IRCs going up - International Reply Coupons will cost 22¢ effective July 1 according to a very recent Postal Bulletin. However, it appears that the old ones will be honored at the new postage rates. Which would indicate NOW is the time to purchase a good supply of IRCs. Check with your PO first, however, to guarantee that this is the case. For a limited time after July 1, those who desire them, may obtain old IRCs at 15¢ each from DEE at pub hdq; they have accumulated for the last 3 years.

Each member may vote for seven of the candidates seeking a position on the BoD. Spaces are provided for write-in votes for each office.

Included on the ballot is a space for you to write in your choice for the Ted Vasilopoulos Award. The TVA is awarded annually to the IRCA member who has done the most during the past year to promote the affairs of the IRCA and to improve the hobby of DXing. Because of changes in the regulations governing the TVA, Larry Godwin and Don Erickson (last year's co-recipients) are ineligible to receive the 1971 TVA.

The candidates and their campaign statements follow in alphabetical order by office. Office: PRESIDENT

#### Percy Kesteven, 13112 - 134 St., Edmonton 44, Alberta, Canada

I'm 23, single, a university grad just finishing his second year of teaching. I've DX'ed for 5 1/2 years, been a member of the IRCA for 4. I DX mostly domestics and have 550 veries and 15 countries. My record stands thus: Board of Directors (current), 2 years; Achievement Awards Committee Chairman, 3 years; Countries Committee, 2 years; Courtesy Program Committee, 3 years (1967-1970), arranged 40 tests. Proposals on the Achievement Awards Committee, taped veries, the Ted Vasilpoplous Award, and other items have kept me active in club affairs. A few special features items have been submitted and various "odds and ends" typing jobs have been done for the club over the years. I chaired a small committee of DX'ers a couple of years ago who drew up and sold 10,000 copies of a Log Entry Sheet (a private venture). It is my feeling that our club, founded to promote and communicate the DX hobby, has strayed somewhat in its aims. While not advocating a stiffling "censorship", I must go on record as favoring DX-oriented material for club publication. I hope to achieve this end if elected. Cooperation with NRC on such items as CPC is essential, yet IRCA must stay independent and continue to grow.

#### Father Jack Pejza, 3266 Nutmeg St., San Diego, Calif. 92104

Every radio club has its strong points and its weaknesses. IRCA's strengths lie in its top-notch bulletin and in the interest and enthusiasm of its members. Its weakness, I feel, is a lack of direction and unity. Our percentage of participation is high, but much of the effort is wasted wrangling about topics only remotely connected with DXing. Our next president has the tasks of trying to re-direct this enthusiasm and to re-establish common goals so that all members overcome petty differences for the improvement of IRCA. As a director and editor for the past two years, I have gained many insights into the opinions of members; I feel I can direct IRCA in such a way that we concentrate our efforts in working for the betterment of the hobby we all enjoy. Your vote for me will indicate that you agree a revitalization is needed; with your help we can move together hopeful of more productive participation.

#### C.M. Stanbury II, Box 218, Crystal Beach, Ontario, Canada

I have been a DXer for 20 years. I am a contributing editor for ELECTRONICS ILLUSTRATED where my column "The Listener" has the widest circulation of its kind in the world (about 300,000 per issue). I'm also the editor of SHORT WAVE NEWS SERVICE which provides tips and background information for 10 subscriber clubs as well as POPULAR ELECTRONICS. I have the outrageous notion that DX can be something more than mere knob twiddling when used to explore the broadcast media. This often leads me into all sorts of controversy, most recently with the Voice of America over their APOLLO coverage. It is very unfortunate that the concept of independent IRCA leadership is treated so contemptuously by many of our current elected officials; the allegiance of certain figures in the IRCA government towards the concepts and philosophies of another club appears to have hindered implementation of reforms which the membership as a whole supports, but which conflict with the philosophy of this other club. Independent IRCA leadership would do much to ensure that the <u>DX MONITOR</u> is not manipulated and biased by an outside group, and that new proposals would be treated fairly and given attention for their own merit. If elected, I would work to make the bulletin a more impartial publication and more relevant to our purpose of accurate dissemination of DX information, regardless of how the other club operates. TRANSPORTATION TO Toledo: If you are able to accept riders (to share expenses or otherwise) or need transportation, please send DEE your name, address, telephone number and any details. These will be published in June, July, and August issue of DXMs. Let's all make plans to be there.

