News and Comment

THE vocational guidance periods begun last year as an experiment by the "American School of the Air" have been made a permanent feature of this year's plan of broadcast instruction in response to popular demand. They are presented over the coast-to-coast Columbia network each Friday from 11:30 to 12:00 noon, PST, in conjunction with the vocational guidance committee of the National Advisory Council on Radio in Education. Dr. Harry D. Kitson is chairman.

Weekly broadcasts are planned to help students decide what occupations to choose. However, the primary purpose of the course is not to induce pupils to choose their occupations definitely, but to open their eyes to the many kinds of things there are to do and to engender an appreciation of occupational life.

The dramatized versions of many types of work met with enthusiastic reception by child and adult listeners alike last year and it was decided to continue them.

Among the subjects to be dramatized are pointers on the vocations of engineers, chemists, foresters, builders, artists, government service, what must be considered in choosing an occupation, how jobs are related, when work runs into play and sidelights on many other closely allied subjects.

Broadcasts of geography, literature, history, elementary science, music and current events courses are also heard each Monday to Friday, inclusive, from 11:30 to 1:00 noon, PST, during the "American School of the Air" sessions.

MORE than 1,500 American composers are competing for the NBC Music Guild Awards of \$1,000, \$500 and \$250 offered by the National Broadcasting Company for new and original chamber music works by native and naturalized composers.

Two hundred composers have called in person at NBC headquarters in Radio City, New York, for official entry blanks; 750 have requested these by mail; and more than 600

have obtained entry blanks from NBC's network stations.

According to the terms of these awards, all manuscripts must be filed anonymously, with the composer's true name on an official entry blank enclosed in an official envelope bearing the composer's pseudonym. The necessary blanks and envelopes may be obtained from NBC's associated stations or by addressing the NBC Music Guild Awards Committee, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, N. Y.

These awards are offered for compositions with a playing time of not less than 20 minutes nor more than 25 minutes.

The competition is open to native or naturalized American citizens. All manuscripts must be submitted by February 29, 1936.

As announced by R. C. Patterson, Jr., executive vice president of the National Broadcasting Company, "these awards are offered as an incentive to our music writers to express themselves in these enduring forms, and as a material recognition of merit on the part of American composers."

The dramatic finale of the Notre Dame-Ohio State football game had such repercussions that it almost wrecked the office of Walter O'Keefe, heard on the CBS each Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Walter, a Notre Dame alumnus, was listening to the radio description of the game with Charles Butterworth, noted comedian and former classmate of O'Keefe, and Bill Conselman, scenario writer. Walter was rather glum until that memorable last period. Then when victory came for the Irish, Walter tossed a beaker of ice water in Butterworth's face, tossed Conselman under a desk and emptied a bookcase in the middle of the floor.

Jack Benny to Revive Initial Radio Skit For Two Hundredth Program

JACK BENNY, radio's grand old man of comedy, will revive one of the routines used on his first broadcast back in 1932 for his two hundredth program over the NBC-KPO network on Sunday, December 1, at 8:30 p. m., PST. Mary Livingstone, Kenny Baker, Don Wilson and Johnny Green's band will participate in the celebration originating in the Hollywood studios.

During the sketch from Benny's original script, Mary will read the lines that belonged to Ethel Shutta, Green will fill George Olsen's role, Don Wilson will play the part taken by George Hicks and Kenny Baker will speak the lines Harry Conn wrote for himself. The writer used to take part in the initial Benny broadcasts, but gave it up because acting made him nervous.

Mary Livingstone was not a member of her husband's radio cast when it was first assembled. Her air debut was a most informal affair—Jack's script ran short of the full half-hour and he waved frantically to Mary who was sitting in the studios to come to the mike and ad-lib with him. Listeners liked her flip voice and within two weeks Benny made her part and parcel of the show.

A highly successful musical comedy and revue comedian, Benny turned his interests to radio because Mary, who had never cared for the hectic life of show business, liked the idea of settling down in one place and starting a home, and because so many of Jack's friends were enjoying success with the newest branch of the entertainment field. There was little fanfare in connection with Benny's debut. By the end of his first series, however, Benny found himself a radio favorite.

