

Good Will Toward Men

THAT a glorious thing it is that on Christmas morning we can take to the wings of radio and figuratively transplant ourselves in the midst of Yuletide festivities in any clime or country on the globe where the jubilee of the birth of the Prince of Peace and Christianity is being observed.

It is an equally wondrous thing that so many of the isolated inhabitants of the Christian world will be able in greater number than ever before to join in the services, listen to inspiring concerts and dramas which will be broadcast from metropolitan centers on this Christmas

We close our eyes as we sit deep in an upholstered chair in front of the radio. What strange sights greet our vision. Christmas on a storm-tossed ship at sea; Admiral Byrd and his crew in the antarctic; Big Ben chiming a greeting to all the world from London; an Old World pageant of Christian devotionalism. Yes, and into the homes of tenements and squalid mountain cabins, where the Christian spirit has raised itself to its full height and brought a taste of happiness to the less fortunate, at least for the day.

The spirit of Christmas is better typified by radio than anything else developed by the mind of man since the birth of Christ. Radio is a very real Santa Claus. We accept its wonders with a childlike faith-wonders we cannot understand nor fathom.

Radio has done more to establish "peace on earth, good will toward men" than any other agency-and the end is not yet. Strife and ill will toward men and nations is largely the result of misunderstandings. Until men understand and enter into a common bond of sympathy, until the barriers of prejudice and intolerance are broken down, universal peace and good will cannot exist. And this, in time, radio must bring about. It is hampered by no international barriers-it crosses all human boundaries.

Again, as in the past, we leave the thought at this Christmas time, of the potential power for good that a chain of radiocast stations encircling the globe could exert; reaching all peoples, not only with certain forms of universally comprehended entertainment and international music, but to transmit the gospel of peace and good will. Such an agency, under the direction of an international peace foundation, would go far to combat the hatreds and distrusts now rampant and bring about a community of interests throughout the world that would make wars impossible.

MICROPHONE GOSSIP

- • Robert Sherwood, who has been heard in various radio productions on local stations, has been signed as an announcer at KHJ. He is a graduate of Franklin High School, Los Angeles. In 1927 and 1928 Sherwood played an oboe in the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. He also was with Raymond Paige, KHJ musical director, when the latter was conducting theater orchestras in Los Angeles.
- • Married seven years, in the show business, and together every day except one, is the proud record of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Penner. "The one day," Joe explains, "occurred when Paul Whiteman and I had a golfing date in the early morning after a theatrical date. We drove out to the club, stayed over night, played in the morning, and then were back in time for the noon show." "Yes," Paul checks.
- • Tom Coakley, maestro of the Palace Hotel orchestra, heard over NBC, is not going East and is not giving up his musical career for law. When first rumors that he had accepted a flattering offer from a New York sponsor drifted to Tom's ears he denied the story as flattering, but untrue. Then he was admitted to practice in the Federal courts the other day and another rumor started—that he was going to devote all his time hereafter to his legal activities. As proof that it is untrue, Tom produces the new contract which he has just signed with the Palace Hotel. So far he has managed to fit in his legal work with his music, and he expects to continue doing so. He is an associate of John L. McNab, nationally famed San Francisco attorney.
- • Wayne Frederick of the Clef Dwellers is going around humming lullabies under his breath. It's a boy, at the Children's Hospital, where Mrs. Frederick and the seven and three-quarter-pounder are doing well. Cost his father five dollars—who bet his brother, Earl Frederick, it would be a girl. And Sydney Dixon, in charge of local sales in NBC's San Francisco headquarters, also is beaming and passing out cigars to celebrate the advent of young Laurence Fergin Dixon.
- • Prince George of England, whose marriage to Princess Marina of Greece recently was the high spot of the international calendar, once saved Joan Blaine, NBC actress heard on Princess Pat and other programs, a lot of embarrassment. It happened at Banff, where Joan was to entertain at tea for Prince George and his brother, the Prince

- of Wales. Joan went for a hike in the forenoon. A sudden rain squall sent her scurrying for cover on a golf course only to find it
 already occupied by two soaked and bedraggled individuals. They turned out to be
 the royal brothers. While Joan and the
 Prince of Wales stood confused and blushing, the younger George just snickered out
 loud and broke the ice. Everybody laughed

