"Nemo" Programs

IF IT'S a program originating outside the studio, it's a "NEMO." The Nemo program—in latin the word means "no name"—like Topsy, "just grewed" from a freak to a major factor in radio broadcasting. To radio engineers a Nemo is a feature picked up at an outside point. Today, programs from points outside the studio represent a goodly portion of all the entertainment sent over the air, but they are still Nemos.

Programs originating outside the studio were offered as features in the early days of broadcasting—something novel and out of the ordinary. They were, of course, subject to every conceivable kind of disaster, with wire facilities failing, microphone going bad and everything else that could occur, happening, usually at the most interesting point. So usual was it for these outside programs to fail, that broadcasters offering them kept an orchestra in the studio to jump into the breach when the expected happened.

Today, of course, outside programs come through to the receiver with the same clarity and consistency as the usual studio program, and the "stand-by" orchestra has been dispensed with, studio talent being needed only in very rare cases when accidents, such as a bad storm breaking down wires, cuts

the connection between the originating point and the transmitter.

As a result of the perfection of facilities for the handling of Nemo programs, the public is receiving much that could not otherwise be presented. Outdoor sports are regularly broadcast from the scene of activity, and such events as the landing here of the German Zeppelin, the return of Lindbergh from his flight to Paris, addresses of the President and other notable persons and similar features are brought to the people of the entire country. Other developments in radio, such as the improvement of short-wave transmission, has made possible broadcasting from airplanes and ships and from foreign countries, a number of programs originating in Europe having been received in the United States with good success.

The Nemo program came into the broadcasting field nearly ten years ago as a waif. Today, it is possible to broadcast a program from any place that man can reach, on land or sea or in the air, to every receiving set in the United States. And, equally important, a program originating in the United States can cover the world, even to the South Pole where Admiral Byrd and his men found solace, during the long Antarctic night, in programs from "home."

On the Air with Walt Roesner—

EDITOR'S NOTE: Since their radio debut via the Shell Happytime microphones several weeks ago, Walt Roesner and his Fox Theatre Concert Orchestra have become one of radio's most phenomenal successes. Thousands of listeners have written letters of appreciation of the program, which is conducted by Captain Dobbsie, and broadcast every Monday morning on the Shell Happytime, and numerous have been the requests for information and pictures of the various members of the orchestra.

In answer to these, we herewith print the first of a series of stories and pictures concerning the individual members of Walt Roesner's Fox Theatre Concert Orchestra.

MOST drummers start their professional career at an early age by playing the drums in their school band or maybe the school cadets. Then, if after several years they have improved considerably and still are determined that that is the life for them, they are graduated to playing in a small but honest orchestra composed of four young men who are working their way up in the world by playing private and country dances. After that they advance from band to band until, if they are very, very good, they find themselves in the coveted position of concert or symphony drummer.

Not so with Joe Sinai. He started out by playing in the famed San Francisco Symphony!

When Sinai decided he wanted to be a drummer, he went to the man who was declared to be the leader of this profession in the West. That man was Eddie Nolting of San Francisco. Under Nolting's instruction, Sinai studied religiously, and without ever having made a professional appearance, soon became almost as adept at the art as his famous teacher. Just at that time Nolting died, but his enthusiasm for his protege's ability must have transmitted itself to the director of the San Francisco Symphony, for, upon Nolting's death, Sinai was offered the position formerly occupied by his teacher in that organization.

There he remained for ten years, during which time he gained distinction as one of the nation's outstanding drum players. This was followed by a long turn with Paul Ash's band, where his ability won him even further recognition. He played with Victor Herbert's famous musical organization; spent two years at the Paramount Theater in New York City, and was master of ceremonies and leader of his own orchestra in Oakland, San Jose and Los Angeles theaters.

With the opening of the Fox Theater in San Francisco it was only natural that Walt Roesner should choose him for the all-important post at the drums of that theater's great concert orchestra. And there we find

him today, dividing his time between the theater and the golf links. He mixes golf sticks and drum sticks and says that it is an unbeatable combination of business and pleasure.

* * *

When George E. Wendt, first trumpeter of Roesner's orchestra, was asked what his boyhood ambitions were, he replied that he was enjoying them right now.

