

SCIENCE ATTACKS PROBLEM OF FADING

SCIENTIFIC endeavor, private, commercial, and Government, is being massed for an attack upon the outstanding barrier to perfect radio reception—the fading of signals.

Having disposed negatively of all hypotheses that transmitter or receiver was responsible for fading, science is about to invade the upper limits of the atmosphere for a solution of the problem, which is outstandingly important to commercial communications as well as to broadcasting.

The Heaviside-Kennelly layer, which is only a name to the average citizen but has real, though theoretical, existence to the scientist, is blamed for fading. This layer, believed to be a blanket of ionized gaseous atmosphere surrounding the earth at a height which changes constantly, varying from 70 to 200 miles or more, is a "ceiling" against which radio signals are bounced back to the earth, the distance from the transmitter at which they return to earth depending, of course, upon the height of the layer.

While existence of the Heaviside-Kennelly layer is practically unanimously admitted by scientists, there is some controversy as to whether it is single or double, a theory that there are two layers having been given substantiation by recent experiments.

The radio ceiling is believed to be higher

at night than during the day and lower during the summer than in winter, thus accounting for the improvement in reception after dark and the much longer range of receivers during the colder months.

Two types of waves are sent out by transmitters, one known as the ground wave which travels along the earth and the other as the sky wave. Good reception is secured at a distance from the transmitter when the refracted sky wave hits the earth in phase with the ground wave, and fading occurs when variations in the height of the ceiling bring the sky wave back to earth a fraction of a second ahead of or after the ground wave.

In order to secure data regarding the effect of the Heaviside-Kennelly layer upon radio signals, elaborate experiments are to be conducted by Government agencies, which will include an expedition to the Polar regions next year for the purpose of taking measurements, while other agencies also are attacking the problem, the Carnegie Institute of Terrestrial Magnetism, for instance, having established a sending station in Peru which sends signals to Washington and to another station in Australia.

Eventually, scientists are confident, the secret of the radio ceiling will be discovered and when that is done radio will be a long step nearer perfection.

Sacred Music Awakens Spiritual Impulses

I noticed in your issue of October 21-31 letter of Mrs. B. C. J., Marysville, commenting on a previous correspondent's ideas favoring religious programs on the radio. Sacred music awakens in the heart, tuned to its reception, spiritual impulses which re-

vive and maintain within us those nobler characteristics which are of lasting value and which contribute most toward making life worth living. A little jazz or its like may be of use in a certain measure as relaxing entertainment, but it is destitute of constructive food value.

The one whose dial is too limited or who for any reason is unable to tune to that which is most real and of enduring value is truly unfortunate.

Suggests Slogan to Decide Ties

Apropos of your editor's note in Broadcast No. 46.

If all BROADCAST WEEKLIES reach their destination at the same time, it does not change the situation; local conditions, hours of labor, etc., put many at a distinct disadvantage, and in any case you are still giving prizes for a race not a correct identification list. But more than that, you will still have ties in postmarks and there is only one way to settle those and that is by giving duplicate prizes. If this is not done, then a sub-rosa lottery with slips of paper and a hat has got to come into play, and, though it is not allowed, it is fairer than the postmark because every tie has an *equal* chance.

The settlement of ties should be easy; merely add some simple requirement besides identification and, in case of ties, the contestant with the best showing in this wins. This scheme is used every day in contests, and *works*.

You are then in the clear. Everyone is satisfied; you don't have to bother with this extra unless there is a tie.

I would suggest a slogan of not over eight words giving the best points of the BROADCAST WEEKLY. Believe me, you'll get some humdingers, because it is a good, snappy, and useful periodical.

Good Suggestion

In re to your Artists' Identification Contest:

I, too, should like to voice a protest against your announced means of deciding the winner in case of a tie.

There are a number of reasons why it is unfair, but I should like to cite just two.

1. In a contest of this nature there are no doubt many entrants of postal clerks. In a small-town postoffice a clerk can regulate the time stamp to suit himself, or stamp the letter date on an envelope the day before and insert his letter when he gets ready.

2. In the large cities one can drop a letter any time of night and it will be postmarked in a few minutes. In the small town you

drop one after six o'clock in the evening and it will be postmarked about nine the next day when they get ready to work on it.

