DX fans are often puzzled by the time difference throughout the world, and have difficulty in computing the time at distant points with respect to the local time. Particularly is this true in the short-wave field, where foreign DX reception is not only possible, but a regular occurrence. For instance, when the Pacific network gives us the London rebroadcasts, no doubt many listeners are puzzled to know the hour in London corresponding to Pacific time.

The local time, under the "Pacific" heading, corresponds to the time indicated on the same

horizontal line in any other part of the world. It is seen that 2 a. m. here is 10 a. m. in London, 9:30 p. m. in New Zealand, 8 p. m. in Sydney, 7 p. m. in Japan, etc. If you should hear Manila on short waves at 6 a. m., you will know that it is 10 p. m. there. In order to determine whether it is the same day, or the preceding or following day, follow this rule: Crossing from dark to light area at midnight, indicates the following day. Crossing from light to dark area indicates preceding day.

The Em Cee Goes Through the Filter

JUST as the movie theaters began some months ago to do without masters of ceremonies, so are radio programs of the future going to get along without their allegedly humorous interruptions.

Five program builders who are getting ready to launch shows for the late summer and fall are planning musical shows where the only spoken word outside of the commercial will be something like this over a musical background: "James Melton sings 'Rose of My Heart,'" and then the tenor starts singing.

Program builders, unusually late, are waking up to the realization that some Broadway yokel's attempt to be humorous has done little else than slow up an otherwise rapidly moving program. They want the musical numbers now tied together instead of being slowed down. And like many sponsors of humorous programs who are ducking away from comedians, they have at last discovered that what they may fancy is very funny the great majority of the radio listeners find only boring. And beyond that, the radio audience is very sick of startling statements like "And now Joe Blotts (of whom you as a listener have never heard) sings his own original arrangement of 'Falling Down a Flight of

Stairs for Flora' as only he can sing it—give it, Joe!" Those days, amid belated hosannas from listeners, are almost gone forever.

In the theater there might have been some reason for a master of ceremonies. Scenery had to be changed and curtains dropped and pulled up. But the microphone needs no scene-shifting. In their overeagerness to lift as much that was entertaining from the theater as they could, radio program builders have attempted to lift too much. One of the unnecessary things they pulled from the wings was the em cee. And now he will have to learn to be very funny, to sing or to operate a sound-effects box if he wants to remain in the studio.

Program builders, in stealing thunder from the theater, have in many instances failed to realize that even before radio kicked it in the slats, vaudeville was limping. Some of the things that made it stagger to oblivion also helped to render certain radio programs ineffably dull. Gradually the radio lads will learn. The first thing they have apparently learned is that a mouthful of meaningless words between musical numbers is without value. And for the sake of your tender ears, that is something!

ETHER GLEANINGS

THE acquisition of KQW, pioneer broadcasting station of the world, by the owners of KJBS, San Francisco, formation of the Northern California Broadcasting system and an award by the Federal Radio Commission to KJBS of a permit to increase its power to 500 watts, are the major happenings along the radio rialto since last we talked to you here.

The San Jose station, a radio plum on which the eyes of not a few station owners and aspiring ones have been focused, was purchased by Ralph Brunton, managing director of KJBS, from Fred J. Hart, who has had control of it for the past eight years.

It is known that Don Lee was interested in adding KQW to his California chain. The station, located in the center of the agricultural belt, is conceded to have the largest rural following in this section of the state.

The station changed hands June 1.

The operating company for the stations is known as the Northern California Broadcasting System.

In announcing the purchase of KQW, Ralph Brunton said:

"The two stations—KJBS and KQW—retain their individuality. There will be no change in the policy of either station. KQW will continue to serve the agriculturists of the state with up-to-the-minute crop information, commodity prices, weather forecasts, frost warnings, and other data valuable to the farmer. The Sacramento studios of KQW in the State Capitol building will be maintained as usual, and the San Francisco studios will be moved from the Dollar building to the KJBS headquarters."

It is the plan to frequently tie up both stations in a chain broadcast.

