If you'd like to get mad at my proposal, go ahead, I don't care. HLH, let's play fair when making comparisons: Last volume IRCA produced 945 pgs (blanks excluded) and NRC 980 (back pages excluded), even with 2 less issues. The final copy in the DXN is generally quite good with the exception of the parts prepared by a certain 2 editors who consistantly produce a poor original -- if they were cutting stencils for DXM the results would be worse. Conversely, the IRCA editors who now produce a good stencil would see their sections come out very clear and readable in offset. Logging Your First Ten Mexicans -- Jay Murley

Logging your first ten Mexicans isn't a problem in the Southwest. But many DXers far away from the Mexican border have definite loggings on only a handful of Mexicans. And those who don't understand Spanish may feel rather frustrated in their attempts to increase their totals.

But there happen to be a few rather fool-proof shortcuts that only require careful listening. The only requirement is an extra receiver, standing by on your most audible Mexican frequency or on certain short-wave dial positions in some cases.

With rare exceptions, for instance, every Mexican station—regardless of time zone—carries the same program from 2300-0000 Eastern Time on Sunday evenings. Even if you don't understand the language, the well-produced "La Hora Nacional del Gobierno Mexico" offers unexcelled opportunities for parallels. This is a prime source of new loggings for both distant DXers logging Mexican clear channels and border area DXers logging the tougher locals by careful looping.

Five of the most commonly heard AM stations have shortwave parallels as well. I suspect that these may present the sort of problems those of us in the West encounter as we attempt to log Nova Scotians via SW//AM. But for those whose loggings of certain large-power XE's have been blocked only by the splatter of a pesky local, this approach may have merit.

Most distant DXers will find their first ten Mexicans to emerge from among the thirteen stations listed below. Some are primarily English-language, some largely so; the majority are Spanish-language outlets.

- 540 XEWA San Luis Potosi, S.L.P., 150 kw. Spanish-language, //to 900, 1190, 6165 and 9515, scheduled 0700-2300 EST.
- 690 XETRA Tijuana, B.C.N., 50 kw. A 24-hour "good music" (wall-to-wall), English language outlet serving Southern California.
- 730 XEX Mexico, D.F., 150 kw, Spanish, // to 6065, 0700-0100, with unloggable satellites that are barely loopable.
- 800 XELO Ciudad Juares, Chih., 150 kw. Basically Spanish by day and English by night. Note: Tijuana daytimer XEMMM is 1000 watts here.
- 900 XEW Mexico, D.F., 250 kw, Spanish, // to 540, 1190, 6165, and 9515, 0700-2300, with two U.S. Chicano daytimers.
- 1000 XEOY Mexico, D.F., 10 kw. Spanish,// to 6010, 0700-2300, hardly a clear-channel in the Pacific Northwest.
- 1030 XEQR Mexico, D.F., 10 kw. Increasing to 20 kw, Spanish, another all-nighter, contemporary music and news.
- 1050 XEG Monterrey, N.L., 100 kw. Somewhat bilingual, on all-night, no SW parallel.
- 1090 XERB Tijuana, B.C.N., 50 kw, Vancouver's soul station, English, 24 hours, featuring "Wolfman Jack", etc.
- 1110 XERCN Mexico, D.F., 50 kw, for many best logged via "La Hora Nacional" parallels; Spanish, 24 hours, no shortwave parallel.
- 1190 XEWK Guadalajara, Jal., 50 kw, Spanish, // to 540, 900, 6165, and 9515, 0700-2300.
- Mexico, D.F., 100 kw., Spanish, 0600-2300, two Chicano daytimers here, but no other XE's from 1210-1230, for "La Hora Nacional" parallels.
- 1570 XERF Cd. Acuna, Coah., 250 kw. Bilingual, 1800-0800, no parallels. Was English 1900-0200 or 0300 and 0500-0730 last year.

