## A NEW MODULATION MONITOR

An oscilloscope ordinarily is used for amplitude-modulation measurements in the laboratory. The technique is well known and has been described, in its various phases, in earlier issues of the C-D CAPACITOR. When time does not permit the several manipulations and calculations required in the oscilloscope method, or when the modulation percentage is changing rapidly, the oscilloscope no longer is practical as a modulation monitor and the direct-reading percent modulation meter is demanded. Thus, the meter-type monitor is invaluable in radio-telephone stations.

Several types of modulation monitor circuits have been developed and are in wide use at this writing. Each

employs some method of comparing the modulation envelope amplitude to the carrier component of the a-m wave. By making provision for setting the carrier intensity to a predetermined level, the instrument becomes direct-reading in modulation percentage while actually sampling the modulation envelope voltage.

The commercial instrument employs a diode demodulator and carrier filter followed by an audio-frequency vacuum-tube voltmeter. Various amateur instruments differ only in their use of a simple, crystal diode-type voltmeter in place of the vtvm. Also, an iron-core coupling transformer is required for voltmeter impedance matching in the amateur circuit.

A disadvantage of the professional monitor is its significant power requirement and the necessity that it be connected to the power line. Although the amateur instrument needs no power supply, it has low sensitivity (necessitating close coupling to the transmitter under test) and requires a special coupling transformer which is not readily obtained. These factors led to the development of the instrument described in this article.

Here, an amplitude-modulated signal (Waveform A) is applied to the input terminals of the circuit by means of a coupling coil, tuned circuit, or antenna. The unilateral conductivity of the diode detector, D, results in transmission only of the positive half (Waveform B) of the modulated signal. The rectified waveform is presented to the radio-frequency filter ( $C_1$ -RFC- $C_2$ ) which removes the high-frequency carrier component but trans-




Fig. 2. Basic Circuit of Modulation Monitor.

#### Operating Principle

The skeleton diagram, Figure 2, illustrates the basic operating principle of the conventional modulation monitor.

mits the low-frequency modulation envelope (Waveform C).

The d-c milliammeter, M, indicates the rectified component of the signal. This direct current is proportional to the average value of the carrier and does not vary during distortionless modulation in the absence of carrier shift. The modulation envelope develops an a-c voltage drop (Waveform C) across the load resistor, R. This voltage drop is indicated by the




Fig. 3. Complete Circuit of Transistorized Modulation Monitor.

vacuum-tube voltmeter which must be insensitive to the r-f carrier.

The modulation factor is equal to the ratio of the peak modulating voltage ( $E_m$ ) to the peak carrier voltage ( $E_c$ ). At 100-percent modulation,  $E_m = E_c$ . In a fixed load resistance, the peak modulating current also equals the peak carrier current. Thus, if the carrier intensity (as transmitted through the monitor) always is adjusted to a predetermined level, as shown by the average carrier reading of the milliammeter,  $M$ , the vacuum-tube voltmeter deflection may be read as a certain modulation percentage and the scale of this instrument may be graduated to read directly in percent modulation.

In the instrument described in this article, the diode tube,  $D_1$  has been replaced with a germanium diode and the electronic voltmeter has been transistorized for low current drain and therefore economical battery operation. The transistors employed are insensitive to radio-frequencies of the magnitude of radiotelephone carriers, so transistorization is an asset here in the design of this a-f voltmeter.

### Complete Circuit

Figure 3 shows the complete circuit of the modulation monitor employing semiconductor components in each stage. The demodulator diode is  $D_1$ , the 2-stage voltmeter amplifier contains two CK722 transistors ( $V_1$  and  $V_2$ ), and diodes  $D_2$  and  $D_3$  form the meter rectifier.

The input system consists of coupling capacitor  $C_1$  and the tuned circuit LC. Coil  $L$  is wound to resonate with  $C_2$  (at its 75-uufd setting) at the carrier frequency. The coil is center-

tapped for a more favorable impedance match to diode  $D_1$ . The MODULATED R-F INPUT terminals may be connected to a whip antenna (with or without an external ground), or to a length of wire. The open-circuit jack, J, is provided for plugging in the vertical amplifier input of an oscilloscope for calibration and for occasional visual observation of the modulated waveform.

The demodulator output is presented to the low-pass r-f filter ( $C_3$ -RFC- $C_4$ ) which has a cutoff frequency of approximately 150 kc. This filter is terminated with the rheostat  $R_1$ . When switch  $S_1$  is thrown to its right (CARRIER) position, the d-c microammeter (M) is connected across  $R_1$  and reads the rectified d-c component. Since  $R_1$  shunts the meter in this position, it acts as a range multiplier. This rheostat accordingly is set for full-scale deflection of the meter. This is a convenient method for standard-

izing the carrier component in the instrument.

When switch  $S_1$  is at its left (% MOD) setting, the meter is in the rectifier at the output of the amplifier and the a-f voltage developed across resistor  $R_1$  is measured by the transistorized electronic voltmeter circuit. The amplifier contains two transistorized stages. Emitter resistors  $R_3$  and  $R_6$  are unbypassed for degeneration which increases the input resistance of the stages and linearizes response. The final collector load resistor,  $R_4$ , is employed as a gain (calibration) control for setting the sensitivity of the amplifier circuit.

