The Week's Special Events on the Air

FIVE thousand singers, representing choral groups well known throughout the eastern states, will participate in a choir festival to be broadcast, in part, from Princeton, N. J., over National Broadcasting Company networks on Friday and Saturday, June 7 and 8.

The festival is an annual affair held under the auspices of the Westminster Choir School of Princeton. The famed Westminster Choir, heard frequently over NBC networks, will present one concert and will join guest groups in Palmer Stadium at Princeton University in another program. Dr. John Finley Williamson, director of the school, will direct the combined chorus of 5,000 voices.

The opening festival program will feature the Westminster Choir over an NBC-KPO network from 1 to 2 p. m., P. S. T., on Friday, June 7, in Part One of Bach's Mass in B Minor. The choristers will be heard from the Princeton University Chapel.

The Festival chorus of 5,000 voices will be heard over an NBC-KPO network from 2 to 2:30 p. m., P. S. T., on Saturday, June 8. The program will be opened by the Princeton Band. In addition to combined choruses, the congregation will join in the singing of many of the numbers.

Ann Turkel in Radio Debut

Anne Turkel, whose dramatic rise from candy salesgirl in the lobby of the Metropolitan Opera House to solo roles with the Chicago Opera Company has been the source of great encouragement to young American singers, will make her radio debut over an NBC coast-to-coast network on Tuesday, June 4, at 1 p. m., P. S. T. She also will be heard on June 11 and 18 at the same hour.

Miss Turkel is a dramatic soprano, and her repertoire includes roles in German, French, Italian, Spanish and English.

An NBC-KPO network will release the programs for listeners in the West.

"Road to Fame," New CBS Opus

"Everything's Been Done Before" does not apply to the new amateur show over the Columbia Don Lee network at 8:30 to 9 p. m., Monday, for "Road to Fame" lays just claim to being distinctively different.

First of all, every artist appearing will receive monetary reward for his efforts; substantial cash awards will go to the first three—consolation prizes to all others.

Secondly, there will be NO gong, the an-

tipication of which has struck terror into the heart of many a worthy entertainer.

"Road to Fame" will have the guiding hands of Gill and Doemling, favorite zanies of many Pacific Coast listeners, and the popular music of David Broekman's orchestra.

At the end of twelve weeks, all winners of first-place awards will compete for "Road to Fame's" grand prize . . . a paid-for appearance as a professional, on a transcontinental network program.

Votes of the listening public will determine the winners. Tryouts will be conducted in the studios of KHJ, Los Angeles.

Torch on Statue of Liberty Winks Welcome to Normandie

When the new French liner *Normandie* arrives in New York harbor on June 3 she will be greeted by a talking beam of light from the Statue of Liberty, France's gift to this republic a half century ago.

Greetings of government officials in Washington will be relayed to the liner over a Neon light beam, and received aboard the *Normandie* by a photoelectric tube device which will change the light signal back into electrical pulsations. From aboard the *Normandie* the greetings will be short-waved to a receiver atop the RCA building in Radio City, and thence relayed to NBC networks, and to the General Electric short-wave station W2XAF. French radio stations will pick up the W2XAF, Schenectady, signals for re-broadcast in that country.

"Orgets" Make Debut in New Children's Program

"Orgets in the Air," modernized good fairies and their adventures with earth children and animals form the basis of a new children's program to be given Tuesdays beginning June 4 at 2 p. m., P. S. T., over an NBC network including KGO and KDYL. Frances Fullerton Neilson is author of the series and will act as narrator while the dramas are enacted by an NBC cast.

Cupid Broadcasting Again

Lyndon T. Miller of the KJBS commercial staff was married to Miss Rose Koubek on May 18. The ceremony was performed in Oakland. Now, with the responsibility of a wife, Lyn threatens to become the best radio advertising salesman in these parts. Happy days, Lyn!

"Paging" World at San Diego

The most extensive public address system ever installed on the Pacific Coast, with volume sufficient to blanket an area ten miles square, will be operated by the Associated Oil Company during the California Pacific International Exposition in San Diego.

This elaborate system of sound amplification, which is similar to the facilities and services of a transcontinental radio chain, will be used for dissemination of information, announcements and musical programs for the 5,000,000 visitors expected at the exposition. It will directly contact every garden, exhibit palace, canyon and mesa in the 300-acre fair district of beautiful Balboa Park.

Thirty-two loud speakers will be placed on the Arco del Porvenir (Arch of the Future) now being constructed in beautiful Plaza del Pacifico to span Avenida de Palacios—main east-west thoroughfare through the fair area. In all, 156 loud speakers will be in service, other groups being located in the Spreckels grand organ console, in the Ford Music Bowl and the Palisade district generally.

