

March 8, 1969 IRCA Editorial Policy I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this Policy is to outline the duties and authorities of the IRCA Editorial Staff. II. CONTENTS: The IRCA bulletin, called DX Monitor, shall comprise the following sections: A. Administrative and General Feature Section 1. The IRCA President's reports, when necessary. 2. Results of voting by the Board of Directors (BoD), to be reported by the President. 3. Club membership and financial reports. The financial report will be written by the IRCA Secretary-Treasurer, and published only after its approval by

4. Cover page, compiled by the Publishing Committee, to include announcements of club interest such as DX programs, etc.

5. Additional feature columns as approved by the BoD.

B. DX Sections

1. Domestic DX sections, to include all reports from members in the U.S. and Canada of stations located in and/or licensed by these two nations.

a. Each member will report to the editor(s) representing his own section of the continent, as follows:

1. Atlantic and Eastern Time Zone areas

2. Central and Mountain Time Zone areas

3. Pacific westward to and including Bering Time Zone areas

b. There will be two columns for each reporting area, a "DX Forum" (DXF) and a "DX Roundup" (DXR).

c. All times reported will be in Eastern Standard Time.

d. DX Forum

1. The DXF columns will contain reports from individual members with information or comment about their DX activity and equipment, the IRCA and its policies, and any other relevant and allowable discussion that cannot be fitted into another column. Members may mention call letters, frequency and location only of selected new catches in the DXF, but no long lists of stations will be permitted.

2. DXF editors shall have the authority to limit reports to fifteen lines in the interest of conserving space for other reports or of eliminating

non-pertinent information.

3. DXF editors may omit from reports any statements made in a language other than English which are, in the editor's judgment, meaningless or

excessively long.

4. If members submit more than one report per issue to the DXF without instructions to destroy those previously submitted, the editor may disregard the earlier report(s), unless they have already been stenciled; in that case, the editor may either defer or disregard the later report(s).

e. DX Roundup

1. Each DXR column will contain reports of domestic DX loggings and tips such as sign-on and sign-off times, frequency checks, and any other useful station schedule information.

2. Reports will be listed by frequency and should include the call letters, location, date and time of reception, type of programming, and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.

3. Certain high-powered Mexican "border" stations, and certain other dearchannel foreign stations which provide substantial QRM to domestic stations, may be listed in the DXR sections at the editors' discretion.

4. DXR editors may omit from their columns tips that, in their opinion, would not be of interest to the majority of the readers.

f. Preferably the DXF editor will also compile the DXR for the same area; however, if necessary, one editor may be appointed for each column from that specific area.

2. Foreign DX section, called "DX World Wide" (DXWW), to include all reports of stations located and/or licensed from outside the U.S. and Canada and, separately, all reports of domestic stations heard by foreign members.

- II. B. 2. a. DXWW will contain reports of loggings, schedules, addresses, and verification information concerning foreign stations.
 - b. Reports should be listed by frequency, and should include call letters (if any), location, date and time of reception, type of programming, and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.
 - c. DXWW will also contain "DX Records" (listing of members' verification achievements, compiled by a separate editor), standings in IRCA foreign DX contest, and any other information deemed helpful for foreign DXing by the editor.

d. There will only be one editor for DXWW.

- C. Size of the DX Monitor
 - 1. The <u>DX Monitor will</u> be twenty pages (ten sheets) per issue, if possible, but may be larger at the discretion of the Publishing Committee Chairman or the individual column editors. Individual sections shall attempt to follow these approximate lengths:
 - a: Each DXF column, two pages.
 - b. Each DXR column, one page.
 - c. DXWW column, six pages.
 - 2. The remainder of the <u>DX Monitor</u> will include the administrative section and any normal excesses of DX columns.

