







The Overlooked Component

In the past, recapping (the process of replacing all capacitors when repairing a radio) was controversial. But gradually it became to be recognized as a good practice. Perhaps it is time to consider another component – the resistor.

In the course of countless radio repairs, I have noticed a common problem in those radios that have been serviced previously. While many of these radios have been recapped, the original resistors are usually untouched. The need to replace aging capacitors seems to be well established because radios for sale are frequently described as having been recapped. However, the replacement of out of tolerance resistors is seldom considered.

So what's going on? Faulty mica capacitors are often overlooked because they are perceived as components that never fail. Perhaps the same belief extends to resistors. Or maybe it's just that the resistors look OK. Resistors that have changed in value look the same, so a visual check is of little value. A burnt resistor is obvious, but the best way to determine that condition of a resistor is to measure its value with an ohmmeter. The purpose of this article is to point out that resistors should be tested and replaced as part of a repair or recapping. This is not to suggest that all resistors should be replaced without regard to condition. Would such a task be called "resisting?"




Figure 1. Carbon-composition resistors past and present. From left to right: A 2-watt carbon-rod resistive element with soldered leads, a 1-watt resistor with formed solder connections, a Centralab resistor with a striated resistive element, a resistor with compression connections to the resistive element, another Centralab resistor with compression fittings, an early version of the molded case type, a 1-watt and 1/2-watt resistor of more recent vintage and lastly an example of a present day 1/2-watt resistor.

Resistors found in old radios are usually the wire wound and carbon composition types. Figure 1 shows some examples of such resistors. The resistance of wire wound resistors does not usually change. Wire wound resistance. Carbon composition resistors are different. As they age, their resistance can vary greatly. An increase in resistance as great as four times the rated value can result. Except for some critical applications, the carbon resistors in old radio will have a tolerance 10 or 20 percent.

It is a good idea to replace them when they exceed the specified tolerance.

Today there are a number of choices for replacement resistors. Carbon composition resistors are still readily available along with newer types such as carbon film, metal film, and metal-oxide film. The power rating of a replacement resistor should be equal to or greater than the original resistor; but not so much greater as to be ridiculous. I recently came across a set that had a $\frac{1}{4}$ -watt carbon resistor that was replaced with a 5-watt wire wound resistor. Probably the only one in the guy's junk box.

CARBON COMPOSITION RESISTORS

Carbon composition resistors consist of a resistive element covered with a protective coating. In very old resistors that meant a coat of paint used for color-coding. The resistance element of a carbon composition resistor is a mixture of carbon and a filler material that is compressed into a thin rod. The ratio of the mix determines the resistance of the element. Low resistance values have a high carbon to filler ratio. More filler and less conductive carbon are used to produce a higher resistance. Usually, carbon composition resistors will increase in value as they age. However, if these resistors are subjected to excessive current and become overheated, the filler material will carbonize and the resistance will decrease. The power ratings of carbon resistors found in old radios are typically rated at $\frac{1}{4}$, 1 or 2 watts. Some later radios may use $\frac{1}{2}$ -watt resistors. Resistor values are not exact. The accuracy of their resistance values are rated in terms of tolerance. The old "carbon stick" types have allowable tolerances as great as 20%, although 10% is more common.

5% carbon resistors are available for critical applications. New stock carbon resistors

are available with tolerances of 5 and 10%. They are inexpensive and readily available.

CARBON FILM RESISTORS

The element in a carbon film resistor is made by coating a ceramic cylinder with a resistive material. The resistive material is then cut in a spiral fashion to produce the desired resistance.

METAL FILM RESISTORS

These resistors are similar in construction to the carbon film resistors, except that the deposited resistive material is nichrome.

METAL OXIDE RESISTORS

These resistors are also similar in construction to carbon film resistors except that the deposited material is a tin-oxide. These resistors have the advantage of being very stable.

THE WORD

The purpose of this article is to encourage the testing and replacement of resistors during the course of a repair. Resistors are no less important than the other components in a radio. New resistors are not expensive. So, "check 'em and replace 'em" as needed. The result may be a better performing radio



The LeWol "Lavore" – This 4-tube TRF set was manufactured by one of the lesser-known radio companies; The LeWol Manufacturing Corp. 844 W. Adams St., Chicago, IL. Its tube line up is conventional and typical for the early 1930s. The tube complement consists of one each of the follow types: 6D6, 6C6, 43, and 25Z5. The cabinet is covered with leatherette and features ArtDeco designs. Ray Bintliff, Acton, MA.

Grebe CR-8 – This shortwave receiver of 1921 operated on one 01A tube. Inside were 3 molded Grebe variometers. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.

Crosley Model 51-P – The “P” stood for portable and this one was a 2 tube set covered in leatherette. Inside was room for the batteries and headphones. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.



Halson Cathedral – This pleasingly designed table set was a simple 5 tube receiver from 1932. Dave Crocker.

L-Tatro Cathedral – This little 4 tube radio was manufactured about 1933. It was marketed as an inexpensive receive of the time. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA



Freed-Eisemann Model NR-205 – This seldom 5 tube receiver of 1924 was produced to replace your phonograph and fit into its cabinet. The controls were under the flip-top cover at the top. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.



Federal Model 135 – This four tube receiver was made to fit into the cabinet of your replaced photograph. It was manufactured in 1924 by the Federal Telephone and Telegraph Co. of Buffalo, NY. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.

Arvin Model 444 – This midget was produced in 1944. The 444 was painted red and was a 4 tube set. Other Arvins of this period were similar in design. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.



Crosley 4-29 – The “4” in the model number signifies it that this set has 4 tubes. The “29” indicates that the price at the time was \$29. This set was sold without tubes, batteries, antenna, and speaker. Dave Crocker.

Operadio Speaker – This metal case acoustic speaker was actual a horn wrapped around inside the cabinet. It was manufactured in 1928 by the Operadio Manufacturing Co of Chicago, IL. Dave Crocker, Mashpee, MA.



(Canadian and other foreign advertisers, please see "Payment" on opposite page for methods.) "Free words" cannot be accumulated from month to month; free words must be requested when ad is submitted. Free ads are OK via e-mail but for your protection, please use our secure website for longer, paid ads.

Faxed & e-mailed ads: Please see additional information on opposite page.

When including ads with other A.R.C. correspondence, write the ads on a separate piece of paper. Include SUB# with ad. Ads may be sent in advance; but, write each ad on a separate piece of paper and indicate the month (or successive months up to your subscription expiration; 12-months, maximum) you want the ad to run.

To minimize our typing errors: Please write legibly. Use both capital and small letters. Do not use a dash between words. Carefully write the following numbers and letters (especially in model numbers) since some can look alike; for example 1, I and l (the number one, the capital I and the small L.) Also: 0, O, o, Q and D; v, r and n; 6, b and G; V, U, u, v and Y; A and R; 5, S and z; 2, Z and z. We try to correct spelling errors, so when using an uncommon word or manufacturer which we might mistake as a more common word or manufacturer, note it so that we do not "correct" it. Editor's annotations are in [brackets] in ads.

Advertising is accepted only for early items related to radio, communication, etc. All items must be described fairly; reproductions, reprints and not-original items must be so identified.
