RULES COMMON TO BOTH CONTESTS

1. These contests are open to all IRCA members in good standing. Entrants will be automatically disqualified if they cease to be members.
2. The entrance fee for each contest is 25¢. (You may join either contest or both.)
3. Entrants will be accepted until 12 November 1966. No entrants will be accepted after that date for any reason.
4. Entries for each contest will be accepted for counting until 14 August 1967. Standings will be published monthly.
5. Winners in both contests will be announced at the 1967 IRCA Convention in Denver. The results will be published in the first issue of the MONITOR following the Convention.
6. Prizes will be announced in late November, and will depend upon how many entrants there are in each contest.
7. The contest manager will have the final say on all rules interpretations.

CONTEST # 1 "States and Provinces"

1. The idea of this contest is to verify up to three stations from each of the 50 states of the United States and the 10 provinces of Canada. The first station verified will count 1 point, the second 3 points, and the third 5 points. No stations may be re-verified for the purpose of this contest. Entrants will be ranked according to the total number of points scored.
2. Entries should include the station call letters and frequency, and the dates heard and verified. The contest manager reserves the right to request for inspection the verie, or a reproduction of it, of any station entered. This procedure will not normally be required.
3. This contest will run from 0001 (Local time) on 1 July 1966 to 2359 (local time) on 30 June 1967. Note the retroactive starting date.

CONTEST # 2 "IRCA Letterama"

1. The idea of this contest is to log (Verifications are not required) stations containing the letters "I", "R", "C", and "A" in tiers of 4 stations (One with each key letter). The stations in each tier must have the same starting letter, except that Canadian stations will be considered "wild", and may be used in any tier. Note that the four key letters can be the second, third, or fourth letter in a station's call, but not the first.
2. Tier prefix letters must be alternated, but you may start with either W or K for the first tier. A typical entry follows below:

WPIT	WROK	WCAM	WFLA	(All start with "W")
KILT	CBR	KICY	KAHU	(All start with "K" except the "wild" "C")
WEWI			CKAR	(Again all start with "W" as in tier one)

 (If you chose to start with "K" the second tier could have been your first, etc.)
3. Each station may be used only once, but you can choose which letter you want to use if the call contains more than one key letter. (Note CKAR and KICY above.)
4. Each station will count 1 point. A tier must be complete before another can be started, but you don't have to wait until it's completed to submit your entry. (Note the last tier in the example is incomplete.) Stations may be re-logged for this contest. Entrants will be ranked according to the total number of points scored.
5. Entries should include the station call letters (And which key letter is being used) and frequency, and the time and date logged. Please note that a lot of trust is implied and required in this contest. A positive ID on each station is a necessity!!!
6. This contest will run from 0001 (Local time) on 13 November 1966 to 2359 (Local time) on 30 June 1967.

Greetings: Thanks to IRCA for the space devoted to the friendly, comprehensive coverage of NRC's Montreal convention. I was very glad to meet both the in coming and outgoing DXWW editors there. I know the tradition of excellence established by Ed Krejny will continue. I would like to take some space, however, to discuss the "highly-confusing" Constitution and By-Laws Ernie Cooper, Gordon Nelson and I presented from a rough draft I wrote. We trimmed up my draft in a pre-business meeting session, with Randy Seaver and Don Jensen as observers. I read it aloud at the business session. It called for an executive branch (the current triumvirate), a board of nine directors elected by the members from each of nine geographical districts, and a JUDICIAL BRANCH of three men chosen jointly by the other two branches. The executive branch had full responsibility for the club's operations, could veto legislation, and could be impeached by the legislators. It was as "highly-confusing" as the U.S. constitution, on which my draft was based. The "dictatorial triumvirate" offered the documents in good faith, opened the floor for unlimited discussion, asked for any proposed changes--but the motion that came almost immediately from the floor was that the conventioneers flat turn the whole idea down. No changes were proposed. Only a smattering of sentiment was expressed for any kind of elected government, and the show-of-hands vote was so overwhelming, we didn't even count it. I estimated it at 36 to 8. I'm sorry to be so picayunish about three lines in an other wise highly-appreciated article, but I feel those IRCA'ers who are interested in the internal structure of the NRC should have a little more on which to base their opinions. The present NRC governing body has tried to give the members what we believed they wanted. We felt the vote and accompanying discussion indicated we had done so fairly well. I guess confusion, like beauty, is in the eyes of the beholder. Thanks for the opportunity to soap-box it. 73

DX: 9/26: KPUR-1440, 0240 with f/c; KTFI-1270, s/off 0300; WRR-1310, 0333 with f/c; 10/3: KIWX-1120, 0120 with f/c; WLS-890, 0155 with f/c; JOIB-750, 0533 with EE programing; CJBC-860, 0600 strong in FF; CBL-740, 0605 good; 10/8: KDCE-970, 0306-0315 with f/c. 73's and good DX

ALBERTA - PROVINCE OF THE MONTH

Here's a province that all DXers should be able to log fairly easily, no matter where they are in North America. The Alberta stations all are well-powered (no graveyarders at all), and some have clear frequencies on MMs after the eastern sign-offs. In California, CBR-1010 is like a local during most of the early AM hours. In the east, watch for CJOC-1220 and CFAC-960. To my knowledge, the only Alberta stations that are not regular verifiers are CHEC and CJOC. And even these 2 have verified some reports in the last year.