Broadcasts from Normandie to Be Heard on CBS

Progress of the French Line's new ocean giant, the *Normandie*, on her maiden voyage across the Atlantic, will be followed by CBS in a series of short-wave broadcasts until Monday, June 3. From the time of her departure from Havre to her arrival at New York, CBS microphones will pick up colorful ceremonies and the gayety of entertainment aboard the *Normandie*.

When the ship reaches New York her stately parade through the harbor and up the Hudson will be described from a blimp flying overhead, from the top of one of Manhattan's skyscrapers and from the crowded up-town pier. Davidson Taylor will describe the departure from France and the arrival in New York as well as introduce the various celebrities and entertainers heard in broadcasts from mid-ocean.

The new "Enchanted Seas" program, originating in the KNX studios each Tuesday at 7:15 p. m., brings a soothing quarter hour of "word-painting," taking the listener by means of song and narration to far-away, romantic ports. Bret Morrison, baritone, known for his lead in "American Caravan," gives the descriptive readings with background and interludes of music by a quartet of organ, steel guitar, guitar and vibraharp.

Dr. Robert W. Seashore of the Psychology Department of USC speaks each Tuesday afternoon over KNX at 4:45, in a series of talks entitled "Analyzing our Abilities."

News and Comment

THE Columbia Broadcasting System's announcement of a new policy restricting the time of commercial announcements, raising the standard of all children's programs, and in eliminating radio advertisements which might be repellent to listeners, has met with a wide and enthusiastic response.

Anning S. Prall, chairman of the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, said:

This new pronouncement of policy by the Columbia Broadcasting System is gratifying not merely because it is one of the most forward looking steps ever taken in the great American radio industry, but also because it is the considered undertaking of a network serving more than 100 stations from coast to coast.

Such an example of wise leadership can hardly fail to exert a profound influence on American broadcasting generally. The net effect of such a marked raising of broadcasting standards can only be to enhance further radio's unique influence in our modern ways of living and thinking and to increase at the same time the interest of the listener and the value of the broadcast service to him.

Owen D. Young, leading American industrialist, likewise expressed his "enthusiastic support" of Columbia's new policy. His letter:

My Dear Mr. Paley:

I have read with the greatest interest the three new Columbia policies explained in the brochure which you were kind enough to send.

I wish to express my enthusiastic support for what you say, and the way you say it. One who knows much less about Columbia than I must get the impression from the objectives which you state, and the excellent English in which you put it, that Columbia can be trusted with those editorial powers approaching censorship which are necessary not only to improve cultural values on the one side, but to prevent the disintegration of broadcast through bad taste on the other. This step, more than anything that has recently been done, justifies, I think, our American system of broadcasting control.

Symphony Orchestras from San Diego

A parade of the finest symphony orchestras on the West Coast—with four of them scheduled at present and additional orchestras to be added later—will be heard in a series of broadcasts during the summer months over CBS network direct from the California Pacific International Exposition in San Diego.

The San Diego Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Nino Marcelli, will broadcast this first series every Tuesday and Thursday at 8 to 8:30 p. m., and on Saturdays from 3:30 to 4 p. m., P. S. T., concluding on Tuesday, June 11.

The second series will feature the Los Angeles Symphony Orchestra, directed by Henry Svedrofsky, beginning Saturday, June 22. During succeeding weeks the Portland Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Willem von Hoogstraaten, and the Seattle Symphony Orchestra, directed by Basil Cameron, will be heard in regular concerts.

Don Bestor, Jack Benny's musicmaster, is busying himself between the Sunday broadcasts in San Francisco, whence he commutes to Hollywood for the weekly air sessions. During the days he plays the ponies at the famous Tanforan track, and at night he plays for the dancers at the St. Francis Hotel.

KQW Occupies Unique Place In Broadcasting History

*First Experiment in 1908 Led to Establishment
As a Licensed Broadcasting Station in 1912*

ON the opposite page is a picture of much historical interest, for it is a picture of one of the world's first radio transmitters. The giant stride of radio broadcasting as it is now known, started more than a decade after the apparatus shown was on the air, discarded and forgotten.

The story of broadcasting's development is more like a Jules Verne romance, than established fact. And the story of KQW, San Jose, California, will undoubtedly figure in the histories of tomorrow, when researches are being made by savants of the next century into "that amazing manifestation of an earlier age, called radio."

The story of KQW is unique in many ways. Not only is it a real pioneer station as to operation, but a pioneer in becoming an integral part of the community it serves. All available data points to KQW as having received the first government license issued for broadcasting by radio telephony.

KDKA, the pioneer Westinghouse station that has made so much radio history, was established in 1920, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The General Electric Company established KGY at Schenectady in 1922. WJZ, New York, the RCA station, began its broadcasting career in 1921, while WEAJ is dated 1922. These fathers of radio broadcasting were spending millions in experimentation long before their advent on the air.

