FOOLPROOFING BATTERY-OPERATED EQUIPMENT

There are many instances in which battery-operated equipment is to be preferred to apparatus operated from the power line. The most obvious examples are complete portability and field operation remote from power lines. Additionally, separate battery operation of each instrument in a test setup eliminates (or at least greatly minimizes) troublesome interaction and stray coupling often caused by operating all of the instruments from the power line. Another advantage of battery operation is its elimination of hum generation and much of noise generation. Equipment powered by dry batteries often is lighter in weight, smaller in size, and cooler operating than comparable equipment containing built-in a-c power supplies.

Since these advantages are so obvious, it might seem strange that electronic equipment is so infrequently operated from batteries. However, the reasons are equally obvious: In some

circuits, the current drain is too high for battery supply to be feasible. In moderate-current applications, the replacement of A and B batteries is comparatively expensive and has some nuisance value. This disadvantage is intensified when a set of batteries is lost through burnout when an unused instrument is left running.

While no system of foolproofing is 100% dependable, a few schemes are available for protecting battery-operated equipment from human error. One or more of these schemes may be enlisted to insure full service from batteries in such equipment. This article describes several practical methods.

2-Sided Approach

There are two approaches to the problem: (1) monitoring the equipment so that the operator knows when it is switched on, and (2) use of automatic protective devices in the circuit to prevent its accidental activation during idle periods. In power-




Fig. 1. Use of Pilot-Light Battery.

line-operated equipment, neither of these schemes poses any difficulty in application, since enough extra power is available to operate pilot lights and time switches, and the apparatus cannot be stored in operation, because it first must be disconnected from the power line.

In battery-operated equipment, on the contrary, monitoring or protective devices must draw little or no current for their exclusive operation, otherwise the objective of prolonged battery life will be defeated.

Monitoring Devices

The simplest monitoring device common in electronic equipment and which causes little annoyance to the operator is the pilot light. These lights are absent in so many battery-operated instruments simply because the lamps draw too much current. In some cases, the pilot lamp requires as much current as the instrument circuit itself.

The following paragraphs describe several schemes for operating pilot lights more economically. Several monitoring devices requiring no additional current also are described. Low- Drain Lamps. Since a large amount of light is not needed, the

pilot lamp may be operated at reduced current through a resistor from the A-battery. There is no need, for example, to operate a 6-volt lamp from the 6-volt A-battery. A 5000-ohm miniature wirewound rheostat in series with a 6-volt, 150-ma (brown bead) lamp makes an excellent brightness control. Set this control for the desired brilliance and leave it.

Another scheme is to use the lowestcurrent lamp. This is the 2-volt, 60-ma (pink bead) type. This lamp may be operated directly from a 1½-volt Abattery. It may be run also from higher - voltage A - batteries, provided the following values of series resistance are inserted: 7½ v, 92 ohms; 6 v, 67 ohms; 4½ v, 42 ohms; and 3 v, 17 ohms.

Lamp With Separate Battery. A pilot light may be operated from a separate battery. Figure 1 shows this scheme. A dpst ON-OFF switch is employed in the instrument and one section handles the lamp circuit. A No. 49 lamp (2 v, 60 ma) is used with a 1½-volt Size D flashlight cell. This is an economical arrangement, since the Size-D cell will operate the No. 49 lamp continuously for approximately 40 hours on an 8-hour-per-day basis. This is a much more severe drain than




Fig. 2. Flashing Neon Pilot Light.

that encountered in the normal intermittent use of an instrument

Neon Pilot. A low-power neon lamp makes an excellent pilot light which can be operated from the B-battery in an instrument. Types NE-2 and NE-51 are rated at 1/25 watt. Type NE-2 is a miniature pigtail-type, and Type NE-51 has a bayonet base. Without external resistors, these lamps may be operated from a d-c source as low as 60 v and they draw approximately ½ milliampere.

Flashing Neon Lamp. A flashing lamp is a good attention catcher. A neon pilot lamp can be made to flash by connecting it in a simple resistance-capacitance oscillator circuit operated from the B-battery in an instrument. Only one capacitor and one resistor are required to complete the circuit.

Figure 2 shows the flashing-lamp circuit. The flashing rate is governed by the R and C values and by the applied d-c voltage. With R 1 megohm and C 0.1 microfarad, as indicated in Figure 2, one flash per second is obtained when the d-c supply is 67½ v, 2 per second for 90 v, and 5 per second for 135 volts. At any voltage

level, the rate may be increased by decreasing resistance R_i or may be decreased by increasing R.

This type of pilot places very little drain on the battery, since the lamp is off at least half of the time. It has the slight disadvantage, however, that its on-off action sometimes generates an interfering noise pulse in sensitive instrument circuits.

Output Meter as Pilot Indicator. In battery-operated oscillators and signal generators, an output meter will serve as a pilot device to warn that the instrument is switched-on, as well as filling its primary purpose of indicating signal output levels. Its particular advantage as a monitoring device lies in the absence of any power demand for the monitoring function.

The output meter therefore should be incorporated in all battery-operated generators whenever there is room for it. In most instances, a simple germanium diode-type meter will suffice. This instrument has the advantage of wide frequency response, being operable from r-f as well as a-f sources.




Fig. 3. AF-RF Output Meter.