- 580 CKUA Edmonton. Heard strongly in the northwest. Has had several DX specials.
610 CKYL Peace River. Logged all down the west coast for last season's DX. 0305 s/off usually. R and r.
630 CHED Edmonton. Were NSP. Very poor signal in California, despite the sometimes clear channel. Pop music.
680 CHFA Edmonton. Also quite directional. Possibly one of the toughest Alberta.
740 CBX Edmonton. Try MMs for the CBC "Music Only" show, but be sure you haven't got // CBL! KCBS usually interferes in the west, except MM.
790 CFGW Camrose. Country and western; much QRM on this frequency, but heard well in Vancouver.
810 CHQR Calgary. Quality music format. AN, but beamed north. Try early mornings, after their antenna change.
850 CKRD Red Deer. Sporadic at distance, but usually audible in Southern California after KOA is off in winter. Try weekends.
910 CJDV Drumheller. Another tough one, because of much interference. Mixed with several others even in the northwest.
930 CJCA Edmonton. Used to be heard MMs often until KHJ went NSP. Gets out well.
960 CFAC Calgary. Heard well on occasions. Often the first Alberta for Eastern DXers.
1010 CBR Calgary. Silent only on Friday AMs. Very good signal, with only CFRB to interfere.
1050 CFGP Grand Prairie. Has CBC AN music, but gives no ID (as does CJIC). For an ID, try at its "s/off" when CBC news from Vancouver (with local weather) can distinguish this from CJIC; ie, 0200.
1060 CFCN Calgary. Good signal, too. Try MMs.
1090 CHEC Lethbridge. Used to be regular on SM s/off at 0300 in summers, until XERB went AN. Quite loud for 5 kw.
1140 CKXL Calgary. Has started to verify reports. Good signal, but QRM heavy.
1220 CJOC Lethbridge. Loudest on the channel often in the west. In the east, try for its MM s/off - then only CKDA is on the frequency, and is almost always weaker.
1260 CFRN Edmonton. Best during Daylight Time, at MM s/off at 0300 EST.
1270 CHAT Medicine Hat. Not as regular as many other Albertans, but still fairly easy in the west.

While thinking of DXing Canadian stations, I'd like to mention the station log published by the Canadian Government. It's called "List of Broadcasting Stations in Canada," and is issued in loose-leaf form, with regular supplements sent to keep it up to date. AM, FM and TV are included (and the SW outlets, both R. Canada and the 49 meter commercial stations). Complete addresses are listed for all stations. There is also a list of all the CBC low powered relay transmitters. Over 90 pages. For information about the cost, frequency of publication, and various ways to buy it (with or without supplements, etc) write to The Queen's Printer, Ottawa, Canada. Not expensive, and it could be a great help for those who DX Canada.

(KGS) Was strong with IS at 0400 MM 9/26. (LBS) Weak u/WLS 0550, 9/19; call letters in EE then NHK pips 0400, 9/26, strong at times. (AWP) Beautiful signal 10/3 at 0500 IS, with 6 pip IS (China?) under. WLS s/on immediately after. On 9/15 at 0800, the JOHK IS had 6 pips in concurrence at 0800. (RJS)

HLKB SOUTH KOREA, Pusan, was very strong, completely suppressing JOHK, late on 9/29. The announcer said "K-B-S" in EE (stands for Korean Broadcasting System) at 0755, then gave call letters in EE at 0800, followed by 3 pips and tone IS. Taped report sent! (LBS)

CHOAX (1605 kc.) on Baffin Island has informed us of its current f/c schedule: 29 days after the Chief Engineer's birthday (which is September 17) from 0215-0230 EST, unless the temperature in Swift Current, Saskatchewan is greater than -10°F. at that time, in which case the check will be rescheduled six months after the occurrence of the third thunderstorm of the season in Talcahuano, Chile, provided the local radiation count is not prohibitive. (Subject to change without notice.)

How to Use the IRCA Frequency-Check List

Dates on this list are literal. A station listed on the Second Saturday at 0100 EST indicates that it checks on the early morning of that day, although in the PST zone, for example, the time of the check would be 10:00 PM of the preceding Friday night. Most of the stations not listed as checking with T, M, etc., probably do test with tone. Most stations checking with t (dial tone) are located in the South. If you don't hear a station one month, keep trying as the check may be made quarterly. Some of the regular checks listed here were contributed by monitoring companies on condition that all reports be definite. Do not send a tentative reception report to a station simply because you hear a tone at the time indicated on the list. YOU can help make the 1968 IRCA f/c List more comprehensive and accurate by:

- Every time you hear a check according to this list, place a check mark beside it. Send a list of those heard to Larry Godwin during the summer of 1967.
- Note any f/c's not contained in this list and keep a record of them. Report them to the DX Roundup sections of the bulletin, or send them to Larry Godwin next summer, whether you think they are regular or not.
- In your reception reports, ask stations when they conduct their f/c's.
- When you hear a f/c, try to obtain the full time, not just the time of one ID.
- Distinguish between f/c's and equipment tests, which are normally not regular. This list is for frequency checks only.
- Note if tone, music, open carrier, etc., is used during the f/c's you hear. This is your f/c list. If you have any suggestions that would increase the usefulness or accuracy of this list, please contribute them. If this list is of use to you, show your appreciation by making the 1968 IRCA List more accurate.