"As far back as I can remember," said George, "I have loved music, and I guess my love for the trumpet started when my dad brought me one of those little tin horns for, I think it was, my fifth birthday. That horn was my prized possession and I must have driven my mother and dad almost crazy playing it morning, noon and night."

When George was old enough his father bought him a real trumpet and the young musician began his studies in earnest. At an early age (he's only 21 now) George was playing lead trumpet in many of Oakland's leading theater, hotel and dance bands. Radio also took up much of his time and he was heard frequently over the bay region broadcasters. So he is not a stranger to many of the Happytime audience who now hear him over the Monday morning program conducted by Captain Dobbsie.

Golf and automobiles head the hobbies of this young player. He likes to play the piano, which he does quite frequently, and makes a particular study of musical harmony. He has a naturally musical "sense" and critics predict a particularly bright future for him.

* * *

Forest Ray, second trumpet in the Fox Concert Orchestra, is another local boy, so far as radio and theater audiences are concerned. He has played the Biltmore Hotel in Los Angeles with Ray West and Gus Arnheim; the Los Angeles Ambassador with Art Hickman; the St. Francis Hotel, San Francisco, with Frank Ellis, and several other Pacific Coast hotel bands. Theater

Butchering the Classics

Have been enjoying your Weekly, especially the Open Circuit, for a long time, and it is getting better all the time.

Hope I am with the majority in praising the various stations and their programs. Think they do just the best possible and all show the vast amount of real work it takes to prepare the pleasing programs and have the variety and presented in so finished a manner.

There can be no programs that will please everyone, but they are all sure to please someone, and it is too easy to tune out when one does not please, and therefore what is the use in kicking?

The biggest and decidedly most disagreeable thing today is the butchering of the classics in music. This is done under the guise of "Special Arrangements" by orchestra leaders. It is so easy to garble a good selection of music, is probably why they do it, but they must remember that it takes a REAL artist to interpret and to lead his orchestra to the successful rendition of the productions of the Old Masters. Some of these same Old Masters must turn over in their graves, and it is a wonder copyright owners will permit such ghastly offerings as is heard under the above caption, presented by would be musicians and which is nothing but a discord to a musical ear.

The General Motors Orchestra week before last played Old Man River in dance

rhythm. Think of it! Even old Southern melodies, which have been crooned by the old negro mammies, are played and sung like jazz. The overture to Poet and Peasant, At Dawning, and many, many more too numerous to mention are thus ruined, and some are so garbled as not to be able to follow the melody at all. I should like to have the opinion of such real musicians as Walter Damrosch. I wonder if he, one of the greatest of all music masters as well as our own grand Madame Schumann Heink are appreciated!

There are surely enough of the real jazz which some orchestras can play well, to fill up the programs without using the classics in this discreditable manner and which is so obnoxious to a musical ear, and those who have been *educated, musically*.

Keep each in their class. Jazz will never be a classic and a classic can never be a jazz.

WHEN you hear the firm, true tones of the violin on KHQ programs, you will recognize the unerring touch of Florence Waterhouse. She plays with a sure power seldom heard from the bow of so young an artist.

Being feminine, Miss Waterhouse refuses to tell her age, but in confidence we will tell you that it is not because the years are so many . . . on the contrary. However, she does say that Spokane is the city of her birth, and local history reveals the fact that her grandparents were among the seven families who at one time made up the entire population of the young city.

She studied violin under Leonardo Brill, displaying unusual talent, and she has filled long engagements with the Spokane Symphony Orchestra, with the Davenport Hotel Orchestra, and she has been on the staff of KHQ for nearly five years.

Florence Waterhouse has a most charming personality, and her circle of friends is very large, but she is most often seen in company with her Mother, with whom she has her home. When not bringing pleasure to others with her music, you will most likely find her at home practicing . . . perhaps bits from her favorite composer, Tschaikowsky, or else reading. After graduating from Pasadena High School, where they studied music, and a year or two of intensive musical study, they joined the Chatauqua circuit. At the end of the engagement they found themselves in Chicago, where they spent all of their money buying new clothes and seeing the musical shows. It was the shows that did it. They visited the music publishers and obtained copies of the hit songs, and when they reached their California home again they were all set for an engagement on KFI, as the Clark Sisters, harmony team, specializing in popular songs. They remained on KFI for a year and a half.