And a challenge to those who have long surpassed the ten-mark in their Mexican loggings: there are about 500 AM stations, satellites included, in Mexico. If you've logged the 13 above, you'll have seven Estadoes (counting the Distrito Federal). That leaves 25 Estadoct and Territorias to go. Some, like Guerrero (best known for Acapulco, the resort town), are very difficult catches. Others are virtually impossible. For those interested in logging XE's by states, here's last year's listings, when 491

Radio Nordsee International'

According to reports received from Tom Sundstrom, Desmond J. Colling (via CMS), and Terry Greenhill, RNI has ceased transmission. The last days of the station appear to have been hectic ones. On August 29, attg and a smaller boat came out to Mebo II, the ship on which RWI was based, and boarded the ship, claiming the station belonged to Kees Menders. When the RNI crew denied this, Menders got back in the tug, circled Mebo II for 20 minutes and then began preparing to cut the anchor chains. The DJon duty put out a distress call, asking people to call a number in Zurich and another in The Hague to find out who the real owners were. Erwin Meister, who was in Holland, came out to the ship with a lawyer and called for help from the Dutch Marines. The tug and the small boat escaped out to the open sea and disappeared in the mist. On September 24, the station left the air. They announced that they were closing down because of pressure within the Dutch parliament to close all pirate stations. They said that the directors thought it better to voluntarily silence RNI rather than have the older Radio Veronica (and the Dutch people) suffer. The 1367 kHz carrier left the air at 0500 EST on September 24, and the 6205 KHz carrier ended a minute later. According to announcements, the vessel cut its sea anchor at 0430, and the ship sailed into Schenveningen harbor in mid-afternmon. According to Desmond Colling, strangely enough, all the DJs seemed unusually happy about the closure. One DJ said he was still employed as an engineer, although not as a DJ. Several times it was said that "The future is bright for all the lads out here", and perhaps most revealing of all is the official announcement, dictated by RNI's HQ and read many times -- "... Our directors in Zurich feel that it would be better for the Dutch people for us to suspend broadcasts so the Dutch government will not attempt to close Radio Vernnica...

Colling suggests that RNI's vessel, the Mebo II, is far from finished as a radio ship. He sees a couple of possibilities: 1) they plan to do what they said they would do when setting up the station, in the event of the Netherlands introducing legislation; that is, sail to the Mediterranean and broadcast to France, supplied from Spain; 2) RNI may have made a deal with R. Veronica who will possibly take over the Mebo now since Veronica's own ship is very old now. The Dutch may allow Veronica to continue with more power instead of having both RNI and Veronica off their coast. Menders (or Mundes) who tried to allegedly hijack RNI last month, attempted to buy Veronica about' two years ago, so he may also be connected in some way. Tom Sundstrom's correspondent in Sweden, Terje Isberg, states that RNI never had or never will have any QSLs, according to Mrs. Bclliers, one of the co-owners. There will be a book printed about the operation of RNI, available for about \$2 US, from "Souvenir Book", Radio Nordsee International, P.O.B. 113, CH-8047 Zurich, Switzerland.

England England's first commercial radio stations are expected to be in operation by January 1972. Commercial radio backers are now hoping for medium-wave allocations for broadcasts. The BBC stations are restricted to VHF broadcasting, which offers big disadvantages; VHF cannot, for instance, offer road information since car radios are generally not equipped with AM/FM receivers. Commercial stations on MW would offer a distinct advantage over the BBC plan. (WRB)

Pirates

Growing numbers of pirate are appearing in England. Severl stations in southern England have formed an organization called "The Southern Independent Radio Association." Member stations include Radio Morsham, Radio Ajax, Britain Radio, and Radio Reigate. Britain Radio operates on approximately 1180 and 1385 kHz. Radio Free Morsham has been noted on about 1115 kHz. (WRB)

Malta According to station from the Station Controller, the British Forces Broadcasting Service, is closing down the MW transmitter on 1430 kHz on Dec.1.

British Honduras According to the British High Commion in Ottowa, British Honduras is an "internally self-governing nation" but that Britain controls all external affairs. The name is still British Honduras, but the country is soon to become independent and it is not known at this time whether they shall be independent within the commonwealth or shall break entirely. (Quentin K. Brown)

India The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting now has its Fourth Plan for a strengthening of the radio networks of India. Equipment for a super-power medium wave transmitter at Rajkot has recently arrived from Yugoslavia, and is expected to be on the air by the end of 1971. High powered stations are also planned for Simla, Najibaad, a place near Bareilly, Jammu, Srinagar, and Imphal. Low pewered transmitters will be at Tawang, Niasa, Aijal, Lungle, and Uttarkashi. The high-powered MW station at Bhug is already in use, while another at Leh is under construction. (SCDX)

Lesotho Lesotho National Broadcasting Service, Maseru, is now on the air 2300-0200, 0530-0700, 1000-1500 EST. Sat 2300-Sun 0200, and Sun 1000-1430 all on 899 kHz with 10 kw. (SCDX) Has drifted to 897, and probably not 10 kw. (EDXB)

