



## RADIO ADVERTISING TO BE SCRUTINIZED AGAIN

**I**NCREASING criticism of radio advertising has culminated in the adoption by the United States Senate of a resolution calling upon the Federal Radio Commission to make a thorough investigation of the question with a view to proposing a plan for control or possibly elimination of commercial broadcasting.

The Commission will find that there are but two alternatives to the present situation, namely: for the Federal Government to subsidize the various broadcasting stations, or for the government to actually own, control and operate them. In the first case, where the government subsidizes, or contributes a certain amount of money to each station every year, the owners of the stations will carry on with their programs but will not worry about raising money by the sale of advertising with which to pay expenses. In the second case the government will have to buy the stations it wishes to operate and condemn the rest. There is one advantage in both of the plans—elimination of advertising talks. The disadvantages are that the Federal Government will have to raise money to operate these stations. The only two suggestions that have ever been made for raising this money are: First, to tax the sale of radio receivers, adding to the price thereof; and, second, to levy a radio tax against all who partake of radio programs.

It is generally agreed that the sales tax system will not work. The radio tax against listeners is in use in other countries, but to the American way of thinking it is a sixteenth century idea that somebody neglected to file when waste baskets were invented.

The second disadvantage is that the incentive that now results from each advertiser's desire to make his own program more popular than his competitor's would be missing. All users of radio advertising are literally competitors in a popularity contest. Therefore, if one spends a hundred thousand dollars for talent another will comb the earth for something better and spend two hundred thousand for it. It is a war for popularity, and from it comes our improved programs.

Advertisers are gradually learning the fine arts and subtleties of radio advertising, and eventually we shall see the problem solve itself without benefit of senatorial investigation. We listeners can do our part, not by complaining but by giving credit where credit is due. We buy our groceries from the grocer who treats us best. If we let that principle guide us in what we hear advertised over the air, commercial broadcasting will develop into a "survival of the fittest" proposition, and the fit will be those who learned how to work in their advertising without leaving a bad taste in our mouths.

# SILHOUETTES

ONE of the most meteoric rises on record was that of Gus Arnheim, director of the orchestra which is heard through an NBC coast-to-coast network, in the new Lucky Strike Dance Hour Series.

It is not long ago that Arnheim, an unknown young musician who played the piano in the band which then supplied Coconut Grove with its music, attracted the attention of Sophie Tucker, "the last of the red-hot mamas." Sophie recognized an unusual quality in the young pianist, and offered him a job in her own vaudeville organization. She took him on a tour of the "big time," and when they returned she helped him to organize the orchestra with which he returned to Coconut Grove—this time as musical director. It was at this period that Arnheim wrote "Sweet Sue," his first song, which has been followed by numerous successes including "At Your Command," "Chances Are," "It Must Be True," "I Surrender Dear," and "Was It Wrong."

When music had its advent on the screen, Arnheim was quickly drafted into service. First he was a staff orchestra director for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, then he became music supervisor at the RKO studios, where he was featured in such bits as "Street Girl," and he and his orchestra were engaged by United Artists for Harry Richman's "Puttin' on the Ritz."

During this picture work,

Arnheim and his orchestra continued to play at the Coconut Grove, but eventually they left for a vaudeville tour of the RKO theatres, ending at the Palace in New York. Following that they sailed to London, where they filled a two weeks' engagement at the exclusive Savoy Theatre; then came a six weeks' engagement at the famous Les Ambassadeurs in

Paris, a second run at the Savoy (three months) and one at the Royal Hotel in Brussels.

Upon Arnheim's return to Hollywood he and his orchestra were immediately engaged for the Montmartre Cafe, then in the heyday of its popularity. Next they went to the Grove, where they have served an eighteen months' engagement, with a nightly broadcast over the NBC network. During these last

months Arnheim has had several screen contracts; his music shortly will be heard in M-G-M's "Flying High" with Bert Lahr; "The Cuban" starring Laurence Tibbett, and a series of shorts.

Arnheim is the originator of his own type of melody arrangement, and it was he who first was successful in abolishing floor shows in cafe ballrooms by combining the entertainment with the orchestra.

HELEN BOARD, one of the newest additions to the list of Columbia's staff sopranos, looks back with fond memories on her Louisville childhood, except for the daily intervals when she was led rebelliously to a piano to practice. It was the same way later with singing lessons. Helen has never been one of those young women bothered with the desire to sacrifice everything to achieve an ambition. She merely enjoys singing as a means of earning a livelihood.

She detests child prodigies, and says she would far rather have climbed fences with the neighborhood gang than have thumped a monotonous—g-b-d-f on the family piano.

