I. D. A. TESTS ON STANDARD RECEIVERS.

(1) The Lincoln SW34.

During the past 10 days tests on the SW-34, we have only averaged one hr. a day at the dials. Despite very unfavorable weather, and severe local interference, results have been excellent.

The antenna is a 125' inverted L of #12 solid copper wire. Both a conventional ground, and counterpoise were used.



One or two early morning's on the PCB netted 2RL, 2UE, 2YA, 3YA, 3LO, 4BC, and several other VK carriers.

Sensitivity has been found to be such that it is seldom necessary to turn the control more than half way up. By carrying the sensitivity control at the half way point it is never necessary to use more than a 1/2 turn on your volume control. We have never had the volume control fully on, for with the tremendous reserve this is never necessary. The neon tuning flame responds freely to the weakest signal.

All I.D.A. Specials during this period have been heard, with the following results. W1Z fair, signal was strong, but modulation weak. HCJB was good except for fades. Modulation was also poor. PSK was strong, an R9, Audibility good, a QSA4/5. CP5 came in good on the peaks, but fading and static made the whole broadcast only fair. LR5 F/G and audibility only limited by the static strays.

GEN. NOTES. DX conditions have been poor everywhere, with static, fading and poor signal strength, general. The TP's have shown some seasonal gain, but are far below last years ratio. Europeans have about faded out as far as N. A. reception is concerned. About the only bright spot has been the unusual strength, and consistency with which larger S. A. stations have been breaking thru. American reception in Gt. Britain has been poor, with a few fair nights. The best period was around the 10th of the month, with one or two very excellent nights. -Ed.


NEW HUNGARIAN S.W. SET-UP:
