

## ULTRA-SHORT WAVES IMPORTANT

**A**N ENTIRELY new field of radio may be opened up in the extreme high frequencies, where the wave lengths approach those of heat and light, giving rise to what are called "quasi optical" waves.

In this field, from 30,000 kilocycles up, influences not affecting communication on the lower frequencies become important factors. The signals, for instance, are radiated in straight lines and the curvature of the earth and mountain ranges are insurmountable obstacles, while above certain limits even smaller objects in the path of radiation can shut off communication. Below one meter, for instance, it is not possible to communicate between different buildings in a city and with the very short wavelengths can be interrupted by small screens of sheet metal or even cardboard.

Discussing transmission with these waves in a symposium on communication development for the Bureau of Standards, Eduard Karplus, engineer of the General Radio Co., explains that, due to the straight-line radiation, fading never is observed in the quasi optical range, while another important factor in the use of these frequencies is the ability to concentrate radiation with rather simple apparatus, so that signals can be confined to one direction and radiation in every other direction is eliminated. They are also characterized by their action under certain atmospheric conditions, such as fog, thus being peculiarly adaptable to use in seaports and aviation landing fields.

These very short waves, according to Mr. Karplus, will eventually be put to highly important uses, particularly for communication under conditions when a large number of transmitters have to operate simultaneously in a limited area, such as in a seaport or landing field. Because they travel only short distances and are capable of being controlled as to direction, a number of transmitters could operate in the same area on the same frequency without interference.

Much of the data which has been accumulated regarding the extremely short waves so far has been theoretical, due to the difficulty of operating on these frequencies, but scientific development is slowly adding to this store of information. Waves as short as one meter can be produced by regular vacuum tubes, but below one meter regular circuits cannot be used, although with an electron oscillator continuous waves down to a few centimeters can be produced. Below this wavelength there seems to be no way to produce the continuous waves necessary for voice transmission.


The development of these waves will be useful in a number of ways commercially, it is declared, among them for communication between scattered points which, for one reason or another, cannot be connected by wire and where other frequencies are not available for radio communication, and for broadcasting in large cities where the regular broadcasting transmitter cannot be used due to limited number of available frequencies.

# MICROPHONE GOSSIP

• • • Charles Bulotti, KFRC tenor, and Charles Bulotti, Jr., KHJ announcer, are both kept very busy these days answering fan mail from listeners who want to know whether the KFRC tenor is the father of the KHJ announcer. Both deny any relationship.

• • • Sylvia Froos, blues singer of the Richman Brothers program, is an ardent devotee of horseback riding. And, whether or not there is any connection, her birthday misses by one day of falling on the anniversary of Paul Revere's famous midnight ride. Incidentally, Sylvia, who is a stage veteran of ten years' standing, will soon be celebrating her eighteenth birthday.

• • • The "Birthday Parties" conducted regularly over KNX, in Hollywood, by Jack Carter, "The Boy from London," upon a recent occasion presented a rather startling aspect to its following.

A special party was given to fifteen persons having birthdays on that day. The youngest of these celebrants was 72, while the oldest was a mere 97!

• • • Sambo and Mandy (Dixie Memories, KPO) deserted a promising career in vaudeville in favor of the ether lanes. In real life Sambo's name is Sam Moore. Zeigfeld signed Moore and put him in the Follies in 1920 in an act featuring him and his musical saw. At the end of the Zeigfeld engagement he appeared with Ned Wayburn in "Town Gossip." During his stay in New York he appeared in shows with Eddie Cantor, Fannie Brice, W. C. Fields, Will Rogers and others. Later he left Broadway for vaudeville in an act with his wife, Carolyn Moore (Mandy), which featured him playing every conceivable instrument augmented with such popular tools as the saw, hammer, fork and spoon. Mrs. Moore has become popular with her husband through her ability to interpret the old time songs, negro dialect and her character readings.

