



News and Comment

IT is interesting to note the new trend in radio, accented by the widespread applause greeting the radio appearances of Jascha Heifetz, one of the world's greatest violinists, and Helen Hayes, distinguished star of the stage.

This season broadcasting is undeniably better in every way than ever before. The finest talent the world of entertainment affords is being marshalled to the country's microphones, with the dignity of the talented showman replacing the old line of ballyhoo.

One of our correspondents, Mr. Earle Ferris of New York, writes:

"Many hundreds of years ago there was a seer who said, 'Everything passes; Art survives.'

"To prove the truth of this observation, artists remain in radio, and in great demand, while noise makers of a decade ago or a year ago for that matter, have begun to pack up their tents.

"The freak voices have vanished, and the odd music some maestros called 'hotcha jazz' is now a mere hollow echo. Comedy has undergone a change, too, and the noisy question-and-answer types of comics are in the sere and yellow and wondering if any sponsor is going to make them a spot cash offer.

"A Thomas and a Tibbet both have swell jobs on the air, thank you, and Nelson Eddy is on deck for his series. Lily Pons and Nino Martini have been signed again and Grace Moore sings from Hollywood. Jane Froman comes back from Hollywood in great demand and only awaits a sponsor to meet her price to forsake guest-starring. La Dragonette goes on like a lovely perennial, and young Igor Gorin, a few years ago a Viennese medical student, is charming listeners by his intelligent interpretation of lyrics.

"Workmanlike musicians are getting the call over the boys who stayed up all night to

think up trick combinations to harass the ear and out-scream their more musical rivals. Don Voorhees takes the baton for Lawrence Tibbett, and both Al Goodman and Frank Black are busy, thank you. All three of them are graduated from the pits of musical comedies where they led orchestras through the tempestuous worries of a musical show night after night to attain that smoothness so necessary to accompany a good singer.

"Sponsors who raid the stage for talent take only the best of the legitimate people. Helen Hayes, long reigning as the first lady of the stage and screen, is first to step into a half-hour program once a week, and she brings with her a story of unbounded sympathetic qualities. A week or two behind her sponsor comes one to offer Leslie Howard and his thrilling voice in an attempt to combine with Eddie Cantor to provide two half-hours in a campaign to lure away some of Major Bowes' listeners.

"If radio has no outstanding novelty to offer as the fall season rolls around, it gives the listener the best it can find. Bach and Beethoven were old stuff a century ago, but nothing better has come along. And the chances are the two, with a dash of Irving Berlin here and there, will have to do, depending on great voices and fine orchestras to interpret them interestingly and intelligently."

Rubinoff, and an orchestra, featuring Virginia Rea, one of radio's finest voices, will be heard over the NBC net in the spot formerly occupied by the "G Men" program, 6 p. m., Saturday. Jan Peerce, tenor, and Graham McNamee as emcee will also be heard.

Family Scripts Win Applause

Radio Listeners Adopt "Homey" Characters of the Current Serials and Famous Stars Who Play Them

EARLY October welcomes two families destined to win their way into the hearts of myriad radio listeners. They are the Edwards Family, around whose heartbreaks the great voice of Helen Hayes will play like a vari-colored light in her new script series, "The New Penny," and "The O'Neills," a family serial which returns, almost by demand, of several hundred thousand listeners.

Miss Hayes, having won honors as the first lady of the stage and then as the first lady of the screen, in "The New Penny" is after top honors as a radio actress. The little catch in her voice, known to theatre-goers since the days of her triumph in "Coquette," is being heard as she, playing the role of Penelope Edwards, weaves in and out of Edith Meiser's charming tale of life in an orphanage. And nicely enough, Miss Hayes, with more honors in her belt than most women win in a life time, comes to the microphone as she says, "without any message whatsoever and only in an attempt to be interesting." There is no propaganda; she merely tries to hold a mirror of sound up to life and in so doing revive memories and breathe life into a character that has all the ear marks of one of radio's most loved people.

"The O'Neills" will be much the same as it was when Jane West, an author who never thought of writing until she was 40 and then only because folks told her that the people she knew about would make lovable copy, first brought it to the loudspeaker more than a year ago. Tried out on a local station in New York, it was chosen as best of a dozen others when a group of women, asked to serve as a jury, selected it almost unanimously. The members of the O'Neill family have been pictured and made to sound just like the folks who live around the corner from you and you. When they left the airways, several hundred thousand wrote and asked the broadcasters to bring 'em back. And now a soap sponsor does.

With "One Man's Family" a great hit, "The O'Neills" return to challenge the family program field for domination, and the very large family that Helen Hayes as Penelope Edwards will look after does likewise. For those who like to listen in on life, whether it be next door or through the loudspeaker, the family fare for 1935 seems to be about the best offered since radio left the crystal set phase.

Murray Bolen is the arranger for the song duets sung by John Ellington and "Brick" Holton on "Time on My Hands" presentations twice weekly.

Frank Luther to Start on Movie

FRANK LUTHER, Men-About-Town tenor, for four years the singing star of many ABC programs, is in Hollywood and will play the lead in a picture to be titled "High Hat," based on a serial which appeared some time ago in the *Saturday Evening Post*.