The San Francisco Maennerchor, a group of 90 male voices, is the next in line of "Male Chorus Parade" features and will be heard over KFRC and the Columbia-Don Lee Network on Wednesday evening, December 4, from 8:15 to 8:30 o'clock.

Frederick Schiller, its director, has been identified in choral work for many years. The Maennerchor, is San Francisco's crack German chorus, a holder of prizes and has carried the banner of San Francisco throughout the United States and in Germany.

Selections which the Maennerchor will sing during the broadcast include Chorus of Priests from the opera "The Magic Flute," the Huntsmen's Chorus from the opera "Der Freischutz," folksong "The Linden Tree," and the historic soldiers' song, "Captain and Lieutenant."

Rosemary and Priscilla Lane, sister vocalists with Fred Waring's Pennsylvanians, are

studying dramatics under Frances Robinson Duff, noted mentor of Katharine Hepburn, Myrna Loy and other stage and screen stars. . . . Rosemary will soon appear as Juliet in Miss Duff's production of "Romeo and Juliet."

Wife Is His Audience

Authors, actors, organist and sound effects man do not comprise the entire personnel of One Man's Family.

There is one person whom the listeners never hear, who plays a large part in every episode—Patricia Morse, wife of Carlton F. Morse, the serial's playwright.

She is the audience for whom Morse writes his Barbour saga, and the critic, he says, whose reaction he takes seriously.

Marjorie Horton, NBC lyric soprano, says her most difficult role was a lead in a Chinese opera "Kwan Yin," in which she was obliged to sing in Chinese.

Dixie Marsh, noted impersonator and comedienne who plays the darky cook in Hawthorne House has been in radio since 1922, when Alabama listeners heard her piano-playing on crystal sets.

Thru the Radioscope with Earle Ferris

FRED Allen's presentation of a "singing Frooster" on the radio may offer one eventual solution to the amateur problem. Some alert talent seeker may bob up any day now with a prize porker able to grunt "Asleep in the Deep." Don't be surprised if a zoo announces the proud discovery of an Antelope who sings alto, or a contralto Cockatoo. Australia may yet see the day when it produces, not one, but many "Krooning Kangaroos" able and willing to offer "Love in Bloom," or "I'm in the Mood for Love." At this writing, a Kangaroo is about the only one who hasn't sung the latter songs over the air waves. The hills of Kentucky may yet produce a fine baritone bloodhound who will do right well with his own commercial, signing up for 13 weeks to plug dog biscuits, and there could be no more attractive radio drawing card than a thoroughbred horse with a nice tenor voice. A lovely smile would go a long way toward making the horse not only man's best friend, but also the amateurs' worst enemy.

MOTOR magnates continue to be the greatest contributors to radio of the higher type of music. For many years their

reason for sponsoring so-called "high brow entertainment" has been questioned, but with the showing of the new super stream lines and super smooth models of today, their interest in the classics can well be understood.

Tap dancers continue to offer "the something new" that radio is always seeking. The feet of Mr. Astaire have produced what the tonsils of Senor Enrico failed to provide.

Miss Eleanor Powell presents an even voice and what the old-timers would call a "pair of flashing silver heels," before the microphone.

Motion picture producers lead the way in a campaign to find "another Will Rogers." One film magnate has lifted Charles Winninger from radio fame to play the home-spun parts Will made famous, and Edgar Guest, "the Household Poet," who is a radio star in his own right, has completed a Will Rogers-like part in a movie called "Home." A couple of Western Senators are being groomed for the microphone with their dry wit, while Bob Burns, rising in the ascending scale of radio popularity, still seems to these ears to be the closest to the late great word-wizard of Ooligah, Oklahoma.

Howard Clancy, announcer on the Sigmund Romberg programs over NBC, draws caricatures in spare moments at rehearsal. He says that the composer has more "action" in his face than any other person he has drawn. A glimpse of Romberg conducting like a human dynamo confirms this.