Helen was schooled first in Louisville, then at a boarding school in Russellville. After the diploma-and-roses episode she studied at a conservatory in Louisville for five years, during which time her soprano voice was trained. She emerged from the conserva-

tory to accept a job as instructor in a Louisville school.

After three years of teaching local youngsters, she was overcome with a desire to visit New York. She packed her bags forthwith, and with more curiosity than determination, entrained for the metropolis.

At a party she was requested to sing, assented, and was approached by someone who knew someone who knew someone who could probably arrange a radio audition. The audition was such a success that in less time than it takes to say Popocatepetl she had penned her name to a contract. You will probably hear a lot of her on Columbia programs.

She has dark, expressive eyes, and high coloring. Her Kentucky drawl is noticeable in a roomful of Yankees. She likes baritones, bright hues in dress, automobiles, and hates rice pudding. The mike does not frighten her, nor does the dead silence of the studios hold any special terror.

Helen has a subdued complex about success—and glamor—as far as she is concerned, she does not find herself the least bit remarkable, and is extremely reticent about discussing her life, which may upset a few ideas you may have held regarding sopranos.

**V**ERSATILITY is a quality highly prized by radio stations. KFRC is proud of quite a number of staff artists who qualify in most anything from singing a solo to doing an imitation of a female owl calling to its mate. One of these is Albert

V. Pearce. The V stands for versatility.

Happy Go Lucky's director doesn't stop at being a genial and witty master of ceremonies. He is also a tenor soloist with a wide following and an expert guitar plunker.

Nor does he stop with being an MC, a tenor, and a guitarist. He is also a Jamboree comedian, filling the rôles of Elmer and Cicero Sprayspreader and a unit in

the H. G. L. quintet and the Al and Cal harmony team.

But he doesn't stop there. He imitates birds and animals. The seagull is his favorite bird, the monkey his favorite animal. He also does some writing—the Cutters and Skinners at Bridge and other acts being brain children of his.

And still he doesn't stop. (Is there no limit to this man's powers?) His organizing and directing ability has been responsible for the collection of thousands and thousands of toys and gifts from Happy Go Lucky fans for distribution among crippled children on the Pacific Coast. He has a humanitarian as well as an artistic side. He enjoys helping others less fortunate than himself.

But we're not through yet. Here's something else to add to the list of Al's qualifications. It's a secret. HE PLAYS THE UKULELE. Now don't tell anyone we told you.

To keep producing in all these different ways keeps Mr. Albert V. Pearce very busy. No night life for him. When he isn't working late at the studios, and for weeks before Christmas he and his wife worked many a night until 3 and 4 o'clock in the morning, he is at home in his modest apartment on Buena Vista Terrace in San Francisco. On occasional weekends he likes to break away for a hunting or fishing trip. He is very fond of both.

His charming and very pretty wife who makes his home for him is a San Francisco girl, the former Audrey Carter. They have been happily married for about two years.

# ... RADIO NEWS ...

EVERY important event of the III Winter Olympic Games to be held for the first time in the United States at Lake Placid, N. Y., from February 4 through February 13, will be reported through NBC microphones.

From the official ceremony formally opening the games, which will take place in the Olympic Stadium, until the closing ceremonies on Saturday afternoon, February 13, NBC announcers, engineers, and field equipment will be present.

George Hicks, Edward Thorgersen, and Ben Grauer are the announcers assigned to the Olympic Games.

Perhaps the most impressive scene will be the opening ceremonies, which begin at 7 a. m., P. S. T., Thursday, February 4, in the Olympic Stadium. At this time all the athletes participating will stand in the center of the stadium and take the oath promising to contend with sincerity and fairness in the games.

This ceremony, said to be traditional since the earliest of the Olympic Games, will be heard over an NBC-KGO network in the West.

Résumés of events will be given Thursday, February 11, and Saturday, February 6 and 13, from 1:45 to 2 p. m., P. S. T., over an NBC-KGO network.

On Monday, February 8, the scene will shift from Lake Placid proper to nine miles from the town, where the III Olympic Winter Games Committee has constructed, with the aid of the town and New York state, the only official and regulation Olympic bob-run on the North American continent. It was hewn out of Mt. Van Hoevenberg and extends for one and a half miles down the mountain side.

The bob-run was designed by Stanislaus Zentztyztki of Berlin, engineer of the famous Schreiberhau run in Germany and other well-known European slides. The run was started August 4, 1930, and represents an investment of \$200,000. It is approximately a mile and a half long and maintains a drop of about ten degrees with a minimum grade of eight and a half degrees and a maximum of fifteen degrees.

Heat two of the two-man bob sled races will be reported by Hicks and Thorgersen over an NBC-KGO network from 6:45 to 7:30 a. m., P. S. T.