S. A. Melnicoe is directing the San Jose activities of KQW, and Carleton Coveny has been named sales manager of the Northern California Broadcasting System.

KQW, recognized as the oldest station in the world, was established in 1908 in San Jose by Dr. Charles Herrold, inventor. Many nationally known radio personalities got their start on the station, among them being Al and Cal Pearce.

Right on the heels of the purchase of KQW by Brunton, came word from Washington that KJBS, at present a 100-watter, had been granted permission to up its power five times. That means a new transmitter which will be added to the station within the next two or three months.

A unique taste of Orientalism will be afforded the nation's tuner-inners on June 15, coming direct from San Francisco's world-famed Chinatown. The CBS has arranged a coast to coast broadcast which will originate in the Chinese Telephone Exchange, right in the heart of the Oriental quarter. This novel broadcast, which will be a half-hour in duration, will originate through KFRC here. Loo Kern, manager of the Exchange, will be interviewed during a part of the broadcast. Lyle M. Brown, manager of the phone company, will introduce the Chinese manager. The scheduled time is 6:45 to 7 p. m.

Word comes from far off Little America, where the intrepid Admiral Byrd has established a scientific base, that during a recent extra-cold period all the scientific instruments were frozen except the radio tubes. Mary Wood, petite singer of NBC, was signed up by Gus Arnheim and recently started with the band in their new engagement at the Cocoanut Grove in the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles.

Stephen Merrill, tenor, who won second place in the national Atwater Kent auditions in 1930, which brought him a \$3,000 prize, is now singing over KYA.

Gill and Doemling, who made quite a name as joint m. c.'s in the ether realm, have come to the forked road on radio lane and each taken his separate way. Frank Gill has gone to KMTR to become production manager, and Doemling remains at KHJ.

If your likes in radio lean toward stark, stirring, stimulating mystery drama, you'll probably find that "The Black Ghost" will

fill that desire. The new spine chiller from the pen of John Eugene Hasty is radioed from KPO each Sunday night from 8 to 8:15 o'clock for the distributors of Crazy Water Crystals. The principals are Helen Musselman, Barton Yarborough, Bert Horton, and George Rand.

The Paramount Studios in Hollywood have more big radio personalities under contract for picture work than any other talkie outfit. At present they have under their banner Joe Penner, Burns and Allen, Bing Crosby, Joe Morrison, Lanny Ross and Jessica Drag-onette.

A new KHJ set-up brings the title of vocal director to Mahlon Herrick, formerly program director. That station has recently formed a program committee, consisting of eight executives, who meet daily to hash over the stuff that is going out on the air.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP



• • • Joe Pine, saxophone and clarinet soloist of KOMO-KJR, began his successful musical career when he was a boy of eight. As Joe says, his daughter has shown musical talent for the last nine years. She is now ten. Mr. Pine joined the United States Marine Band when he was 17 and had the opportunity of studying saxophone with Rudy Wiedoft, noted saxophonist. At 19 Mr. Pine was appointed sergeant and at 20 he became assistant bandmaster. Since his discharge in 1921, Mr. Pine has been a member of Ben Black's band, California Theater, San Francisco; Metropolitan Theater orchestra, Los Angeles, and Hermie King's band in Seattle. In the last seven years he has been exclusively a KOMO-KJR artist and has won the deserving title as "the Northwest's outstanding saxophone soloist."

The response from the radio audience has been more than gratifying, so much so that Director Stanley Dillon has just left on an extended trip to the middle west and eastern radio stations to make arrangements for the presentation of the serial by electrical transcriptions.

• • • Lee Baron, well known San Francisco organist, replaced Elbert La Chelle at the console of KTAB's Welte during the latter's absence of two weeks. La Chelle left May 29 for a two week vacation to be spent among the big timbers of Oregon.

