The IRCA Achievement Awards Committee offers to all IRCA members the following series of awards:

Series I, States Award

20, 30, 40, and 50 (VAS) States Verified

Series II. Provinces Award

6, 8, 10, and 12 (VAP) Provinces Verified

Series III, Countries Award

10; 15, 20, 25, 30 Countries Verified (increments of 5)

Series IV, Total Stations Verified Award

100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 550, 600, 650, 700, 750 Stations Verified (increments of 50)

Series V, Domestic Capital Cities Award 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62 Domestic Capital Cities Verified

Special Award, Verified All Continents (VAC)
(Antarctica not required for this award.)

The following set of regulations will apply to all members requesting an Achievement Awards Certificate. They are simple and easy to follow; please read them carefully.

- 1. You must be an IRCA member to qualify.
- 2. For each station used in the application for an Achievement Award, the member must have in his possession, at the time of his application, either a verification of reception from the station concerned or a taped verification. A taped verification should include a definite ID (see below) and may be very short in duration. Some material recorded a few seconds before and after the ID gives the tape a desirable continuity.
 - A. A Canadian or U.S. station, to be tape veried, must have the station call letters PLUS either the location of the station AND/OR the frequency. (All three are preferred. If a station promo contains the above elements it may be counted as a definite ID.
 - B. For foreign stations a station slogan (or call) plus location and frequency is best. Minimal requirements would seem to indicate that the slogan plus the location are needed. Promos, or even spots, (if they are clearly local) will help. In the case of stations (Latin American especially) on a network with no local station IDs, a network ID is the best that one can do. Make certain that your presumed station is indeed on the network heard and that there is no chance of mid-identification. In the case of a foreign language, be certain that you heard and translated correctly.

AS A GENERAL RULE ASK "WOULD MY TAPED VERIE CONVINCE A VISITOR TO MY SHACK THAT I DID INDEED HEAR THE STATION CLAIMED?"

- 3. The Awards Committee reserves the right to require eighter the original or a photocopy of any verification, or a duplicate tape in the case of taped veries, and shall be the sole authority in awarding certificates. Decisions are final.
- 4. A fee of 25ϕ (per award) will be administered to cover the printing and postage costs. U.S. members may send the fee in U.S. mint (unused) stamps (any denominations) and Canadian members may send mint stamps of any denomination of 10ϕ or less (to a total value of 25ϕ). Other members may remit the fee in any convenient form. (2 IRC's, etc.)
- 5. The term "broadcast band", for the purposes of these awards, and in accordance with IRCA Bylaws, is considered to be that range of frequencies extending from 510 kHz (kc/s) to 1630 kHz (kc/s) inclusive. All types of stations in this range may be counted. This includes commercial broadcasters, beacons, special low-powered military stations, etc.
- 6. Countries and continents are based on the latest edition of the IRCA Countries List. The District of Columbia will count as part of Maryland for the States Awards; the Yukon and Northwest Territories are considered as provinces for the Provinces Award. Capital Cities Award refers to capital cities of all continental U.S. cities, the capital cities of Canadian provinces and territories, and the capital cities of Alaska and Hawaii. Persons verifying either capital cities of the Yukon or Northwest Territories will receive an Honorable Mention on their Domestic Capital Cities Verified Award.

7. Please submit your applications on standard sized paper $(8\frac{1}{2} \times 11)$ in either hand-written or typed form. Here are the formats to be used in applications: A. When applying for States, Provinces, Countries, and Continents Awards:

In both formats (A) and (B) above please number each entry--this speeds checking. Taped veries should be listed in with written ones but a small asterick (*) should be used beside the entry number to indicate that the verie is taped.

8. Initial applications for 300 or more Total Stations Verified MAY be listed in order of frequency (as in 7, B, above), in order of call letters; state, province or country; or in order of cities. Note that thelast 3 choices should be alphabetical. Additional applications for TV Awards should be in format 7,B.

