SUBSTITUTE TUBES*

Circuit Changes to Use Available Tube Types in Converter and Second Detector Position

Tubes are holding up the delivery of the greatest part of sets being fixed. Until critical types become available in volume, it is necessary to use substitute types—or let the set remain dead. In some instances, this means rewiring, and/or changing sockets. Adapters can do the job nicely.

Any wiring changes should be accompanied by (1) a circuit diagram placed in the set or (2) a notice with a warning that certain changes have been made, and your name and address. For one thing this will help to bring the set back to you for further repairs.

In every case, it is important that you explain that it is necessary to substitute a tube and that changes will be made.

Replacing 12A8

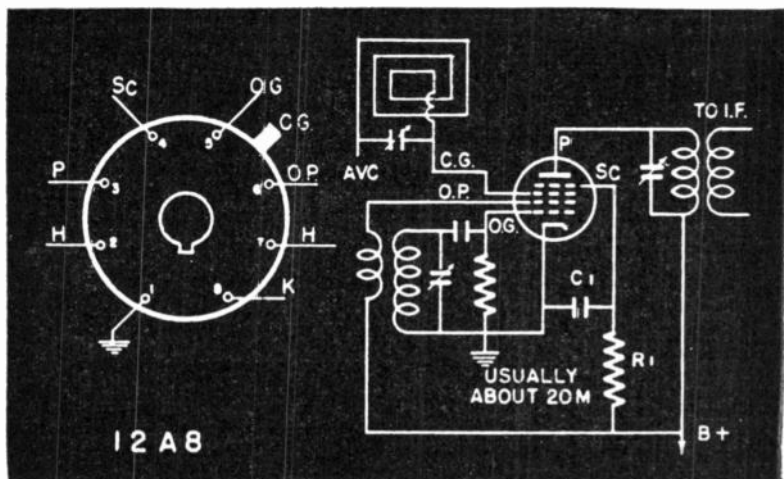


Fig. 1—Conventional 12A8 converter circuit using tickler feedback oscillator and loop RF coil.

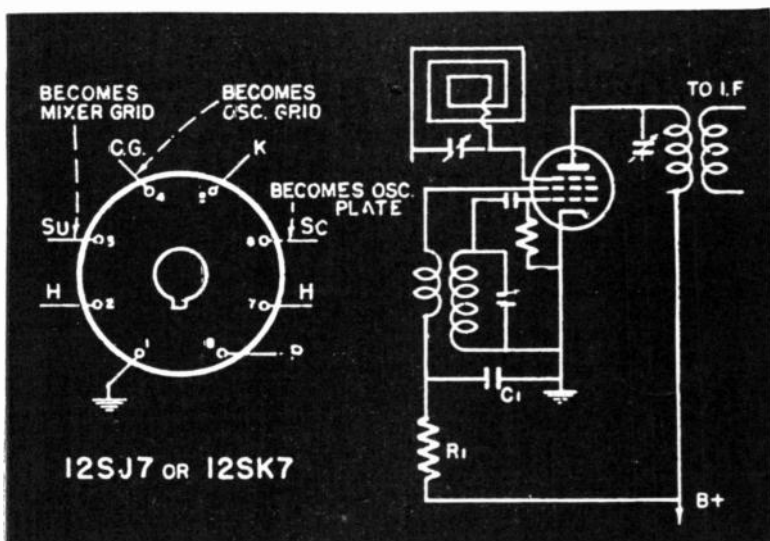


Fig. 2—Changeover circuit using 12SK7 or 12SJ7 to replace 12A8. Sensitivity is considerably reduced with this circuit.