- • Studio engineers of KJBS and KQW have started work on changing over the two stations preparatory to tests which will begin shortly on higher power experiments. After January 1 KJBS becomes a 500-watt broadcaster and KQW a 1,000-watter. The tests will be conducted after reguler broadcasting hours, according to Jack Burrell, chief engineer of the Northern California Broadcasting System, which operates KJBS and KQW.
- • If you want to please Jane Froman, the lovely lark of the air waves, just call her "Mrs. Ross" the next time you meet her. The singer has been known for so long as Miss Froman that she is agreeably surprised whenever someone addresses her by her married name. She and Don Ross, the CBS baritone, have been wedded for five years.
- • A radio romance came to light in the NBC studios this week when the engagement of Muriel Wilson and Fred Hufsmith was announced. Miss Wilson, soprano star of the Maxwell House Show Boat, met Hufsmith, a popular NBC tenor, three years ago at a rehearsal for an early morning program. On Thanksgiving Day they announced the engagement at a dinner attended by both families. When Miss Wilson appeared in the studios wearing a diamond solitaire the news was out.
- • Murray Bolen, of the Murray and Harris rhythm comedy team, heard over KFRC and the Columbia-Don Lee network in a variety of programs, has sung with Bing Crosby, Vera Van, the Boswells, and was one of a trio with Russ Columbo. . . .
- • MacGregor and Sollie Electrical Transcription Studios of San Francisco have recently completed a series of fifteen-minute transcriptions for the Moscow Movement. The program features psychological discussions by Dr. Frank B. Robinson, member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and Fellow of the American Society for Physical Research. - • Listeners sometimes expect radio performers to help them with their affairs of the heart. Robert Simmons, the tenor and member of the Revelers, received a request to "sing 'Love Thy Neighbor' next Wednesday night, because I am going to propose to the girl next door." Two days later Simmons received a note from the same correspondent: "Thanks just the same, but, you don't need to sing 'Love Thy Neighbor.' The girl eloped with an electrician."
- • Laurance Cross, "Colonel" of the Crosscuts from the Log o' the Day program, celebrated his fifth year on the air on Thanksgiving Day. This broadcast was the one thousand, six hundred and fiftieth one he has presented with the Southern Harmony Four and other artists assisting in his reproduction of a scene in the deep woods of the South. Crosscuts is heard transcontinentally on Tuesdays.
- • David Broekman, composer of the symphony, "Harlem Heab'n," and nationally known orchestra director, has been signed as a staff conductor for KHJ and the Columbia-Don Lee network, according to an announcement today by Thomas Lee, president of the Don Lee Broadcasting System. Broekman will be an addition to the KHJ musical staff, as none of the present directors are being replaced.
- • A radio star's fan mail occasionally brings in a gift of unsuspected value. Jane Froman recently received a copy of "Godey's Ladies Book" from an admiring fan in the Southwest who thought the old fashions might interest the NBC star, who designs her own wardrobe. Jane returned the book with a note explaining to the kindly lady that it was much too valuable a gift for her to accept and suggesting that the fan get in touch with an antique dealer, who would be only too glad to take it off her hands at a handsome price.
- • Al Pearce Briefetts: Walter Kelsey is writing a symphony; Al Pearce artists who have been guests on the Rudy Vallee hour include Mable Todd, Johnny Kiado, Tony Romano, and the Three Cheers. Tony Romano is making records with Bing Crosby. Carlyle Bennett's success on the Al Pearce program has signed him a movie contract which will take all of his time.
- • Tony Wons, star of the NBC House by the Side of the Road program, hasn't a golf club and doesn't play golf, but he is learning all about the game, nevertheless. All he does is sit back in his office and watch an attorney across the way practice the game in his office in spare moments. The view is so good and the practice so frequent that Wons is tempted to go out some day and try out his newly acquired knowledge.

- • George Gershwin had to ask permission to play one of his own tunes in his CBS program last week, because of a network rule designed to eliminate excessive duplication of musical numbers in one evening's program.
- • Dee J. Ball, who pens these scripts "Joan of Arc," "The Shadows of Kali-om" and others, has been appointed to the KYA staff as continuity writer. He has a long record of successful writing behind him and is possessed of many qualities that suit him to radio.
- • Blakley Quin is the new junior staff member of KJBS. Weighing eight pounds and the son of Scott Blakley Quin, of the KJBS commercial department, the newcomer made his advent into the world on December 6. His proud dad was known to early KFRC listeners as Scott Blakley. He was also at one time an entertainer with Roxy's Gang in New York.
- • Just because two radio stars want to attend the Stanford-Alabama contest is no reason that their programs will not go on the air on New Year's night. Jean Carole and Bob May, KGGC, will be in the Southland for the big pigskin tournament, but the transcription-making department of the station has enabled their broadcasts to go on as usual.
- • Country ways appeal to Virginia Rea, the soprano star of the airwaves. The singer, who, in private life, is now Mrs. Edgar Sittig, chose a home in the mountains near Stroudsburg, Pa., so that she could rusticate in the seclusion of the countryside, far from city noise and distraction. However, Miss Rea doesn't spend all of her time at home. She is often seen at farm auctions, spelling bees and square dances, popular pastimes of the neighborhood which she and her husband now call home.
- • Speaking of All-American line-ups, take a glance at the staff of announcers at NBC's New York studios. Among them you'll find Kelvin Keech, born in Hawaii; Frank Singiser, brought up in India; Lyle Van, a native of Holland, and Alois Havrilla, who calls Pressov, in the Balkans, his home town
- • A parrot which yodels may be the next attraction in the Crosscuts program. Gertrude Lyne, who with Grace Frankel makes up NBC's piano team, a Pair of Pianos, has taken a fancy to Pal, the tiny gray parokeet, who is a member of Laurance Cross's bird choir, and every morning when she comes off the air she stops long enough to give him a lesson in yodeling. He is beginning to get the oo-le-ay effect pat, and practices it at intervals the whole day through.

