

ILLEGAL TRANSMITTERS TROUBLING GOVERNMENT

OFFICIALS of a half-dozen Government agencies are considerably concerned over the large number of illegal radio stations in operation at points throughout the country which are used for smuggling liquor, aliens and narcotics, and are giving much thought to means of trapping these law-evaders, both for the purpose of enforcing the radio act and for the apprehension of those engaged in smuggling.

The Department of Justice and the radio division of the Department of Commerce are cooperating in the apprehension of unlicensed stations and operators and, in the case of transmitters used for smuggling, are working with the immigration service of the Department of Labor, the prohibition forces of the Department of Justice and the Coast Guard and narcotic squad of the Treasury Department.

Radio is at once both a great aid and an equal handicap to smuggling operations. Until detected, it can be used to direct the landing of contraband, both human and merchandise, and warn of the proximity of land or sea forces of the Government. Once located, however, a radio transmitter becomes a liability, leading the Government often to the center of operations where, unless advance warning is secured, leaders of smuggling rings frequently are apprehended.

Most of the illicit radio operations are carried on in the short-wave bands which are more crowded than any of the others due to the large number of amateurs operating. As an added precaution, however, many of the illegal messages are sent in codes which are frequently changed.

To cope with this situation, there has gradually grown up in the Government a sort of "black chamber" where experts decipher these code messages, easily picked up by inspectors because amateur operations are in straight English. Once a code is deciphered, Government agents frequently take advantage of their knowledge to interfere with smuggling operations, the stations themselves being left unmolested until a big "haul" can be made.

It is, of course, a simple matter for agents of the Department of Commerce to locate a station which may be operating illegally, once its signals are picked up, and in the past year a considerable number were seized, some of the operators subsequently being given prison sentences. As a result of a series of raids, it is believed a number of other stations were abandoned, but there are still a considerable number of unlicensed stations along both coasts and on the Canadian and Mexican borders which the Government plans to "clean up" as rapidly as possible.

• • • Will King, former local stage comedian, is proving equally popular over the air in his "Milt and Morris" episodes. He recently introduced a new character which is played by his wife, Claire Starr, who used to be Will's leading lady in his musical comedy productions. Claire is possessed of an unusual radio personality and her addition to the cast is a great asset. The skits are produced by Harold Horton, who also takes the part of "Milt." "Milt and Morris" is presented over KJBS every Sunday afternoon at 1:15 o'clock.

• • • Newell Chase, now heard regularly on the KFRC productions, the Golden State Blue Monday Jamboree, California Melodies and Synco-Thots, is composer of some of today's most phenomenal song hits. Among his better known tunes is "My Ideal," "If I Were King," and "It's a Great Life if You don't Weaken." His newest is "Music in the Moonlight," now taking the country by storm.

Before coming to KFRC, Chase was under contract with Paramount in Hollywood. He arranged the complete supplementary score to "Vagabond King" and wrote all the score and music for Maurice Chevalier's "Playboy of Paris." Chase is originally from New York, where he gained wide popularity as one of the original members of Roxie's famous gang at the Capitol Theatre there.

Miss Constance is a "real baby," take it from her proud parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter McWicker of San Francisco. The youthful star was sitting in her high chair in her father's cleaning and dyeing establishment when Tom Hutchinson, NBC production manager, entered the shop. Constance vamped him so thoroughly with her chuckles and gurgles that he audibly wished it was possible to get baby effects like that before the microphone.

"But she'd never coo just when you wanted her to do so," he added.

"Try and see," challenged Mrs. McWicker, while Constance obligingly said "Goo," and Hutchinson arranged an audition on the spot. The young lady went on the air that very night in "Raising Junior" and has been portraying Junior ever since.

• • • The latest addition to KHQ's staff of entertainers is Homer MacDonald. You cannot identify Homer by calling him "organist," "pianist," "accordionist." He is all three of these and more. He has gained great popularity in Spokane as organist at the Liberty Theatre, and now is rapidly increasing his number of friends over the air. 