• • • Linda Lee, lookable torch singer of the KHJ staff, has received a letter from Sharon Smith of Ramseur, North Carolina, announcing the organization of the Linda Lee Fan Club, with a charter membership of ten. It seems that the "California Melodies" program a week ago Sunday, Miss Smith called up some of the more ardent Linda Lee fans in her community and proceeded to perfect an organization. Now the club is

planning to issue a club paper, have special stationery printed and embark on a studied campaign to boost Linda Lee.

• • • One of the most widely known fictional characters on the air today is Mary Lou. And this popularity has come about, in considerable measure, through Rosaline Greene who has talked the rôle of Mary Lou, script-sweetheart of Lanny Ross, since Captain Henry's Show Boat went on the air a year and one half ago. Muriel Wilson is the singing Mary Lou.

• • • A year ago last May, Kay Kyser and his boys were strung along the transcontinental route from New York to San Francisco, in twelve automobiles. The longest and fastest mileage in one day for one car was from Pittsburgh, Pa., to North Platte, Neb.—1,250 miles in 29 hours, with stops only for gas and food. Fellow artists commented on the devotion of brother and sister, but wondered why Nanette didn't give some of the other boys a break now and then.

Today they know, because Nanette and her "brother," Harry Sarkin, have finally 'fessed up. They are Mr. and Mrs. Harry Sarkin, and were married in Los Angeles last October, just before Nanette came to NBC. Her booking agent advised her to keep her marriage secret, but the strain of

"What a relief it is to have it over," smiled Sarkin, who is in a financing business, and studying acoustical engineering on the side. "When other fellows were asking Nanette to go dancing and places with them I used to have to act as if it was none of my business."

Nilsson and Viola Dana, screen actresses, will make their radio transcription debut sometime in June when they do a series of fifteen minute programs at Radio Release's sound studios in Hollywood. Georgia Fifield, who does drama work on four NBC programs originating in Hollywood, will direct. Harry James, former manager of KELW and KDB, will announce. Robert F. Hill, who did the screen adaptation for Tarzan and other talkie serials, will do the writing. It will be entitled "The Boulevard of Make Believe," with scenes laid on mythical studio lots, depicting the trials and tribulations of a young extra girl who aspires to stardom.

• • • KFRC's maestro of the organ console, Dick Aurandt, is back on the job now that he has recuperated from a recent appendectomy at French Hospital. While tucked between the sheets at night at the hospital, Aurandt spent most of his waking hours in finger setting-up exercises to keep the digits nimble.

Rush rushes to Los Angeles from San Francisco every week-end to serve as the "Observer" on The Shell Show. Packing and unpacking grips bothered him. Now he has solved the problem by getting the newest type of bag with zippers all the way 'round so they can be thrown wide open, and closed in a jiffy, and he is happy.

• • • During a Manhattan Merry-Go-Round broadcast over NBC recently Frank Luther sang all his numbers to Zora Layman. Besides being a radio star, Miss Layman is Mrs. Luther, and it was her birthday.

• • • Cal Jackson, pianist member of the KYA concert orchestra, studied the piano at the age of seven, and a year later practiced on the trumpet. At the tender age of eleven, Cal toured professionally with a young talented band throughout the country playing both instruments.

• • • Emily Rayburn Kneiss, who is pleasing so many women with her 9:15 Thursday morning book reviews on KFRC, was born in good ole Kentucky, but was graduated in 1922 from the University of California where her primary interests were history, English and dramatics. Her favorite hobbies are horseback riding, and like the postman who goes for a walk on his day off, Mrs. Kneiss likes nothing better than to curl up on the sofa with a new book.

• • • Charles P. Hughes, producer of First Nighter over NBC, came to radio in the industry's infant days. He sold advertising, announced and built programs.

SILHOUETTES

THOSE brilliant, colorful rhythms which make such an effective background for the pseudo-judicial atmosphere of NBC's Night Court program emanate from the baton of Clyde Doerr, new NBC orchestra leader in San Francisco.

But in spite of that "new" he's no stranger, either to San Francisco or to NBC listeners.

Radio audiences have been listening to his music for the last eight years from Chicago and New York, and before that San Franciscans danced to the teasing croon of his saxophone in local dance bands.

