I hope someone somewhere in this issue elaborates on the new pre-sunrise FCC rules, which'll have a great influence on morning DX, especially in the winter. (see this issue for a complete report on this or perhaps next issue--bl) Daytimers that previously have signed on at 4am ST now must stay off until 6am local time (ST or DST). And the daytimers will be limited to 500watts until sunrise. This will affect numerous full-time regional stns which have signed on with day facilities at 5am. Example: KRLC-1350 has s/on now at 5am year-round with 5kw non-dir., although they use 1kw DA at night. Now to s/on at 5am they must use 1kw DA, which requires a 1st phone. Rules go into effect 8/19, but most stns won't make the switch until end of DST on 10/28. Naturally, I'm concerned about this, since I only have a third-class license. JEP, I would suspect that KTW does monitor the KWSC s/off, so if KWSC goes over KTW I can tell the FCC and force KWSC off the air. I didn't realize Cosmopolis was big enuff to support a DXer--Mike Smith do you know me? 73.

3000 mile SINGLETON - ELIMINATOR CONTEST (jointly for members of NRC and IRCA)CONTEST RULES

1. All entrants must be members in good standing of either the National Radio Club or the I.R.C.A. Those residing in the U.S.A. or Canada will be grouped into four zones as follows:

ATLANTIC ZONE: Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland.

EASTERN ZONE: Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, Ohio, Missouri, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ontario.

CENTRAL ZONE: Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska, Wyoming, South and North Dakota, Montana, Manitoba, Alberta, Saskatchewan.

WESTERN ZONE: Arizona, California, Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, British Columbia.

Anyone residing in an area not listed above may apply to the judges for entry and special assignment. (Ed. note: D.C. is in Atlantic Zone-RJS) It is suggested that they try to get others to compete from their own general area thus making creation of other zones possible. This will be decided by judges panel.

2. Because of the large number of faked or improper receptions which have been submitted in past contests, IT IS REQUIRED that a carbon copy of the original reception report to the station be submitted along with notification that the verification has been received and is being entered in the contest. This will establish the time of reception and will determine who shall receive the SINGLETON or ELIMINATOR credits in case of duplicate entries for the same station. To prevent a total chaos in the scoring verifications must be reported for contest entry within seven (7) days after being received by the contestant. While there is no definite way of checking this, the contestant may very well be hurting his own chances by not sending his entry promptly during this period because points will be awarded after this reasonable waiting period and THEY WILL NOT BE CHANGED for any later entry (even for earlier reception). To do so would result in utter confusion. This rule MUST be enforced strictly.

The carbon copies of reports sent in by contestants will be returned to them in reasonable time. All entrants must further agree to submit actual verifications (or reproduced authentic copies made by photostat, Xerox, or similar method) for examination by contest manager and/or judges if requested to do so. Failure to do this may result in contestant being disqualified. Verifications will be handled with the utmost care and will be returned within 30 days by the type of mail in which they were submitted. This rule will be enforced only in cases of extreme doubt which may not be fully satisfied by the original report carbon copy. This rule is inserted to help protect honest DXers from the deplorable practices of lying, cheating, or faked verifications to gain plaudits or points in such a contest. Absolute honesty on the part of each contestant will eliminate the necessity of enforcing this point.

JUDGES: The panel of judges will be composed of the FOREIGN EDITORS of each club (or individuals appointed by the editors) and the CONTEST MANAGER. A majority decision of the three judges will be final in every situation.

3. An entry fee of 50¢ will be paid by each entrant at the time of his entry into the contest. Any necessary special mailing costs, etc., will be deducted from these monies and the remainder, along with larger donations, will be used for the purchase of really worth-while prizes-welcome additions to any DXer's den, their values will be far greater than the total entry fees. Any and all donations in this area (large or small) will be welcomed by the contest manager.

(cont'd) Prizes for FIRST and SECOND places in each zone will be awarded within 45 days after the entry closing date -- just in time for Christmas.