I believe that you stated somewhere that you were open to suggestions for any better method.

Why not? Since this is an artists' identification contest, publish the fact that you are changing your means of picking the winner and that each tying contestant will be sent a piece of paper containing the faces of another ten artists. Make those plenty tough show only a small portion of face. In event this does not eliminate the tie, send out a ten still tougher to those not yet eliminated.

I have seen the above method used as a tie breaker in various contests and it has never failed to be held as absolutely fair to all contestants.

SILHOUETTES

“YOUR singing devas-
tates me!” “Your
voice is entrancing—”

Thus runs the comment of Russ Columbo enthusiasts. Hundreds of letters to the latest NBC “find” chant the praises of this Pacific Coast sensation now heard over an NBC coast to coast network from New York.

Columbo has captivated the broadcasting world with a style unique in singing method. He’s not a crooner, a blues singer nor a “straight” baritone. Instead he has a technique all his own, a sly delivery of tone that weaves its way through a song hard to describe. And, the men like his style! Many of the letters that are pouring in upon this Valentino of song are from men—he-men, mind you! One writes:

“I am also from the coast—Los Angeles is my home. I left there six years ago to join the Foreign Legion. Five years of that was enough. I listen to you every night.”

Of course the women listen, too. Hundreds of them write Columbo for his photo, and many request him to sing favorite ballads. Yet, through all the furor of fan mail and sudden popularity, Columbo modestly maintains that his singing isn’t anything unusual.

“You see, I’ve been singing for quite a while now. Also I studied voice, and I’ve a musical background. Therefore, whatever I have done has come naturally. Of course I’m glad the public likes my singing, and I’m especially pleased

that the radio has given me my big chance.”

Yet, behind Columbo’s sensational rise to radio popularity is a story of hard work and disappointment. He was born in San Francisco in 1908. He attended Everett Grammar School here, and led a normal boy’s life. When he was sixteen his parents moved to Los

Angeles. He attended Belmont High School there and studied the violin with Calmon Luboviski. Italian blood in his veins caused him to love the instrument. Russ had been playing the violin since he was seven. He got his first job with an orchestra while he was studying with Luboviski, and the money he earned as an obscure violinist in a dance orchestra went for lessons and to help support the family. The young musician’s mother was in bad health and needed care and medicine.

Then Russ began doing vocal work in the orchestra. He had studied a little with Alex. Bevani, Los Angeles opera star. He encouraged the young pupil. He even thought Columbo had operatic talents, and hoped to see him launched on the concert stage. But Columbo, always pressed for immediate necessities, kept on with the orchestra until George Eckhardt Jr. heard him one night and engaged him for the newly-opened Mayfair Hotel. That was in 1927. Later he sang and played at the Roosevelt Hotel and a few months later Gus Arnheim engaged him as soloist at Cocoanut Grove in the Ambassador Hotel.

In the meantime the Hollywood studios heard of his voice and he sang leading rôles in a number of talkies. Some of his successes were in “Woman to Woman,” starring Betty Compson; “Wolf Song,” with Lupe Velez, and “The Texan,” with Gary Cooper.

And, strangely, the movie work was more or less a sideline. Russ had his heart in orchestra work. He even organized his own club, the Club Pyramid, and started making money. All Los Angeles flocked to hear the new coast sensation. Among these were Hollywood stars and persons prominent in the theatrical and entertainment world. One of these was Con Conrad, New York song writer. Conrad was captivated by the liquid tones of the singer’s mellow baritone. He prevailed upon Columbo to quit the club business and come

east. He believed Russ had tremendous radio possibilities. A few weeks ago Conrad arrived with Columbo and introduced the shy youth to NBC executives. They liked his personality, and most of all his appealing voice.

Hitherto unknown in the East, Russ Columbo is now the singing sensation of the hour. Radio is talking about him—excitedly at that, and he's gaining in popularity at every broadcast. And at 23—he's one of the most modest of chaps. Doesn't drink. Likes athletics, football and baseball especially, and is careful about his hours. Sleeps eight hours and vocalizes religiously.