• • • In the business of covering the earth with radio programs, KLX in Oakland takes a back seat to none. Jack Delaney, whose dance band has been heard

over that station for the past three years, reports the receipt of a letter from Boston, Mass., with program detail and proof that his band has been heard in that city. Other distant points heard from include, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, Cuba, Alaska, and New Zealand.

Jack says: "If KLX is a 'local' station, Mr. Webster made a mistake on the definition in his big book."

• • • For the past ten years the Bem Little Symphony has been connected with the Hotel Whitcomb in San Francisco. The group recently has been engaged by the Palace Hotel and it is from that hostelry that NBC is broadcasting the Sunday night concerts. The Bem Little Symphony is directed by Eugenia Bem, wife of Stanislas Bem and violinist of the group. Bem plays the 'cello. Both have a long list of concert engagements to their credit. Lev Shorr, well known Russian musician, plays the piano. These three musicians have been together ever since the inception of the Little Symphony. This ensemble has spread its fame over the entire country as one of the most perfectly orchestrated small symphonies in America.

• • • Joe Sanders and the Original Nighthawks Orchestra, pioneer radio band, will carry on. Complying with the deathbed request of the late Carlton Coon, who passed away in Chicago recently, Joe Sanders, pianist, vocalist, arranger and director, will keep the famous Nighthawks Orchestra and will continue to play at the College Inn, Chicago, and over the Columbia network. While the death of Carlton Coon is a distinct loss to the orchestral world and a sad blow to the members of the Nighthawks organization, Joe Sanders is well qualified to keep the famous name of the Nighthawks in the foreground as one of the headline attractions of the dance orchestra world.

• • • Esley Stebbins away from the microphone is Arthur Allen, originally of Gowanda, New York, where he played a church organ until the lure of the footlights proved too strong. Early in life he made an

intimate acquaintance with the New England scene as a member of a stock company in Northampton, Mass., which had Calvin Coolidge on its board of directors. Eventually he became known as a leading delineator of New England roles. He is thoroughly at home in his part as Esley Stebbins. It is not a mere matter of practiced voice control; he actually feels himself the kindly New England storekeeper. Gestures and facial expressions unconsciously are fitted to the words, his chuckles are signs of genuine amusement. Away from the studios, Arthur Allen lives the simple life of a country gentleman, with a garden and a house filled with early American glassware. He has three cats, named Swithen, Amelia and David. Week-ends he frequently visits his 84-year-old mother, who is now living in Buffalo, N. Y.

• • • Lea Vergano is the newest member to join the ranks of the KFRC Golden State Blue Monday Jamboreadors. Her family decided she should be a concert pianist and sent her to Europe to study. But she had ambitions for the business world and secretly studied languages. Upon her return to America, and much to the chagrin of her parents, she became an interpreter. Quite by accident, several months ago, she discovered that she had a voice. An audition at KFRC convinced station officials that Miss Vergano had made a mighty important discovery. The new Jamboree star was born in San Francisco twenty-one years ago.

• • • Twenty years ago Ernie Golden, Columbia orchestra leader, and George Marsh constituted the orchestra in a dancing school at Minneapolis—Ernie was the pianist and George played the drums. They were the first musical organization to play a tune in the fox-trot rhythm in the Minnesota metropolis. Now Marsh plays with Golden's band in its weekly broadcasts.

• • • A "Memory Lane" room is planned by H. C. Connette, NBC continuity writer and author of the famous ether serial of that name. His new apartment is furnished in modernistic fashion, but his bedroom when completed will be 1893 in period, furnished altogether with articles popular in the "Memory Lane" time.

"All I need to make it complete is a pair of pillow-shams with 'Good night' on one and 'Good Morning' on the other, embroid-

ered in red cotton novelty braid," explains Connette.

• • • Karen Royce, who is in the Liebes program, Julie and Jim, heard over KJBS, is in real life just such a smart modern girl as the radio character she impersonates. At twenty, Miss Royce can remember experiences that would make a long life seem exciting. She campaigned with Ramsay McDonald through the English provinces in 1929; she has studied painting in Florence; she danced with Ruth St. Denis, and last year was the holder of the woman's fencing championship at the University of California.