Ruth, who plays the piano, is about two years older than Lilah. They were born in obscure little towns in Iowa, but were brought to Pasadena before they were old enough to enjoy the trip. In fact, they weren't old enough to realize just what was happening. Since then, however, they have become very fond of traveling, and have had a great deal of practice at it. An agent heard them on KFI one night and liked their work so well that he booked them on a vaudeville engagement through Canada. After that they played the Publix and Keith circuits from coast to coast, including a three months' engagement in New York City. During that time they were heard regularly over WHN, in New York. A FEW years ago KFRC's harmony team, the Clark Sisters, Ruth and Lilah, were offering the public Hungarian Rhapsodies and arias from Rigoletto in obscure little tank towns touched by one of the leading Chatauqua circuits. Now they may be heard in the same tank towns, and in the big ones, too, and on the farms,

Coast they drove across the country in their own car. That is one of their greatest pleasures, motoring. They like to camp, too, on vacations, and are both fond of swimming. When it comes to indoor sports, Ruth is a very good cook, while Lilah's responsibility ends when she has set the table.

Their work is marked by individuality.

"PEDRO," KFRC's lazy Mexican, just as lovable as he is worthless, learned what processes are present in a Mexican's soul, together with the Mexican dialect, while engaged in selling milk from house to house in a little desert hamlet of California called Barstow.

Eugene Hawes is his real name. His parents had a farm near Barstow and it became Eugene's duty to haul the milk to town and distribute it among the inhabitants, about half of whom were Mexicans. When he grew up he found employment as a switchman for the Santa Fe and Southern Pacific railroads, but this somehow or other failed to satisfy. His ambition was to become a comedian, and he left the old home town for Los Angeles, where he attended dramatic school for a short time.

Employment on the stage was not easy to find, at first, and he returned to railroading for a time. He then came to San Francisco, where he went into the automobile accessory business, managing in the end to go broke. Through his friendship with "Mac," of KFRC, who had also been a switchman, he became interested in broadcasting. The public's response has placed him on a level with the most popular comedians of the air. And he attributes it all to the early training he received while delivering milk to the Barstow Mexicans.

BELIEVE it or not, but "Cuckoo College," that mythical center of learning whose insane doings are chronicled through the NBC network each morning at 7:45 o'clock P. S. T., by Van and Don, the Two Professors, was founded over a luncheon table.

The waitress who used to serve Don McNeill and Van Fleming in a Louisville, Ky., restaurant really should be one of the trustees of dear old Cuckoo, for she it was who abetted its future pedagogues in their foolery. The hilarious radio act they present each morning grew out of Van and Don's inability to be serious, even while eating. From the "gags" they tossed across the

table at each other to make the waitress giggle, developed a comical duo which is unlike any other on the air.

Whether it be in their tense description of a knitting tournament between Cuckoo College and some rival university, or a "drammy" class lesson in which they put on a deep "drammy" to show the students how to act, Van and Don present perfect teamwork. There was the time the Two Pro-

fessors set fire to Cuckoo's school buildings to test the efficiency of their fire drills—and the time they ran against each other for the job of janitor of Cuckoo, because as professors they were unpaid, and as a janitor, one of them could "clean up"—and the big football game in the Nose Bowl at Washalfornia—the boys themselves have to smile when they discuss some of the side-splitting situations in which the Two Professors get entangled. Don started a career which included newspaper work and radio announcing when he was graduated from Marquette University. His first job was radio editor of the Wisconsin News. From there he went to the Milwaukee Journal, and from there to the Louisville Courier Journal, still steeped in the tradition of "Marse" Henry Watterson. He acted as announcer at NBC station WHAS there, where he met and renewed acquaintance with Van Fleming, guitarist and singer of sweet songs, whom he had known in Chicago.

Fleming has been soloist with various leading dance orchestras of the country. He was a member of the NBC artist staff in San Francisco before he went to Chicago, where he was heard with an orchestra conducted by Jean Goldkette.

He was singing at NBC station WHAS, Louisville, when he and Don became partners and inaugurated their Cuckoo College skit over the network of the National Broadcasting Company.

So successful was it that the Quaker Oats Company, which sponsored their program, brought them to San Francisco to broadcast it over the NBC network from here when the company opened a Pacific Coast campaign.

The two of them sat down one afternoon and dashed off the music and the empty-ump verses.