Any particular station that your have heard and verified becomes a "new" station and may be counted again when verified if it has: A. Changed call letters; B. Changed frequency; or C. Changed location (one city to another).

The countries labelled "inactive" per the IRCA Countries List will be valid for 10. the Countries and Continents Awards if they have been verified before the "inactive" date.

The stations heard and verified must be heard within 25 miles of your permanent 11. home. To be fair to everyone, DX heard while travelling cannot be counted, However, if you once resided, for example, in Utah and then moved to Maine, you may count DX received from both points. Similarly, if your permanently reside at a military base, or attend some sort of school at another location for long periods of time, you are also permitted to count the DX and veries received from these points, When applying for an award which covers DX received from more than one point, please clearly mark this on your application, along with the particular circumstances of the case.

12. Please submit a separate application for each award. (E.g. Don't use a

Countries Award application for a Continents Award-kindly list them separately.) KEEP A CARBON COPY OF EACH APPLICATION, as your original will not be returned. The system used is cumulative. For example, after applying for, and receiving, an award for "30 States Verified" you may, upon verifying another 10, apply for "40 States Verified" by merely listed the new 10 in the format mentioned in #7.

Richard E. Wood - Dept. of Euro. Languages, Univ. of Hawaii - Honolulu, HI 96822 Regretfully, I had to vote against the proposed Article II "Purpose" of the Bylaws. In the first place, I object to the continued use of the outmoded and actually meaningless term "kilocycles". This only had a meaning, once, in combination with the words "per second", and is, in any case, now obsolete and gives the club an outmoded, fighting-against-history style. More important, however, I object to the lack of a definition of the classes of stations which the club covers. It should be clearly and specifically stated that we receive only broadcasting stations directed to the general public and transmitting information and entertainment. Aircraft beacons, stuff like "NB" are totally outside our coverage, and, moreover, our members in most countries other than the U.S. and Canada are forbidden to receive such stations. We must define our coverage, not by an arbitrary high or low frequency (what would happen if R. Nordsee International drifted to 1631 kHz? Would it suddenly cease to be a MW station and to interest our members?) but by the class of station we receive. Here in Hawaii, quite a few non-broadcast stations can be heard encroaching on the MW band, but I would not think of wasting Monitor space to mention them.

I use an HQ129X rx with a choice of 75' long wire or 4'3" square loop. Special from KFTR-1370 was received 100% on 4/13 with no change noted in signal strength from 1000 to 500 watts. 73 & good DX until next time.

Richard E. Wood - Dept. of Euro. Languages, Univ. of Hawaii - Honolulu, HI 96822 Rather poor conditions lately and not too much DA to report. Verifications from CFOX-1470 P.Q., which becomes my 2nd best E. Canadian after CBA-1070; KXL-750 in promptly after Test; KLIV-1590; CBR-1010; WDAF-610; KCBQ-1170. Then two unusual ones: KNX-1070 for the auxiliary 10kw transmitter, both on day and night patterns; and best of all, KDAY, nominally 1580, for a pair of parasitic radiations loudly noted on 1556 and 1604, i.e., + and - 24 kHz from the fundamental. Attached was a copy of a letter to the FCC explaining what had been done to correct the parasitics, for which the station received a citation. I have now verified KDAY, in effect, on three frequencies, and, while local parasitics or other spurs are of limited interest, I think a pair of regular parasitics at 2400 miles is of genuine DX value; but I am not sure how to count them. Come to think of it, is there an official club policy on counting Noumea, ex-1420, now heard on 670 also, KREX-920 and 1100. Different technical facilities are involved and propagation is different on different parts of the band, so that the actual DX value of the different frequencies is different; yet I still feel inclined to count each as one station. Oops, when I said I hadn't logged KKJO-1550, I meant to say WOKJ.