When you read this, the 1971 Toledo IRCA Convention will be little more than two months away! Therefore it would be wise to begin planning for vacation days from work, and making any other plans and arrangements that may be required for attending the Convention. We have made some of the arrangements and set up some of the activities for the convention, and hope to have everything finalized in time for publication in the July bulletin.

The Convention will take place at the TOWN HOUSE MOTEL, 1111 West Bancroft St., near downtown Toledo. Arrangements have been made for the Convention room and the banquet, and a block of motel rooms will be reserved especially for persons attending the Convention. Room rates have been finalized as follows (ALL: Double Beds):

One person in a room......\$13 (THESE ARE NIGHTLY RATES!!)
Two people in a room.....\$17 (or, \$8.50 apiece)

Three people in a room......\$18 (or, \$6.00 apiece) Four people in a room......\$20 (or, \$5.00 apiece)

Five people in a room.........\$22 (\$4.40 apiece. Two beds and a cot.) As you can see from the above, it will be much more economical if you group several people together into the same room.

The other convention costs (besides transportation) will be registration and the banquet. Unlike most previous conventions, there will be a choice of THREE different main courses for the banquet, so everyone attending will be able to order something he likes. Each individual may opt to eat any one of the following entrees:

French Fried Shrimp......\$4.50
Swiss Steak.....\$4.25
Country Fried Chicken....\$3.75

Total registration costs will probably be the price of the banquet (depending on which meal a person chooses) plus an extra \$2 to cover refreshments as well as supplies costs and mailing costs in preparation for the Convention. This extra \$2 charge, however, is not yet firm and definite, and could change slightly in either direction depending on how these miscellaneous expenses run. These will not be paid until Convention time, nor will the room charges, so no money need be sent through the mail.

We must have an accurate indication of who will be coming (i.e., how many people will show up) and how they will be arriving, banquet and rooming preferences, etc., by TUESDAY, AUGUST 10TH. A cardioid array has a heartshaped reception pattern, much like the surface of an apple cut in half (w/the antenna at the base of the stem). It differs from the ordinary loop antenna having only one broad null instead of 2 sharp ones. Also, the idea is nothing new, as navigators have used such arrays for decades before LORAN, etc, came along. Part II of my article, dealing w/the theory of operation, should appear shortly. The Chicom sts are not overmodulated as claimed in an earlier DXWW. They use forward XR sites which relay off-the-air signals which (I suppose) emanate from around Peking. They use some clipping which adds a "crispness" to audio. VOA uses the same technique to program its P.I. XRs. It uses a receiver site at Camp John Hay (USAF), Baguio where it receives off-the-air signals from Stateside VOA xr. These are sent via VHF link to Barrio Tinang, Capas, Tarlac; and Poro Point, San Fernando, La Union for transmission at those two XR sites. VOA-760 uses the same method and I presume VOA Okinawa also. Naturally, phase fades in the received signals cause distortion, which is "overmodulation" to the uninitiated. Visited VOA-1140. Uses big Continental 1000kW feeding four 0.625 wavelength towers. Present DA pattern yields 6.4db voltage gain into Indochina (more than 4,000kW, ERP!). When I was in Vietnam, VOA-1140 was always strong.

#### IDing Trans-Pacific Stations -- Gene Martin

Perhaps I have stumbled onto a promising new way to identify some of those elusive trans-Pacific stations which use time pips on the hour or half-hour in some cases. This new method involves the precise musical classification of the pips. When this is done, important differences are revealed from sets of pips which have always been assumed to be identical.

For example, the six pips I recorded from 3LO in Melbourne on April 12 were in the key of G. One hour later, I recorded six pips from a most probable 5CL in Adelaide in the key of C. I cannot know the reason for this difference but it's worth noting that 5CL and 3LO are affiliates of different networks. The pips from 1YA, Auckland, on May 8, were in the key of C.

Art Peterson sent me a copy of his extremely valuable Asian ID tape, which contains samples of all the trans-Pacific pips. On that tape, he offers a set of six identical pips with the explanation that they represent what you would hear from New Zealand, ABC Australia, and the USSR Home Service. The Peterson pips are in the key of B, suggesting that he took the USSR Home Service pips as his sample of what would be heard from all three countries.

But it appears that there are differences in pips which can be detected by a good musical ear, and these differences may be enough to clear up the identity of some mystery TP catch if it has been preserved on tape.

Personally, I am a musical ignoramus. The musical ear I have been quoting belongs to Miss Ellen Lewis, a music major at the University of Denver. (She is my son Paul's girlfriend). She listened to all the pips on the Peterson tape, and here is what she tells me about them:

Japan: three short notes in A, and one long fourth note in A one octave higher. North Korea: three short pips in F, one long in E flat.