Venezuela Radio El Sol, La Fria, is a new station on 1160 kHz. (SCDX)

West Germany A SSB MW transmitter operates from Hanover-Hemming 0300-0900 EST on 1025 kHz with 400 watts, relaying first program of NDR/WDR. (SCDX)

Mozambique A new 50 kw transmitter located in Lourenco Marques will operate on 1007 kHz in the near future. (EDXB)

Ramadan The Islamic Holy Month this year is from November 1 to December 1. This means a daily fasting period from sunrise to sunedt, and therefore a considerable nymber of MW stations in Arabic countries are on extended schedules in the late evenings. (SCDX)

Radio VL2NI

A challenge to all medium wave DXers is little VL2NI of the Norfolk Island Broadcasting Service.

You may quite possibly know nothing about Norfolk Island. Its geographical coordinates are 167.56° east and 29.03° south which puts it in the So Pacific 660 miles NW of Auckland, NZ, and 1035 ENE of Sydney, Australia.

Only 8528 acres in area, it is an Australian Territory with an Administrator and a locally elected Council. Its main income is from the sale of postage stamps and from tourism.

It is in fact a popular place for tourists who come mainly from Australia and New Zealand but increasingly from other countries. They are attracted by a near-perfect climate, luxuriant flora and fauna, fascinating historical remains, duty-free shopping and first-class hotels.

The Island was a notorious British penal settlement in the early 1800's and there is much evidence of this unsavoury period still in existence.

VL2NI is the only broadcasting station on the Island and is now operated by the Administration. It started life as a Department of Civil Aviation utility designed to inform Islanders of aircraft movements.

A studio was then set up in the Administration buildings at the capital, Kingston, and a transmitter with an output of approx. 12w was used on 1570 kHz.

Following the recommendations of an Australian Post Office engineer who visited the Island and reported on the local broadcasting service in 12/67, a new 50w trans. was installed and a new aerial erected. An ultra-modern studio was built in a restored convict building and a library of records and tape-recordings was established with the assistance of the New Zealand Broadcasting Corp., the BBC and Deutsche Welle.

The Island now had an excellent broadcasting service providing international news, local news bulletins and a wide range of musical and variety programmes. Transmission times were 0900-1200 local time (2130-0030 GMT) Mon. thru Fri. and a Monday evening programme 2000-2230 (0830-1100 GMT). Monthly Council meetings were broadcast Tue. eve.

But on the morning of Wednesday, May 27, 1970, a disastrous fire completely gutted the building housing the new studio along with the Public Library and historical museum. Priceless historical documents were lost and VL2NI went off the air.

But not for long. The enthusiasm of its staff, particularly people like part-time technical officer John Anderson, owner of a large radio shop, had the station operating the next day from the tiny transmitter shed.

With fellow broadcaster Pastor Matt Cathcart sick with hepatitis, Broadcasting Officer Mrs. Kathy Lecren has since the fire presented 45 min. daily programmes under dreadful conditions. Her entire equipment consists of one ancient record-player, a Sony transistor radio, a small control box, a low-density mike and a kitchen clock.

International news is taken from R. Australia or Brisbane's VLQ9 through the transistor set and there are unavoidable lengthy breaks as records are changed. But no one complains. VL2NI is a community station and everyone on the Island would help if he could. Each morning there are many visitors to the transmitter building and children play outside the open studio door.

Saturday and Sunday aircraft movement broadcasts continue to come directly from the airport terminal where Department of Divil Aviation controller Les Bright has a lower power transmitter also tuned to 1570 kHz.

The staff at VL2NI are aware that many foreign DXers are trying hard to capture their elusive signal and they look forward to receiving reception reports. In fact, several accurate reports have come in from N.Z., Australia, Germany, Finland and elsewhere and have been quickly verified.

Strangely, none have arrived since the 50w tx was commissioned except from a ship in the Tasman Sea. John Anderson thinks the old makeshift aerial must have had sky-wave tendencies while the new system is specifically designed for local transmission and may have none of the former long-distance capabilities.

