Canadian Family Life - It's Twins!

Unlike the FCC, Canada's CRTC seems to think that a station can't survive financially in a small-town market. Thus many "big-city" stations (we'll call them "mothers") are licensed to give birth to "twins," creating radio families.

The CRTC expects these twins to provide about four hours of daily live programs from their own studios. The rest of the time, the twin is merely a relayer of its mother. Some twins have no studios, but as the town or area grows (more advertising dollars) a studio is added. Even in Canada money is king (or is it queen).

Some twins provide more than a few hours of live programs, again joining the mother later in the evening. Some mothers would like that, hi.

Some twin networks like CJCI-620 join other families (CFBV-1230 and kids) to provide a 24-hour inexpensive network of nine stations. Five of these stations are unmanned 50-watt LPRT's, but some have easily been heard over 500 miles. CJYR-970 in Alberta now has three of these "iceboxes," a name given to their LPRT cousin a la CBC. Other stations with 50-watt mini-twins even have separate local commercials. Many DXers have mistakenly ignored these as potential DX due to their low power.

Most twins serve only a small area, so expect to find them on the "graveyard" or local service channels: 1230, 1240, 1340, 1400, 1450, and 1490. But some are on better DX channels: 590, 1220, 1250, 1280, 1370 and 1570. Recently, some twins are appearing on the FM band, so the DXer should be aware of the possibility of hearing the FM call letters or towns. CFTK-590 in B.C., CKBW-1000 in Nova Scotia, and CFCB-570 in Newfoundland all have FM twins, some with low power.

Rarely does a DXer hear a twin live on its own, as most local fun is aired during the daylight hours. Local football games, election results, or a speech from Mayor Glotz are the exceptions. It's an extra DX challenge trying to hear a twin on its own. Little CJNH is alone whenever mother, CJBQ-800, carries the CFL football games. CFWB-1490 is a good bet in season on the west coast. CKTA-1570 is fair game on its morning show, again in season, from the Pacific Northwest.

Newcomers to DXing may wonder why they hear a "Check 10-90" ID on 1570 (CKTA), or a "C-jock 12-20" ID on 1490 (CJPR). Don't be confused by ID's. As the DXer will hear only the mother's ID, let's just consider that all these twins are merely relayers. Canada's CRTC isn't too strict about IDing twins or even using the full call ID's. Many twins and mothers use mostly their slogans. Watch for East Kootenay Radio, "R" Country, Cariboo Radio, Central Interior Radio, Reseau des Laurentides, or even Stereo 97 (CHMM-FM Winnipeg feeds its all-night show to stations in Ontario).

Hear a "Stereo 97" ID on 900 or 1220? Don't bother phoning CKDR or CJRL. Twins are usually unmanned nights as the CRTC doesn't require any ticket man on duty. The CKGO-1240 staff is in bed, too, but their feed from mother, CHWK-1270, includes pre-timed separate ID's. That's one case where you won't hear an ID of a mother on a twin's frequency.

Twin hunters might try the Dr. Mollar method (he used it for DXing Mexican parallels) when hunting for twins. With an extra set tuned to the mother, it may be easier to hear or ID the twin on your regular set. A tape of the twin, plus other stations IDing on the twin's frequency, would prove to the CE at the mother station that it was the "relayer," not the "relayee," that you logged. Some CE's don't believe their 50 or 250 watt grave-yard twin can be heard while it's easy to copy the same programs from the usual 10,000 watt mother. They also don't know that DXer's don't cheat.

Sending a tape is expensive, but a note saying that a tape is available would be nice. Your reports should go to the CE at the mother station. A twin's staff is usually small and busy.

To those who asked why a twin can't survive alone in an area of 10,000 plus, or aren't some just wasting space by duplicating service, I'll just say that those are good questions.