The picture will be produced by one of the major picture companies and will be under the supervision of Bill Pizor, who was producer of Bing Crosby's first cinema starring vehicle. Luther will play the part of a young man who struggles, ultimately with success, to obtain radio stardom.

"High Hat" will be Luther's first major picture but he has been starred in twelve shorts produced in the East. The radio star does not plan to abandon broadcasting while in production and it is probable he will be heard in programs from Hollywood.

Luther plans to return to New York as soon as work on his picture is completed, probably within four months. One of radio's most versatile performers, Luther has found success as a ballad singer, recording artist, star of movie shorts, radio columnist and night club entertainer.

A one-hour broadcast, Saturday, October 5, presented over an NBC network from Hollywood and New cast, Saturday, October 5, presented over York, Max Reinhardt, director of the picture, virtually the entire star-studded cast, film executives and a symphony orchestra playing Mendelssohn's famous "Dream" music, under the direction of Erich Wolfgang Korngold.

The broadcast prefaced simultaneous premieres of "A Midsummer Night's Dream" in New York, London, Vienna, Amsterdam, Paris, Manila and Sydney, Australia, on October 9.

Announcers Hold Sports Convention in San Francisco

Sports announcers and officials in a pre-season get-together as Associated launches its tenth year of football broadcasts.

IN the largest meeting of its kind ever held in the United States, radio sports announcers who will handle the broadcasts of major Pacific Coast football games for western fans this season met recently in San Francisco.

Purpose of the conference was to make 1935 Associated Sportcasts even better than they have been in the past ten seasons.

Originator and chairman of the conference was Harold R. Deal, Associated's advertising and sales promotion manager. The 1935 staff of announcers includes twenty-two veterans, who report vivid, accurate "on the scene" accounts of football, baseball, ice hockey, tennis, track, wrestling, rugby, six-day bike races, polo and other sports events.

Technical discussion of football occupied a large part of conference time. Coach "Clipper" Smith of Santa Clara explained what Western coaches have in the way of systems and odd formations, and Herb Dana, Pacific Coast football commissioner, interpreted the rules on many technical decisions.

Summed up by Harold R. Deal, here is the credo of a good football announcer:

He will follow the progress of the ball

carrier: "Five yards, ten yards, fifteen yards! He's down on his own forty-five yard line," so that the fans at home can mentally follow the exciting action.

He will never anticipate a play or the results of a play or an official's decision.


He will be impartial at all times, because impartiality is a fundamental of good sportsmanship.

In his remarks before the first kickoff, he will make the listener see the field as clearly as he sees it; reporting weather, attendance figures, the spirit of the crowd, the positions of the teams.

Following a spectacular play, he will switch on his field microphones for crowd noise, yells, songs and music because these things are a vital part of American football.

He will name the leading participants in each play, and the names of all substitutes coming into the game and of the men whom they replace.

He will keep his fans posted before and after every play on the position of the ball and the "down," and also will announce frequently the period of the game and the score for later dialers.



If a player is injured he will find out as soon as possible the extent of the injury and make an announcement accordingly.

He will never lose his own individuality because the good sportscaster must be sincerely himself at all times.

During this first get-together of Associated's star announcers, they were guests of Vice-President B. I. Graves, Domestic Sales Manager P. E. Allan, Mr. Deal and other company officials at a luncheon at the Olympic Club.

"Associated believes that its football sportcasts are a real service to our friends on the Pacific Coast," Mr. Graves said. "We bring their favorite sports to shut-ins, to people living in remote sections, to those who have to work during games, and to those who for any other reason cannot get to the games.

The new schedule includes: October 17, "Much Ado About Nothing," by Shakespeare; October 24, "Lady Windemere's Fan," by Oscar Wilde; October 31, "Henry VIII," by Shakespeare.

Lum and Abner on NBC Chain

Lum and Abner, who came out of the Ozarks four years ago to achieve national prominence over NBC networks, will be brought to Pacific Coast listeners by way of the NBC-KPO network nightly except Thursday, Saturday and Sunday at 8:15 p. m., P. S. T., beginning Monday, October 21.

With them Lum (Chester Lauck) and Abner (Norris Goff) will bring their Jot 'Em Down Store and all the citizens of mythical Pine Ridge, the backwoods village now familiar to radio listeners throughout the country.

It was on July 27, 1931, that Lauck and Goff made their first appearance over NBC, their network debut coming after only nine previous radio broadcasts. They came to NBC as vacation substitutes for another radio team and scored such a tremendous hit that at the expiration of the two weeks their sponsor sent them on a personal appearance tour, after which they returned to NBC. Broadcasting and stage appearances have kept them busy continuously during the past four years.

Mendelssohn Club on "Parade"

In the fourth of the series of "Male Chorus Parade" presentations, the Mendelssohn Club of Spokane, Washington, will be heard Wednesday night, October 16, from 8:15 to 8:30 o'clock, over the Columbia-Don Lee network. The club is considered to be in the front rank in competitive performances with other male choruses of the Northwest.