Yes, he's tall, dark and handsome, and unmarried!

A FEW years ago a slim black-moustached chap with a look in his eyes which might have been hunger stood facing a man at a desk.

The standing one was Carol Lofner, and although he wasn't hungry, he wasn't at all certain that he might not be, within a few days, for the hotel-ballroom where he and his orchestra had opened just a short while ago had closed, leaving Carol and his partner, Phil Harris, with a disbanded organization, plenty of debts and nothing to meet them with except hope.

The man at the desk represented that hope, for he was about to open a new ballroom, one which promised to stay open, and Carol was determined to be its orchestral director.

"But this orchestra of yours," his hope was saying, "How about it?"

"It's a knock-out," said Carol fervently. "Say, wait till you hear it."

He continued with a description of the rhythm, balance and smoothness of the wonderful orchestra he had, and described it so enthusiastically that he left the office with a signed contract for the Venice Ballroom in Los Angeles. He had sold his orchestra—so he went out to find it.

The one which he organized in the next fevered

twenty-four hours, searching for musicians who could live up to his sales-talk, was so good that it's still in existence, intact. The Lofner-Harris Hotel St. Francis Dance Orchestra heard nightly over NBC, is the same orchestra almost to a man, as the Venice Ballroom orchestra. The only additions to the group are the Eddie Bush Trio and "Muzzy" Marcelino, singer. The smooth harmony of the Lofner-Harris orchestra's dance music is partially a result of this long experience as a unit, Lofner believes, but another impor-

tant item in the organization's success, he declares, is the fact that there are no instrumental stars in the group.

"An orchestra in which no one player stands out as better than the rest is a better orchestra for dancing and rhythm than one in which there are two or three brilliant musicians," he explains. "In the 24 hours it took to get the Lofner-Harris Orchestra together, we obtained the best musicians we could find—but we purposely left out 'prima donnas' and stars. No instrument outweighs the others in importance in our orchestra, and no one player is better than the others—therefore the result is perfect teamwork."

Lofner was born in Whites-town, Indiana, and is a graduate of the University of Indiana. From conducting his fraternity house orchestra he drifted naturally to dance band work after graduation. He took his own band to Miami, Florida, then toured South Carolina and Georgia with it for two years. He has worked only twice in his life in orchestras or bands he did not direct; once was when he took the famous Don Clark's place as saxophonist in the Lyman Ballroom, Los Angeles.

He and Phil Harris, deep-voiced songster of the Lofner-Harris group, met in Los Angeles and went to Australia together. Carol had a good singing voice himself, but lost it, and taught Phil Harris how to use his unusual bass in orchestra work. Now Carol's voice is beginning to come back, and he hopes to return to vocal work soon.

"I want to sing into the NBC microphone, like Phil Harris does!" he laughs.



This is the largest number of letters the San Francisco audience mail department has received; the record for one month's mail, up to then, was January's, with 43,226 letters.

• • • Wilbur Hall, magazine writer and author of the book, "The Harvest of the Years," a reminiscent volume on the life of California's beloved Luther Burbank, is now a regular member of KPO's staff of dramatists. Hall is the author of such well-known radio serials as "The Self-Made Half Back," "Colonel Kibbe's Round Ups" and "In the Heart of the News," all of which have been broadcast over KPO.

• • • H. C. Connette, NBC continuity writer and author of "Memory Lane" stays away from the studio when that popular serial is being broadcast. "Memory Lane," mirroring his own boyhood, is closer to "Connie's" heart than anything else he writes, and he makes a ritual of listening to it each Tuesday night, just like any other fan. He does not even welcome visitors when "Memory Lane" is on the air; he sits alone before his radio, with Mimi, his cat, as his only companion.

• • • Tania Akounine, violinist with the KTM miniature symphony, has resigned to devote all her time and attention to her operetta "Barbaria," the premiere of which is scheduled in the new Hollywood Civic Theatre from December 14 to January 9. It is a musical romance of old California. Miss Akounine, of Russian parentage, is a native daughter of California. Although just out of her teens, she has studied in Italy several seasons.

• • • Russ Columbo, the "Voice of the Golden West," heard over NBC network, was christened Ruggiero, after a historical warrior of ancient Italy. The English translation of Ruggiero is Roger. In the movies Columbo was known as Roger Russel.