Referring to Fig. 1, the circuit shows the 12A8 original base diagram and conventional converter. R1 and C1 are not always in the original wiring, but the great majority of receivers using this tube contain both of these parts, R1 averaging about 20M and C1 about 0.01 mfd. In changing to the 12SJ7 or 12SK7, as shown in Fig. 2, it is recommended that this simple changeover be used on sets with an antenna coil and short antenna, rather than sets with a loop. Experience shows much better performance with the former, although in an emergency the changeover can be made with loop sets. The receiver becomes a strictly local set with this changeover. Change wires in the following order:

(1) Connections to socket pins 1, 2, 6, and 7 are left alone. (2) Lift leads from No. 4 and connect B plus

otherwise, a desensitizing negative voltage will be fed back along this bus to the IF stages.

end of oscillator plate coil, cutting off original B plus lead. (3) Move leads from No. 5 to No. 4. (4) Move leads from No. 8 to No. 5. (5) Move lead from No. 3 to No. 8. (6) If possible, remove grid cap lead from top of tuning gang section and connect between bottom of stator and lug 3 on socket. Otherwise, cut off grid cap and extend lead to reach lug 3. (7) Realign.

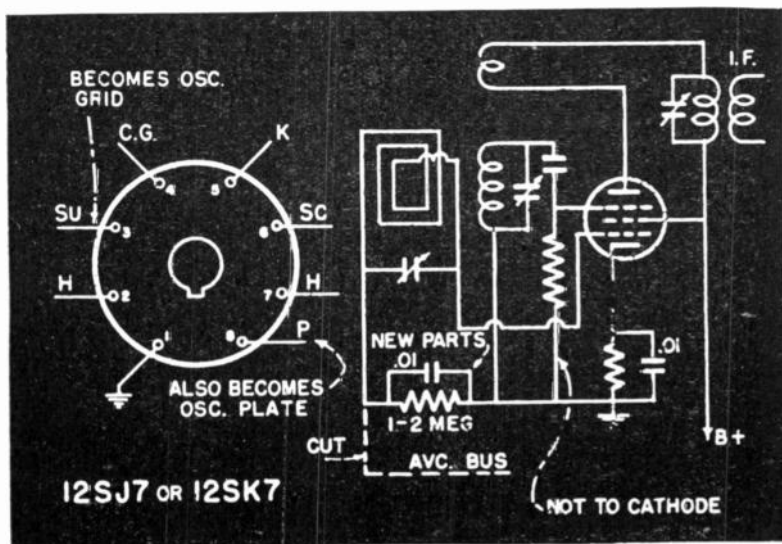


Fig. 3—Another circuit for change from 12A8 to 12SK7 or 12SJ7. Note oscillator tickler in series with IF primary.

The changeover for the 12A8 to 12SJ7 or 12SK7 shown in Fig. 3 is a little more complicated, but will give better performance than Fig. 2 with less converter hiss. Here the mixer plate also becomes the oscillator plate, and the suppressor becomes the oscillator grid. Two new parts are required, a 1-2 meg 1/2 watt resistor, and an 0.01 mfd capacitor. The AVC bus is disconnected as shown,

(1) Connections to socket pins 1, 2, and 7 remain the same. (2) Lift IF plate coil lead from lug 3 and connect to B plus end of oscillator plate coil, cutting off original B plus lead. (3) Move lead from lug 5 to No. 3 just vacated. (4) Move leads (cathode) from lug 8 to No. 5. (5) Move lead from lug 6 to No. 8. (6) Move screen leads from lug 4 to No. 6. (7) Cut off control grid cap and connect to lug 4. (8) Realign. Notice that grid leak does not return to cathode, but to circuit ground, unless no cathode resistor is incorporated in original circuit.

Circuits for 12SA7

A simple changeover, similar to that used in Fig. 2, can be used in changing the 12SA7 to 12SJ7 or (Continued on page 7)

12SK7, and is recommended only for emergency use, especially if receiver is other than a loop type. Circuit is not shown but changes are very easy.

(1) Interchange No. 8 and No. 3 wires. (2) Lift screen connection from No. 4 temporarily. (3) Lift oscillator grid from No. 5 and connect to No. 4. (4) Lift cathode from No. 6 and connect to No. 5. (5) Reconnect screen (lifted from No. 4) to No. 6. (6) Realign.