The use of resistance-capacitance coupling throughout has simplified construction, increased compactness, and removed the possibility of troublesome interaction which might be encountered in transformer coupling.

Output of the amplifier is presented,




Fig. 4. Front-Panel Layout of Instrument. (Compare with Figures 1 and 3.)

by way of capacitance coupling ( $C_1$ ) to the rectifier-meter circuit ( $R_2$ - $D_1$ - $D_2$ - $M$ ). The scale of the microammeter,  $M$ , may be graduated directly in percent modulation, as explained under Calibration.

This is a stable circuit having a common ground throughout. The transistors and diodes are of the inexpensive variety, and the entire instrument is readily adaptable to subminiaturization and printed circuitry.

Total current drain is 1.1 milliamperes dc from the 22½-volt battery. This low power requirement of 2¼ milliwatts enables long life to be obtained with a small-sized battery. The large amount of degeneration in the transistor amplifier stages renders these stages less sensitive to variations in battery voltage occurring during the normal battery life.

#### Mechanical Construction

Figure 1 shows the completed modulation monitor. This version of the instrument is built in an aluminum radio chassis box: 8" long, 6" high, 4½" deep (LMB No. 146). The layout sketch, Figure 4, identifies the components seen on the front panel. Since the circuit gives no interaction trouble, a more compact assembly is possible and practical; the reader is not restricted to the editor's layout.

A 4-pin tube socket is slung under the top of the case (upper left in Figure 1) under a 1 $\frac{3}{16}$ "-diameter clearance hole. This socket receives the plug-in coil,  $L$ . This arrangement places the coil close to the tuning capacitor,  $C_2$ , in the interest of short, direct leads. The signal-input binding posts are mounted on the left end of the top of the case.

The components of the entire detector-amplifier section (with the exception of  $J$ ,  $R_1$ ,  $S_1$ ,  $S_2$ ,  $M$ , and  $B$ ) are mounted on a 4" x 6" phenolic panel. Printed circuitry can be used to advantage in this section, if desired. Potentiometer  $R_2$  is provided with a slotted shaft for screwdriver adjustment, since this control needs only occasional adjustment.

The transistors and diodes are soldered directly into the circuit by means of their pigtail leads. During the soldering operation, however, hold the pigtail with pliers and continue to hold until the soldered joint cools. Only in this way can heat damage to the diode or transistor be prevented.

Be careful to observe the correct polarity of each diode and transistor and of the microammeter. This is an important matter, since a reversal will cause faulty operation and it also may cause transistor burnout.

The plug-in coils to cover the frequency range desired in a particular installation are wound on 1"-diameter, 4-pin phenolic forms (National XR-1). These coils may be determined (i.e., number of turns calculated) with the aid of conventional formulas or by means of the inductance slide rule.

Battery  $B$  may be held in place, by means of a strap or clips, to the floor or one wall of the metal case.

#### Calibration

For calibration of the monitor, an oscilloscope and an r-f signal source having amplitude modulation percentage adjustable from zero to 100 percent will be needed. The absolute value of the carrier frequency and modulation frequency is not important.

However, a convenient combination is a 2-Mc signal modulated by 400 or 1000 cycles.

Follow this calibration procedure: (1) Connect the signal source to the MODULATED R-F INPUT terminals of the instrument. (2) Connect the vertical amplifier input of the oscilloscope to jack J. (3) Throw switch  $S_1$  to CARRIER. (4) Set rheostat  $R_1$  to its maximum resistance position. (5) Plug-in a coil for the signal-source carrier frequency. (6) Switch-on the signal source and oscilloscope and allow an ample warm-up period. (7) Throw switch  $S_2$  to its ON position. (8) Set the signal-source r-f output to maximum. (9) Tune-in the signal, as indicated by peak deflection of meter M. (10) Adjust  $R_1$  for full-scale deflection of meter M. (11) Adjust the signal source modulation percentage to 100%, as measured with the oscilloscope. Readjust  $C_2$  and  $R_1$  if necessary. (12) Throw switch  $S_1$  to its % MOD position. (13) Adjust potentiometer  $R_2$  for full-scale deflection of meter M. (14) Steps 8 through 13, but omitting Step 10, may be repeated for successively lower modulation percentages (such as 90, 80, 70, 60, 50, etc.) in order to calibrate the entire scale of the microammeter, after which a special direct-reading card may be prepared for the meter.

### Operation

After the instrument has been calibrated, it is used in the following manner: (1) Connect an antenna or pickup lead to the MODULATED R-F INPUT terminals. A ground may or may not help. (2) Throw switch  $S_1$  to its CARRIER position. (3) Throw switch  $S_2$  to ON. (4) Tune-in the

signal to be measured, as indicated by peak deflection of meter M. (5) Set rheostat  $R_1$  for full-scale deflection of the meter. (6) Throw switch  $S_1$  to its % MOD position and read the modulation percentage direct from the meter scale. (7) When the meter switch ( $S_1$ ) is in its CARRIER position, there should be no fluctuation of the deflection under modulation. Any such change in reading shows the presence of carrier shift. It may or may not be an indication of overmodulation.