Radio Viet Nam: Three short pips, one long, all in key of F. Sounded like cricket notes to me.

Radio Hanoi: Five short ones in D, one long pip in F.

Cambodia: Three short pips in D, and a final one in D an octave higher.

Red China: Five pips in G, a final one in G one octave higher. It takes ll seconds through the Chinese pips.

South Korea KBS: Two short ones in B flat and a long pip in B flat an octave higher.

AFVN South Viet Nam: Three in B, and one in B an octave higher. The single note which Peterson connects with JONR, Japan, and Philippine stations is in the key of C. The single pip for FEN-Japan was diagnosed as the key of A.

I have previously been informed that the six pips from LRA, Bueonos Aires, are in A flat, and the final one is prolonged.

I suspect a great deal more analysis of the musical characteristics of pips needs to be done. It well may be that we cannot assume that pips from 3LO and 1YA will always come in G and C respectively. But if that does turn out to be the case, then it becomes a splendid new tool in identification. Just get yourself some friend with a good musical ear!

Radio Carrousel I have received a sample QSL card from Dave Gleason. These QSLs will be available to the first 500 people correctly reporting reception of the station in Guayaquil, Ecuador, on 660 kilohertz. Reports, either new or follow-ups, should be sent to Dave Gleason at P.O. Box Q, Hato Rey, Puerto Rico 00919. Should anyone wish to have his verie mailed from Ecuador, they should enclose Ecuadorian stamps for return postage. There have been many DXers who have sent reports to Guayaquil, but such reports will not be answered from Ecuador. Dave, who is, I believe the owner of Carrousel, is the only source for verifications.

Rather unusual daytime conditions noted currently (May 18), with good openings to Queensland, New South Wales, Tasmania, of up to 1000 miles at 12:30PM local time. - New Zealand, Wellington, usually the first NZ to fade-in, noted 0540 with classical music.
- 701 BBC Masirah Island with identical signal 1628, ID "Huna London" 1630.
- 770 JOUB Japan, Akita, NHK2, with English language lessons on a Saturday, 1415, strong.
- 844 VSZ1 Gilbert and Ellice Islands, Tarawa, fade in around 0730, much island music, and consistently better than old shortwave outlet.
- Philippines, morning music 2045, s/on 2054 with English announcements, frequency, license information, anthem. Also in evenings around 1330 with telephone talk-back program. (These calls are listed in WRTH71 for 690 kHz with 500 watts. Ed)
- 1214 ... Albania, Tirana Foreign Service, Arabic 1900, s/off 1927 with "Internationale".
- Philipppines, s/off 1600 after ID, frequency, personnel listing, anthem; unlisted this call in WRTH is "Sound of South" reported previously by some sources as DXMM. (Location? Ed)
- 1313 ... USSR, Radio Moscow, Arabic 1935, listed as Simferopol, and probable.
- 1457 ... Rumania, Constanta, Rumanian announcements, classical music around 1820, mixed with BBC.
  - BBC ??? Carrying World Service around 1800-1900. Is this the Cyprus relay? (Probably so, according to Glenn Hauser in last issue of DXWW. Ed)
- 1466 ... Monaco, Monte Carlo, fade-in around 1835, French with many pops.
- 1475 ... Austria, German talk 1820, through until fade-out around 2115 (0715 LT)
- 1511 RBI East Germany, with Danish talk 1935, good level at times. Blocked at 1945 by ABC opening up (2NA Newcastle).

Radio Northsea International (UPI and AP, Los Angeles Times and San Diego Union, May 16 and May 17) Two men were arrested and have confessed that they planted a fire bomb aboard the MEBO II, the ship holding RNI. A police spokesman said two of three men arrested on suspicion have given detailed accounts of their part in the attack. The men, who were not identified, offered no explanation of their motives. The bomb started a fire that extensively damaged the ship. The station went off the air a few minutes after 11 PM Saturday, but came back with an announcement saying

that an explosion caused by a fire bomb had occured in the engine room. The crew and staff of seamen, disk jockeys, and engineers escaped without injury. About 2:30 AM two fire-fighting ships had extinguished the fire. The station resumed broadcasting in a while. Captain Jan Hartevelt broadcast a message that everything aboard was all right. Each member of the Swiss-Dutch-English crew sent a message to his family and then they all same "Happy Birthday" to one of the crewmen. Police said that the three saboteurs used a rubber boat to go to the 670-ton broadcasting ship, anchored seven miles off the beach at Scheveningen, Holland. They cut the rubber boat to pieces after the return trip. The police said they understood detectvies found parts of the rubber boat and diving suits at the beach opposite the position of the pirate station, Earlier reports said that a launch had raced along side the ship and lobbed the bomb into the engine room.