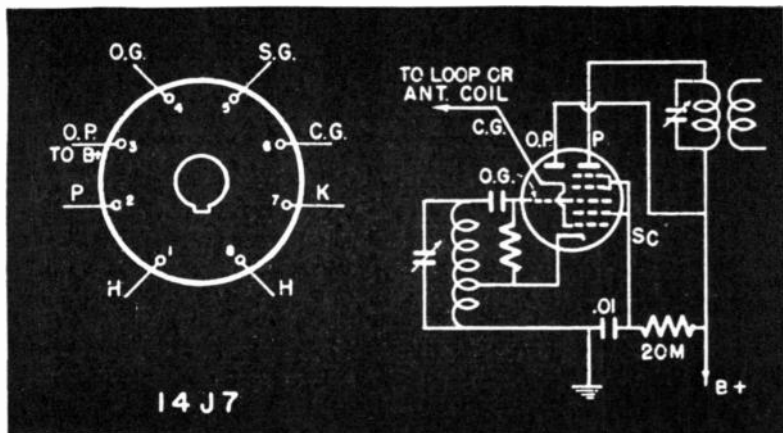


Fig. 4—A 12SA7 may be replaced by 14J7. Above circuit for Hartley type oscillators. The 12A8 can also be replaced by this tube.

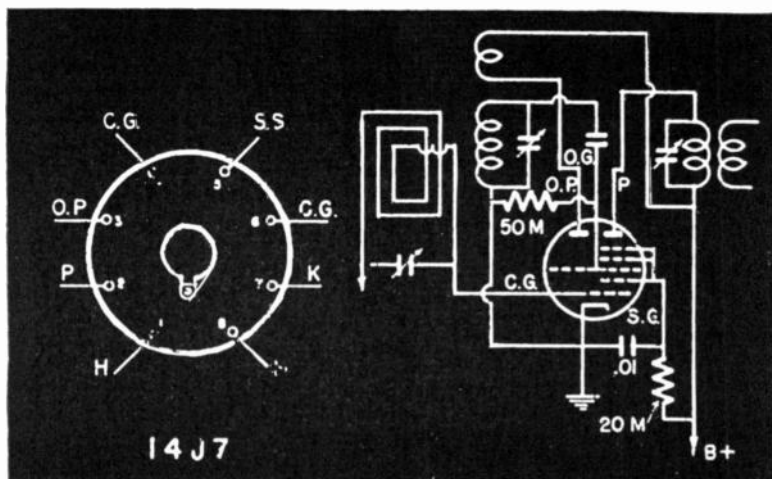


Fig. 5—Tickler type oscillator coil should be connected as above to change from 12SA7 and 12A8 to 14J7. Use 75 M oscillator grid resistor.

Using a 14J7, some of which are still available, and a loctal socket, a good changeover from either 12A8 or 12SA7 can be made. These are shown in Fig. 4 and Fig. 5. While the circuits explain themselves, a step by step procedure for the 12SA7 is given below. If any of these circuits are slow in starting, raise the oscillator grid leak to 50 or 75 thousand ohms.

Changes for 12SA7 to 14J7: (1) Change octal to loctal socket. (2)

Connect heaters to No. 1 and No. 8 (these were No. 2 and 7 on 12SA7). (3) Mixer plate, which was No. 3 on octal socket, now connects to No. 2. (4) No. 3 pin connect directly to B plus. (5) Oscillator grid goes to No. 4. This was No. 5 on octal socket. (6) No. 5 on new socket goes to B plus thru a 20M resistor, bypassed to chassis ground as shown in sketch, by 0.01 mfd. capacitor. (7) No. 6 goes to loop or antenna coil (whichever is used) high lead. (8) Lug No. 7 becomes the cathode (this was No. 6 on old socket). (9) Realign.

Types for 14B6 and 75

In circuit of Fig. 5, change oscillator grid leak to 75M for best results. Insert 20M screen resistor and bypass capacitor as shown, if not in original circuit wiring.

Another scarce tube seems to be the 14B5. This can be directly re-

placed by the 7C6, which has the same filament drain in a series string, but insert a 50— ohm 2-watt resistor between the heater and the next tube in line.

Type 75 tubes are very scarce in most parts of the country. This can be replaced by the 6Q7GT or 6Q7G,

whichever is available, by changing the socket to octal and rewiring, following the base diagrams for the two tubes. The 7C6 can be used for either one of the above if they are operated from a transformer and NOT in a series string because of the different current taken by the 7C6. However,

the 6Q7 and 75 are interchangeable, if receiver is rewired, whether in series or parallel operation.