The races will be described by Thorgersen at the start, Hicks at the finish, and through seven reporting stations established by the Olympic Committee at the most dangerous curves along the run. This will be accomplished by an intricate system of headphones connecting the announcers at the top and bottom of the course, as well as the seven reporting stations.

Only one sled goes down the run at a time, and it is not until the seven stations notify the course officials that all is clear that another sled starts.

On Tuesday heat four of the two-man sled races will be described at the same hour and on the same network as on February 8. The four heats of the four-man bob sleds will be broadcast on Thursday and Friday mornings. The descriptions will be heard over an NBC-KGO network from 7 to 7:30 a. m., P. S. T., on Thursday, and from 6:45 to 7:30 a. m. on Friday.

Thursday afternoon, February 11, spectators attending the III Olympic Winter Games at Lake Placid will move from the bobsled run at Mt. Van Hoevenberg to Olympic Ski Hill for the first ski competitions.

Olympic Ski Hill, at the Intervales, is said to be one of the most perfectly designed in the world for jumping between forty and sixty meters (135 to 200 feet). The jump is 975 feet long and its tower rises to 290 feet above the valley floor.

Chats with competing skiers before they start their jumps, reports of their leaps into the air, and their landings will be related in detail by announcers located in three advantageous positions over an NBC-WJZ network, beginning at 11:15 a. m., P. S. T. George Hicks, Ed Thorgersen, and Ben Grauer will be inter-connected by headphones so they can carry on a running description of this colorful event. Stations of the NBC-KGO network will release the broadcast.

The final hockey game to determine the Olympic Championship will be broadcast by NBC from the Olympic Stadium Saturday, February 13, from approximately 6:45 to 7:30 a. m., P. S. T., over an NBC-KGO network.

Microphone positions will be established in the NBC booth at the center of the stands and a second position will be made available

on the ice level at the south side of the judges' stand. In addition to the staff announcers, Jack Filman, well-known Madison Square Garden hockey announcer, will be at the microphone for the description.

The closing ceremony of the III Olympic Winter Games will take place in the Olympic Stadium Saturday afternoon, February 13. Distribution of prizes and diplomas will be made, and the winners of events throughout the games will be honored. The spectacle will be described over an NBC-KGO network from 12:45 p.m., P.S.T., until the close.

**J**UDICIAL determination whether the radio facilities in the largest zones shall be limited to those which can be accommodated in the smallest zones as, it is alleged, is contemplated by the Federal Radio Commission's order of allocation, is sought by broadcasters in California and North Carolina, whose applications for increases in power have been denied.

A decision of the District of Columbia court affirming the commission's action has been appealed with a view to securing a final decision, on which it is claimed, future broadcasting expansion in many States depends.

It is contended in the broadcasters' petition for review that the commission's order restricts the facilities of the third, fourth, and fifth zones to those which can be accommodated in the other and much smaller zones, and by so doing, it is claimed, benefits neither the stations nor the public in the small zones while depriving the larger zones of facilities which they could well use.

In preparing its allocation chart on the basis of which facilities are divided among the several zones and States, it is claimed, the commission could not exactly limit the facilities of the large zones to those existing in the small ones because to do so would show the large zones so far over quota as to make equalization impossible. Accordingly, the limits fixed make the small zones "under quota" although, it is asserted, they are "already congested far beyond the dictates of sound engineering."

"The effect of the general order," the petition recites, "is to encourage increases in these two zones, where there is no room for increases, with the result of further increase in the already excessive interference; on the other hand, the order operates to prevent increases in the large zones where no interference will result."

In dealing with questions of allocation, the petitioners urge that the court construe the Davis "equitable distribution" amendment with regard to the public convenience, interest and necessity of the radio service of the entire country and charge that the radio commission did not so interpret it with the result that as construed by the commission it is unconstitutional.

**A**DOPATION by television interests of a single standard for scanning discs as a means of advancing the progress of the art is urged by C. Francis Jenkins, internationally known motion picture and television inventor.

Unless some agreement is reached as to the number of lines per picture, he declares, television development will be sadly hampered by the necessity for receiving set owners to have several different discs if they are to receive the pictures broadcast by different stations.

At present, Mr. Jenkins pointed out, there are only a relatively few radiovision broadcasters, and each follows his own inclination as to the elements which go to make up the treatment of his picture frame—the scanned area. Some use as low as 24 lines per frame, some as high as 100 lines, but most television broadcasting now is being done on the basis of 60 lines per frame, 60 picture elements per line and 20 frames per second.