NEWS and COMMENT

Beatrice Lillie, Lionel Barrymore and an array of radio, stage and screen stars will entertain the nation during the Nash Christmas Party on the Columbia network, Christmas Day (Tuesday), from 11:30 a. m. to 2:15 p. m., P.S.T. Other luminaries who will contribute to the Yuletide merriment include Ernestine Schumann-Heink, George Olsen's orchestra, Ethel Shutta, Kathryn Witmer and raconteur Alexander Woollcott, the master of ceremonies for the occasion.

In addition, Clyde Pangborn and Roscoe Turner, two noted air pilots, will regale listeners with several interesting aviation stories. Then there will be stirring songs by the Don Cossacks chorus of thirty-five voices, and the famous Apollo Club of Chicago, the oldest choral group in the Middle West with a roster of 200 singers.

Lionel Barrymore is making his first radio portrayal as old Scrooge in a presentation from Dickens' "A Christmas Carol." Mme. Schumann-Heink will sing "Silent Night."

The marathon Christmas party will come from New York, Chicago and Hollywood.

The addition of the three-hour period on New Year's Day will constitute radio's greatest combination of concentrated time, talent and coverage ever attempted by a single sponsor. This heralding of 1935 with entertainment galore also will come from New York, Chicago and Hollywood.

The complete talent assemblage and exact times for the Nash New Year's Day broad-

cast will be announced later.

Chico is about to retire.

No, Chico isn't one of the Marx Brothers. He's a canary bird, and probably one of the most famous in the country. He's nine years old now, and for years has been singing on Feminine Fancies, heard daily at 3 p. m. over KFRC and the Columbia-Don Lee network.

About five months ago Chico became a great grandfather, and so his owner, General Odabashian, thinks it's about time Chico was pensioned. Chico isn't a soloist. He has his own quartette, composed of four canaries— Chico, Junior, Jewel and Shooshan. Chico is tenor; Junior, baritone; Jewel, basso, and

Shooshan, soprano.

When Chico retires as leader of the famous KFRC canaries, his great grandson, Claude Sweeten, named after KFRC's musical director and master violinist, will succeed him as headman of the Canary Quartette. This little bird was born crippled. It's tiny leg is twisted so that it cannot hop. Friends urged General Odabashian to destroy the bird when it was born.

"I wouldn't do it," he said, "because I believed that it would become one of my best singers, and would bring happiness to thousands. It has never been in a cage and never will be. It has absolute freedom, and is

Wherever Odabashian goes the little canary goes with him. He carries it on his hand, and has a special food tray that fits

over his thumb.

The world premiere at the famous La Scala in Milan of a new opera by Pietro Mascagni, composer of "Cavalleria Rusticana," will be heard in part by music lovers in America in an international broadcast over National Broadcasting Company networks, following completion of arrangements now being made.

"Nerone," by the 70-year-old Mascagni, deals with the more human side of the notorious Roman emperor, with his aspirations and frustrations as poet, musician, actor and athlete, rather than with his political or regal life. The opera has been in preparation for several years and its premiere will be one of the outstanding musical events of the season.

According to plans now being worked out, microphones on the stage of La Scala will pick up the voices of the grand opera stars. Rome's powerful short wave station will then flash the music across the Atlantic, where it will be broadcast over NBC networks. The date of the first performance is set for Janu-

Mascagni leaped into fame over night with the production of his prize-winning opera, "Cavalleria Rusticana." Other works did not meet with such success, although his "Iris," based on a Japanese theme, has been performed at the Metropolitan in New York.

