




ETHER GLEANINGS

By J. CLARENCE MYERS

THERE are no "chicken-feed" deals where big broadcasting stations are bought and sold. The NBC, for instance, is bouncing out more than a half-million dollars for KPO, for the past ten years an institution in San Francisco. The exact price is \$600,000.

The big network did not buy the station outright, but is leasing it at the rate of \$100,000 a year for five years and \$50,000 a year for two years after that, when the station becomes the property of the network. And, along with the lease goes the right to build and operate a 50,000 watt transmitter for KPO. Permission to operate on that basis was recently awarded by the Federal Radio Commission. The site for the broadcasting giant has already been chosen and initial work is under way. It will be located on the peninsula, just south of San Francisco.

The cost of the new transmitter alone will cost in the neighborhood of \$250,000 and will take about six months to complete, NBC executives say.

The old owners—Hale Brothers and the Chronicle—have been anxious to unload the burden of KPO from their shoulders for some time, it is whispered about. And why shouldn't they, when the famous "Voice of San Francisco" caused them to mark in their ledgers a loss of \$577,000 since the station has been operating?

Just what will happen when KPO gets its 50 kilowatt completed is but a guess now. But we'll predict that there will be some juggling around of stations on the two Pacific Coast networks of the NBC.

All of the KPO artists who escaped the messenger with the little blue slips here a few weeks back are bunking at the NBC studios now. And the NBC is making good use of the two KPO studios, producing many of its daytime programs from there.

* * *

Rumors are current—and believe us, they are more than rumors—that Anson Weeks and his great band are soon to make a change from the CBS to the NBC network. My dopesters inform me that it will be before August 1, too. And, if true, soon we'll be "dancin' with Anson" via the NBC stations. Anson, it is generally conceded, has one of the best dance bands in the country. At least the sponsors of that ciggie bill thinks so. They've chosen Anson's rhythm masters to appear regularly on their coast to coaster.

To broadcast or not to broadcast the major pigskin tussles from the Western grid-irons this season will be one of the principal debates at the Pacific Coast Football Conference in Pasadena on July 26. It seems that the colleges are divided on the question. Some declare the broadcasts cripple their gate receipts. Others think they build up interest in the sport, thus increasing attendance at the games. Anyhow, they'll decide on the 26th whether or not the coast games will be broadcast. Recently the Eastern Intercollegiate Athletic Association voted to ban all football broadcasts this season.

M. H. Aylesworth, president of the NBC and RKO side-tracked into San Francisco recently and told newspapermen, among other things, that he didn't own a radio set until he became head of the big network; that Television will not become effective for another five years; that the largest response to the Walter Damrosch concerts comes from Iowa; and that the Lindbergh baby broadcasts cost the NBC \$80,000.

The KFRC Happy-Go-Lucky hour, captained by Al Pearce, is prime pickings for those autograph hunters. Daily, at least fifty fans, many of them youngsters, hound the artists on the program for their signatures. And since BROADCAST WEEKLY's new artist book "Stars of the Radio" has been published, many fans are asking the artist to autograph his picture in the book.