CHINESE SATELITE The satellite launched on April 25 by China transmits on 20.014 mHz according to Art Peterson who heard the signal on that date at 2340. The newspapers and other sources have variously reported 20.000, 20.009, 20.007, and other frequencies but 20.014 was measured by Art, who suggests that night monitoring is probably the best time and that it is simple to find with WWV on 20 mHz. The satellite requires 114 minutes to make a revolution around the earth and is audible for around ten to fifteen minutes each pass so it may be necessary to listen for a while. However, even an inexpensive communications receiver, if it tunes to 20 mHz (higher in frequency than 20-meter hams and just below the 15-meter hams). For those interested, it is a easy way to get your name in the paper in some areas; just call them and tell them you're monitoring the satellite. Typical of newspaper reporters, they'll call you a ham and otherwise confuse the report. One local paper reported the frequency as "20,000 megacycles"!!

Report from Panama- Pfc Bill Hardy, 535-48-0583, 9th Psyop Bn, 8th SFGA, Ft. Gulick, C.Z., APO NY 09837.

By the time you read this I'll be in Mexico on a two week leave with my folks. I hope to DX and listen to locals for skeds, etc. Sorry I couldn't give more warning but I just found out about it a few days ago myself! So if anyone has any questions I can answer, write to me when I get back (May 11th), and if I was listening the night you were, I'll try to help. I'll be in Mexico City, except for May 2 to 5 when I'll be in Guanajuato. Muy gracias to FJP for the list of Panamanians. It clears up some of my past blunders in the last two issues and at the risk of wasting space, I'll present the correct info:

880 HOB51 Panama, Colon, "La Fabulosa de Colon," which has been NSP and was off completely for a week, is back days but not AN. WRTH lists it as Cadena Universal in Panama City; that's the Prensee, but the station itself is in Colon with this slogan.

Panama, Panama. This seems to be the call. HOS22, which I listed in my 4/18 report, is the call of "Mia" on 650. ELK's old verie gives HOM21, so Till correct the call. "R. Montonita" is a branch of the R. Mia company, which runs 3 non-parallel stations in Panama City plus a couple of relays.

Panana, Panana. This is the station listed as HOEGI-1210 last issue.

Boy, did I goof. 1210 is off completely and 1190 was first heard afterwards, so I jumped to conclusions. Anyway, it's apparently AN-5 or 6 and I Haven't had the chance to try MM yet. Announces 24 hours in SS. Call, "R. Libertad."

1210 HOE91 Panama, Panama, "R. El Mundo" (no slogan change) currently off air. Not AN as listed in 4/18 issue. See HOI47-1190 above.

1420 ACB20 Canal Zone, Ft. Davis, correct call (4/4 typo). NSP. Lots of skywave (no groundwave, hi!) so maybe this 250-watter could bust through some day.

1505 HOA95 Panama, Panama. They give the call "HOA" without the numbers, but they belong in there. "Cabina 95" is the slogan. Maybe KISN would have less trouble with incorrect IDs down here, hi?

Congrats to Larry Abraham on catching Mia on 650, but my log gives power as 10 kw. S/on at 0445 Mon-Sat is regular; they don't sign off with a NA so I don't think they use it to s/on. I'll have to listen again. On MM with ally KORL on after 0630 it shouldn't be too bad a catch if you're before sunrise. It's always been 650 as far as I know (which isn't too far, hi!). Okay, from now on my donestic catches go to DXR, where they belong. My next report should be a dandy, so 73 till then!

735 ??? UnID, 4/16 1215, dictation, evidently numbers, by YL, much repetition, and parallel to 801, 1080, 6250, and 5870.

801 ??? UnID. 4/16, 1212, as 735. This group of frequencies smacks of North Korea...altho ether channels such as 655 and 785 were not heard.