But do try to log VL2NI. And if you can't log it, why not visit Norfolk Island yourself? The Administration or Tourist Board will be pleased to send you information on VL2NI and the Island in general. Remember, Norfolk Island is an excellent location for South Pacific DXing.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

Amendments may be made to this Constitution by submitting a proposal in written form to the President of the International Radio Club of America at least 60 days prior to the beginning of the annual convention. To become enacted [as] an amendment, the proposal must receive a full hearing before the members assembled at the business meeting at the annual convention, and announcement must be made at that time to express the intent to have the full club membership vote on the proposal. In addittion, to become enacted, a proposal must receive a two-thirds majority of the total club membership.

BYLAWS OF THE INTERNATIONAL RADIO CLUB OF AMERICA, INC. (Revised to 8/1/70) ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the International Radio Club of America, Inc., and the official abbreviation IRCA may be used in referring to this organization.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of the IRCA shall be to promote the hobby of radio listening on the AM Broadcast Band, 510 to 1630 kilocycles.

ARTICLE III - ELECTIONS - A CONTRACT OF A SECOND OF A

Section 1 - Frequency

Elections in the IRCA shall be held in odd-numbered years to elect the officers listed in Article V. and well by the grade of the section of the property of the first traditions

Section 2 - Dates

- Part 1 Nominations: April 1 to May 15. Part 2 - Campaign statements: due to be submitted to the Chairman of the Election Committee one week prior to the date of the June DX Monitor. The same deadline applies to nominees who wish their names withdrawn from the ballot.
- Part 3 Elections: Ballots and the printed campaign statements are to be mailed to all members with the June issue of the DX Monitor in the election year and are to be returned to the Chairman of the Election Committee by August 1. In case of a tie in the balloting for any office, a run-off election among the nominees that tied will be executed immediately by the Election Committee, and results announced

- Part 3 (continued) as soon as possible thereafter. In case of a tie in the run-off election, or in case there are no persons nominated to fill a particular position and no write-in candidate receives an undisputed majority of the votes cast, the newly elected members of the Board will appoint from the candidates that tied (if any) an officer to fill the position within 30 days of the election. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical Region in which the vacancy exists. In case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President shall cast the deciding vote.
- Part 4 Results: The results of the above elections are to be announced at the IRCA Convention and published in the following issue of DX Monitor. Results of other elections are to be published within 30 days of the ballot deadline.

Section 3 - Scope

- Part 1 The President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected by the membership-atlarge.
- Part 2 The Board of Directors shall be elected on the following basis:
 - a.. The world shall be divided into seven regions, each representing as nearly as possible an equal number of IRCA members.
 - b. Each region may contain as few as 10% but not more than 20% of all IRCA members.
 - c. One Director shall be elected from each of these Regions.
 - d. Region boundaries will be reviewed by the Election Committee before each election and, if necessary, revised.
 - e. Eligibility: No member shall be eligible to election to any office without having held one year's membership in the IRCA; no member shall be eligible for more than one elective office concurrently.
 - f. If a Board member moves permanently from his Region within one year of election, he shall be relieved of his duties at the time of such move; if the move occurs after the first year of his term has elapsed, he will be allowed to fulfill the term but will not be eligible for reelection from his former Region.

Section 4 - Nominations

- Part 1 All nominations for officers must be submitted in written form to the Chairman of the Election Committee.
- Part 2 Nominations for President and Secretary-Treasurer may be made by any member regardless of location.
- Part 3 Nominations for Director must be made by a member or members residing in the appropriate Region.
- Part 4 An IRCA member may be nominated for more than one office, but must decide for which he prefers to run and so inform the Election Committee.
- Part 5 Only one nomination per office shall be allowed any one member. If a member signs a nomination as a group, this will be considered his one nomination.
- Part 6 All candidates will be notified of their nomination by the Chairman of the Election Committee shortly after May 15 of election year. Nominees may submit campaign statements to the Election Committee Chairman with limits as follows: President and Secretary-Treasurer: 20 lines; Directors on the Board: 15 lines.

Section 5 - Determining Winners, Election Committee

An Election Committee appointed by the President with the Board's approval will handle all aspects of each election with complete authority.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Dues will be collected on an annual basis and the amount will be subject to change by the action of the Board of Directors. The Secretary-Treasurer will be in charge of collecting dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1 - Officers

The government of the IRCA shall be comprised of the following officers: President,

Section 1 - (continued) Secretary-Treasurer, and seven members of a Board of Directors.

