An Open Letter from KGYN "Dear Bruce: On Febr. 10th, KGYN conducted a test for the IRCA which was co-ordinated by you. And I believe your reception rpt was among the ton of mail we have received as a result of the test. Some members sent tapes as requested, and all reports have been of great value to us here at the station. But we have recently experienced a catastrophe regarding the mail and tapes received from club members. David Rogers, one of our engineers, has been answering the mail for me with cards which have just recently been printed and mailed. The last bunch of QSLs will be in the mail by March 3. The problem is this: I had all the letters and tapes beside my desk in a cardboard box which the janitors judged to be trash. You can guess the rest. Members' letters, a ton of them, which I had great plans of building a stunning file with, have been hauled out and destroyed at the city dump. All of these letters have been QSLed, and the cards should be in the hands of the DXers by March 7th at the latest. So, this much of the disappointment is mine. However, there will be some disappointed DXers out there who sent tapes. The tapes were in the box, too. One I'm just sick about...one of the four reports we received from Invercargil, New Zealand was a tape of KGYN, and the DXer's prize reception of an 18 watt station someplace nearby was also on the tape. I was to return the tape to him so he could use it for verification of the 18-watter. I valued and appreciated his tape the most because of its importance due the great distance of reception. And now I must communicate to him that due to such a stupid mistake, his prize tape will never return. gotten and lost his name and address. Bruce, would you please try to explain the situation in the next IRCA DXM so members will be made aware of the terrible situation? For those who lost tapes in this mess, they can drop a card describing the amount of tape (size of reel, etc.) which they sent, and I will see that they receive replacement of at least double the original amount of tape. Once again, my apologies. It is as great a loss to me as it must be to those who lost tapes. All the lost letters have already been QSLed and the cards should be in the hands of DXers by March 7th. The more valuable tapes are what's been lost. Thank you for your trouble. We'll try to avoid such stupid errors next time. Sincerely, Joseph S. Fields, Prog. Director (KGYN)." Broadcasting Yearbook Released Broadcasting Yearbook (BYB) has finally been received on the West Coast, at least at IRCA Pub. HQ. Delivery will be made on March 12 by United Parcel Service. Other parts of the U.S.A. have apparently received BYB earlier. The price is \$11.50 and for the serious domestic DXer, it is well worth the price. A "book review" on the 1969 edition will follow as soon as a few IRCAers have analyzed its contents.

Phase 1 If you would like to meet other DXers in your IRCA Membership Committee area and help increase membership in IRCA, please note a card to IRCA Membership Committee, Don Erickson, Chairman, 6059 Essex Street, Riverside, CA 92504. Complete lists have been compiled, alphabetically, of all DXers to whom sample copies of DXM have been sent the past several months. The list includes the complete name and address, the station from which the name was obtained or the source from which the DXer learned of IRCA, and the date the sample copy was mailed. Lists are ditto and contain approximately 1000 names. Phase 2 In an effort to continue to publicize the club and increase membership (goal: 300), it would be very much appreciated if any members who have the facilities would check at nearby high-power stations seeking permission to check the station's files of reception reports for names and addresses. All those names and addresses received will be processed and information on the club sent. It was by this method that IRCA grew ten-fold in a period of one year when the club was formed. If you'd like to help gather names, and would like further details, write DEE.

Editor's Deadlines The deadline for reports to most sections now is Friday, 8 days before publication date (date of bulletin). Bob Jacoby's deadline was earlier Saturday and hasn't been listed recently. It is now Friday. In the hope that it will prove useful, here is a general run-down on the procedure at pub. hdq. for the bulletin. Most stencils arrive in Monday before the Saturday bulletin date. Address labels are put on envelopes and (when the size of the bulletin is known) stamps are applied. Whatever number of stencils can be numbered Mon. night are run. Front page is typed either Tuesday morning or Tuesday evening and the remainder of the mimeographing finished Tuesday evening. The bulletin, in such instances, would be mailed around 1 AM PST Wed. morning. However, if not all of the material has arrived by Tuesday's mail, the bulletin goes out a day later, or 1 AM Thurs. morning. This explains your receiving a bulletin as much as 2 days before it is dated. An attempt is made to get your bulletin to you in time for Monday's DXing. If you receive your bulletin later than Saturday when it is mailed on Tues. (first class or air mail), please let pub. hdq. know so steps can be taken to remedy the situation. That "Tues." is Tuesday night and would be a Wed. AM postmark. For those sending in last-minute CFC items, Monday's mail is assured. Tuesday will usually be printed if not on the front page. Wednesday "flash" items will appear when possible/necessary for you to learn of the DX/Test in time. If you choose to phone in an item, the number is 714-687-5910. Please phone only stn-to-stn as I live alone. Any time of the day or night (when you can find me home) is fine; I'm just as often awake at 2 AM as 7 FM. -Don Erickson, 6059 Essex St., Riverside 92504

An IRCA History

In our fifth Anniversary Issue, it is appropriate to reflect upon the early history of the IRCA. As most of you know, ours is a young club, yet has assumed considerable size and importance in radio circles from the beginning.