Clyde Charles Doerr is the full name of the latest addition to the Western Division headquarters staff. He was born in Coldwater, Michigan, and began his musical education in Detroit when his father, a well known violinist and organist, gave him his first lessons. With a thorough grounding in these and other instruments he was destined for a concert violinist's career when he came to California. A scholarship at the King Conservatory in San Jose brought him more study, and there he took up the saxophone. He found it so interesting and its field as a legitimate instrument so new that he decided to specialize in it instead of the violin.

It was as a saxophonist that in 1916 he joined the George Gould orchestra at the Techau Tavern, still a familiar landmark in the memories of most San Franciscans. Then Art Hickman enlisted his services for his orchestra and he played at the Hotel

St. Francis with Hickman for two years, then went east with him.

He believes he can lay claim to the honor of having introduced the use of the saxophone as it is played today in modern music, and that he was the first saxophonist to use the baritone saxophone as a solo instrument.

Eastern dancers found his harmonies so appealing that he was kept busy in various bands and orchestras for the next few years. He directed music on the Biltmore Roof and in the Club Royale in New York and played at the Congress Hotel in Chicago for several seasons. In 1924 he and his orchestra played the Orpheum circuit on a transcontinental tour that brought them back to New York, where the National Broadcasting Company signed him, and where he has devoted himself to the microphone since that time.

Doerr led orchestras or was a featured instrumentalist on a number of NBC programs originating in the East in the last few years. A saxophone octet which he organized and with which he produced some beautiful and unusual effects was heard by western audiences on Sunday mornings.


He and Mrs. Doerr came to San Francisco several months ago on a vacation—the first one for which he has found time in years. They journeyed all the way across the continent to celebrate their wedding anniversary in the city where they first met and where they were married just seventeen years ago.

"The ceremony—it was not very formal!" twinkles Doerr's pretty, blonde, French wife. "We met, we decided to marry, and we did so—between a tea dance and the evening performance of Art Hickman's orchestra."

"But it took," grins Doerr. "Hilda is my right-hand man and most ruthless audience. She tells me the truth about my programs and makes the world's prize jelly."

The list of Doerr's own compositions include numerous theme songs for broadcasts, a college song which is the official song of Vermont Academy and a number of waltzes and compositions written especially for the saxophone.

Doerr conducts the orchestra on Music of Today and Yesterday, 5:15 p. m. Sunday, P. S. T., over KPO, and he has his own orchestra program several days a week as well as directing the musical fortunes of Night Court, heard every night except Saturday and Sunday.

VIVIAN JANIS, brown-eyed, vivacious songstress featured over the Columbia Broadcasting System with Leon Belasco's orchestra, was born May 29, 1913, in Omaha, Nebraska. Her father and mother were actors and she was a typical stage child. She trouped all over the midwest and south while her parents played in various stock companies. During these travels, Vivian received her formal education in a dozen cities or more, and also her mother helped to tutor her. She was graduated from high school in 1930.

She started her career as a professional entertainer at the age of five. Vivian sang "It's a Long Way to Tipperary" in a production starring father and mother. Since then she has played "bits" in dozens of plays.

In 1931, after finishing school, Vivian was working in a Chicago night club. Dick Stabile, a member of Ben Bernie's orchestra, heard her sing, was impressed by her voice, and asked for an introduction. Stabile arranged for Bernie to hear Miss Janis sing. Bernie immediately offered her a contract which she accepted. She made her radio debut over Columbia as a guest star on Ben's program from the College Inn in Chicago.

After working several months in Chicago, Vivian went on a vaudeville tour with Bernie. In the fall of 1932 she joined the cast of the Chicago production of "Girl Crazy" and when the play ended she came to New York with Belasco's orchestra.

After singing in New York for a short time she was booked for another vaudeville tour—this time with her own act. Shortly after starting the tour she was offered a place in the "Follies of 1934," which she accepted, and returned to New York. She sings with Belasco at the St. Moritz and is heard several times a week on Columbia's sustaining programs.

