an antenna and cable distribution system incorporating a local transmitter to provide vintage programming as well as live broadcasts off the air.

Best of all, the hands-on lab gives children – of all ages – a chance to work with radios. Some of the displays include:

- Crystal set
- Regenerative receiver
- Seeing sound
- Jacob's Ladder
- Tesla coil
- Basic electrical experiments

As you can see from the accompanying photographs, there are antique and vintage radios. TVs, phonographs, military equipment, photographs pertaining to communications events, and much more.

So if you find yourself in the area, make sure to stop by and enjoy a wonderful Sunday visit.



# WITH THE COLLECTORS

## Stewart-Warner Model 1281-D Radio

BY LAUREL "OZZIE" AASGAARD

The many variations in vintage radios provide much of the intrigue and fun of collecting them. These differences include tube types and locations, tuning mechanisms, volume control methods, and cabinet styles.

A unique characteristic of the Stewart-Warner Model 1281-D radio highlighted in this article is its loudspeaker. It is pictured here out of the cabinet, but next to it, to show the relatively massive size of the magnet yoke. This yoke is solid iron, 1 1/2 inches thick, 2 1/2 inches wide, and extends beyond the 8-inch diameter of the speaker. It weighs about 10 pounds. The audio fidelity of the speaker is very good.

The schematic diagram of this radio can be found in Volume VII of Rider's Perpetual Trouble Shooter's Manual. This speaker is a permanent magnet type versus most of the electro-magnetic types used in radios of the 1930s. The exact same circuitry with a different tube line-up and with an AC power supply is shown in Rider Volumes V and VI listed as Models 1271 to 1279 with electro-magnetic speakers. The magnet coils of these speakers also served as filter chokes in the AC power supplies, but they were also found in direct current circuits of several battery-powered sets.

The radio tunes four bands with dial markings as follows: the broadcast band, tuning 530-1600 kHz, but labeled 53 to 150 in divisions of 10; shortwave bands, 1.54-4.4 MHz, 4.17-MHz, and 10.6-23 MHz. The tuning mechanism is a friction disc-type with little backlash, but the usual high frequency tuning problems



without band spread are apparent. Otherwise, it receives quite well on all bands with a long wire antenna.

The cabinet is attractive and is in excellent and original condition except for two knobs. I consider it to be of the Tombstone styling.



The tube complement consists of the following: 6K7 RF, 6L7 mixer, 6J7 oscillator, 6K7 IF, 6H6 detector, 6F5 1st AF, 6J7 BFO, 6E5 tuning eye, 6F6 AF output and 5Z4 rectifier. The tuning eye on the right is real. What appears to be another tuning eye on the left is a dummy that was added by the designer to balance the front panel's appearance. It measures 21-3/4" x 11-1/2" x 10" and awaits restoration. (Ray Bintliff - Acton, MA)

**Music Master 1930s wood radio.** Plays AM band only. No model number and was probably a private label model. Has 5 tubes and licensed by Hazeltine Corporation. (Porter S. Links-Bloor, NM)



**Silvertone Model 5656A** - This is a 3-band, 8-tube superhet communications receiver from 1936. It tunes the broadcast and two shortwave bands with a top frequency of 18MHz. The set is also referred to as the "8A" and "Super 8." The tube line up consists of a 6A7 RF, 6L7 mixer, 6C5 oscillator, 6K7 IF, 6Q7 detector/1st audio, 6F6 audio output and 5Y3 rectifier. In addition to the tuned RF stage, the set features a variable IF bandwidth, a sensitivity control and a BFO. The receiver measures 21" x 11" x 10. It is a different looking radio with its large dial and speaker. (Ray Bintliff - Acton, MA)



**General Electric Model H-620 Bakelite Radio** - Manufactured in 1939. Plays AM and shortwave bands. Comes with Bakelite back. Similar to model H-610 which played AM band only. (Marvin Staples-Newark, DE)



**Gas Pump Transistor Radios** - Very popular during the 1960s. Here are examples of Sinclair and Sunoco transistor radios that were sold or used as give-a-ways at gas stations. They worked on standard 9 volt batteries. (Paul Garrity-Normal, IL)