The IRCA was created out of a conflict that arose in the National Radio Club during the fall and winter of 1962. The question at hand was how the NRC should be governed, and if a Constitution and Bylaws were necessary. Considerable debate was carried on through the NRC bulletins and by newsletter, and at the 1963 NRC convention (held in Denver in September) the members present drafted a new Constitution and Bylaws for adoption by the club.

A copy of the documents and a ballot were mailed to every NRC member, who voted 98 in favor and 53 opposed. However, the NRC government did not recognize the balloting outcome, and the consequence was the formation of a new organization. On February 1, 1964, the National Radio Club, Inc. (NRCI) was founded under Colorado law by six Denver NRCers: Larry Godwin, Dallas John, Dave Johnson, Bill Nittler, Marvin Robbins and John Tracy. It considered itself the successor of the original NRC on the basis of the majority vote favoring the Constitution and Bylaws. A new A.B. Dick mimeograph machine and supplies were purchased immediately, and were paid for shortly by special charter memberships and donations. By the end of the month the club had over 40 members although it had not yet published a bulletin. The first issue of the NRCI bulletin, identical in format to the NRC's, was published in Bill Nittler's basement on March 17 and mailed to 69 members. The new NRCI editors were Dallas John (Musings), Dave Johnson (DX Down the Dial) and Ed Krejny (International DX Digest).

A month later it was recognized that the NRCI had not received a majority vote of the entire NRC membership for adoption of its democratic government, and really had no right to the parent club's name. Also, there was a general desire to take a unique name with a more international scope. In the April 14 issue a ballot was circulated containing two choices for the club's name: International Broadcast Listeners (IBL) and International Radio Club of America. (It was first thought the name could be changed to, simply, "International Radio Club," but we discovered a club with that name in Sweden.) 93.5% of the membership voted, and the majority selected "IRCA." Our first printed mastheads, exhibiting the new name of the club, were donated by our Industry Advisor John Tucker in May.

Also in May a ballot was circulated to determine the new name for the bulletin and to select a new emblem. A run-off between "International DX News" and "DX Monitor" resulted in the choice of the latter, and the present emblem (designed by Marv Robbins) was adopted by a clear majority. Around the same time the sections of the bulletin were renamed by their editors and became the DX Forum, Domestic Tip Index and DX World Wide.

The new club's first DXer of the month was Dave Gleason who had just moved to Quito from Cleveland; Dave arranged several advertisements over HCJB on behalf of the IRCA. Our first DX program was aired over KATI in Casper, Wyoming. Marv Robbins contributed 10,000 two-color mastheads which were first used in the July 21, 1964, bulletin. The first IRCA convention was held in Atmore, Alabama, August 21-24, hosted by Alex Bowab and Park Barton.

The Denver IRCA members served as the club government until September when the first election of officers was held. The results were: President-Marv Robbins, Secretary-Treasurer-Bill Nittler, and the Board of Directors-Dallas John, Don Erickson, Dave Gleason, Ed Krejny and Dave Johnson -- who were all elected for a one-year term.

Thanks to the steady efforts of Membership Committee Chairmen Marv Robbins and Don Erickson, the club had grown in size to over 350 members by its first anniversary. It was hoped the Anniversary Issue would continue to be a very special event and the largest of the year.

From the beginning, the foundation of the club has been its Constitution and Bylaws, although they were not officially ratified by the IRCA membership until July of 1965, after a few changes from the Denver originals had been made.

As time passed, our relationship with the NRC became friendly and now many of our members belong to both clubs. A wholesome spirit of mutual benefit and friendly competition has developed between the NRC and IRCA, and brought them closer together.

An IRCA History (Continued)

The IRCA has brought many new BCB DXers into the club and shown them how useful radio club membership can be. The <u>DX Monitor</u> has undergone several changes of format and editors since 1964, but it retains the essential purpose of quickly circulating DX information and news to IRCA members.

It would be difficult to express the club's appreciation to those members who contributed so much time and effort to the IRCA. The members who have edited the various columns, those assisting with the publishing, those acting as heads and members of the various committees, those serving with the IRCA government, those who gave constructive suggestions, and those who contributed regularly to the bulletin -- all those members are responsible for the success of our club.

This year particularly I would like to thank Don Erickson for his efforts on behalf of the IRCA for the past five years. As Publisher, Don makes more sacrifices of time and convenience than any other club leader and he truly is, in my opinion, the

club's most valuable asset.

Now it's time for election of officers once again and nominations will take place through May 15. The new President, Secretary-Treasurer and seven Directors on the Board will begin a two-year term on September 15. The only requirement for serving as an officer is membership for one year in the IRCA.