III. EDITORIAL AUTHORITY

- A. Editors may omit portions of reports to comply with size regulations, provided that omission does not remove pertinent DX information or detract from the effectiveness of included portions.
- B. Editors may add to columns or reports only if such additions do not violate size regulations and if comments are both pertinent and in accord with this Policy.
- C. Editors may determine individual formats of their particular columns, and methods by which reports are to be submitted, beyond the formats specified in this Policy.
- D. Editors may omit any report or portion thereof that they deem would
 - 1. Violate any applicable portion of this Policy
 - 2. Be detrimental to the IRCA, its individual members, or its policies
 - 3. Be interpreted as profane or otherwise improper language
 - 4. Be in violation of any federal, state or local law.
- E. It is a privilege of members to have in their published reports any reasonable and prudent mention of non-DX information, provided such information does not violate the format of the particular column and that such mention does not jeopardize the particular column's size.
- F. Editors will have authority over "filler" material used at the end of their columns, provided such material follows this Policy.
- G. Editors may disregard illegible reports.
- H. Editors may rephrase any report or portion thereof if they deem such rephrasing to be in the best interest of their column(s), this Policy, or the IRCA. Any such rephrasing must, however, be indicated as such by the editor, with the knowledge that the reporting member assumes no responsibility for the rephrased text.
- I. No advance publicity will be given to any station broadcasting in violation of the rules of its specific nation's radio regulatory, agency. However, reports concerning reception of such stations may appear in applicable DX columns.
- J. Editors will have authority to omit reports submitted by other than IRCA members-in-good-standing; however, interesting reports from non-members may be included if they comply with this Policy.

IV. RESPONSIBILITY

- A. The BoD will have sole authority for passage and amending of this Policy.
- B. Any violations of this Policy will be dealt with by the BoD in accordance with the IRCA Bylaws.

The government of the IRCA shall be comprised of the following officers: President, Secretary-Treasurer, and seven members of a Board of Directors.

Section 2 - Duties of Officers

Part 1 - President

- a. Shall preside at all official club functions, including the annual business meeting, when in attendance. If he is not to be present at the annual business meeting, he will appoint at least two weeks in advance of the meeting date a member who does plan to attend, to preside over the meeting; this appointment is not subject to Board approval.
- b. Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote and administer the affairs of the club to the best of his ability.
- c. Shall, with the approval of the Board, have the power to bring reprimand and revocation proceedings against any member who he deems is not adhering to the rules of the organization; he must submit in written form any findings to the Board for their action.
 - d. Shall have the power to appoint the chairman for committees, with the approval of the Board.
 - e. Shall have the power to remove a chairman of any committee for neglect of duty; this action must in turn be approved by the Board.
 - f. Shall have the power to appoint any contest managers, with the consent of the Board.
 - g. May create any additional committees which he may deem necessary with the approval of the Board.
 - h. Shall have the power to bring action to appoint and/or remove editors of the club publication DX Monitor with the approval of the Board of Directors.
 - 1. Shall have the power to appoint or remove the Publisher of DX Monitor with the final approval of the Board of Directors.
 - j. Shall have the authority to act on any suggestions or proposals, making any recommendations if he so desires, but also submitting the primary proposal to the Board of Directors; any action on a suggestion or proposal is subject to the final approval of the Board.
 - k. Shall have the power to vote on any proposal that does not receive a majority decision by the Board of Directors during the contemporary administration so as to break any deadlock that would result.
 - 1. Shall not have the power of pocket veto.
 - m. Shall be responsible for the inclusion of the complete IRCA Constitution and Bylaws, as amended during the previous year, in one of the summer issues of the DX Monitor each year.
 - n. Shall be responsible for reporting the results of voting by the Board of Directors in the DX Monitor; such reports must be made by the time a ballot is circulated among the membership dealing with matters that were presented to the Board for decision.

Part 2 - Secretary-Treasurer

- a. Will be in charge of collecting all dues for membership and membership renewal.

- f. May, with the consent of the Board, appoint members to assist him in some of the bookkeeping work.
- Shall be responsible for recording and filing minutes of the annual business meeting. In his absence at the business meeting, he shall appoint another member to record said minutes.