• • • In appreciation of Kate Smith's work, the veterans of the Hines Hospital in Illinois have sent her a belt made of cellophane with buckles carrying the American Legion insignia. The belt is inscribed "To Our Songbird of the South." On the reverse side are the names of the soldiers who helped make the belt.

• • • That realistic golf-links scene in "One Man's Family" recently which created so much admiring comment, was produced more simply than NBC listeners might think. A drum-stick, waved sharply before the microphone makes no perceptible sound to the human ear, but over the ether it was an exact replica of the swish of a golf-club. The click of the club against the ball was made by tapping another drum-stick, at just the right minute, against a flat wooden instrument which is part of the trap-drummers' equipment.

• • • Mabel Jackson, soprano heard on the "Today and Yesterday" presentations, declares that her earliest ambition was to play the saxophone. Instead, she took lessons on the piano and pipe-organ. At the age of fourteen she had mastered the latter instrument and became organist in a church. A year later she had fifty pupils herself. It was quite by accident that she was launched on a singer's career. One Sunday, the regular church soloist took ill at the last moment, and Mabel sang from her seat at the organ. From that time on, she devoted herself entirely to vocal rather than instrumental music.

• • • The Russian Male Choir which was heard during a recent Kodak Week-End Hour is composed entirely of opera singers who have appeared in both Russia and the

United States. Ivan Velikanoff, director of the group, was at one time among the leading artists of the Moscow Imperial Opera. After the revolution he turned to radio and was awarded a prize by the Soviet Government for his vocal work.

• • • One of the most unusual feats in radio production was accomplished in connection with Columbia's recent international broadcast of a recital by Florence Easton. In the middle of an orchestral number from abroad the signals began to fade until they were all but indistinguishable. Emery Deutsch's ensemble, standing by in the New York studios, picked up the melody and went on the air. When London's signal strength was restored and was again fed into the network it was found that the two orchestras on either side of the Atlantic had been playing in the same tempo. Listeners, therefore, did not know there had been a break in the program.

• • • Stray cats, dogs, birds and other animals have been picked up from time to time by the tender-hearted young daughter of Eva Gruninger, NBC contralto. The eight-year-old brought home a new kind of pet the other day.

"See what I have," she said, opening a chubby fist. "It's a bumble-bee who got his foot hurt, so I brought him home to make him better."

• • • Many strange gifts have arrived at NBC's San Francisco headquarters, but two pairs of tiny silk socks which appeared there the other day, all wrapped in tissue paper and ribbons, struck a new note. They were addressed to "Mrs. Jim Foster, Care Memory Lane," and with them came a note from an Oakland follower of the famous serial, congratulating "Mrs. Foster" upon the twins whose advent was a feature in a recent episode.

"Inasmuch as you celebrated my birthday by giving all of us Memory Lane listeners a pair of twins, I am sending them their first socks," she wrote.

• • • Countess Olga Albani, the beautiful soprano, and the foster son of Chauncey Olcott were reminiscing the other night about the latter's father and radio. And then Olcott told a tale that never before has been bruited about much. It seems a young Irish-

man approached the elder Olcott several years ago and diffidently asked for a part in one of Olcott's plays. He was tried out, but didn't quite make the grade, and went away downhearted. The young man, it appears was Morton Downey.

• • • Bill Brenton, Columbia announcer, has become air-minded since he took part in tests for the network's recent plane broadcast. He has been taking ground school lessons in parachute jumping against the day when Columbia plans a broadcast from a 'chute.

• • • Leonard Joy was scheduled to be a piano player, but he preferred the cornet and later gave up playing in favor of leading his own orchestra . . . Harry Richman also first took up the piano but found that his singing was appreciated better than his key tinkling.