Cambodia, Phnon-Penh Home Service is here; had wondered why I hadn't head then in the 1400's. Believe this has been here for some time, but mistaken for just another Thai station. Observed 4/16 1040, strong with anti VietCong statement in Khmere, then in French, then ID, "Thini Phnon Penh", martial music, drama in Khmere. Was //4907 SW, and not heard on 740 or 6090. At 1119, program ended, ID in Khmere, and repetition of proclamation, dated 4/15. Excellent national music continued past 113/

- 1080 ??? UnID, dictation thrice by YL, evidently numbers, 1138 4/16. Parallel to 6250, 5870; still going at 1215.
- 1140 VOA Philippines, VOA now sked AN, but usually just OC if anything. On 4/16, however, special EE talk at 1225 //1178. Evidently on late for Apollo coverage.
- 1178 VOE Okinawa, //1140 at 1226 4/16; SAH evident.
 - ... <u>Kazakh SSR</u>. Man and woman alternating in Russian news, 1403 4/10. Not heard before; list Petropavlovsk.
- 1220 AFTN Thailand, Utaphao, 4/13 1504, AFTN ID, weather, mechanical rooster, local announcer introducing "Genie Weedse Time." Not //1450 which had a different Gene Weed program.
- 1475 ... Austria, Wien with German talk mixing with USSR at 1459, 4/10, during Interval signals; 2-pip time signal must have been from Austria.
- 1586 WDR West Germany German Talk, fair 1337 4/10; but grew weaker instead of stronger as night progressed.

Answering my own question about Tay Bac and Viet Bac, North Vietnam, these are not cities, but regions of the country, encompassing several provinces. Tay Bac is in the North, and Viet Bac in the Northwest. I would like to point out that I have been wrong in identifying the Soviet and Chinese anthems. I had always thought that the anthem heard from Soviet stations was the Internation ale; thus a different piece heard from China had to be something else. I have finally realized that the Soviet anthem is just that—"The Soviet Eynm," and that China does routinely use the Internationale, as REW has maintained all along. So many of my reports have been incorrect in this respect.

Why Colombian Stations are the best Verifiers in Latin America—Richard E. Wood Although I have recently been very pleased to not good verification percentages from Mexico, Uruguay, and other countries, my experience over 13 years! active Latin American DX'ing is that the best verifier is beyond a doubt, Colombia. It is the best not only in percentage of replies to reports, but in the number of pennants (I have now almost seventy) and other souvenibs, in the length of letters (two and three pages are common), and in the general tone of the verifications, which leads me to believe that the reports are really appreciated.

Here are what I believe to be the main reasons for the positive verification policy of most Colombian stations:

- 1) Colombia is a highly literate country, conscious of its links with world culture. It calls its capital, Bogota, the "Paris of America."
- 2) Unlike some of its neighbors, it is not a xenophobic country; Americans and other foreigners are liked, and their opinions on Colombia solicited, Nationalism is not rampant, and there are no major problems with foreign companies.
- (3) Colombia has the oldest domestic airmail system in the Americas. The system of Apartados Aereos really works, and such addresses, if known, should always be used.
- 4) There are large, sophisticated urban centers all over the country. Unlike many latin countries, there is no immense gap between the capital and the hinterland.
- 5) The stations are organized into well-run networks, which print letterheads for the affiliated stations; hence, there is no lack of stationery.
- 6) Identifications are clearly given, often with distinctive musical chines. Station identifications are better known to DX ers than in most latin countries.
- 7) Hence, the quality of reports is probably better, and fewer tentative or erroneous reports (which might alienate the station) are sent.
- 8) Unlike the repeaters in Costa Rica croNicaragua, and even some relays in Mexico, all stations have their own staffs, and all reports may be sent direct. Occasionally network headquarters in Bogota or elsewhere may, however, help with follow-ups or inquiries.
- 9) There are no language problems. Spanish is universally known, in contrast with the situation in Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, and Paraguay. Some of the larger Stations

may be reported in English, although Spanish is preferable.