Part 3 - Board of Directors

- Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote the affairs of the club to the best of their ability.
- Shall have the final power in ruling on any club affairs, suggestions, proposals, b. recommendations, or findings submitted by the President; the Board shall have the power to present legislation and findings as well as make rulings.
- Shall not have the power to appoint chairmen of the various committees, contest managers, publishers, or editors, but shall have the power to confirm their appoint-
- Can conduct most of their business by mail, but if five are present during an annual convention, a quorum for business shall be said to exist.
- Shall have the power, if they deem it necessary, to call for a special election to submit a major issue to the membership-at-large; the Election Committee then will to isvore handle all aspects of the special election.
- The Chairman of the Election Committee shall ballot the Board of Directors soon after each election to determine the Chairman of the Board, who will be the spokesman for the Board and will be responsible for assuming the President's office in . basofi sib case it is vacated during the current term; a tie in balloting will be broken by the President. In the case where the Chairman of the Board becomes club President, he shall be required to resign as Chairman of the Board and a new Director from his Region must be selected to fill the position vacated by his succession, in accordance with Article V, Section 4; should the Chairman of the Board resign from the isah saldi Board of Directors with such resignation not subsequent to succession to the Presidency by him, or when the Chairman of the Board succeeds to the Presidency due to a vacancy of the offic of the President, he must immediately hand down the Chairmanship of the Board to the remaining Director who has been a member of the IRCA for the greatest length of time, this to be determined by the official records maintained by the IRCA Secretary-Treasurer.
- Shall have the power, if they deem it necessary, to submit a decision to the vote of diend **5**• those present at the business meeting with a simple majority prevailing.
 - All decisions of the Board of Directors including the names of the representatives voting for and against each proposal must be published in DX Monitor as soon as possible after the decision is made. No member shall be held responsible for such decision until they are made public through the DX Monitor.
 - All members of the Board shall submit to the President their votes on all proposals no later than 30 days after the mailing of the proposals to them by the President. All votes not received within the 30 day period will be considered abstentions from voting by the Board member(s) in question.

Section 3 - Term of Office

All terms of elective office in the IRCA begin on September 15 in the year the nominee is elected and expire on September 14 two years hence unless re-election takes place.

Section 4 - Replacements

Part 1 - When the Presidency becomes vacant, the Chairman of the Board will assume the Presidency for the remainder of the current term.

Section 4 - (continued)

- Part 2 When the office of Secretary-Treasurer becomes vacant, the President shall
- appoint a new Secretary-Treasurer, with the approval of the Board, for the remainder of the current term.

- Part 3 When a seat on the Board of Directors becomes vacant, the Board must appoint a successor to complete the unexpired term as soon as possible. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical region in which the vacancy exists (see Article III, Section 3, Part 2). In the case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President will cast the deciding vote.
- Part 4 If a Director on the Board moves permanently from his Region within one year after his term of office begins, or in the event a Director fails on two consecutive occasions to communicate to the President his vote on club matters within three weeks after the President's letter to the Board, his seat on the Board will be declared vacant and the procedure outlined in Part 3 (above) will apply.
- Part 5 If an IRCA officer's membership in the club expires during his term of office and he fails to renew it within two weeks after such expiration, his office will be declared vacant and the relevant procedure outlined above will be applicable.

ARTICLE VI - PUBLICATION.

The official publication of the IRCA shall be known as DX Monitor. It shall be issued 34 times each year, except in cases of emergency. With the permission of the Board the number of issues may be changed. DX Monitor will normally be published beginning with the first Tuesday in October, up to and including the last Tuesday in March, twice in April and September, once in May, June, July and August.

ARTICLE VII - PUBLISHING COMMITTEE

The President shall have the authority with the final approval of the Board to appoint a chairman of the Publishing Committee. Publishing proposals should be submitted to the President in written form and should include the qualifications of the publisher as follows: amount of time available for the job; availability of helpers (should include at least two helpers in addition to the chairman); access to mail schedules; availability of necessary space for duplicating equipment. The job of Chairman of the Publishing Committee shall not be terminated until such times as continuance is no longer deemed beneficial to the organization according to the Board, or until such time as the publisher is no longer able to continue in his capacity.

ARTICLE VIII - OTHER COMMITTEES

Functions of other committees shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Committee chairmen shall have complete authority over the activities of their committees (contest managers are considered chairmen of their respective committees).