• • • Chuch Mandell, pianist, and the former organist at the Fox Theatre, is now broadcasting over KJBS every Friday afternoon at 4:15.

• • • Morton Gleason, baritone in the "Buccaneers," KFRC male quartet, is a veteran of the "mike" in the bay district. He first went on the air in 1923.

Gleason has lived in California since 1905, graduated from the University of California with a degree in economics, and was a member of the famous Golden Bear Quartet.

In addition to his vocal work he has been in the steel-window business for the past several years, selling Fenestra steel windows. He is vice-president of the Junior Chamber of Commerce of Oakland.

• • • Cookie, the KFWB Sunshine Girl, confesses a hobby. She loves to cook! In addition to being a "blues" crooner, she is a culinary expert, and they do tell that she makes a mean apple pie, while her roast chicken—well, it just melts in the mouth,

• • • KGER's bewitching pianist, Helene Smith, studied music for five long and weary years before getting her diploma at the Wilder School of Music back in Burlington, Vermont . . . famous for its maple sugar, granite slabs and bleak, dreary winters. Then she came West, married Freddie Carter, and has been on radio for seven short, eventful years. Although the young lady studied piano, all this time she

has never taken a vocal lesson . . . claiming that her voice is a "natural" as she warbles vocal refrains for much of her piano harmony.

• • • Allan Watson, staff baritone for the United Broadcasting Company in Los Angeles, has a collection of silver cups and medals, and a press book full of flattering press notices, but the awards of recognition which he appreciates the most are the two gold medals he received at the British Columbia Musical Festival in Vancouver. Competing with entrants from the entire of British Columbia, Mr. Watson was singled out for the highest honors in the contest. These finals were broadcast throughout the Northwest from Vancouver radio stations.

• • • Calmon Luboviski, famous violinist and exclusive radio artist at KNX, Hollywood, was especially honored February 16, when by specific request of Albert Einstein, the world's greatest scientist, he played at a banquet tendered Einstein by the Jewish community of Los Angeles. Prof. Einstein is known as a most capable violinist himself, although he employs his talents merely as relaxation. During his stay in southern California the scientist had often heard Luboviski in his concerts at KNX, and signally honored the artist by his special request.

The popular harmonica player at the San Francisco studios of NBC used to trod the boards, but the microphone demands so much of his time now that it is but seldom that he gets a chance to return to the stage.

• • • Mr. and Mrs. Gibson, Doakes and Doakes of KFRC, in times past played San Francisco vaudeville theaters half a dozen times. They played the old Orpheum, the old Pantages on Market Street, and the new Pantages which is now the Orpheum. They have settled down in San Francisco to raise their two children, Harry, age eight, and Jimmy, age six.



the last word in radio entertainment.









S and W Mellow'd Melodies

By L. SCOTT PERKINS

FOUR years ago Sussman, Wormser & Co. went on the air for the first time, thereby placing themselves on the list of modern-day pioneers. Radio, youngest of the industries, and fast-growing young giant whose ultimate power and influence still is a matter of guesswork, has gone forward many a mile since 1927, but S and W, one of the first of the coast's program sponsors, has kept step.

Looking back over these last four years, radio listeners can recall the outstanding artists to whom they have been introduced through Sussman and Wormser programs—Dobbsie, Charlie Hamp, Charlie Wellman and Cecil and Sally. Each of these stars and the S and W programs on which they appeared or still appear, embody the dominant theme upon which W. Vincent Leahy, advertising manager of the company, has based S and W advertising—public service.

Following this theme, S and W billboards carry not only a message on S and W products, but also a huge clock.

The first radio program sponsored by Sussman, Wormser & Co. bore out the same public service idea, with morning exercises for physical fitness. The second brought a breezy thought on optimism and mental health, and those which have followed have presented consistently high standards in entertainment.

With achievements like this to face, I admit that I felt small when it came my turn to become a guiding member in the S and W radio family, and to produce a program for NBC which would measure up against such an array of talent. It was obvious that only the best would do, so I set out to find it.

It has always been my belief that nearly every one delights in old melodies. Another pet theory of mine is that a string orchestra cannot be outdistanced in a race for public favor. The blending of the two brought about the basic idea behind the S and W Forum of the Air, which later became S and W Mellow'd Melodies, broadcast through the NBC network on Friday evenings.

