

## CHASSIS

1. Lubricate every moving part by chart
2. Check for loose bolts, rattles, breaks
3. Clean and spray springs

## WHEELS

4. Check front wheel grease\*

6. Check play in steering
7. Lubricate rear wheel bearings

## SHOCK ABSORBERS, BRAKES

8. Check hydraulic shocks for fluid level\*
9. Check brake reservoir for fluid level\*

## BODY HARDWARE

10. Wax door hinges, catches, stops
11. Clean steering wheel
12. Clean grease from gear shift base

## BATTERY

13. Remove corrosion from terminals, grease to protect