Havrilla Wins Diction Award

A LOIS HAVRILLA, NBC announcer, and Lynn Fontaine, famed actress now featured with Alfred Lunt in the Theatre Guild's production of "The Taming of the Shrew," were awarded the 1935 Diction Medals for radio and the stage of the American Academy of Arts and Letters.

The awards were made recently at the Academy's celebration of the 100th anniversary of the birth of Mark Twain, presided over by Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler of Columbia University, and were presented by William Lyon Phelps, professor emeritus of literature at Yale University and chairman of the Academy's radio committee.

"This award to me is an illustration of the opportunities America offers," Havrilla said in accepting the medal, "because, coming to the United States from Czecho-Slovakia when I was four years old, I first became

acquainted with the English language through the stately cadences used in the church where I, as a boy of seven, sang in the choir.

"The English language to me is still a glorious adventure," he continued, "Through radio during the past decade I have been able to hear the many dialects and colloquialisms which make it up in America, and I can see the day that, through this same radio, all these conflicting dialects will be fused into a single language, without losing their color.

A unique clause in the contract signed by Bob Burns, that makes him the permanent emcee and comedian of the Paul Whiteman Music Hall, on the NBC red network each Thursday, stipulates that Burns be permitted to work without a script, but using "cuff notes" the way he does for his present guest star appearances. Burns begins his permanent duties on this program on January 2.

A NOTED philosopher once said, in effect, "If there were no poor performers in this world, how could we form a standard and appreciate the good artists?"

It may seem like another theory, but let's study for a minute the significance of the thought in regard to radio and the amateurs. Yes, they're in again.

Many professionals have complained in the past that the ever growing list of amateur programs is ruining radio for the pros. Actually, there is no truth to that statement.

We never expect the amateur to be a "finished" performer. After all his work is new to the tuner-inner and that's why he is called an amateur. His talent has to be judged.

Studying the claim from another angle we find alleged professionals weeping because they are being crowded out of the radio

picture by the competition offered. Coming down to facts, if they can't stand up under the pace set by a simon-pure how can they expect to buck professional competition?


The trouble with a lot of artists who are irked by competition is that they are seeking the easy way out. A real fighter would say, "I'll show 'em. If they think they can get away with that stuff, I'll give them such competition—it won't even be funny." But instead, they seek the easy way out. They raise a kick and seek comments in the radio columns on, "What is Radio Coming To, Anyhow?" thereby following the line of least resistance. But such procedure will spell oblivion for them if they persist in boosting themselves by knocking others.

Radio is a big business and better artists are all that the public is after. The theory, "survival of the fittest" has gradually raised the standard of radio talent and the same theory will keep it going.

Johnny Green, music maestro of the Jack Benny show, has composed a new symphonic suite, "Danse Basque," which will be introduced next season at the Hollywood Bowl, with Jose Iturbi conducting.

Here's one for the book: NBC's Lum, who is a tall guy, and Abner, who is about Jimmy Walker's build, both attribute their tallness and shortness to eating turnip greens.

Records and Precedents Set by Jumbo Series

The Jumbo-Fire Chief Show broadcast every Tuesday night at 6:30 p. m. P.S.T., over an NBC nationwide network from the Hippodrome Theatre is setting radio precedents and breaking microphone records right and left. Here are a few:

1.—It is the first radio program based on a Broadway production to run concurrently with the stage show (Billy Rose's circus-operetta, "Jumbo.")

2.—It is the first broadcast to originate from the same stage as a Broadway show. (The Hippodrome.)

3.—It is the first series to use the same principals as a current Broadway show (Jimmy Durante, Donald Novis, Gloria Grafton, Arthur Sinclair, etc.)

4.—For the first time in history, a Broadway show stands aside one night each week to permit the radio broadcast. (Tuesday nights.)

5.—It is the first time that a radio show based on a Broadway production has had its premiere before the stage show opened.

6.—The Jumbo-Fire Chief broadcast, originating in the Hippodrome, has the largest weekly audience of any regular network series; 4,500.

