Kalph Sanserino is considering making available kits to construct an altazimuth loop with an FET booster of Kolb/Manning design. While these are only estimates and orders are not being accepted at this time, the parts for an altazimuth air core loop, all assembled and ready to wire with instructions, would be about \$10; the parts for the air core loop and FET booster, about \$15. The parts for the loop would be assembled, not the loop. For those without equipment necessary to construct the FET booster, it may be possible to obtain that portion already constructed. PSAs The large number of PSAs listed in the FCC changes last issue has prompted some questions on "PSAs"; no, they are not public service ann's. They are presunrise service authorizations. Stations with PSAs may use daytime facilities with a stated power. Stations with PSAs need not use them; it is not mandatory. A station may elect to use nighttime facilities with regular power during the time between 6 AM LT and sunrise. And daytimers, of course, would wait until sunrise to sign-on. -DEE

There are 20 stations in Saskatchewan - all getting out quite well. CBDH-880 CJSL-1280 CFGR-1230 probably qualify as the hardest. No DST is observed throughout Alberta and Saskatchewan, so this should create some good summer DX.

DX "Programs" and "Tests" At one time, especially in NRC, there was a definite distinction made between programs and tests. If the stn was using night facilities, it was a program; if day facilities, it was a test. The reason is that FCC regs do not permit a daytime-only stn to conduct 'dedicated' programs, whether for DXers or other organizations, during the experiemental hours of 12-6 LT. Nor may full-time stns conduct such programs with day facilities, if rules are correctly interpreted. The FCC, at one time, wrote the NRC stating that it was OK to list pre-scheduled tests from stns using daytime facilities but the club's name could not be used. Whether these rules still apply 100% or not is subject to both consideration and debate. If they still apply, to what extent? Several stns in the past few years have not followed these rules, to various degrees. Hopefully, we might receive some clarification from NRC CPC Chairman Jerry Starr who is, himself, a DJ at WHOT-1330. And CPC members are cautioned not to request any stn to mention the club's name if they are using daytime facilities, at least until some change in rules or interpretation is found. -DEE

Although the 1971 WRTH may list a number of AFTN relays, later information reveals that all the relay stations have been closed down or converted to reddiffusion systems. In addition, all the remaining stations are to be converted to FM by mid-1971. Here's the situation as of 11/23, provided by CE Larry Loback:

- 1450 Korat (network headquarters also here); longwire: 25 watts nominal.
- 1220 Utapao: longwire: 25 watts nominal.
- 770 Nakhon Phanom ("NKP"); longwire: 25 watts nominal; do not confuse with WABC, jingles in whose style it uses.
- 940 Ubon: longwire; 25 watts.

this transmitter will no longer originate programming but will relay Korat. It and the base will be completely closed around April 1971. Following a disastrous crash last April when the AFTN building was completely demolished in Udorn, and 9 AFTN staffers killed, AFTN-Udorn has been rebuilt with an FM transmitter only. 3/4 watt with a log-periodic antenna on 101.9 mHz. It is planned that the other four stations will use the same frequency. So you have but a few months to DX AFTN on the BCB!

England The Conservative government elected last June is reported mulling over the possibility of selling BBC's new local radio stations to private interests when commercial radio makes its appearance in Britain. Policy clarification is expected in a few menths, when the government's white paper on commercial radio is due. In the meanwhile, even the mere hint of such a sale has the BBC hopping mad. The Tory regime is committed to greenlightling local commercial radio run by private entrepreneurs, and at one time, 100 such outlets were mentioned as a possible future goal. The BBC currently is operating 13 "local" outlets (non-commercial, of course), and seven more are planned for spring. These are the stations the government is considering selling. (Midwest DX Club, via Dave Alpert)

Synchronous Transmitters---Ed Kocsan

The explanation in 12/5 DXWW was an excellent explanation of multiple wave interaction, especially in the manner that directional antennas operate, when the radiating or parasitic elements are in the close proximity to each other. However, at distances from the transmitter(s), this no longer is entirely valid, because of scattering, bouncing, refracting and other anomalies of signal propagation. Two evenly started signals may no longer arrive from the same precise direction, or may have travelled not exactly the precise distance, nor even arrive in the same plane of vertical or horizontal polarization; yes, or even remain in any given relationship from one instant to the next.

Actually, synchronizing of broadcast stations on the same frequency is more concerned with establishing a fixed relationship in the <u>audio</u> links between each of the stations, so that each carrier is modulated precisely in step with every one of the others. At the speed of light there is no perceptible difference to the ear listening to two or more radio signals coming simultaneously from unequal distances. There is, however, very readily recognizable differences to the delays inherent in landwires to telephone systems which are uncompensated. Witness two well known US cases of synchronization: first, the old WBZ and WBZA operations where the two stations were synchronized to serve specific areas with the same program; second, WWV and WWVH where synchronization automatically occurs because of the very preciseness of the modulating source system.

Publications Since Elementary Electronics and Scieence and Electronics have been merged, they now plan to put out their answer to Communications Handbook, called Communications World, on sale January 15 for \$1.25. It will include the complete White's Radio Log (oh boy!) and will have articles by Don Jensen on DXing. Speaking of Communications Handbook, I haven't been able to locate a copy on the newsstands yet--DEE, where did you get yours?

There are few receivers (within reason to the typical DXer) that are designed mainly for BCB. This one is, and it's downright cheap! It is a NAVY type CRV 46151 "Aircraft Radio Receiver" commonly called the ARB.

It covers 190-9050 KHZ in four bands. The frist two cover the BCB. It is a six tube single conversion superhet, with a 135 KHZ intermediate freq, for BCB. This gives very sharp selevtivity on the BCB, and makes "splits" easily audible. Tuned RF amplifier.

Tube line up: 12SF7, RF amp. 12SA7 mixer, 12SF7's for IF amps, det, and 1st audio, 12A6 audio output. It has a big beautiful four gang tuning capacitor. (They don't make 'em like that any more) The receiver weighs 26.8 LBS, and measures (approx) 7 X 8 X 15½.

There is very little info about the ARB around, however schematics are available, and conversion is quite simple. It comes with an internal dial, and although it becomes a bit hard to read on the high end, (calib every 20 KC after 800, every 10 before) once the oscillator is set, and the set is warm, drift is minimal. It would also be easy to change a SW dial to cover the BCB better for tuning ease.

The receiver is available from: G & G Surplus, 45 Warren St. New York, N.Y. 10007. (Catalog: 25¢) It comes complete with tubes, for \$39.50. A wired AC power supply is \$8.95 extra, and there are remote tuning units, etc. available if desired. This set is very well shielded throughout, and I noticed no image problems here on a LW antenna, 30° high, and 50° long EW.

As it is, all that is needed is an audio gain, and an off-on switch, and an output jack for phones. Depending on how far you want to go, you can easily add: "S" meter, RF gain, BFO, 4 ohm speaker output, (it comes with 600 ohm output xformer) there are several good books describing furthur conversion.

For under \$50. this set would definitely make a good main receiver for many IRCA members, easily comparing with receivers seven or eight times the price (on BCB).

I offer this information with the hopes that some of the members that are on a tight budget (as I am) won't go and blow \$100. on some of the "glitter radios" available today. Most of them are gutless on the BCB, unless you go over \$400. If you want some DX instead of a status symbol, think seriously about an ARB. It's sure worth the effort! I will be happy to answer any questions as I have one here working quite well.
