

Crusade for Clean Entertainment

THE American Church Federation's battle for the uplift of motion pictures is under way. This crusade in the cause of decent entertainment should receive the thoughtful and active support of every member of the radio audience and of the entire radio fraternity. Its outcome will undoubtedly have a great influence on the future of radio. If commercial expediency be established as sufficient justification for the wholesale purveying of obscenity and salaciousness, then well may we expect filth to spread crime and degeneracy through the microphone as well as leer at us from the tarnished silver screen.

However great the investment therein or the profit therefrom, any industry which must deal in degradation and debauchery to maintain its existence, should not be permitted to exist—no more than white slavery or the drug traffic. Bankruptcy is not the only alternative to sensuous sex pictures and the glorification of gangsters. The motion picture industry has merely been following a golden fallacy along the path of least resistance.

The fact that some "clean" pictures have failed no more proves the impossibility of entertainment being both moral and profitable than the failure of a hundred grocery stores indicates that the entire grocery business faces ruin. As these words are being written, people of San Francisco are standing in line to procure seats for a motion picture that the Federated Churches could attend en masse without finding cause for the slightest criticism. Attracting daily a greater audience than attends motion picture theatres weekly, Radio has proved conclusively that "clean" entertainment does pay. Although not all programs have been above reproach, the large majority of broadcasts have been entirely wholesome, a great many really uplifting and inspirational; and sporadic at-

tempts to put smut and ribaldry on the ether have been promptly denounced by the audience itself.

Contrarily, certain weekly magazines would seemingly have us believe that entertainment in general, and motion pictures in particular, cannot be purged of crimson without killing box office profit. The public is accused of having perverted tastes, and the Church is held basically culpable for the entire situation, allegedly having misconducted itself so grievously as to alienate its following and neutralize its holy influence.

Every respectable, God-fearing home in America gives the lie to this sacrilegious slander. Mouthing such inanities when the advertiser clinks his coin, is a trick as old but now quite as obvious as the elusive "pea" by means of which light-fingered gentry once mulcted and mystified their credulous audiences. The wonder is not that a publisher of this ilk will blaspheme the Church so readily and so eloquently for an advertising dole or a newsstand increase, but that with his miserable motives so thinly disguised he can find any one who will believe what he prints.

The instinct that leads men to pray in time of disaster is a safer guide than academic reasoning. Argumentative sophistry and random figures, however adroitly expounded, can neither contravert the truth of divine principles nor impede their inexorable working. In any other land, where free speech carried less license, a writer or publisher whose decency alone did not dissuade him from maligning the Church and seeking to discredit its activities, would be suppressed by law.

Against such opposition the battle for "clean" entertainment will be long and hard and require the united effort of an aroused nation. Let every Radio owner enlist now.

ETHER GLEANINGS

CONTRARY to various reports, rumors and whisperings from those supposedly in "the know"—Myrt and Marge—which runs nip and tuck with Amos and Andy as America's foremost script act—will work for Wrigley's another season on the air.

They return on the entire CBS wireup on October 1, to be heard thereafter five nights a week at 8 o'clock.

Rumors had been fitting about since Myrt and Marge started their annual summer vacation, that when they returned to the air this fall it would be for a sponsor other than their gum-manufacturing backer. But the latter, it now is certain, doesn't intend to let the goose that laid the golden egg via radio fly over into someone else's yard. And who can blame him.

Myrt and Marge are mother and daughter in real life and met phenomenal success, with this, their first radio act.

They had been stage troupers all their lives. But that business in the past decade hasn't been any too healthy. Radio seemed to open the door to new opportunity. Myrt wrote a script about stage life, which she knew so well. She took it to Mr. Wrigley, read him the first two acts, (so the story goes) and sold him the idea of going on the air with a quarter hour program every night. That was nearly three years ago. The name of Myrt and Marge soon became of significance in every radio equipped household.

The girls surrounded themselves with a cast of excellent actors and actresses and Myrt succeeded in turning out scripts that were chock full of human drama, thrills and that very necessary dash of comedy.

We note that the Myrt and Marge time will chop fifteen minutes off the coast to coast Blue Monday Jamboree on CBS. Inasmuch as the latter is not sponsored, it probably will be shifted to another hour, the KFRC folk said.

Here's one philosopher we know will be welcomed back to the air theatre with attentive ears. The Voice of Experience—who manages to keep his identity a secret—returns on the CBS hookup from coast to coast and border to border on September 10. He will speak daily thereafter from 8 to 8:15 a. m. Last season the Voice of Experience had a night-time broadcast in addition to his morning affairs on Columbia and it is hoped by many dialers that such arrangements will be made in conjunction with his present morning schedule.

Betty Kelly, former NBC ace here, who won the Campbell Soup district audition at KFRC, is in New York City to participate in the national finals. The girl chosen from

the auditions, which are to be held August 16 and 17, will win the coveted rôle opposite Dick Powell in the new radio presentation of the soup makers, which goes over CBS network. Miss Kelly was chosen from nine contestants at the San Francisco audition.