• • • The customary "O. K. America" or "O. K. Louis Sobol," heard on an NBC network during the Lucky Strike hour, was changed recently when the program came from an airplane flying over New York City. The call became "O. K. Terra Firma."

• • • While Bing Crosby was playing a vaudeville engagement in Boston recently there was held a radio contest for the best imitation of the Columbia baritone. None of the competitors was announced, merely being identified by a number.

Bing himself took part and when the returns came in it was found that he hadn't even placed.

• • • Mrs. Phillips H. Lord, better known as "Lizzie" of NBC's Sunday Night at Seth Parker's program, is one of radio's busiest mothers. Besides directing the care of her two children, she is making stage tours in metropolitan theaters, where the movie, "Way Back Home," is showing. Her husband, portrayer of the Seth Parker roles, starred in the picture with Mrs. Lord.

• • • Miss Georgia Fifield, noted impressario, who directs and produces dramatic skits and playlets heard over KNX, has been with the Hollywood station in that capacity for the past six years. In all this time there have been only two weeks during which she has not been on the air. Swimming and dancing are her favorite diver-

sions. She is the only radio star to be a member of the exclusive "Dominos," a club for stage and screen stars.

• • • During the first four months of the current year the postman has carried a total of 154,757 letters from radio fans to KFRC. The monthly totals were: January, 24,401; February, 32,763; March, 66,960; April, 30,633.

• • • Mona Lowe, pretty blue-eyed contralto who recently joined the San Francisco staff of the National Broadcasting Company, is only twenty-three years old, but she has been singing since she was four. She was just seventeen when she first sang over the radio in Glendale, California, in a sister act with Loyce Whiteman, and she continued to sing on the air while she went to boarding school in Detroit, and when she returned to California to go to college. A blues singer who can attune her voice to the most modern tempo, Mona, away from the microphone is a demure young person who writes interesting verse and collects etchings.

• • • A recent guest in the Columbia studios during Singin' Sam's program was Joe Maghee, an old time trouper, who for many years was Sam's colleague as an endman with A. G. Field's Greater Minstrels. The meeting in the studios was their first since the minstrel show troupe disbanded six years ago. Maghee heard Sam on the air, thought he recognized the voice and came to see if it belonged to his old friend.

• • • C. B. Juneau, KTM production manager, has been with the station since it started seven years ago. He was formerly its operator when it was a 100-watt set—now 1,000 watts.

• • • Every radio producer knows that folks most difficult to persuade to talk into a microphone are also the hardest to get away from it, once they are started. The producer is held responsible if a speaker overlaps on some other program's time, and he generally tugs gently at a recalcitrant speaker's elbow until he pulls him—or her—from the microphone.

John Ribbe, self-spoken, quiet member of the NBC production department in San Francisco, had to take stronger measures one time, when he not only had to pull a feminine talker off the air, but also to put his hand

over her mouth to keep her from shouting some more remarks into it. Much to his surprise, she wasn't a bit angry.

"I guess I forgot all about the time," she said placidly. "I do think you ought to let a person finish what she is saying, though."

• • • Alex Haas' Budapest Gipsy Ensemble, which made its Columbia debut recently, contains only strings, piano and cembalon—an instrument with wire strings, played with padded hammers—giving the music its characteristic Bohemian rhythm.

All of the members of the orchestra are Hungarians and they play an entire program from memory.

• • • In case you sometime want to imitate the sound of footsteps in a cemetery at night, try a handful of bamboo sticks. By manipulating the sticks in various ways, Ed Ludes, sound effects engineer in the National Broadcasting Company's San Francisco studios, obtains the crunch of feet in gravel, the swish of the cemetery grasses and even an occasional bump against a tombstone, in the graveyard scenes in "The Witch of Endor," NBC serial thriller, by Carlton E. Morse.

• • • Wilmer Walter, Columbia actor, is planning to spend the summer on the banks of a Maine lake in a house that he himself built seventeen years ago. Wilmer insists that he inherited his talent for construction and design from his great-great-grandfather, Thomas U. Walter, who was the architect and building supervisor of the dome of the United States Capitol.