• • • Owing to the increase of work occasioned by KPO becoming the key station of the NBC-KPO network, Thomas Preston and John Moran, both well known in college circles about the bay cities, have been added to KPO's program department in the capacity of "set up boys." On them falls the task of getting the studios in broadcasting order following each program in order to eliminate any possibility of delay.

• • • Phyllida Ashley and Aileen Fealy, who compose the NBC piano duo which is heard in "Piano Pictures," have 120 compositions in their repertoire which they can play from memory—more than twice the number many concert pianists possess. It would take them seven and a half hours to play all the waltzes, concertos, suites, sonatas and nocturnes in this repertoire.

• • • Phil Harris, whose low-pitched vocalizing is a feature of the Lofner-Harris orchestra, heard through the NBC network nightly, confesses himself a "reformed trap drummer."

• • • Gladys Johnson, 'cellist and director of the KTM miniature symphony, was assistant program director of KGW, Portland, Oregon, for three years.

• • • Lucile Kirtley, pretty young blonde soprano of NBC's San Francisco studios, sang in musical comedy as "Lucile Hall" when she was just beginning her career. Her family did not approve of Lucile's ambition, but when she became a radio star, they no longer objected to use of her own name.

• • • If you call "Abigail" out loud in NBC's San Francisco studios, Gail Taylor, soprano-star of the NBC Matinee, will turn around. Gail was christened "Abigail"—the fourth generation of girls in her family to bear that name.

• • • Charles Runyan, NBC organist, is the author of a Rhapsody for saxophone and orchestra—one of the three of four rhapsodies for saxophone in existence.

• • • With the marriage of Wallie Butterworth in Montreal on October 31, only two Chicago NBC announcers are left single. And girls, we are going to tell you who they are—Charlie Lyon and Ted Pearson.



POSSIBILITIES that broadcasters who sell time may find themselves subject not only to the control of the Federal Commission, but also to that of the Interstate Commerce Commission are seen in the filing with the latter of the first complaint to be received regarding charges for time.

The complainant in the case, a purchaser of advertising time, alleges that rates charged by a named broadcasting station and by one of the chains are unreasonable and in violation of the interstate commerce act, and seeks reparations.

It is contended that rates charged are unjust, unreasonable and discriminatory in that all persons are not accorded the same treatment. It is also charged that the chain and the broadcasting station have not filed nor published tariffs, have not submitted properties for valuation and have not submitted annual reports to the commission.

The station in question, it is alleged, refused to furnish facilities to the plaintiff for "messages at night" although others got such service. This is the first attempt to invoke the interstate commerce act in connection with broadcasting. The complaint is predicated upon the accepted assumption that all broadcasting messages are interstate, a view which has been upheld by the courts.

ALTHOUGH broadcasting is more than ten years old, meteorologists have not yet been successful in laying the bugaboo that radio is responsible for excessively wet or equally dry weather.

An almost continuous stream of complaint dribbles into weather bureau offices throughout the world, some charging that radio is causing drouth, others that it is resulting in heavy rains. The most detailed explanation how drouth and rain occur, couched in the simplest language, has failed to convince many that normal weather conditions could not be assured by the elimination of broadcasting.

Denial of these charges by scientists is based upon an exhaustive study of the possibilities of radio's influence upon weather conditions. An investigation has been made, for instance, upon the effect of a powerful transmitter upon adjacent bodies of water,

which showed that the temperature of the water did not very appreciably, if at all, with the activity of the station, nor did its volume increase or decrease. No change has been observable in wind conditions around a transmitting station. Sections of the country affected by drouth have been found to have as much broadcasting activity as other sections simultaneously suffering from excessive precipitation. In no way can any condition of weather be traced to radio.

Although the United States during the past few years has experienced floods and drouths, scientists point out that neither of these conditions is a new development, for flood and drouth have been experienced ever since history began and both flood and famine are referred to in the Bible. Many developments of modern life are known to have an effect upon weather conditions, extensive cutting of forests which reduces rainfall in the deforested area being cited as outstanding, but radio is not considered a factor.