"La Pinotta," the manuscript of which was lost for more than fifty years, was produced

two years ago in Milan.

Release of the broadcast on the Pacific Coast will depend upon the time, which has not yet been determined.

The second annual nation-wide celebration of President Roosevelt's birthday on Wednesday, January 30, will be observed over the country's great radio networks by a full hour

program of party music and song.

Birthday balls will be held in cities, towns and villages from coast to coast in honor of the President, the proceeds from which will be used to further one of Mr. Roosevelt's chief interests, the fight against infantile paralysis. At 8:30 p. m., P. S. T., these community parties will tune in on the elaborate musical programs which will be broadcast over combined NBC and CBS networks and other millions of listeners in their homes will join in the celebration.

This year the radio program will feature

"folksy" music, melodies that everybody knows, which can either be sung or danced to. Several of radio's most popular orchestras will take turns in playing for the nationwide audience, and radio's star vocalists will

lead the singing.

More than 5,000 communities are expected to give benefit balls this year which will add approximately a million dollars to the war chest for the campaign of prevention and cure of infantile paralysis. Thirty per cent of the proceeds will be used for research, the other 70 per cent will go for the expansion of facilities for the treatment of cases in the communities in which the funds are raised.

As a result of the enthusiastic reception of "The Gumps," famous cartoon family, as characters of a radio series, the Columbia network over which they are heard daily except Saturday and Sunday from 9:15 to 9:30 a. m., have been increased from twenty CBS stations to a coast-to-coast link of forty-eight stations.

Sidney Smith's Gump family has been famous for the past seventeen years as a cartoon series and currently is syndicated to some 300 newspapers throughout the country. It is now extending its far-flung fame through the broadcast series, under the direction of Himan Brown. The experienced cast of radio actors bringing the black-and-white characters to life at the microphone includes Wilmer Walter as Andy Gump; Agnes Moorehead as his wife, Min; 13-year-old Lester Jay as Chester, son of the family; George Graham as Uncle Bim, and Edith Spencer as Tilda, maid and severest critic of the family. Because it possesses the human appeal and dramatic qualities that are fundamentals of a good radio script, rather than relying entirely on caricature on the "Zowie," "Bam" and "Socko" type of comedy, "The Gumps" is one of the few comic strips readily adaptable as a radio series. The programs, rather than presenting a ludicrous group of characters, portray the lighter side of a typical American family.

Those who sit in relaxed comfort twisting the radio dial during the stay-in rainy evenings would get a fuller significance of the reliance that citizens of remote districts put upon their radio receivers if they live in Little Squaw Camp in Colorado.

Here is a letter received by KNX the other day which tells a vivid story of the thousands of people whose only communication with the outside world is through the magic chan-

nels of the ether waves:

"We wish to express to you at this time (before we are snowed in for the winter), our appreciation of your news broadcasts. While we enjoy your other programs, we most particularly enjoy the news, as we are snowed in some five or six months during

the winter in the Rocky Mountains, at an elevation of 9,300 feet, thirty miles from the nearest town. We get no mail or papers during this period and must depend upon our radio set for our contact with the outside world. KNX is so generous with the news."

The letter was signed by the people of Little Squaw Camp, Colorado. Thus is written another incident in the great boon to

mankind-modern radio.

Two new contestants will be heard each week for nine weeks. During the following three weeks six semi-finalists will be presented again, and at the thirteenth broadcast the two winners will be featured.

THE Three Rhythm Kings—Hal Hopper, Chuck Lowry, and Woody Newbury—who are heard over KFRC and the Columbia-Don Lee network on the Blue Monday Jamboree and the Borden Friday Frolic, began singing those rhythms for which they are famed, in Alhambra, California, about three years ago.

Terry Dantzler, London's current sensation, heard them one night. He liked their harmony, and persuaded the youths to tour with his band and entertainers through the Southwest. Clubs, dances, theater dates followed, and then radio. Phil Harris heard them, and so began their first Cocoanut Grove engagement in Southern California. So successful were they, that Sid Lippman, Harris's successor at the "Grove," persuaded them to play another return engagement.

Their history from then on is familiar to most radio audiences—fact is, recently fan mail came from far off Turkestan. Even harems are rhythm-minded these days. The Three Rhythm Kings have been featured coast to coast on several of the biggest broadcasts—in fact, for over a year on the California Melodies alone, a Columbia Broadcasting System feature. Their success has not been confined only to radio, but to personal appearances in theaters—audiences approving tremendously.

