KRUX will test with short TTs and rock and roll music. Main interference will be WSAI and, possibly, KXOL. Power will be 5kw non-directional. This DX program is listed in NRC's DX NEWS as "evidently strictly for Western members," though it isn't known why. If ever a test had a good possibility of being widely heard, this should be the one. Chief Engineer Ray Thomson is very much interested in the response to this program so be sure and write to let him know how well it was heard at your location even if you don't desire verification. And a thank-you note if you are unable to tune-in or to log the station will show that you appreciate the effort of Mr. Thomson and the station in conducting this test. It isn't known for certain but your Publisher expects that phone calls will be accepted from listeners and the names of those calling announced over the air. This has generally been the case with PSL-type DX programs. And, a special word of thanks to Paul for arranging this and other tests from Arizona. A History of Idaho Radio

When young Harry Redeker arrived in Boise from Rupert in 1917 to teach chemistry and physics at Boise High School, he found he was also supposed to handle an extra class at night: teaching World War 1 preinductees to operate radio signal code keys.

First he had to teach himself. Then, fascinated with the novelty that radio was, he began scrounging equipment. Bit by bit, through Redeker and the members of his student radio club, Idaho's first broadcasting studio took shape under the stage of Boise High School.

By 1920, with a seven-watt radio telephone set loaned by the U.S. Forest Service, the school was broadcasting as 7Y-A. In 1922, when the government issued new licensing regulations for the experemental stations, Redeker became one of the first licensed operators and the high school found itself the owner of radio station KFAU.

The stations patch and scratch equipment search ended in 1925 when Western Electric Co. and Idaho Power Co. helped the school acquire new equipment at about one-tentlits actual cost. With a transmitter tower located on the rool of the school and students handling the programing, KFAU provided market reports, weather, lectures and locatelest shows for the Boise Valley.

Redeker, now retired and living in California, recalls some of the excitement of the time. KFAU once broadcast "a big convention in Caldwell in about 1925. The Secretary of Commerce spoke, a man named Herbert Goover." Redeker had met Hoover before the convention over short wave radio.

Redeker and his students experimented with the new media, and with the rules. When Jogn Philip Sousa arrived in Boise to give a concert KFAU was ready with broadcast plans and mike in place.

But the March King wanted no part of broadcasting. He had never played "on the air" and he never would. Redeker politely removed the microphone and didn't mention the second mike, rigged for short wave transmission, that was out of sight.

So Sousa who never would agree to broadcasting, was heard on Boise 7X-T and Redeker got a listener-response card from New Zealand, a triumph he couldn't share with the great conductor.

And there was the time when broadcast-believers out of a booster club from Payette. The group appeared in 1926 on the station and, in the course of the broadcast, offered to mail a pre-paid box of Idaho apples to anyone who wrote in. The club received, and filled, hundreds of requests and sent boxes of fruit all over the western states.

Plenty of other people were playing the radio game too. In 1922 KFAU advertised that it would give a public exhibition of broadcasting at the First Congregational Church. Charging a small admission to raise money for equipment, it would let the community share the wonder of listening to far-away KSJ in Los Angeles.

"We were afraid something might go wrong, and it did," recalls Redeker. "Some joker drowned us out with a coil set right after we got started, but I had Bob Stone waiting over at the high school.

"As soon as I realized what was happening I called him to put KFAU on the air with records, So at the church we all sat and listened to a broadcast that was clear for the music, but you never could quite understand the announcer on the station identification.

"The only suspicious person was A.J. Priest, the Statesman reporter. He caught on and wanted to write it up, but he didn't and most of the people thought they had listened to L.A."

The above story is taken from KBOI's magazine, Intermountain Observer. I printed only the most interesting part, as the article is very lengthy. The article is by Alice Dieter.