Section 2 - Duties of Officers

Part 1 - President

- a. Shall preside at all official club functions, including the annual business meeting, when in attendance. If he is not to be present at the annual business meeting, he will appoint at least two weeks in advance of the meeting date a member who does plan to attend, to preside over the meeting; this appointment is not subject to Board approval.
- b. Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote and administer the affairs of the club to the best of his ability.
- c. Shall, with the approval of the Board, have the power to bring reprimand and revocation proceeding against any member who he deems is not adhering to the rules of the organization; he must submit in written form any findings to the Board for their action.
- d. Shall have the power to appoint the chairman of any committee, with the approval of the Board.
- e. Shall have the power to remove a chairman of any committee for neglect of duty; this action must in turn be approved by the Board.
- f. Shall have the power to appoint any contest managers, with the consent of the Board.
- g. May create any additional committees which he may deem necessary with the approval of the Board.
- h. Shall have the power to bring action to appoint and/or remove editors of the club publication DX Monitor with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- i. Shall have the power to appoint or remove the Publisher of DX Monitor with the final approval of the Board of Directors.
- j. Shall have the authority to act on any suggestions or proposals, making any recommendations if he so desires, but also submitting the primary proposal to the Board of Directors; any action on a suggestion or proposal is subject to the final approval of the Board.
- k. Shall have the power to vote on any proposal that does not receive a majority decision by the Board of Directors during the contemporary administration so as to break any deadlock that would result.
- 1. Shall not have the power of pocket veto.
- m. Shall be responsible for the inclusion of the complete IRCA Constitution and Bylaws, as smended during the previous year, in one of the summer issues of the DX Monitor each year.
- n. Shall be responsible for reporting the results of voting by the Board of Directors in the DX Monitor; such reports to be made by the time a ballot is circulated among the membership dealing with matters that were presented to the Board for decision.

Part 2 - Secretary-Treasurer

- a. Will be in charge of collecting all dues for membership and membership renewal.
- b. Shall issue IRCA membership cards.
- c. Shall keep an up-to-date list of all members.
- d. Shall keep a complete financial record of all monies received and spent.
- e. Shall submit every six months a condensed financial statement to the Board for their examination, and, at the time of said submission, shall present the statement to the membership through the official club publication. The financial statement of the club must be approved by the Board of Directors before publication in the DX Monitor.
- f. May, with the consent of the Board, appoint members to assist him in some of the bookkeeping work.

g. Shall be responsible for recording and filing minutes of the annual business meeting. In his absence at the business meeting, he shall appoint another member to record said minutes.

Part 3 - Board of Directors

- a. Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote the affairs of the club to the best of their ability.
- b. Shall have the final power in ruling on any club affairs, suggestions, proposals, recommendations, or findings submitted by the President; the Board shall have the power to present legislation and findings as well as make rulings.
- c. Shall not have the power to appoint chairmen of the various committees, contest managers, publishers, or editors, but shall have the power to confirm their appointment:
- d. Can conduct most of their business by mail, but if five are present during an annual convention, a quorum for business shall be said to exist.
- e. Shall have the power, if they deem it necessary, to call for a special election to submit a major issue to the membership-at-large; the Election Committee then will handle all aspects of the special election.
- f. The President shall ballot the Board of Directors soon after each election, or in case the Chairman of the Board resigns, to determine the Chairman of the Board, who will be the spokesman for the Board and will be responsible for assuming the President's office in case it is vacated during the current term. A tie in the balloting will be broken by the President. In the case where the Chairman of the Board becomes club President, he shall be required to resign as Chairman of the Board and a new Director from his region must be selected to fill the position vacated by his succession, in accordance with Article V, Section 4.
- g. Shall have the power to submit a question to the vote of those present at the annual business meeting with a simple majority of those voting prevailing.
- h. All decisions of the Board of Directors, including the names of the Directors voting for and against each proposal, must be published in the DX Monitor as soon as possible after the decision is made. No member shall be held responsible for such decisions until they are made public through the DX Monitor.
- i. All members of the Board shall submit to the President their votes on all proposals no later than 3 weeks after the mailing of the proposals to them by the President. All votes not received within the 3 week period will be considered abstentions from voting by the member(s) in question.

Section 3 - Term of Office

All terms of elective office in the IRCA begin on September 15 in the year the nominee is elected and expire on September 14 two years hence unless re-election takes place.