Much of the Mendelssohn Club's success, it was announced, especially in recent years, is attributed to Harold E. Fraser, who has been its director for several years. A number of the club's past members have gained national prominence as singers. Sixty members of the chorus will line-up for the Wednesday night broadcast with Mrs. Hildegard Guth Presley, as accompanist.

The Mendelssohn Club has just rounded out twenty-nine years of singing giving two formal concerts each season, as well as making occasional informal appearances each year.

Selections to be sung by the club include "Battle of Jerico," "Lassie O' Mine," "Tally Ho," and "Allah's Holiday."

Wallace Beery New M. C. for Chateau Show

Wallace Beery, America's No. 1 male screen star according to box office records, will bring the lovable character he has created for the screen to the air when he takes over the master of ceremonies job in the Chateau on Saturday, October 12.

Beery will introduce the guest stars and keep the show moving along its proper course in the spot which has been occupied by Al Jolson during the last six months. In addition to this he will also be featured in a dramatic sketch in every program.







THE long-awaited shift in frequencies for Japanese broadcasts has finally been effected. The daily "Overseas Program of the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan" is now being released from 9 to 10 p. m. through JVN on 10.66 meg. in place of JVH. Volume from JVN is not particularly strong at the present time, but will undoubtedly improve greatly within the next month.

Between 1 and 4.40 a. m., the broadcasts of JVM have been taken over by JVT on 6.75 meg., as predicted in this column a few weeks ago. JVT has been reported with excellent volume in all parts of the Pacific Coast, and will undoubtedly continue to carry these early morning transmissions during the next three or four months.

* * *

Station VY2RC of Caracas, Venezuela, has had so many complaints of interference on its frequency of 6.11 meg. that the genial manager, Edgar Anzola, has decided to move the station's frequency. A cleared channel on 5.80 meg. was selected, and the shift in wavelength has not only improved the signal from VY2RC 100 per cent, but has also lessened the congestion around 6.1 meg. considerably.

* * *

A brand new Mexican transmitter has appeared in the short-wave spectrum. The latest addition to the ranks of Spanish-speaking broadcasters operates on approximately 11.25 meg., and may be heard almost every afternoon from 4 to 6:30 o'clock relaying the programs of XEB and XEW, two broadcast band stations in Mexico City. The new high frequency transmitter uses the call XBJQ, and has been reported as far north as Vancouver with good volume. Equipment is owned by the National Bank of Mexico City.

* * *

According to a late flash from Paris, work is progressing rapidly on the first two transmitters of the powerful new short-wave station which is now being built at Villebon, France. The power of the new broadcaster is to be 100,000 watts for wavelengths higher than 30 meters and 50,000 watts for other waves. Equipment consists of four transmitters to be used on eight different wavelengths, and six directional antenna systems, two of which will be beamed on the United States and Canada.

* * *

Many listeners have no doubt been somewhat surprised to hear a new call-sign men-

tioned in announcements from Pittsburgh's famous W8XK. Broadcasts now conclude with the statement: "This program has come to you from the Pittsburgh Grant Building Studios of KDKA, W8XK, and experimental station W8XKA." The latter call letters are those used for a new 5-meter transmitter which operates on approximately 55.5 meg. It will be noted that this is an exceedingly



high frequency. As ultra-high frequencies in radio increase, they tend to take on some of the characteristics of light waves, and transmissions are generally conceded not to exist to any great extent beyond the horizon. It is very improbable, therefore, that W8XKA will be audible on the Pacific Coast.

* * *

The Saturday evening broadcasts from station VK2ME in Sydney, Australia, are now being received with excellent volume on the Pacific Coast. Some fine recorded programs, interspersed with the amusing laughter of the famous Australian "Kookaburra," may be picked up easily every week between 9:30 and 11:30 p. m. on 9.59 meg. And incidentally, the Sunday morning transmissions from this station are also approaching maximum volume in this region of the world. VK2ME is on the air Sunday from 1:30 to 5:30 a. m.

The management of station CEC in Santiago, Chile, has announced that regular programs will probably be broadcast on an extended schedule in the near future. Special tests have already been heard several times near 4:30 p.m., and experimental transmis-

sions are released every Thursday and Sunday from 5:30 to 6 p. m. on 10.67 meg. The English announcements are made through a telephone from the control room, and are rather distorted, but the musical portion of the program reaches this country with excellent clarity and signal strength.

The DX Corner

The Tropical Radio Telegraph Company is responsible for new short wave broadcasts from Tegucigalpa, Honduras. A station HRN of that city is now on the air lines daily between 4:45 and 7 p. m., signing off to the familiar strains of 'Ted Lewis' "Good-night Melody." HRN employs a frequency of 5.87 meg., and will be found midway on the dial between YV5RMO of Caracas, Venezuela, and HJ4ABE of Medellin, Colombia.

* * *

HIZ of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, has been heard irregularly between 4:30 and 7:30 p. m. in addition to its Saturday DX broadcasts, which are aired between 8:30 and 10:30 p. m. The frequency seems to shift from 6.31 to 6.40 meg. on different evenings, but signal strength before 8 o'clock is too weak to ascertain the correct wave.