The time for determining a specific standard for television pictures is while there are comparatively few transmitters and receivers, he asserts. By making such an agreement now, large sums of money will be saved the industry and public, since later standardization must involve the scrapping of much valuable equipment.

"It is quite obvious," he declared, in writing on the need for standardization in the official organ of the United States Bureau of Standards, "that if television reception is to be enjoyed by everyone from all radiovision stations, then all stations must adopt a standard of analysis of the object or scene broadcast. Otherwise each household would have to buy a receiver for each broadcast station, or limit its reception to the offerings of a single station."

"The sooner such standardization is accepted and practiced by all interests involved the sooner a large and enthusiastic audience will be nightly receiving television entertainment."

Glee Club and during his college days played piano in various campus dance orchestras, and he has also taken a fling at vaudeville. He is the son of Harry E. De Lasaux, former well-known writer, who, until his passing last September, was on the staff of the National Broadcasting Company San Francisco studios.

• • • Edwin L. Chillberg, lately with Omaha radio stations, has joined the commercial staff of KTM.

• • • Hail to KELW's left-handed fiddle player. Long has Robert Kauffman, studio boss, lamped his piercing orbits hither and yon in search of something that the other stations don't have. At last he has found him in the person of Joe Landon, left-handed fiddle player and leader of the Rocky

Mountaineers (now augmented and including eight performers).

• • • Armand Girard, NBC basso, has been singing for eighteen years—but he's a mere beginner, compared to his father, who was a well-known vocalist for sixty active years.

A letter accompanying the rug explained the meaning of the different designs.

• • • It's a far cry from the humble rôle of a \$1-a-day piano player in a storefront movie house on New York's lower East Side to leadership of an orchestra which enjoys international popularity. Such has been the career of Irving Aaronson, leader of the Commanders, whose orchestra is heard nightly over WBBM, Chicago, and the Columbia network. Aaronson's Commanders, incidentally, are scheduled to leave Chicago soon for an engagement at the Club Forest in New Orleans.

• • • Imelda Montagne, petite, dark-eyed member of the NBC Coquettes, started her professional career by playing "Little Red Riding Hood" in a musical comedy and enacted leading roles in stock productions of the coast before she became a radio singer. She sings contralto parts in the Coquettes Trio.

• • • Ann Chase, NBC actress, and graduate of the Carnegie Institute of Technology's Drama School, was chosen as the most beautiful girl in college.

• • • Here's the low-down on Cecil Wright's recent marriage. He was married to Dorothy Smith of San Francisco on the 28th of last November at Grass Valley. The couple now reside in Baltimore Park, Marin County.

• • • When Henry Grossman and George Sears, Columbia engineers, met for the first time recently, they remembered that they had communicated with each other often in their old amateur days. Sears produced a card which he had received in Buffalo from Grossman in 1920, when the latter was operating an amateur station in Cleveland.

• • • Al Pearce of KFRC has a personal library of old popular songs that perhaps rivals any in the country. It is in this collection the Happy Go Lucky artists dig for the old-timers for Chestnut Day on Happy Go Lucky.

• • • A program that is drawing the interest of the fans is the Family Album on KROW every Friday evening. This program is composed of a group of well known people such as Mae Frances O'Keefe (readings); Mary Bern, pianist; Leila Graves Thomas, vocalist; Katherine Maule, astrologist and lecturer who are all artists in their profession and have banded together to present a simple and heartfelt type of entertainment. The Albuneers, a group of trained singers, bring the old and popular ballads in according to the type of sketch presented. Charles W. Thomas at the microphone as master of ceremonies is well liked by all.

• • • Bob and Jimmy (Palmer), the Utah Trail Boys at KTM, have composed nearly a hundred popular songs the past year and their program spot for each broadcast is composed entirely of numbers which are their own creations.

Their theme song, "The Utah Trail," has been one of the "best sellers" for several seasons.

• • • Arthur (Street Singer) Tracy worked so hard on the last day of 1931 that his throat broke down under the strain and he wasn't able to appear for his first scheduled broadcast of the New Year. Five stage shows and guest singing at the opening of the new Cafe de la Paix started the trouble, although up to half an hour before his initial 1932 program he refused to admit that he couldn't go through with it. But his doctor said no, and an orchestra substituted for him. He has recovered fully, however, and will be heard as usual in his solo programs as well as in the Pillsbury Pageant on Friday night.

Some of 'em have done splendid work in the past but in "Ventures to Venus" they're as consciously artificial as the basement bargain plot. Not a redeeming feature in the whole silly commotion.

The monitors or whatever they're called musta been out to lunch the other day when they allowed Hazel Warner to sing an entire song into the wrong mike. I could hear her off in the distance but the orchestra drowned out the words completely. 