Section 4 - Replacements

- Part 1 When the Presidency becomes vacant, the Chairman of the Board will assume the Presidency for the remainder of the current term.
- Part 2 When the office of Secretary-Treasurer becomes vacant, the President shall appoint a new Secretary-Treasurer, with the approval of the Board, for the remainder of the current term.
- Part 3 When a seat on the Board of Directors becomes vacant, the Board must appoint a successor to complete the unexpired term as soon as possible. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical region in which the vacancy exists. In the case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President shall cast the deciding vote.
- Part 4 If a Director on the Board moves permanently from his Region within one year after his term of office begins, or in the event a Director fails on two consecutive occasions to communicate to the President his vote on club matters within

- Part 4 (continued) the limit specified in Article V, Section 2, Part 3 herein, his seat on the Board will be declared vacant and the procedure outlined in Part 3 (above) will apply.
- Part 5 If an IRCA officer's membership in the club expires during his term of office and he fails to renew it within two weeks after such expiration, his office will be declared vacant and the relevant procedure outlined above will be applicable.

ARTICLE VI - PUBLICATION

The official publication of the IRCA shall be known as DX Monitor. It shall be issued 34 times each year, except in cases of emergency. With the permission of the Board the number of issues may be changed. DX Monitor will normally be published beginning with the first Tuesday in October, up to and including the last Tuesday in March, twice in Ap ril and September, once in May, June, July, and August.

ARTICLE VII - PUBLISHING COMMITTEE

The President shall have the authority with the final approval of the Board to appoint a chairman of the Publishing Committee. Publishing proposals should be submitted to the President in written form and should include the qualifications of the publisher as follows: amount of time available for the job; availability of helpers (should include at least two helpers in addition to the chairman); access to mail schedules; availability of necessary space for duplicating equipment. The job of Chairman of the Publishing Committee shall not be terminated until such times as continuance is no longer deemed beneficial to the organization according to the Board, or until such time as the publisher is no longer able to continue in his capacity.

ARTICLE VIII - OTHER COMMITTEES

Functions of other committees shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Committee chairmen shall have complete authority over the activities of their committees (contest managers are considered to be chairmen of their respective committees.)

ARTICLE IX - EDITORS OF CLUB BULLETIN THREE OF Finds bets largered form prizhant

The Editors of the club bulletin shall be appointed by the President with the final approval of the Board of Directors. When an editorship vacancy is announced, volunteers will be sought by the President. A reasonable time limit will be established for names of volunteers to be submitted. After the time elapses, the President will select one person from the list of volunteers, appointing him as the new editor; immediately, he will send to the Board of Directors a proposal to that effect, listing in his proposal the names of other volunteers (if any) from which the editor could be chosen if the President's choice is not approved. A majority vote by the Board will make the President's appointment official; if the proposal is defeated, the President will appoint another person from the list of volunteers to be the new editor. The process will be repeated until the Board confirms an appointment by the President. If necessary, the President shall have the power to appoint a temporary editor to serve during the selection process, without approval by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X - CONVENTIONS A PROPERTY AND ARREST STORE OF SERVICE AND ARREST OF THE AREA OF T

Section 1 - Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the IRCA shall be held in conjunction with the annual convention for purpose of presenting the reports of officers, committees and boards, and such other business as may lawfully come before the meeting.

Section 2 - Special Meetings

Special meetings of the IRCA may be called at any time by the Board of Directors on its own motion, and must be called by the Board of Directors on petition of at least 10% of the membership. Such meetings shall be held at such times and places, either within or outside the state of Colorado, as the Board of Directors or petition herein specified shall determine.

Section 3 - Convention Location

The Board of Directors shall solicit during January of each calendar year bids submitted by those wishing to host the annual convention. The Board shall subsequently cause a special election to be held among the members to select the convention site and date.

Section 3 - (continued)

Such special election shall be conducted during the first quarter of each calendar year. The Board may, on its own motion, determine any bid made as unqualified prior to the special election.

Section 4 - Voting

Each member shall have one vote on each and every matter submitted to a vote of the members. At all meetings except as otherwise provided by law, the members entitled to vote who are present shall constitute a quorum. All action except as otherwise provided by law, by the IRCA's Constitution or bylaws, shall be by majority of those members present and voting. Presence and voting by proxy may be allowed at the discretion of and in accordance with rules prescribed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XI - SUGGESTIONS AND PROPOSALS

All suggestions and proposals shall be submitted to the President in written form, who will then submit them to the Board for action (along with any specific recommendations he may care to make). The final decision as to any action to be taken rests with the Board of Directors. A proposal that receives more "yes" votes than "no" votes will be considered passed. A proposal which is related to the activities of an IRCA committee or the club Treasury will first be submitted to the respective Committee Chairman or the Secretary-Treasurer for his recommendations, which will subsequently by submitted to the Board along with the primary proposal.

