Gary Vollbracht Wins Harris-Intertype Scholarship



Gary Vollbracht, pictured on the right, and Jack Huehne, on the left, both Senior students at Quincy High School, made application for a \$1,200.00 Freshman Scholarship in Mechanical Engineering to the University of Cincinnati. Both came through with flying colors, with Gary winning top honors and Jack coming through with third place out of 25 applications in final competition from all divisions of Harris-Intertype, in Quincy, Cleveland and Dayton, Ohio, and Westerly, Rhode Island.

Gary is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Vollbracht of Wilmar Drive, and Jack's parents are Mr. and Mrs. K. W. Huehne, 935 South 21st.

This cash scholarship is offered annually by Harris-Intertype to graduating seniors in the cities where Harris divisions are located. This was promoted locally in both Quincy Senior High School and Christian Brothers High School.

To qualify, the applicant had to be in the upper 25% of his Senior class, and interested in mechanical engineering. When this contest was announced, there were 6 Quincy High School Seniors who made application. Gary and Jack survived the first requirements, and they were then given a 3-hour English and Math test, in addition to being interviewed by 3 executives of our company.

In addition to the cash scholarship for the Freshman year, this can continue with an additional 4 years of work in mechanical engineering under the University's cooperative plan. The University of Cincinnati was one of the founders of the cooperative college plan, where a student works for 8 weeks, and then goes to school for 8 weeks. If possible, this period of work is done in the student's home town, and in a division of the company sponsoring the scholarship. It may be that Gary will be doing some of his work with us. By working, the student can gain knowledge and experience, but can also provide a source of income to further finance his education.

In addition to being one of the top students in this year's graduating class, Gary has been active in the High School Band and Orchestra, and this year was voted membership in the Society for Academic Achievement, National Honor Society, and Who's Who among Student Leaders in High Schools of America. He is an Eagle Scout and president of the Young People's Group at St. James Lutheran Church.

Congratulations to both Gary and Jack on their fine showing. It's certainly a fine tribute to Quincy High School and our community to have them both finish so high in this competition. We are proud to have Gary represent us in the University of Cincinnati during the next 5 years!

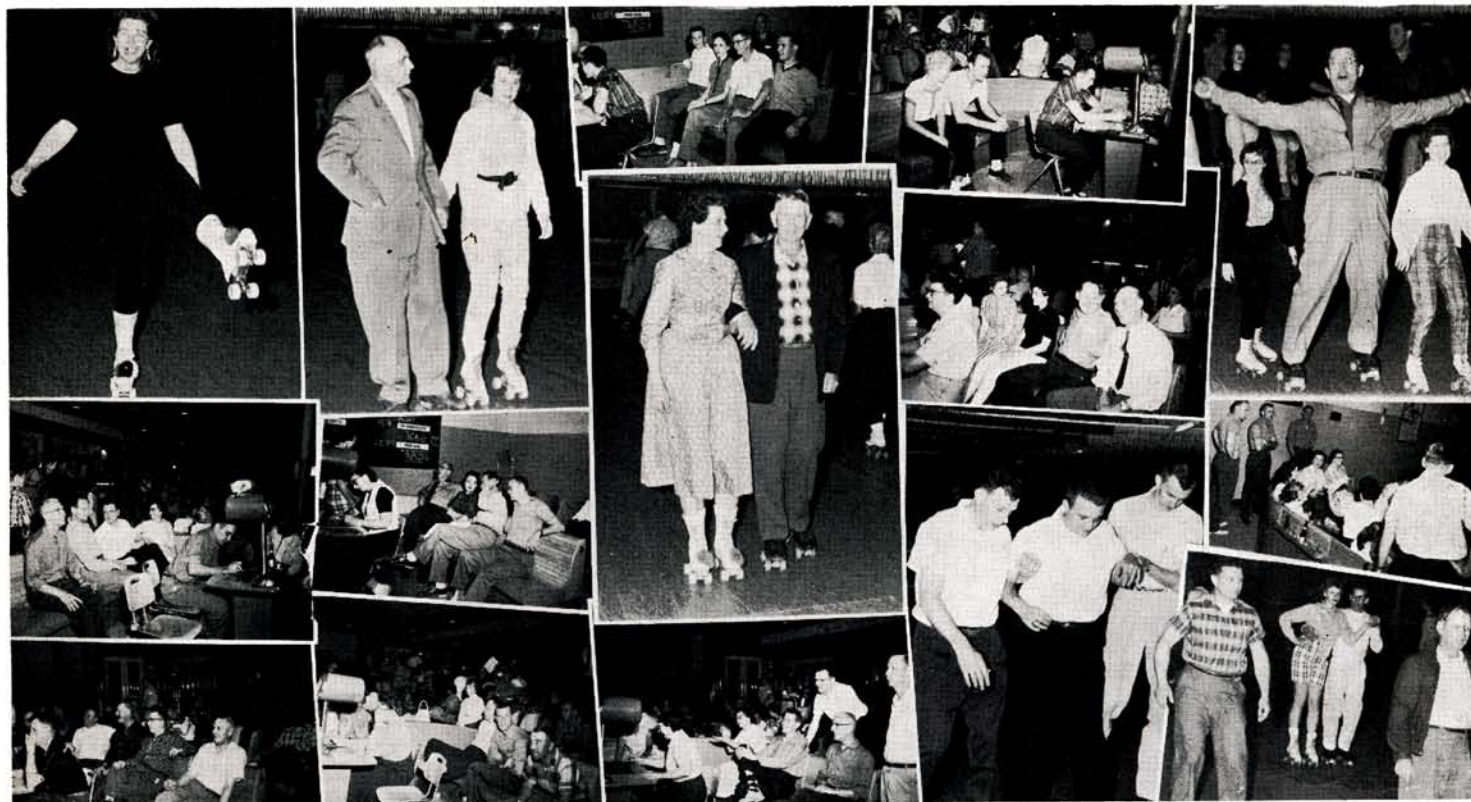
Career Day Visitors on April 18