7.—For the first time in history, a "studio" audience remained after the broadcast to witness a preview of a stage production.

8.—The Fire-Chief series is the first on which such noted Broadway song writers (Richard Rodgers and Lorenz Hart), authors (Ben Hecht and Charles MacArthur) and producer (Billy Rose) have collaborated.

Roy Russell of the "Bitter Sweet" company has been given the tenor spot at KFRC and at present is booked on Feminine Fancies and Happy-Go-Lucky. He has sung over KIJJ as well as orchestra vocalist in Hollywood pictures, recently appearing with Ted Fio-Rito's band on the screen.



OUR patience is sometimes strained almost to the breaking point when certain overseas stations insist on bewildering the short wave listener with frequent and irregular shifts in wave-length, but the peculiarities of high frequency transmission demand such changes to meet varying seasonal conditions. Such being the case, we can do little more than attempt to chronicle these changes as they occur, hoping that another shift will not be effected before the news gets into print.

The Broadcasting Corporation of Japan has replaced JVH on 14.60 meg. by JVN on 10.66 meg. for the regular afternoon broadcasts, the schedule of which was given in this section last week. The change was made in anticipation of a general weakening in winter reception on the higher frequency. The immediate result has been a tremendous drop in signal strength for Pacific Coast listeners, but the program has by no means been rendered inaudible. It is expected that volume will gradually increase as the days grow shorter, and a considerable improvement in reception on the new frequency should be observed within the next month.

* * *

And although we may grumble about these frequent shifts in wave-length, we certainly can't complain about any lack of new stations for diversified foreign entertainment. The thrill of identifying a mysterious new broadcaster in the short wave spectrum is one of the fascinations of reception on the low waves, and hardly a week passes without the appearance of several "strangers" on the dial.

The South American Republic of Colombia occupies the spotlight this week with the addition of two newcomers to its Spanish-speaking family on 49 meters. The first has been heard testing after 9 p. m. on 6.13 meg. using the call "Emissora Philco." According to the genial English announcer, the station does not yet broadcast on any regular

schedule, but arrangements are being made to do so in the near future. A new 1000 watt Collins transmitter is in use at the present time, and excellent reception has been reported as far north as Vancouver.

The second new Colombian broadcaster is located in Bogota, and operates on 5.95 meg. under the call letters HJA. Programs are usually released between 6 and 7:30 p. m., although no definite schedule is being employed at present.

Reports on a new German station have also trickled into our office during the past week. It seems that the Reich-Rundfunk Gesellschaft has added another transmitter to the famous Zeesen group, the latest newcomer using the call DJU on 9.67 meg. Programs are often released during occasions of special interest near 3 or 4 p. m., but no regular time-schedule is now in use.

* * *

The special goodwill programs from Havana are now being released on Monday and Thursday evenings from 8 to 9 o'clock. The broadcast goes out over fourteen long and short wave stations, the connecting land lines for the network being furnished by the Cuban Telephone Company. English announcements are made by one Jack Rice, and music is by the combined efforts of 62 members of the Cuban Army Band. Best bets for West Coast listeners are COCO on 6.01 meg. or COCD on 6.13 meg.

* * *

HRN of Tegucigalpa, Honduras, is operating exactly on 5.875 meg., according to the versatile announcer, and broadcasts daily until 7 p. m., signing off with Ted Lewis' famous "Goodnight Waltz." On Sunday evening, the station presents what it calls its "American Appreciation Hour" from 7 to 8 p. m., with all announcements in English.

* * *

Incidentally, a great many South American broadcasters have been remaining on the air as late as 9 or 10 o'clock in the evening with experimental programs. Most of these stations may be picked up between 5.80 and 6.80 meg.

HJ4ABE of Medellin, Colombia, is one of the most interesting of these Spanish-speaking transmitters, and the amusing announcer will dedicate anything from a farm moratorium to a wedding anniversary. Requests are received between 7 and 8 p. m. via cable, phone, or mail.

ORK of Brussels, Belgium, is again being received on 10.34 meg. from 10:30 a. m. to noon with fair signal strength.