• • • In five years of broadcasting, Jessica Dragonette, NBC soprano, has memorized more than 500 songs and the lead roles of seventy-five operettas. Miss Dragonette is one of the few artists who do not use notes while broadcasting.

• • • Brad Browne and Al Llewellyn, Columbia's singing comedians, are kept busy preparing material for their five air performances a week. Their greatest difficulty is in securing comic songs. To solve this problem they employ two writers who turn out on the average of five humorous numbers a week. Incidentally, Brad himself has produced the words and music of some 350 numbers.



# SILHOUETTES

**T**ED BERGMAN, who portrays big, dumb but lovable Joe Palooka in Columbia's new comedy series, has wrestled with life both on and off the stage ever since he played "Shylock" in grammar school and his beard was caught in the stage door. That began a career marked by a strange mixture of the sporting and Shakespearean urge.

Bergman came to radio drama after seeing life in alternate rôles as an athlete and actor, scholar and seafarer, candy merchant and stage manager. He still can't get near a punching bag without "seeing red."

The present 200-pound comic who coins the familiar Palooka expressions, "Good day, pleasant-like" and "G'bye now," grew up in New York. He was born the son of a New York merchant, on August 20, 1907.

Ted's grammar school friends knew him as a squeaky-voiced "Merchant of Venice." His high school classmates remember him either as a muscle-bound "Columbus" or as interscholastic broad-jumping champion. Comrades at Columbia University knew him as a college wrestler, co-author of school plays and a beefy "Hendrik Hudson."

Bergman's adventurous theatrical rôles as a youth were matched by vacation wanderings as a deckhand on transatlantic vessels. There he picked up a knowledge of characteristics which later were to stand him in good stead as a versatile Thespian. He also juggled cases in a

New York cotton goods house for \$10 a week.

Bergman deserted the study of literature and drama for a practical excursion into stock playing. His first job took him to Oklahoma City, where he portrayed "Pierre of the Plains" in a house of melodrama. The adventure lasted three weeks and Ted came home.

Appearances with the Provincetown Players followed.

They included rôles in "Abraham's Bosom," "Him" and a cycle of sea plays by Eugene O'Neill. Bergman later managed and directed productions of the Playwright's Theatre which opened on Fifty-second Street and moved to Greenwich Village where, at one time, Ted managed, directed and played two leads in Upton Sinclair's "Singing Jail Bird." He also toured vaudeville with his cousin, Harry Green, the comedian.

Between theatricals, Ted managed to save his first \$2800 and invested it in a confection which he merchandised to the city's candy stands. Business was excellent until hot weather came, causing the sugar to crystallize in the confections and bankrupting Ted.

Bergman then took to the road in stock companies, touring with "What Price Glory," "Road to Rome" and others. Times became slack and during the lull Ted put his big bulk to work as physical instructor and manager of a Manhattan gym club. There he taught S. L. (Roxy) Rothafel, the theatre man, how to play handball and trounced him twice a week.

Simultaneously, radio drama emerged and Bergman came to the Columbia network in

early detective thrillers. Here he met Fränk Readick, 130-pound actor who today plays the part of Knobby Walsh, diminutive and wise-cracking manager of Joe Palooka. They swapped stories over the luncheon table, became roommates and teamed in many Columbia acts together. Their bachelor partnership ended recently when Ted met Finette Walker, concert soprano, in the CBS television studio, and won her as an April bride.

Bergman's hobby outside the theatre is a summer camp on an island in the middle of a 12-mile lake in the Berkshires.

**G**USTAV SEVERIN, KYA's Captain Argus to you, takes full credit for losing the World War.

Made a prisoner on the not at all "quiet" western front, Severin made a spectacular escape—at the head of fifty-two men—from a French prison camp in Algeria. After five months of adventurous travel he reached America—just before our entry into the war. He found he could not recross the Atlantic to join the German forces, and he has always maintained that this was the real cause of Germany's defeat. The sieurs Hindenburg and Ludendorff were simply helpless without him—the captain says so himself. He concludes that while no one really knows who *started* the war, he is the man who *lost* it.