4. Any station operating in the STANDARD BROADCAST BAND (520 to 1620 kHz) is eligible for entry IF it is located at least 3000 airline miles away from the contestant's receiving station. Distances will be measured on a large world globe by contest manager. Any questioning of his figures may be submitted to JUDGES PANEL for their final decision. It is suggested that contestants state the distance for each station on his entry, which will be verified or corrected by contest manager.

5. The FIRST PERSON in any zone reporting a verification from a station for entry in the contest will be awarded 10 POINTS for a SINGLETON plus 2 points FOR EACH 1000 MILES of airline distance to the station. This station will then be credited to him as a SINGLETON. Of course, this award must be determined by the provisions covered in Rule 2.

6. The NEXT PERSON in the SAME ZONE to report verification of the same station on the same frequency will receive 5 POINTS for an ELIMINATOR plus 1 point FOR EACH 1000 MILES of airline distance to the station. This station will then be credited to him as an ELIMINATOR. This, too, must be determined by the provisions covered in Rule 2.

VERIFICATIONS: A verification eligible for either a SINGLETON or an ELIMINATOR must be for reception during the contest period considering local time at the entrant's receiving location. While the wording may not be 100% specific, the entry must be what is generally considered acceptable as verification from that particular station. Any "doubtful" verifications should be submitted to the judges for their final decision.

7. All stations that have been used for SINGLETONS AND ELIMINATORS are then "DEAD" for all contestants in that zone for the remainder of the contest year. A listing of these "DEAD" stations will appear at the end of the monthly standings published in the foreign sections of the club bulletins.

8. Any person who has a SINGLETON credited to him for 3 months from the post-mark on his entry notice without it being eliminated will receive a BONUS AWARD of 10 POINTS providing that the station is still operating on the same frequency as originally heard from the best knowledge available (A deviation of up to and including 5 kilohertz will be considered as the "same" frequency). This award to be repeated at the end of each 3 month period of singleton status continues.

9. The contest will run from September 1, 1967 through August 31, 1968 and all verifications entered must be for reception during this period. The extreme deadline for entries of verifications will be October 31, 1968, but actual reception must be during contest period stated above. Contestants may enter at any time during the run of the contest. However, it is definitely to their advantage to be "off and running" at the very beginning.

10. If the contest receives popular support, it will be continued as a BRAND NEW CONTEST beginning September 1, 1968 with all "dead" station restrictions lifted and all stations once again becoming eligible for all zones.

- 835 ???? UnID SS noted 0339-0355 SM 7/23. Any ideas? (Godwin, Colo) (Honduran-Larry?-RJS)
- 840 YSF El Salvador, San Salvador a nice surprise with call ID and as "Radio Vanguardia" at s/off SM 7/23 at 0310. Had program of record requests 0212-0310. Also probably the CST-SS SM 8/13 at 0128. Reported. No interference at all on this one SMs. (Godwin, Colo)
- HJBI Colombia, Santa Marta a powerhouse at s/on 0456 7/17. (Godwin, Colo)
- 850 CX16 Uruguay, Montevideo seemed to be the one s/on 0402 8/7, but not sure.
- YNAV Nicaragua, Managua, very strong with "Radio Continental" ID 0155 SM 7/23. S/off 0303 MM 8/9 and announced s/on would be at 0500 EST.
- HJKC Colombia, Bogota, s/on followed by NA 0450 MM 8/7, dominating.
- CM.. Cuba IDing as "LV de Cuba" quite strong SM 8/13 at 0348, apparently AN. (all 850 is Larry Godwin, Colorado)
- 870 WHDA Puerto Rico, San Juan, heard with mx, then talking in SS w/fair signal 7/16 0422-0423. (Grise, Ind)
- 871 HCN2 Ecuador, Guayaquil this time definite with frequent "Radio Cristal" IDs SM 7/23 0227-0328. Reported. Some DRM from Cuban on 870. (Godwin)
- 880 TGI Guatemala, Guatemala, s/on 0602 7/17. Regular most eves. (Godwin, Colo)