First Broadcast in 1908

But KQW, a precocious radio youngster on the Pacific Coast, with the transmitter pictured boldly started broadcasting after a fashion, in 1908. The station was duly licensed as a recognized broadcaster in 1912.

As you look at what today is a "contraption," consisting of a few electrical "gadgets," a piece of stove-pipe, an old phonograph turntable, crude microphone and a bale or so of wire, amusement is the first reaction. But in those pre-radio days, it was a mechanical marvel, representing tedious labor of its inventor, Dr. Charles D. Herold, and his co-worker E. A. Portal.

Through their constant efforts, in the face of tremendous obstacles, technical and otherwise, what closely approached normal speech, was achieved. Residents of the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco marvelled at the novelty of picking music from the ether, from KQW, San Jose, on a daily schedule. The year 1912 also distinguished KQW for successfully carrying on two-way wireless

telephone operation. In 1915, KQW broadcast music to the receiving booths at the Panama Pacific Exposition fair grounds in San Francisco.

The public were invited to "listen in" at the Wiley B. Allen store in San Jose, at the same time, being urged to "take a chance" on this new idea of radio—and install a receiving set, then the latest new thing on the market.

The Day of the Amateur

It was a long time before any appreciable number of home sets were in use. The amateur, with a crystal set, or cigarbox receiver, held nightly vigils with headphones clamped tightly to straining ears.

As the radio years sped along, KQW established a studio and staff, in San Jose, anticipating the future of radio broadcasting as a commercial and public service. The basic idea of operating for the public good, has influenced all KQW policies from the beginning. With very practical foresight, the management determined to serve first, its own community. This wise decision has borne fruit through the years in establishing KQW as the "Voice of California Agriculture." Since 1926, the station has maintained service features designed to benefit the immensely rich agricultural section of which San Jose is the center.


Today, KQW maintains studios in Sacramento, San Francisco and San Jose, with many remote points from which news and features of particular interest to California agriculturists are broadcast daily.

The "rural" sections of California, differ from those in most parts of the world. Ranches and orchards are busy, efficient institutions, conducted like any other modern business, with packing plants and other correlating enterprises, a part of the general community.

In the section served by KQW are scores of modern cities and towns, where all conveniences and standards of living are expected as a matter of course.

In June, 1934, KQW was acquired by Ralph, Mott and Sherwood Brunton, of San Francisco, operators of KJBS. Under the direction of C. L. McCarthy and his staff associates, KQW has become one of the most modern broadcasting organizations of the Pacific Coast.

The traditions of service to agricultural California have been maintained and ex-

tended, together with registering a splendid growth as a commercial medium.

KQW programs offer wide variety of interests. As an associate station of the Northern California Broadcasting System, many of its programs originate in the San Francisco studios of KJBS, the key station.

C. L. McCarthy, who directs the activities of KQW, is a veteran broadcaster of recognized talent. He was for a long time an executive with the National Broadcasting Company on the Pacific Coast and in the East.

Through his organization the policy of public service is stressed through the medium of programs designed to entertain as well as serve. News is an important ingredient in the station's daily program schedules, with most complete agricultural service, programs of local interest presented in cooperation with local musical and dramatic organizations and officials of the municipal, county and state governments.

Intercollegiate debates, musical programs and school sports are covered in cooperation with the public schools of San Jose and San Jose State College.

A unique feature that has won a tremendous following for KQW is the regular Monday afternoon broadcast direct from the


courtroom of Judge Percy O'Connor, in San Jose.

Thus the oldest radio station in the country has progressed from an uncharted course, to the point where it is recognized as one of the most constructively useful radio broadcasting organizations in the country. KQW is fortunate in having the courage to forge ahead on the demands of today, rather than lean on the exploits and traditions of yesterday.

Like every other enterprise worthy of public interest, radio marches on; and the voice of KQW, San Jose, gains force and influence as each day's parade of radio events passes in review before millions of eager listeners.

OWNERS of all-wave receivers will soon have the opportunity of listening in direct on transmissions of the 1935 stratosphere flight. Stratosphere short-wave tests will begin almost any day now on an assigned frequency of 13.05 meg. The transmitting set, which weighs approximately 40 pounds, has been installed in the gondola of the balloon, and Captain Albert W. Stevens will soon be broadcasting experimental tests every evening from Rapid City, South Dakota.

Probably never in the history of radio has there been a more thrilling broadcast than that made by Captain Stevens in the 1934 Army-National Geographic stratosphere flight, when the balloon burst. Although the breath-taking drop of 60,000 feet completely wrecked the equipment, the short-wave transmitter functioned perfectly up until the time of the crash.