10) As so many Colombian stations send beautiful pennants, I suspect that some DX'ers receiving them have sent thank-you letters or cards which have pleased the stations and kept them friendly. By sending thanks and keeping in touch with the station, they are helping themselves and their fellow-DX'ers.

The Three P's: Probably, Presumably, and Possibly (An Editorial Corment)
Recently Hank Ward expressed his opinion that since many of Glenn Hauser's reports were not definite, their validity was questionable. I would like to point out that Glenn is DXing from an area of the world which is largely unknown DX territory. He doesn't have the benefit of a backlog of many previous reports to help him. The language barrier alone would be enough to make many DXers throw up their hands in despair. Even though I personally may not profit very much from Glenn's reports, I feel that he is performing an invaluable service to the DXing fraternity. Hence, under the editorial policy (IIIA) which specifically forbids editors from omitting pertinent DX information, I will continue to run Glenn's and all other! reports until I receive other instructions from the BoD, since in my opinion, his reports do constitute pertinent DX information.

Radio Nordsee International -- C.M. Stanbury II
RNI commenced operations on 1578 kHz on April 10. Shortly thereafter, the British government's Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications began jamming this new frequency, officially at the request of the Norwegian and Etalian governments. At this point, all radio hell seems about to break loose. RNI co-owner Bollier has threatened to jammthe BBC. He says that his ship has three transmitters and one can easily be adapted to interfere with BBC transmissions: "If the Ministry disturbs us, then we will disturb them." (RNI's SW transmitter, it should be noted, has so far been silent the entire month of April.) The "Commercial Radio Network" which has contacts with some 200 hand-based pirates within Britain it—self was scheduled to jam BBC's 1214 kHz broadcast on Saturday April 18 and again on the 20th. Operating on the same frequency as the BBC, it is believed, these bootleg garmers will be almost impossible to trace.

Meanwhile according to Bollier, RNI who went silent again on MW at 1600 EST on April 15, plans to move to 1385. The only country interfered with there should be Spain. As Spain and England are on poor diplomatic terms, London it is thought will have less excuse for jamming RNI. When on, RNI is AN weekends and public holidays, with a 0130-2000 EST schedule on other days.

American Virgin Islands, Radio Libertad is said to be broadcasting from St. Croix on 1550 kHz. Addresses: 2113 Ocean View Branch, Miani, or Box 5650E, Caracas, Venezuela. (EDXB)

El Salvador New stations are YSKIC Circuito YSKL, Sonsonate, 77 kHz with 10 kw; YSKLD Circuito YSKL, La Union, 780 kHz, 10 kw; YSKT Radiorona, Sal Salvador, 820 kHz, 5 kw. (EDXB)

Nicaragua YNLU Radio Managua has boved from 965 to 957 kHz. (EDXB)

Venezuela, Some new MW stations: YVTB, Onda Internacional, Maraci bo, 980 kHz, 10 kw; YVTA, Radio Tricolor, Barquisimeto, 990 kHz, 10 kw; YVMA Radio Universal, Maracay, 1080 kHz, 10 kw; YVSZ Radio Comercial de Venezuela, 1090 kHz, 10 kw; YVRM, Radio Impacto, Caracas, 1260 kHz, 10 kw (previously perorted as in Puerto Rico), YVTK, Radio Metropolitana, Baruta, 1330 kHz, 5 kw; and YVTT, Radio Terepaina, Cabudare, 1390 kHz, 5 kw. Tarawa Alan Merriman sent along a bit of additional information about VSZ1-844. He had mentioned in his report that the carrier had remained on the air almost 20 minutes after programming ended. The verie letter he received stated that the transmitter is located on a different island from the studios and that the transmitter is turned on and off by a timer which is set to turn off the transmitter shortly after 0430. On the date he heard them it didn't go off until 0437. New studios are being built at the transmitter location and will be completed shortly. At that time they are installing a new remote control unit.