Prior to the last elections in 1967, only a handful of members volunteered or were nominated. In an attempt to provide a slate of competition, the Board approved a special nominating committee; I hope this won't be necessary this year. There are many capable leaders in the IRCA and if you will take a few minutes to nominate your

choices, we will be assured of a full slate in 1969.

According to the IRCA Bylaws, the following election procedure will be followed this year. After the deadline for nominations on May 15 has passed, the Chairman of the Election Committee George Tanner will notify each person of his nomination. Each nominee will be requested to submit a short "campaign statement" (limit 20 lines for President and Secretary-Treasurer; 15 lines for Directors) which may outline his qualifications and explain why the members should vote for him. If a member is nominated for two offices, he must decide for which he will run. The campaign statements along with ballots will be included in the June issue of the DX Monitor. The deadline for sending ballots to George Tanner will be August 1, and the results of the elections will be announced at the IRCA convention business meeting in Chicago on August 23.

What are the duties of the various officers? The President presents legislation to the Board of Directors via proposals submitted by himself or other club members, and reports the results of the Board's voting. He makes appointments, and he makes announcements of general interest through the President's reports. He presides at the

annual business meeting.

The Secretary-Treasurer collects dues, prepares renewal notices, pays for the club's expenses, and keeps the club's books. He presents financial reports to the club and for that reason it is desirable that he or his appointed assistant have a practical knowledge of accounting theory. He also keeps an up-to-date list of members and records minutes at the annual business meeting.

The Board of Directors are responsible for voting on the various proposals forwarded by the President, for confirming appointments, and for submitting legislation on their own. Each Director initiates legislation and evaluates the various proposals based on correspondence and the DX Forum reports of the members in the region he represents. The Chairman of the Board, who is the Board member selected in a special election among the Board members, is responsible for assuming the Presidency in case it is vacated during the current term.

The President and Secretary-Treasurer are elected by the membership-at-large. However, the Board of Directors are elected on a regional basis, with the members in each region voting for the one corresponding Director. Nominations for President and Secretary-Treasurer may be made by any club member; nominations for Director must be made by members residing in the appropriate region. All nominations must be in written form. Only one nomination per office shall be allowed any one member.

Mike Northam has reapportioned the various Director regions, and the exact areas included in each appear elsewhere in this issue of the DX Monitor.

Bylaws Amendments Ballot

Enclosed with this issue is a ballot concerning five proposed amendments to the IRCA Bylaws. Each has been approved by the Board of Directors but in order to become enacted, each must receive approval by a majority of the votes cast by the membership. Please return your ballots to George Tanner, Election Committee Chairman, 8349 East Cypress, Scottsdale, Arizona 85257 by Modnosday, April 30, 1969.

The IRCA is one of the few clubs that permits such membership voting. Take advantage of the democratic structure of our club by voting in this important event. The Bylaws proposals below are presented for your consideration:

Proposal 2.2-47 would amend Article V, Section 2, Part 3, i of the Bylaws by changing the deadline for Directors on the Board to submit their votes on all proposals sent them by the President from 30 days to 3 weeks. The Bylaw would read:

All members of the Board shall submit to the President their votes on all proposals no later than 3 weeks after the mailing of the proposals to them by the President. All votes not received within the 3-week period will be considered abstentions from voting by the Board member(s) in question.

Proposal 3.2-19 would amend Article X of the Bylaws by changing the method of selecting convention sites. Under the present Bylaw, the members present at one convention choose the site for the next, and the date of the convention is determined as early as possible by the hosts. As amended, the Bylaw would read:

The general club membership shall select the convention site on the basis of bids submitted by those wishing to host it through a special election to be held six months prior to the convention date (the fourth weekend in August). All bids must be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval prior to the special election.

Proposal 3.2-39 would further amend Article X by amending the above proposal 3.2-19 as follows: (changed portion is underlined)

... prior to the convention date (which will normally be the fourth weekend in August).

Proposal 3.2-29 would amend Article V, Section 2, Part 3, f. Under the present Bylaw, the Chairman of the Board is automatically the remaining Board member who has been a member of the IRCA for the greatest length of time, in the case where the current Chairman of the Board resigns. As amended, the Bylaw would read:

The President shall ballot the Board of Directors soon after each election, or in case the Chairman of the Board resigns, to determine the Chairman of the Board, who will be the spokesman for the Board and will be responsible for assuming the President's office in case it is vacated during the current term. A tie in the balloting will be broken by the President. In the case where the Chairman of the Board becomes club President, he shall be required to resign as Chairman of the Board and a new Director from his region must be selected to fill the position vacated by his succession, in accordance with Article V, Section 4.