Factors in Frequency Stability of Local Oscillators

Space-charge coupling between signal and oscillator grids is very much less in hexode than in heptode type frequency changers. The use of a neutralizing capacitance about 1 μmF may be used in the latter case.

Stray capacitance coupling between the signal and oscillator grids must be avoided if the tuning of the signal circuit is not appreciably to affect the oscillator operation on the short wave ranges.

Oscillator Stability

The following summarizes the steps which may be taken to increase the frequency stability of the oscillator.

1. A tube having a high G_m and high R_p is required.

2. Grid current should be as low as possible, i.e., a high grid self-bias resistance, provided "squegging" is not experienced, and feedback coupling only just sufficient to sustain oscillation at the required amplitude are necessary.

3. The coil resistance should be as low as possible.

4. The L/C ratio is required to be low so that variations of stray capacitance and load reflected from the frequency changer have less effect. Too low a value, however, makes oscillation difficult. Except in band-spread receivers with fixed signal tuning, and push-button operated receivers, the values of L and C are fixed by ganging considerations, and little control is possible.

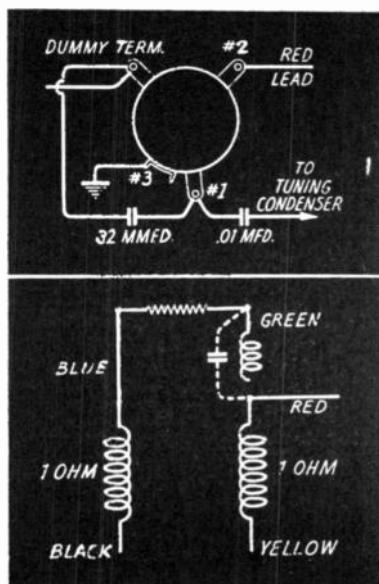
5. The use of a phase-correcting reactance is not feasible as it is only suitable for fixed-frequency operation.

6. The feedback coupling, if a coil, should have the smallest value of coil inductance with maximum value of mutual inductance coupling to the tuned LC circuit.

7. The tuned circuit should be loosely coupled to the tube, i.e., the tube should be connected across a part of the tuning inductance, and tuned anode is preferable to tuned grid because space-charge capacitance changes are greatest at the grid electrode.

The B+ supply should be adequately decoupled and smoothed. The possibility of audio-frequency feedback from the power output stage may be reduced by a push-pull audio-output connection.

9. Temperature-frequency variations are reduced by mounting inductances and capacitances away from such sources of heat as the power transformer, the power output and rectifier tubes. Low-loss coil formers of ceramic material are to be recommended. Different rates of radial and axial expansion for the coil are a possible means of reducing the temperature effect. High-loss insulators must be avoided as these almost always have high positive temperature



coefficients. Rigid mechanical construction of coils, variable capacitors, range switches and wiring is very necessary.

10. Compensation by a capacitance having a negative temperature coefficient may be provided.

11. Humidity effects demand the use of non-hygroscopic insulating material, waxes, and varnish.

12. The optimum oscillator voltage required by the frequency changer should be as low as possible, as this allows loose coupling to and reduces the load reflected from the frequency changer into oscillator tuned circuit.

13. A frequency correcting device may be connected to the oscillator in order to introduce additional reactance in parallel with the LC circuit as the frequency tends to vary from

its correct setting. The magnitude of the reactance is determined by the amount of error, and high initial frequency errors may be reduced to quite small values. Thus an uncorrected oscillator frequency error of 20 kc/s can be reduced to a final error of only about 200 c.p.s.

This material on oscillator stability is from "Radio Receiver Design," a new book published by John Wiley & Sons, N. Y.

Replacement Oscillator Coils

Oscillator coil used in RCA 45E is an alternate for No. 35116 in 45X1 and 45X2, using connections in upper diagram. Oscillator coil RCA No. 38338 is replacement for 34443. Green lead is capacitor winding and if not used, should be replaced by 50 μ mf shown dotted.