And now as to personalities-

Hal Hopper is, like others of the trio, married to a non-professional. He is a keen student of music, and since his earliest school days in Alhambra has been singing, arranging, and composing. Chuck Lowry, matriculated in Alhambra, has been a lifelong pal of Hal—the boys going through school together. Chuck plays golf, loves to fish and hunt, and is a keen enthusiast of all outdoors. His musical talents are varied—plays with ease the guitar, piano and violin.

Woody has been, through his life, a theater executive, publicity director, and a composer. . . His first efforts were recorded when he was only fourteen years old. He is married, and believe it or not, he loves to go shopping with his wife. Musically

talented, he plays a number of stringed instruments. As hobbies, Woody collects phonograph recordings, paintings, and is deeply interested in Oriental life.

Although much of their life and work has taken place in or around Hollywood and Los Angeles, San Francisco is now the home of The Three Rhythm Kings. . . .

THE rare combination of beauty, brains and ability distinguishes Sylvia Jones, KOL's petite songstress. A strikingly beautiful brunette with brown curly hair and deep brown eyes, she is an honor graduate of Washington State College. In addition to her singing and acting, she takes her turn at operating KOL's busy private branch exchange.

She landed her first radio contract because she had to—a wager with her parents stipulating that if she did not get a job in Seattle within one month, she was to return to the family fireside at Tacoma, "never more to roam." With a girl chum, she came to Seattle in the fall of 1933 and before the four weeks had passed they had both achieved their goals.

Graduated from the School of Fine Arts at Washington State College, with several years' experience as leading soprano with both the Glee Club and Varsity Quartette, and with numerous successful school dramatic performances to her credit, Miss Jones was well equipped to enter radio. Her first engagement as an entertainer and singer with Wen Niles' Olympic Hotel Orchestra, with whom she frequently broadcasts over KOL, was followed by an appearance at the Metropolitan Theatre. She preferred radio, however, so accepted an offer from the Seattle CBS station a few weeks later, and has remained there to this day.

HANDWRITING

AND

Radio Personalities

By ZITA LOMAS

"GYPSY"

S a nice change, this week's victim will be outside of the musical realm. Gypsy is a literary gal. As most everyone knows, she interviews radio personalities—one every Sunday evening. And she's the one who writes it all up. That, however, is right in her line, for she used to run a "Questions and Answers" feature in this magazine.

Dear Miss Lomas-This requires courage but here goes. 94,554

NOTE: This handwriting is considerably reduced from original.

Her handwriting, which appears above, is a very typical example of the journalistic hand. It is large, scrawling and irregular, with long t-bars, and i-dots high and in advance of the letter. Such a writing reflects imagination, vivacity, enthusiasm, flowing ideas, and lucidity of expression.

Some of the capitals are joined to the letters following, while others are separated from them, and there are quite a few breaks within words. This means that both the perceptive and reflective faculties are well developed in her, and the combination gives clarity of vision, and good powers of observation, analysis, deduction and comparison. Read in conjunction with the basic style of the writing, it is a sign of a quick, active and alert mind.

This wide-spaced and very open type of large writing denotes an exceedingly frank, candid, generous nature, with a large share of charm and magnetism, and a spontaneous and expressive personality. There is no repression or constraint of any kind. Amiability, geniality, humor and "sparkle" are all clearly defined.

One reason why this writing is typical of journalists is because it shows lenience, tolerance, a very charitable attitude, and a complete absence of any hard, rigid or exacting standards. And journalists, in case you are unaware of the fact (but how could you be?), are notoriously broad-minded. Taking them all in all, they are quite literally dripping with kindly feeling, and warm, human sympathies. And that is exactly what Gypsy's handwriting typifies.

In graphology, the body of the writing shows the character, and the signature the personality, of the writer. In some cases, particularly of professional people, there is a difference. It is the professional self, contrasted with the actual self.

Here we have an interesting example. Gypsy writes her note, but prints her signature. The typographical form of the latter (each letter a distinct unit, standing alone) always reflects a feeling for exact form, and the impulse to clear, concise, fully-charged expression. It is so perfectly understandable as a part of Gypsy's "professional self" that it requires no comment.

Her long, firm t-bar reveals a good share of will-power, and considerable enterprise. However, she certainly needs PLENTY of will-power, with a temperament like hers. It takes a lot to keep so many fly-away qualities of enthusiasm, moodiness, impulse, restlessness and excitability in check!

Musical talent, but mostly in the line of "personality stuff," is shown in Gypsy's writing, too. She has a decided dramatic instinct.

In addition, the extremely wide curving of the strokes which form the bases of the letters, is a sign of faith and belief in extraordinary and unusual subjects. . . Hence a flair for mystic or occult things.