Proposal 3.2-34 would amend Article XII, Section 1. The current Bylaw requires irregularities to be brought to the attention of the President, with any subsequent action taken by the President subject to approval by the Board. The Bylaw as amended would read:

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors and the President. A statement of the irregularity and the member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charges, and shall be submitted directly to each Director and the President; all shall determine any action which shall be taken.

IRCA Wembership Distribution 15 March 1969 IRCA Chairman of the Elections Committee, George Tanner, has reapportioned the Director regions as of March 8, 1969, as follows: (263 members)

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There is an error in the Results of Board Voting in the March 1, 1969 bulletin.

Proposal 3.2-36 should read: All Directors-O. Defeated.

Proposal to go before the Board of Directors scon: The President would be authorized to cast the IRCA's ballots in ANARC voting and elections. Under a new ANARC constitutional amendment, votes on all issues other than the election of Executive Secretary shall be cast by the member clubs and not by the individual reps and shall represent the official position of each club on the proposals submitted.

Arthur Cushen of Invercargill, New Zealand, will be taking a world tour this spring and will visit Denver from Friday May 2 through Monday the 5th. I'll be hosting a get-together that weekend and anyone who can attend is welcome. Please let me

know in advance if possible.

I am in favor of all the Bylaws amendments presented for a vote in this issue of the DX Monitor. I hope you will take a few minutes to mark your ballot and send it to George Tanner, Election Committee Chairman.

The results of Board voting on the various proposed Bylaws amendments have been announced in the DX Monitor previously with the exception of Proposal 3.2-39. With five votes received through March 5 the voting is Podall-F, Krejny-F, Brooks-F, Wesolowski-F and Lipis-F. The proposal has passed.

The Editorial Policy as revised will appear in the bulletin soon. There are some areas that could be improved, I think, and I would appreciate receiving any proposals

dealing with amending the Policy. A few parts seem outdated.

Thave decided not to seek reelection as President this year, primarily because I feel the club should be exposed to someone new at this post; also because I have lea free time to devote to the hobby than I did a year ago. After serving in this capacity for three years, I believe it is appropriate for the club to have the benefit of a new President with a fresh outlook on the club's goals and problems.

The economic case for taped veries: The Feb. 13 BROADCASTING Magazine scoreboard of AM stns on the air is 4,233. If every stn were rptd by a DXer @ a cost of 12 cents each he would invest 507.96 in his QSL collection. IF instead he went the ppc route he could save \$42.33 reducing his investment in QSLs to \$465.63. If he used, say, a Cassette tape recorder, he can buy tapes for as little as \$1.03 each incl. a 4% tax. Assuming he would settle for a 1 minute ID using a 60 min. tape, he could get 60 IDs per tape & to ID every one of the 4233 stns would require just under 71 Cassette cartridges at a cost of \$73.13. The net difference between the original \$507.96 & the low possible of \$73.13 is \$434.83. For that kind of dough our new members to the DX fraternity could buy a whole battery of Cassette tape recorders or one heck of a fine regular recorder! Where would a lot of us be today if we had refused to accept the loop antenna! C'mon fellows, be a little rational in your approach to things. There's no gun in your back to count tape veries just as you don't have to use prepared cards; but, again, at least be rational & maybe even a little logical. I'm for allowing & recognizing taped ID's as "proof of reception" & I'm against stacking the deck on the terminology of what can be counted. If one fellow wants a $\frac{1}{2}$ hour \log ...fine! If another is satisfied with an ID only...fine! Above all, be logical... these statistics above are not...they are the ultimate, not the mean. Radio Vltava, lb adcasting Soviet propaganda since Moscow's troops invaded Czechoslovakia last August 21, has gone off the air, Radio Prague says. The Prague report says the Soviet occupation radio stopped transmission on February 13 in the morning. A few ..ours later the East German national anthem was heard on the same wave length [1430 khz - FJP] followed by a routine East German radio broadcast. Most Czechoslovaks believed Radio Vltava broadcast from East Germany because its announcers spoke with a heavy German accent. Czechoslovak critics of the occupation repeatedly demanded that the station be silenced. (News item from AP, via Tom Hartloff.)

- St. Maarten In answer to a question I asked in the February 8 issue, Mike Worst has sent the following bit of information: St. Maarten, St. Eustatius, and Saba are at least 600 miles from the ABC islands (Aruba, Bonaire, Curacao), and hence are considered as a separate country by DXers. These islands are in North America, while the ABC islands are in South America. The ABC islands are referred to as Netherland Antilles, while St. Maarten, etc. are referred to as the Netherland West Indies.
 - Guam Radio KUAM, Agana, 610 khz, has been noted recently signing on at 1900 GMT (1400 EST) rather than the scheduled time of 2000 GMT as indicated in the 1969 WRTH. S/on consists of the SSB, just before 1900, then full identification, followed by a news broadcast. (WRB, via Larry Godwin.)