Gustav Severin has done many things since he took up a new life in America. After a strict and exclusively military education in his own country, he found that a military man is least in demand here. He decided to make a new start and conquer a job for himself. And so the formerly carefree and much gold-braided young officer became in due course of time, a laboratory technician, a price clerk, a nurse, an instructor of French for a United States

Severin is devoting the rest of his time to a story of his adventurous career. He has seen service in China, France, Russia, Turkey, Algeria, Morocco, Venezuela, Suriname, and Devil's Island. He draws his stories of espionage and counter-espionage from this colorful background of experience. Since January, 1930, he has spoken before scores of clubs, schools, lodges, conventions, and he has been praised by men and women alike.

He is not at all a finished speaker and still less a "silver-tongued orator," according to his own criticism. He is an extemporaneous speaker. He never uses a manuscript; he does not even make notes for his talks. He confines himself to subjects with which he is thoroughly conversant—largely to events which he has himself witnessed. He warms up to his subject in a few minutes and then—as he says—"entertains himself." When he speaks before the microphone, he makes tiny balls from rolled-up paper and then plays with them, rolling them here and there on the table and tossing them up into the air. This informal method of delivery is perhaps the secret of his undeniable appeal to his audience. He does not talk to them, he visits and talks with them.

And whether or not he lost the war, Gustav Severin's war-spy story—which are the outgrowth of personal experiences—make a fascinating broadcast.

Student Training Corps (for he speaks French as well as German). He was manager of a film import company, and quite by accident entered the lecture and radio field. That he made good in every job, with no special training for any of them, merely proves to him that "Prussian militarism" would make a man fit for almost anything.





# ... RADIO NEWS ...

**F**UTURE development of the scanning disc method of television may necessitate a tremendous broadening, rather than a narrowing of the channels used for that service, and it is for this reason that the government has been reluctant to make any permanent provision for television frequencies, according to Radio Commissioner Harold A. Lafount.

The commission has been following closely the progress of television and will give consideration to a fixed position in the radio world for it as soon as it is demonstrated to be commercially feasible Mr. Lafount declared. But, he added, "we are not yet convinced that television has emerged from the laboratory and is ready to matriculate into the more severe course of adult entertainment and education."

The best television picture yet produced can show only a comparatively small group of persons at any one time, if the features of the actors are to be kept at all recognizable, the commissioner pointed out.

"These imperfections and limitations of present-day television result from the comparatively small number of what are known as television scanning lines," he explained. "A number of years ago television was being developed on the basis of 48 scanning lines per picture which means that whether the picture was an inch high or was projected to a large screen, the number of lines still remained at only 48. From a projection standpoint it can be readily seen that if the ordinary motion picture screen is divided into 48 horizontal strips, the amount of resulting detail must necessarily be meager.

"The number of lines has been gradually increased from 48 to 60, and we are now told that 120 lines are being used with the possibility of doubling this to 240 lines. Such an increase in line scanning will of course give a considerable increase in the detail of the picture transmitted, but the picture will still be far from approaching the quality of present-day motion pictures."

The normal 60-line picture used by the majority of television experimenters requires a single sideband modulation width of 43,200 cycles, or 86,400 cycles for double sideband transmission. "If the number of lines is increased to 120 a total band width of 414,720 cycles is required for double sideband transmission, while if 240 lines are used with the methods known today, a total band width of 1,650,880 cycles would be required for a single picture, which is almost twice the entire width of the whole present broadcasting band from 550 to 1,500 kilocycles.

The ultra-high frequency bands which have been set aside for television have a total width of 24,800 kilocycles, but would permit only about ten channels if a band approximately 2,000 kilocycles wide is to be used, it was stated.