ARTICLE IX - EDITORS OF CLUB BULLETIN

The Editors of the club bulletin shall be appointed by the President with the final approval of the Board of Directors. When an editorship vacancy is announced, volunteers will be sought by the President. A reasonable time limit will be established for names to be submitted. After the time limit elapses, the President will select one person from the list of volunteers, appointing him as the new editor; immediately, he will send to the Board of Directors a proposal to that effect, listing in his proposal the names of the other volunteers (if any) from which the editor could be chosen if the President's choice is not approved. A majority vote by the Board will make the President's appointment official; if the proposal is defeated, the President will appoint another person from the list of volunteers to be the new editor. The process will be repeated until the Board confirms an appointment by the President. If necessary, the President shall have the power to appoint a temporary editor to serve during the selection process, without approval by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X - CONVENTIONS

At its annual meeting the IRCA shall select a convention site for its next annual meeting on

ARTICLE X - (continued)

the basis of bids submitted by those wishing to host it. The date of the annual convention shall be determined as early as possible by the hosts.

ARTICLE XI - SUGGESTIONS AND PROPOSALS

All suggestions and proposals shall be submitted to the President in written form, who will then submit them to the Board for action (along with any specific recommendations he may care to make). The final decision as to any action to be taken rests with the Board of Directors. A proposal that receives more "yes" votes than "no" votes will be considered passed. ARTICLE XII - IRREGULARITIES, REPRIMANDS, DISMISSALS

Section 1 - Irregularities

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the President. A statement of the irregularity and a member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charge. Any action the President may take, if necessary, must be approved by the Board.

Section 2 - Reprimands

In case of irregularities the IRCA President must with the approval of the Board issue a letter of reprimand to be sent by registered mail to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense.

Section 3 - Dismissals

If the nature of the offense is serious enough to cause further action than a reprimand the President must, with the final approval of the Board issue a letter or letters clearly stating the nature of the offense and that dismissal proceedings are being taken. The aforementioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time must be allowed for the accused to answer the serious charges. If the reply is not forthcoming or if it does not meet with the satisfaction of the President, a letter or letters of dismissal may be sent with the final approval of the Board of Directors, removing the membership of the accused.

ARTICLE XIII - REFERENDUM/INITIATIVE

If a member cannot get action on a proposal in the prescribed manner, he can submit a petition bearing 20% of the signatures of the club membership to the Election Committee to effect a special election on the matter. This pertains to matters other than those concerning the contents of these documents.

ARTICLE XIV - RECALL

If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members, asking for removal from office of the President or Secretary-Treasurer, the Committee shall call a special election at which the membership will be able to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the officer is approved by 75% of the members voting, the office shall be declared vacant. If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members in a certain Region, asking for removal from office of the member of the Board of Directors from that Region, the Committee shall call a special election at which the members in that Region will have the opportunity to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the representative is approved by 75% of the members voting in that Region, the office will be declared vacant.

ARTICLE XV - AMENDMENTS AND CHANGES

These Bylaws may be amended by the submission of a By-Law amendment in written form to the President. He, in turn, must submit the proposal to the Board for consideration. With the approval of the Board, the proposal is then submitted to the Election Committee who shall arrange a special election. A proposed By-Law amendment petition containing the signatures of 20% or more of the membership must be presented by the Election Committee to a vote before the entire membership. To be enacted as an amendment, the proposal must receive a simple majority of those members voting. An amendment to the Bylaws goes into effect immediately after its adoption, unless the proposal to adopt specifies a date for its going into effect.

A few locations only are without offices: 1ZK Kaitaia-1440; 1ZE Kaikohe-1220 (both relay "Radio Northland," 1ZN Whangarei-970); 1ZT Turangi-1390 (relays :ZA Taupo-1500); 3YW Westport-1460 (relays 3YZ Greymouth which in turn is almost entirely a relay of the National Program from Wellington over the YAs, YZa, and YWs); and 4YW Alexandra-640 (relays 4YA Dunedin-780, etc.); 2ZH Hawera-1560 relays 2ZP New Plymouth-1370 as "Radio Taranaki," but I believe they have a commercial sales office in the town. If anyone has any queries, I'll try to answer them; if not, Dene Lynneberg of Titahi Bay (25 miles NW of Wellington; the transmitter site for all Wellington stations except 2ZM and Channel 1; 2ZM being on Mt. Victoria in the middle of Wellington city, and WNTV-1 on Mt. Kau Kau (would you believe "cow-cow")) who works for the NZBC as a technical trainess and who is an IRCAn, could probably be of help.

In the January issue of NZ DX Times, it states that the All Night National Program is on NZ Monday mornings now—alternate weeks zYA,3YA, and ZYA, 4YA; other mornings all four.