Vivian is a small and attractive blonde. She has brown eyes and light, wavy brown hair. She lives with her parents and still spends much of her spare time studying. Recently she completed a course in stenography.

She likes to take long walks, ride and swim. Her hobby is baseball, at which she excelled in school. If only she weren't a girl, Vivian says, she would like to be a professional baseball player. She's an ardent Yankee fan and a great admirer of Babe Ruth. She expects to see as many games this summer as her work will permit.



CBS to Broadcast Close of Congress

The closing session of the Seventy-third Congress, scheduled for some time in June, will be broadcast over the WABC-Columbia network from the Capitol in Washington, D. C., through the facilities of station WJSV. It will be the fourth successive year that CBS broadcast the closing ceremonies.

Advance plans for the program include a multiple microphone system which will be used to bring a complete and colorful picture to the listeners. Pick-up points will include the floor of the House of Representatives, the House Library, which opens into the Chamber, and the District of Columbia committee room adjacent to the United States Senate.

Announcers will invite legislators to express their views on the accomplishments of the session as they approach the congressional halls or walk through the corridors. The entire membership of the House and approximately one-third of the Senate come up for election this autumn.



New Studio Technique Developed

A new type of production technique has been evolved in the MacGregor & Sollie Electrical Transcription Studios by Sigurd Arnold Sollie, chief recording engineer, and John Eugene Hasty, production manager.

In the past, while reading their lines, radio actors have stood in one position before the microphone. Action has always been indicated by the context of their speeches.

Under the system evolved in the MacGregor & Sollie Studios, the studio is set up very similar to a stage. By special arrangement of microphones and draping, the voices may be picked up at any point on the set; thus the actors are able to move about, actually going through the action indicated in the script.

The result is a performance with considerably more realism and a greater degree of perspective than has heretofore been possible.

Another innovation in program production perfected by the MacGregor & Sollie Studios, is "location" recording. For example, when a play calls for a street scene, the microphone is actually placed on the street and the voices recorded there by remote control.

There is not much doubt but what these developments in program production will soon become standard practice.



Radio Showmanship at KJR

An example of very clever showmanship took place over KJR this week in coöperation with the Seattle Chamber of Commerce. A symposium of fifteen rapid-fire speakers representing fifteen different lines of business activity spoke over KJR giving their ideas as to what should be done to add to the interest and pleasure of tourists who will visit Washington this year. The particular purpose of the broadcast was to prepare the way for the influx of tourists who come to Washington by the hundreds of thousands each spring and summer as a part of the educational campaign seeking to acquaint the people of Washington with their state.

Arrangements for this unusual broadcast were made by Frederick Seixas, well known Seattle citizen. The fifteen "know-your-state" speakers who passed before the KJR mike for forty-five minutes were: A representative of the Seattle Police Department, a girl scout, a master barber, a hotel hostess, a street car operator, a mail carrier, a railway information clerk, a telegram messenger, a baker shop girl, an elevator operator, a boy scout, a waitress, a boot black and a bus driver. A widespread comment and response has come from this broadcast.

Pres. Roosevelt's Ex-Double Is Heart Mender

Bill Adams, ex-radio double of President Roosevelt, has found a starring spot for his suave, persuasive voice on those Beatrice Fairfax heart-problem dramas you hear every Saturday on the NBC network.

The actor, whose voice was such a realistic echo of the Chief Executive's that he lost the job by White House request, has taken honors in the rôle of the sympathetic friend who helps the unhappy husbands and wives reunite in those dramas which Miss Fairfax has picked from actual human experiences that have been confided to her.

"I've been chief patcher-up of trouble with my friends and relations for years," said Adams, who is one of radio's leading character actors. "But this is the first time I got paid regularly for that particular rôle.

"Maybe it's because I'm lazy; but I never get mad easily. And, when you aren't mad, it's easier to see both sides of a question—to have a little perspective. I've been trying to show people the unimportance of most quarrels for years. Now I find Miss Fairfax has the same ideas."