* * *

The correct call letters of the new Hongkong short-wave station are ZEK. ZBW is the call of the medium-wave station whose programs are relayed by the short-wave transmitter, and it is this call-sign which is usually heard in the announcements. The station is still being received daily on an announced frequency of 8.75 meg. between 4 and 6:30 or 7 a. m.

* * *

Atmospheric conditions continue to threaten reception of South American stations, but in spite of the rising noise level, several of these Spanish-speaking transmitters refuse to give up the endless fight with disturbances in the short-wave ether.

HJ4ABE of Medellin, Colombia, is often heard well until as late as 8:45 p. m., broadcasting fun, music and merry-making from one of the city's most popular hotels. Listen for them on 5.95 meg.

Another Colombian transmitter which retains its position on the abbreviated wavelengths is HJ3ABH of Bogota, better known as "La Voz de la Victor." They operate on 6.02 meg., and may be heard daily until 8 p. m., signing off at that time with a familiar organ selection.

And to Colombia must go credit for the best-received South American station at the present time, for such is HKV of Bogota, which is received almost every day between 5 and 7:15 p. m. on a frequency of 8.8 meg. Although owned and operated by the Colombian Ministry of War, the programs are by

no means confined to military subjects. The announcer, who, by the way, speaks perfect English when he chooses to do so, conducts a broadcast consisting in the main of popular recordings and vocal selections.

* * *

Another country which always has and probably always will contribute its full share to the enjoyment of short-wave listeners is Ecuador. Situated squarely across the equator and in the midst of the Andes Mountains, this country claims what is probably the highest broadcasting station in the world. This is HCJB, located in Quito, and announcing as the "Voice of the Andes." HCJB operates on 8.21 meg. daily, sometimes signing off as early as 8 p. m., and sometimes as late as 9:15.

In Guayaquil, Ecuador, are three stations which are now being reported regularly in this country. The first is HC2RL, which transmits on 6.67 meg. every Tuesday until 8:15 p. m.; second is HC2ET, working on 8.62 meg. Wednesday and Saturday as late as 8:45 p. m., and testing irregularly on other days; and third we have HC2AT, which tests in the evening on a frequency of 8.45 meg.

* * *

Two powerful phone stations are still sending excellent signals to the Pacific Coast on regular schedules. PLV of Bandoeng, Java, phones San Francisco at 6:50 a. m. and 5:15 p. m. JVF also contacts San Francisco, in the afternoon at 12:45 p. m., and again at 8:15 p. m.

The directional antenna systems employed by both these stations direct the signal toward a given area, so that the received signal within that area is increased approximately four times. It is interesting to note that, in the case of the 80-kilowatt station PLV, in order to increase the received signal four-fold without the use of a directional antenna, it would be necessary to raise the station power to the almost incredible amount of 1,280,000 watts!

RKI of Moscow, U. S. S. R. handles phone work with Khabarovsk, Siberia, irregularly near 10:15 a. m., using a frequency of 15.04 meg. A woman announcer is usually heard calling "Hello, hello, Moscow calling Khabarovsk."

A flash from Reykjavig, Iceland, states that the new Iceland stations are still awaiting arrival of new equipment. The transmitters are on the docks in Liverpool, awaiting shipment, and will not be ready for operation for several months.

The Italian Consulate states that 2RO has been conducting its American hour on 9.64 meg. every Monday, Wednesday and Friday since May 1. Try for them on this frequency between 3 and 4:30 p. m.

* * *

CMHD, a new Cuban station, is now carrying out regular tests between 2 and 5 p. m. on a frequency of 10.20 meg.

* * *

HIZ, of Santo Domingo, Republic of Domicia, is reported to be conducting a spe-

cial DX program every Saturday night on 6.31 meg. between 6 and 8 p. m.

* * *

SUZ on 13.83 meg. has now replaced **SUV** for Egyptian phone transmissions and is being heard by several coast listeners near 2:30 p. m.

* * *

WVD, the 500-watt Alaska Fisheries station at Seattle has now changed frequencies from 5.99 to 8.62 meg. Contacts are effected with **WXA** of Juneau, Alaska, almost every day near 5:15 p. m.


An 8,000-mile Radio Pickup

A recent broadcast of unusual interest and enterprise was waited on the ether waves, via stations **KJBS** and **KQW** of the Northern California Broadcasting System. It was a "remote" from Buenos Aires, Argentina, nearly 8,000 miles distant, by short-wave to San Francisco.

The occasion for the broadcast was the annual alumni gathering just prior to the seventy-second commencement exercises at Berkeley, and the thirtieth anniversary of the writing of the song.

At the request of Robert Sibley, executive manager of the University of California Alumni Association, the unique broadcast—one of the longest ever accomplished—was arranged by Mr. Ralph R. Brunton, general manager of the NCBS.