Figure 3 shows the circuit of a basic af-rf output meter. A 0-1 d-c




Fig. 4. Switch Flag

milliammeter in this setup gives fullscale deflection for an applied signalinput voltage of 0.6 v rms. Increased sensitivity may be obtained by substituting a d-c microammeter for the milliammeter. Suitable multiplier resistors may be connected in series with input terminal X to increase the voltmeter range.

When the generator output contains a d-c component, a blocking capacitor, C₁, must be inserted into the circuit to prevent erroneous deflection of the meter and possible damage to the diodes and meter.

Plate Milliammeter as Pilot Indicator. Like the output meter, a d-c milliammeter in series with the B-plus line of the instrument circuit will serve as a pilot device without demanding any current other than that already flowing in the circuit. In addition to warning that the instrument is in operation, this meter will give a continuous, rough indication of the condition of the batteries.

Switch Flags. Attention-catching, nonelectrical devices to warn that an instrument is switched-on can be made quite simple. Although they usually are not as forceful as lamps, they provide an alternative in those instances in which any additional current drain is prohibited. One of the most effective of these devices is the switch flag.

Figure 4 shows how a flag may be attached to a rotary-type ON-OFF switch. The flag here is a small triangular vane of metal, plastic, or paper colored to contrast sharply with the shade of the instrument panel and mounted on the shaft of the switch. The switch must be recessed behind the panel to employ this scheme. The vane stands behind a small window hole in the panel when the switch is in its ON position, and is clearly seen. It is shifted away from the window, as it appears in Figure 4, when the switch is at OFF.




Fig. 5. Glowing Switch Marker.

Another type of flagging which is applicable to the toggle switch is illustrated by Figure 5. A strip of the phosphorescent adhesive tape ob-

tainable from automobile accessories stores is applied to the under side of the lever of the toggle switch. When the switch is thrown to its upper ON position, this tape is exposed and readily attracts attention by its bright glow. When the switch is thrown to its lower OFF position, the tape is completely hidden. Even in moderate room lighting, this gives the illusion of a glowing pilot lamp.

Protective Measures




Fig. 6. Lid-Operated Switch.

Lid-Operated Switch. Figure 6 shows an arrangement in which the ON-OFF switch is thrown to its OFF position automatically when the cover or lid of the instrument is closed. This makes it impossible to store the instrument "live" unless the cover is left off.

For this application, the switch must be of the pull-on type. A short post is attached to the inside of the lid directly opposite the switch so as to press down on the latter and throw it to its OFF position when the lid

is fastened in its closed position. With a little ingenuity, a tapered post may be arranged to throw a toggle switch.

This system presupposes that the cover is replaced on the instrument after usage. But this usually is true only when the instrument is returned to the shelf. When an instrument is left in a test setup overnight, covers ordinarily are left off.

Time Switch. A small timer, driven by mechanical clockwork, for switching-off batteries after a reasonable operating time is invaluable. A number of years ago, such timers were common but today are not as readily obtainable as the electric-clock type. When suitable machine shop facilities are available, a mechanical timer may be made from a small clock and installed in an important battery-operated instrument.

Immediately after the instrument is placed into service, the timer is set for an interval of 1, 2, or 3 hours, at the end of which it automatically will open the battery circuit. If the test runs for a longer time, the timer can be re-set. If the operator forgets to switch the instrument off at the end of the test or day, the timer will do so automatically a short time later. While some overdrain results, since the timer keeps the instrument running until automatic shutoff occurs, it is not nearly as injurious as having the batteries completely exhausted from a prolonged drain.

Fusing. While well-designed line-operated equipment always is adequately fused, battery-operated apparatus seldom is. Fusing is essential in battery equipment, however, since internal

short circuits not only burn out batteries quickly but often cause them to leak as well.

Miniature, instrument-type fuses for protecting B-battery circuits (plates, screens, etc.) are available in ratings from 2 to 62½ milliamperes. Similar fuses of higher rating are available for protection of A-battery circuits, the value selected depending upon the number of filaments operated. A suggested rule of thumb is to choose a current rating equal to twice the normal, total filament current drain.

Transistorization of Circuits

A very effective way to reduce current drain in battery-operated equipment is to transistorize the circuitry. Admittedly, not all circuits are amenable to transistorization; but wherever possible in the design of new battery-operated equipment, transistors should be used.

Some transistorized circuits, especially those employing only one or two transistors, draw such a small amount of current that they may be left running (either intentionally or accidentally) for long periods of time without materially reducing the normal service life of the battery. Some designers have questioned the necessity of an ON-OFF switch in such circuits.

A further advantage of transistorized circuits is their low voltage requirement. This means that satisfactory operation often is obtainable with one or more inexpensive flash-light cells. Single-battery operation is still another advantage.

Storage Batteries

Miniature, storage A-batteries have been used in some battery-operated equipment, especially when high-current filaments are employed. These units have the obvious advantage of being chargeable. The small storage battery is very familiar in portable, electronic photoflash units. However, there is at present no comparable midget storage B-battery. The A-battery solves only half of the problem.

The packaging of instruments employing storage batteries must offer adequate venting, in order to circumvent the corrosive effects of fumes generated by the battery. The battery construction must be such that the electrolyte will not be spilled when the battery is tipped from its vertical position.