**C**LAIMS of the Federal Government to ownership of patents on inventions perfected by its employees have been denied for the second time, the United States Circuit Court of Appeals at Philadelphia having affirmed a decision of the District Court of Delaware holding that Percival D. Lowell and Francis W. Dunmore were entitled to the benefits from radio inventions made by them while in the employ of the Bureau of Standards.

Because of the importance of the issue, it is probable that the government will carry the suit to the United States Supreme Court for a final decision. Large numbers of important inventions in many fields of effort would be effected by the case. Numerous patents are taken out for the government each year on inventions perfected by scientists in the War, Navy and Agriculture Departments and other agencies, including the Bureau of Standards.

The patents involved in the suit just decided are declared to have made all-electric radio receivers possible and cover methods of using ordinary house alternating current in radio sets.

Ownership of the patents by the two inventors was upheld by the court on the ground that they had not been specifically assigned to work out the problems involved, even though the inventions may have been developed in government laboratories, principally during the regular hours of employment, with the use of government-owned material and with the assistance of government mechanics and draftsmen. At the time of the invention, the two men were assigned to projects for a visual indicator for radio signals and for an airship and marine torpedo radio control; the subject of radio receiving sets was assigned to a group of which they were not members.

The rights of the Federal Government to inventions made by its employees are no broader than the rights of a private employer, the court held, except that by statute the government is accorded limited licenses under patents issued to its employees in the nature of shoprights to use the apparatus and systems invented by the patentees during their employment.

A SHARP controversy on the question of radio advertising featured the recent annual meeting of the National Advisory Council on Radio in Education at Buffalo, N. Y., when educators and broadcasters clashed as to the best means of improving the advertising portions of sponsored programs.

The attack on advertising was led by Lyman Bryson, director of the California Adult Education Association, who, however, announced that he was not in sympathy with reform groups which contend that the people do not know what they ought to want and should be given what is good for them and whose ultimate aim, he charged, is the total elimination of radio advertising.

On the contrary, he declared, the people know what they want but are not getting it. They are getting, instead, from some stations, "the quack, the slanderer and the swindler." Such programs are not to be found in the offerings of the better class of stations or of the networks, he said, but the fine programs there furnished are marred by high-pressure efforts to stampede the people into purchasing the particular commodity advertised and to eschew the use of

competing articles which, it is intimated, are full of unpleasant and undesirable qualities from which the advertised product is exclusively free.

If such advertisers "believe that they are not challenging a resistance which will some day make itself effective, they are mistaken," Mr. Bryson declared.

"The remedy for all this lies at our hand if we would use it. If only a few thousands of the great audience of 60,000,000 would send in post cards saying simply, 'I don't like your air programs and I won't buy your product,' offensive programs would vanish from our hearing.

"But there is small chance of that happening. We are inert and lazy; we have had our rebellious independence subdued by the forces of salesmanship."

Efforts of the broadcasting industry to improve the quality of advertising were defended by Frank A. Arnold, director of development for the National Broadcasting Company, who asserted that recent investigations have shown the radio audience to be in favor of sponsored programs, objecting only when the advertiser oversteps the bounds of moderation in the use of advertising.

Advertising, he admitted, is one of the greatest problems of the broadcasting station, and it has been the subject of much experimenting in the effort to advertise products in a way which will be productive from the standpoint of sales without being offensive to any member of the radio audience. Broadcasting, he pointed out, is still passing through the formative period which marks all great industries, and like the others, if left to itself, the present—and in some instances unbalanced—advertising program will gradually find its level at a point where public sentiment and sales returns will both be satisfactory.

No form of government control, Mr. Arnold declared, has even been found a satisfactory substitute for public sentiment. The proposed limitation of advertising under the new Canadian plan soon to go into effect, to 5 per cent of the time of the program in which it appears, he asserted, will "simply force the advertiser, in preparing his advertising continuity, to use bullets instead of bird-shot."