Two of the NBC's oldest male quartets have been disbanded—the Doric and the Knickerbocker. From the scrap heap the program builders have constructed a new group which consists of Bob Stevens, Myron Neisley, John Teel and Harry Stanton.

After a very successful tour of the East, Tom Gerun and his grand band are back in their old haunt—the snazzly Bal Tabarin—noted San Francisco night spot. The band is heard several times a week on the NBC wire-up over the coast chain.

Another NBC Pacific Coast personality has been handed a nationwide audience Will Aubrey, the Wandering Minstrel, who has been a favorite of many dialers through his work on the Night Court and the Carefree Carnival, will be spotlighted from 4 to 4:30 p. m. on a coast to coast hookup beginning on August 21.

If the suggestions of Ralph Brunton, president of the Northern California Broadcasting System and C. L. McCarthy, manager of KQW, hit a responsive chord with the Monterey peninsula business men, the radio audience will soon be hearing broadcasts direct from that world-famed territory.

At a recent meeting of Monterey Peninsula Breakfast Club at the San Carlos Hotel in Monterey, at which Brunton and McCarthy were guests, the radio men offered the suggestion for the radio hookup. They pointed out how remote control radio pickups at various Monterey peninsula points would make it possible to give the radio audience word picture accounts of the various sports activities of state and national importance that transpire in that section frequently—descriptions of big golf tournaments, polo matches, tennis contests, important society happenings and dance tunes from the famous Del Monte Hotel. The matter is now being considered.

A. A. Schechter, news editor of the National Broadcasting Company, is in Los Angeles with Lloyd Yoder, press chief of the network here on the Coast. Schechter was a visitor in San Francisco last week. The purpose of his trip to Los Angeles is believed to be primarily for the purpose of working out ways and means of getting a more satisfactory news service to the Richfield Reporter. The latter has been more or less

stymied of late because of the restrictions on news-casting. The Press-Radio Bureau which was formed jointly by the four big news-gathering agencies and the national networks, prohibits the use of its news in sponsored broadcasts. That left Richfield out of the picture. Their own local and state coverage, together with a couple of European news services which they bought, hasn't been enough to fill a good snappy fifteen minute news-cast such as we had always been used to getting from Richfield. So what to do? Lately the feature has brought more comment than spot news. Naturally the newspapers would prefer just that type of news broadcast. But Schechter is in the southland for the express purpose of seeing just what can be done about it. And it probably will be all ironed out smoothly before long.

With a race story theme, a suds brewer took off on the KFRC airplanes for the first time August 16 at 8 o'clock with a half hour comedy show. The sponsor is Humboldt Beer. The title of the show—the Humboldt Derby. Most of the stars who parade before the mike during the Jamboree have something to do in this newcomer. For instance you hear Claude Sweeten's orchestra, Helene Hughes, Murray and Harris, the Bluettes, Midge Williams and the Williams Four. Howard Swart is penning the show.

Freeman Lang, Los Angeles transcription maker, takes a bow in telling us how he saved the day and the reputation of the CBS chain in an emergency in those parts just recently. Seems that General Hugh S. Johnson, NRA chief, was flying from the city by the Golden Gate to Los Angeles. He was due at Hollywood Bowl at 4 o'clock to make a speech which was to be broadcast nationwide by CBS and locally by KNX. The plane was late, or something. Johnson radioed from the plane that he would have to speak direct from the airport. So the airport officials sent out an appeal to Lang for some radio equipment pronto. Within fifteen minutes the apparatus had arrived at the field and a few minutes after Johnson's plane swooped down on the field, he was standing before the microphone. And the Freeman Lang studios today are proudly displaying a congratulatory wire from CBS officials expressing their appreciation and gratefulness for "saving the day." Hotcha!

Jimmie Grier and his orchestra, now engaged at the Biltmore Hotel in Los Angeles, have returned to the M. J. B. Demi Tasse Revue. Gus Arnheim's contract with the coffee blenders concluded recently. Grier has been signed to appear for a series of broadcasts. Ruth Etting remains on the thirty-minute show, which is released over

the Pacific Coast and Middle West networks of the NBC, Mondays at 6:30 p. m.

The complaints of his customers at his tardiness caused him to lose his paper route.

When the Gang played in Portland recently Richards looked up his old friend and found her still alive, though past ninety. He played again on the old organ for her—"The Lost Chord" and "He Leadeth Me," at her request. She listens to him every day on the air and takes pride in his success.

• • • It required 260 miles of special lines to relay the voice of Al Carbone's baby from Cambridge, Mass., and 1,232 extra miles of wire to carry the greetings of Joe Pelter's offspring from Pensacola, Fla., to their fathers during the Byrd Expedition broadcast last Wednesday (July 25). The total technical cost of transmitting the voices of the babies to their daddies was in the neighborhood of \$2,000.