ARTICLE XII - IRREGULARITIES, REPRIMANDS, DISMISSALS

Section 1 - Irregularities

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors and the President. A statement of the irregularity and the member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charges, and shall be submitted directly to each Director and the President; all shall determine any action which shall be taken.

Section 2 - Reprimands

In case of irregularities, the IRCA President must with the approval of the Board issue a letter of reprimand, to be sent by registered mail, to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense.

Section 3 - Dismissals

If the nature of the offense is serious enough to cause further action than a reprimand the President must, with the final approval of the Board issue a letter or letters clearly stating the nature of the offense and that dismissal proceedings are being taken. The aforementioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time must be allowed for the accused to answer the serious charges. If the reply is not forthcoming or if it does not meet with the satisfaction of the President, a letter or letters of dismissal may be sent with the final approval of the Board of Directors, removing the membership of the accused.

ARTICLE XIII - REFERENDUM/INITIATIVE

If a member cannot get action on a proposal in the prescribed manner, he can submit a petition bearing 20% of the signatures of the club membership to the Election Committee to effect a special election on the matter. This pertains to matters other than those concerning the contents of these documents.

ARTICLE XIV - RECALL

If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members asking for the removal from office of the President or Secretary-Treasurer, the Committee shall call a special election at which the membership will be able to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the officer is approved by 75% of the members voting, the office shall be declared vacant. If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members in a certain Region asking for the removal from office of the member of the Board of Directors from that Region, the Committee shall call a special

ARTICLE XIV - (continued)

election at which the members in that Region will have the opportunity to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the representative is approved by 75% of the members voting in that Region, the office will be declared vacant.

ARTICLE XV - AMENDMENTS AND CHANGES

These Bylaws may be amended by the submission of a By-Law amendment in written form to the President. He, in turn, must submit the proposal to the Board for consideration. With the approval of the Board, the proposal is then submitted to the Election Committee who shall arrange a special election. A proposed By-Law amendment petition containing the signatures of 20% or more of the membership must be presented by the Election Committee to a vote before the entire membership. To be enacted as an amendment, the proposal must receive a simple majority of those members voting. An amendment to the Bylaws goes into effect immediately after its adoption, unless the proposal to adopt specifies a date for its going into effect.

ARTICLE XVI - RATIFICATION

The ratification of a 2/3 majority of those members voting shall be sufficient to establish these Bylaws and Constitution as the official documents of the International Radio Club of America, Inc.

- II. Requirements of proposals submitted to the President:
 - A. Name of the member submitting the proposal.
 - B. Date of submission of the proposal to the President.
 - C. A proposal must not violate procedures established by the IRCA Constitution, the IRCA Bylaws, or the incorporation laws under which the IRCA is organized.
- A proposal may be accompanied by comments of explanation or justification.
- III. Procedure for submitting proposals:
 - A. Eight copies of each proposal should be submitted in written form to the President. (Only seven copies are necessary when Board members submit proposals.)
 - B. Upon receipt of the proposals, the President will send one copy to each Board member as soon as feasible, with his own comments and recommendations if he wishes. Board members will communicate their decisions to the President within thirty days. [Bylaws, V,2,2-i, specify a three week time limit. ed.]
 - (Exception to the above.) Proposals concerning certain special areas for which committees exist will be sent to the appropriate committee chairman by the President for recommendations. Then the proposal, together with the committee's recommendations, will be sent by the President to the Board for
 - D. After the Board's decision is obtained, the President will have the results published in the club bulletin as soon as possible. If the member who submitted the proposal desires to know the outcome immediately, he may send the President a self-addressed stamped envelope.
 - A proposal that is passed by the Board becomes effective immediately, unless otherwose specified in the body of the proposal. Exception: proposals dealing with additions, changes or deletions to the IRCA Bylaws, which must be approved by the club membership as well as by the Board. (Note: Proposals amending the Constitution are not sent to the Board of Directors.)
 - A proposal that is defeated by the Board may not be resubmitted in identical form for a period of one year from the date of announcement of the Board's

These guidelines have been approved by the Board of Directors, and should be followed in all instances. Naturally, all proposals are welcome and will be carefully considered by the Board.