- 1220 XEB Mexico, Mexico, DF was clear at 0015 with LA music and number 3033 (?) and 3034 (?) between each record on 8/7. (Brown, Mich)
- 1235 ZBM-1 Bermuda, Hamilton, often strong carrier, but shallow on audio in the evenings. (Scrimgeour, Ontario)

- Pirates: From Ken Brownless, 7, The Avenue, XXXX Clifton, York, England :
1. Radio 390 lost its appeal to High Court against GPO order to leave the air. Was silent as from July 28th.
 2. Radio London has announced it will leave the air on August 14, also Radio Scotland.
 3. Besides the U.K., Norway, Denmark, Finland, Sweden and Belgium have taken steps to implement the Council of Europe agreement on Pirate B/C. France, West Germany, and Irish Republic are to take action. Holland will be under pressure to take similar action.
 - 4) Radio 355 and 227 left the air on August 5th.

From Larry Godwin, : "Letter from Radio Hauraki says the new pirate, Radio International will begin programming near Auckland Sept. 7. No freq. mentioned, but sked will be 1300-1600 and 0500-0800 EST. R. Hauraki sked now is 1200-0800 EST; still on 1485 kcs, per Arthur Cushen. Art says the NZ gov't has deferred the Marine Broadcast Act to outlaw pirates until next year, so Hauraki et. al will be on another year at least".

ISLE OF MAN SET TO FIGHT 'AGGRESSORS'..DOUGLAS, Isle of Man (AP): On this low-taxed, high-living haven in the Irish Sea, the rebels of Man yesterday drew up final plans for taking Great Britain before the UN as a sort of aggressor. Publicity stunt? To many Manxmen, it is deadly serious. The ancient parliament of this little holiday isle meets in emergency session today for a vote on whether to engineer an international showdown with London...What brought London and Douglas to loggerheads was Britain's new law banning pirate radio stations, which pump commercials and pop music from ships and abandoned ports around the coast. One of the most successful pirates is Radio Caroline North a boat moored off the isle's northern coast. Among the commercials it beams to Britain are plugs for holidays on the Isle of Man...Nevertheless, protecting its state broadcasting monopoly, Britain insists that all pirates must go. The island will be allowed to keep its own low-powered station, Manx Radio, but its weak signal cannot be heard for any distance. Tynwald, the Manx parliament...already has rejected the antipirate law...

The latest word from our man in the Cisnes islands is that an anti-American pirate ship, calling itself CMS2, is destined for service to Navassa Island, the Yucatan peninsula and all the ships at sea. This project is under Cuban sponsorship.

"ANTENNA FARMING"

One of the most important assets that a fervent DXer has is his antenna. There are many types of antennae; among them: the directional loop, the inverted L, the Beveridge, the doublet, your own bedsprings, the rhombic, etc. All, in their own way, lend themselves to an antenna farm, which is what any cultivated DXer should have.

The prime requisite for an antenna farm is abundant acreage, unless one has an indoor garden in which loops could be planted. Some helpful tips for antenna farming may be in order.

- 1) Protect your farm: it is suggested that scarecrows, dressed like an Otrab, be used, and that they scream "Cheat, Cheat" to drive away the farm's enemies
- 2) Beware of harmful insects; such as the wild-metal-boring-spotted loopers
- 3) Do not irrigate your farm, for the wild rust may strike a heart-rending blow.
- 4) It may be a good idea to fertilize your farm. The suggested method is to hold fertility rites (in which three of your best veries are sacrificed) before the DX season begins. This will insure a perfect season producing splendid crops.
- 5) Crop rotation is optional. However, if you don't have directional loops, you may get your wires crossed if you try this.
- 6) Avoid crop dusting, since severe interference results.
- 7) Government subsidies should be sought to make your farm's results as prosperous as your neighbors. Write for the Dept. of Agriculture's form DA-4971 to apply for a farm subsidy.

The above is but a resume of a much-longer treatise on the subject by member Gal R. Mann, titled "DX and Other Fertile Games for the Family, or How I Became a Real Estate Magnate with my 107 Rhombic Antennae".
