

RADIO TO "COVER" NATIONAL CONVENTIONS

THE entire United States will be invited to attend both the Democratic and Republican national conventions in Chicago next month, when the most important general election this generation is expected to experience will get under way with the selection of the presidential candidates.

More than 200 broadcasting stations are expected to carry the full proceedings of the two conventions to every corner of the country, and the most important parts of the program are to be sent to Europe, where all eyes will be focused upon the political activities of the United States, on which European economic recovery is felt largely to depend.

Radio facilities this year will be vastly improved over those used in the conventions four years ago. New microphones recently developed will enable engineers to pick up the voices of speakers seated among the various delegations, so that the listening public will be able to hear not only the addresses from the platform, but motions and debate from the floor.

As usual, the Democratic convention is expected to be more colorful than the Republican, the former usually presenting a larger number of candidates for the nomination whose initial strength is approximately even. The big fight will be between former Governor "Al" Smith and present Governor Franklin T. Roosevelt of New York, but there will be a number of "added

starters" to complicate the selection of the standard bearer.

"Economic rehabilitation"—to most of us just "prosperity"—will be the major issue of the campaign. Every other issue injected into the election will be considered from its effect on depression. The causes, trend and cure—politically—of depression will be the theme of both parties.

Because of depression, which will make difficult the financing of elaborate campaigns, radio will play a more important part in the fight for votes than ever before. Both parties are expected to do most of their campaigning over the air, enabling candidates to reach millions of voters at a fraction of the expense which would be incurred through a personal "swing around the circle."

The addresses of the presidential candidates will all be distributed over national networks, while individual states and groups of states will be covered by smaller networks carrying the pleas of more prominently known local workers.

The 1924 presidential campaign saw the first extensive use made of radio as a vote-getting medium, but that campaign lacked the bitterness which marked the election of 1928, when both parties were heavily engaged in broadcasting. But the coming campaign will be even more desperately waged, for public opinion is more evenly divided than it has been for many years, and both parties will be eager to control the administration in office when prosperity returns.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP



• • • Tom Wallace, genial and handsome Chief Night Announcer at KNX, and master of ceremonies of the "Noonday Revels" program swaps ties with Drury Lane, silver-voiced tenor of the KNX staff. Each of the boys claims one up on the other—we hope the best tie wins.

• • • Several important changes in the personnel of the NBC Pacific Division have been announced by Don E. Gilman, Vice-President in charge of the Pacific Division. Howard I. Milholland, who for the past two years has been manager of the program department and for several years prior to that, manager of station KGO, Oakland, will become manager of station KGA, Spokane, on May 15. Thomas Hutchinson, who has been affiliated with the NBC production department for the past four years, becomes program manager of the Pacific Division on May 15, and Lewis S. Frost will assume the duties of production manager in his place. 