• • • Irene Beasley, the "long, tall gal from Dixie," who is featured on the Armour program over an NBC network, finds time between broadcasts to write extensively. In addition to a novel, Irene has completed the first draft of a book of poetry.

• • • Ted Fio-Rito has written 72 song hits, including "No, No, Nora," "Laugh Clown Laugh," "King for a Day," "I Never Knew" and "Now That You're Gone." . . . But his favorite tune is Jerome Kern's—"Smoke Gets in Your Eyes."

• • • What was planned as a short theater tour by the Voice of Experience is tending to get out of bounds with the Voice trying to hold it down. Atlantic City's Steel Pier has secured his presence for the week of July 20 and it begins to look as though the radio counselor will have to do six weeks on the boards instead of only four as he originally planned.



Dark-eyed, dark-haired, with a determined chin and an impish smile, Twiss's character doesn't belie the chin or the smile. Quiet and competent when on the job, he's one of the greatest practical jokers on the announcing staff. His favorite diversion is chess; his favorite sport is football, and he would rather fish than eat.

ETHER ETCHINGS

LET'S turn aside from the well-traveled highway and follow for a half-hour the Romany Trail, opened up for us by the Columbia network on Sunday morning.

This entertaining program leads right into a gypsy camp, where picturesquely clad men, women and children are grouped around a campfire, their voices soft and musical as they speak to each other. We hear gay laughter on the other side of the fire, where a group of children are playing with several small puppies, the watchful mother looking on the while.

As we slip into the circle a pretty young woman comes to meet us, begging to be allowed to tell our fortune, but we laughingly shake our head, being a little afraid that she really could, and might tell us things that we don't want to know!

Presently a man, sitting on a log a little to one side, takes up his violin and as the plaintive notes thrill through the night, we draw near to him and in an eager voice we implore him, "Play to Me Gypsy." Play all the vagabond yearning of my heart that I can't put into words! Play all the allure that beckons from the top of yonder hill, the whisper of leaves overhead, the caress of vagrant breezes drifting by. Put into music the shy beauty of wild flowers growing on sunny hillsides, and along lonely trails; interpret for me the murmur of the stream as it sings a low song in the night; play to me the call of that road which winds away like a ribbon laid down for me to walk upon to the place of my heart's desire. Play all of these, then add all that I cannot, dare not, name. Oh, "Play to Me Gypsy!" And he plays on into the night while the camp grows quiet, and the fire has burned to embers—and we listen, and understand.

A CAMP FIRE burning low, its light reflecting on the sun-tanned faces of a group of men lounging around it, relaxing after a hard day in the saddle. To the accompaniment of stringed instruments they are singing songs of the range, of loneliness and a life that is apart from any other.

Beyond the circle of the firelight is the stillness and peace of the night. The stars twinkle brightly in the dusky blue of the sky; the breeze stirs the dry grass with a little lonesome rustle. Now and then a horse comes near while grazing, his hobbles, compelling him to take short steps, make a clanking sound as he moves. Lying contentedly near by, the herd is bedded down for the night.

The King Cowboy program over KNX will add variety to your radio menu, though it may be like the cowboy ration of beans and bacon. Nevertheless, they do put on a perfect "etching" of the life they represent.

The programs put on by Paul Whiteman are in a class by themselves. Taking something of that which we hear in a variety of programs and moulding them into one that is distinctly individual in character is artistry, indeed.

We hear the orchestra play music having a primitive, barbaric rhythm that stirs our pulses in a way that nothing else does, then with equal mastery they turn to something of higher class, lifting us with them to a higher level.

To put musical comedy on the air so cleverly that our imagination is equal to finished television is real achievement and with the help of clever actors they actually do it. What actress on the air (or anywhere else, for that matter) has a more compelling personality than has Ramona, and it fills the room in which we are listening when she sings in her own vivid manner.

And Al Jolson! Whether or not we like his voice as well as that of many others, we have to hand it to him for finished showmanship. He steps up to the "mike," and with no apology whatever, sweeps us into the spirit of whatever he is singing or acting. We can't help feeling the pull of his assurance. He ceases to be Al Jolson—he is living the part he is playing at the moment, conscious of no other individuality.

With a bit of grand opera sung by stars whose voices are entirely suited to the parts, and a short play to end the hour, we feel that we have had our money's worth had we paid the price such a performance commands when attended in a theatre.

* * *

WE are glad the eclipse is over and that Paul Carson and Alvino Rey are back on the air with Blue Moonlight in its old place in the night skies of Radioland.

It is the first time in all history that two stars were known to make moonlight, but we wager that these radiant ones could even make sunlight if they chose! At any rate, we've never known more exquisitely lovely, or more thrillingly romantic moonlight than that which they broadcast on Saturday night at ten o'clock, Pacific time.