The orchestra was put under the direction of Joseph Hornik, noted Viennese violinist and conductor, who is a member of the NBC staff. That was the first step; the second was that of finding one of the best singing groups available on the Pacific Coast, which was easy.

In the NBC family of the Pacific Division were Eva Gruninger Atkinson, nationally known contralto and operatic singer; Barbara Blanchard, rated the best lyric so-

prano in this part of California; Ben Klarsen and Myron Niesley, tenors; Harold Dana and Everett Foster, baritones, and Harry Stanton, basso.

Every voice an outstanding solo voice, together they form an ensemble in the S and W Mellow'd Melodies which has aroused the admiration of the man who is best equipped to criticize such a group—Emil Polak's NBC's musical counselor, who coaches them for the S and W program.

Polak, who has helped to form some of the best voices in America, and who has coached Mary Garden, Geraldine Farrar, Maria Jeritza and other famous stars, generally is slow to enthuse. But of the S and W group he says, "Here are six singers whom I would put on at the Metropolitan Opera House, in any opera, without a qualm, at any time.

In the orchestra are such well-known musicians as Walter Ferner, noted 'cellist; Arthur Schwarzman, pianist; Barbara Merkley, harpist, and Caesar Linden, violinist. Equally distinctive are the musical arrangements they offer, which come from Arthur Ward, also a member of the NBC staff in San Francisco. Many NBC listeners still remember his arrangement of Rachmaninoff's "Prelude in C-sharp Minor," "The Lost Chord" and his delightful heart-song medleys. The string arrangements for the violin choir and their voice treatments are from the pen of Charles Runyan, whose touch added new interest to the "Meditation" from "Thais," "Venetian Love Song," "Old Black Joe" and many other well-known airs which have been heard in the S and W Mellow'd Melodies.

And now it is my pleasure to introduce to NBC listeners a new S and W character—Kenya Bill, who will be presented by Harold Dana, master of ceremonies in the program, as "a mellow'd old trader from the far-away Kenya Hills of East Africa." I hope you will come to love this old chap as I do, for—he is my own creation!

Friday evenings, hereafter, at 8:30 o'clock, Pacific standard time, Kenya Bill will invite you to come back into the Africa of some sixty years ago, and listen to his yarns. We promise you romance, adventure, thrills and realism, paying close attention to the educational values for children.

Don't forget to be at the radio Friday evening to meet Kenya Bill, and remember that Mellow'd Melodies will retain their heart songs, with the added zest of romance and adventure.

audiences have heard him in Los Angeles at Loew's State Theater, Paramount, Grauman's Egyptian and Chinese theaters and Warner Brothers'. Radio audiences have heard from him via stations KFWB, KHJ and KNX.

* * *

It seems hardly necessary to introduce the banjoist of Walt Roesner's orchestra to radio fans. He's Sammy Carr, who, before his affiliation with Roesner, was a featured soloist over both the NBC and CBS networks, in addition to a long period of success as soloist at station KHJ, Los Angeles.

Sammy started out on his musical career back in 1914. He was 14 years old at the time and decided that the mandolin was the way to win a girl's heart. He studied religiously under Art Casey in Omaha, but by the time he had mastered the instrument so that he was able to play something that would woo and win the girl of his dreams, he had changed his mind about her and decided that the Goddess of Music was to be the object of his adoration.

In 1918 he began studying the banjo under Earl Ammundsen and within a year was looking for new musical fields to conquer. The violin was the next instrument to catch his fancy, and, accordingly, began a period of instruction on that instrument under Hillweg of Minneapolis. The guitar, ocorino, harmonica and even the musical saw came under his mastery before he was satisfied with his musical education. Carr not only learned to play these instruments, but to play them well enough on the stage to draw a sizeable salary for it.

In 1921 he joined Art Landry's orchestra and remained there for two years. Next came a year at the Warfield Theater in San Francisco under the baton of Walt Roesner. From 1924 to 1927 he was banjoist in George Lipschultz' band, which was followed by a year as featured banjo soloist on the Fanchon and Marco circuit. In New York he appeared with his banjo in Earl Carroll's "Sketch Book" and also did time with Paul Ash's band in that city.

With the opening of the Fox Theater Roesner obtained him as a star member of his organization, where he has remained since.

Carr is a deep student and delights in the studies of anthropology and philosophy. He tempers these with hiking as a hobby.