Thailand Radio Thailand broadcasts on 830 and 923 kHz from 2300-1530 GMT, in Thai. Reception reports are welcome and are acknoledged by QSL card if correct. Return postage is not required. France ORTF, Limoges, 791 kHz, has increased power from 100 kw to 150/250 kw.(EBU via Dave Alpert)

Iran The following power boosts are planned: Radio Ahwaz-1390 to 400 kw; Radio Bandor Abbas-620 to 125 kw; and Radio Mashad-725 to 400 kw. (SDXK via Dave Alpert)

Israel The Armed Forces channel of IBA is negotiating the purchase of at least one 50 kw transmitter from an American firm. (MWDXC, via Dave Alpert)

Australia Station 3YB Warrnambool is now using 880 kHz, instead of 1210. The move took place on April 4, and is the latest of a series of frequency changes by ABC. 4TO Townsville, 780 kHz, is now operating on a 24 hour schedule, making 32 stations now operating full-time in Australia. (Bob Padula, in WRB)

Tahiti The new transmitter on 740 kHz has a power of 20 kw. They also still are on 1400 kHz with 4 kw. Schedule: 1615-1830, 2100-2330, 0300-0800. (Arthur Cushen in WRB)

Monaco Radio Monte Carlo's British service experiment: has failed. After 4 months of English broadcasting, the station closed in April. During the recent weeks of service, the station was forced to move a few kHz within the 205 meter band to avoid QRM from BBC World Service testing on both 204 and 206 kHz. (WRB)

Cyprus Radio Monte Carlo has been testing in Arabic on 1232 kHz, with IDs in Arabic and French, starting at 1000 GMT. (SCDX)

Portugal Emissora Nacional is testing a new powerful transmitter on 971 kHz which interferes in France with NDR, Hamburg, West Germany. (SCDX)

Radio Northsea International—further information from C.S. Stanbury II N.C. Jurgens, the advertising manager and PR officer for Radio Veronica has been arrested. It is alleged that he paid each of the three divers \$7200 to destroy RNI, and then went for a holiday in Hungary while the job was done. A popularity poll published the preceding week in a leading Dutch newspaper showed that RNI was taking many listeners from Veronica because of its higher power. Two Radio Veronica directors are also being held. They admit to investing \$24,000 in a plan to get RNI off the air. They claim that the plan was to drag the Mebo into port with two large tugs, and that the divers had disobeyed orders by trying to sink the ship. Also recently revealed is the fact that Veronica paid RNI \$240,000 to stay off the air for two months at the start of this year. RNI (1367//6205//FM) is presently on its summer schedule of 0500-0200.

Cyprus Clearing up the 1232 kHz. thing, the station here belongs to Radio Monte Car10, and was testing, relaying the BBC. Since then, the BBC relays have been dropped
and replaced with near-continuous music. The station will assume a regular sked
later this summer. (Dave Alpert)

Romania Since May 31, through the summer, there is a new special service called "Radio H9liday", broadcasting music and information intended for visitors to Romania in English, French, German, Russian, and Romanian on 1457 kHz. Sked is 0800-1300 and 1600-1800 GMT. (GNDXN via Dave Alpert)

Switzerland Fire struck the studios of SBC in late April, causing extensive damage. It is not known if/how their programming was affected. (MWDXC via Dave Alpert)

VOA Okinawa-1178 kHz is presently signing on at 0500 GMT. Better try for them now since it appears that the islands will very shortly be turned over to Japanese rule.

#### Guidelines for Reporting to DXWW

Foreign DXing is a new experience for many. Definite identification of stations requires a good ear, much patience, and in many cases, luck. To encourage DXers who have not tried foreign DXing, and to remind those who have been reporting to DXWW of the preferred methods of reporting, here are some guidelines.


- 1. There are basically two reasons to submit reports to DXWW: a) to aid others in logging the station; and b) to get help in identifying an unidentified station you have heard. To accomplish either of these, sufficient information must be included in your report. Too few details simply do not aid anyone. Your report should include the following information; date and time (in GMT) of reception, type of programming, ID if heard, conditions of reception (excellent, good, fair, poor), and any other helpful information, such as some details of the programming or any interference present.
- 2. If you are not certain of the exact identity of the station heard, indicate that your identification is tentative. To claim definite identification sometimes can place you in jeopardy, if the known facts about that station simply do not match up with your report. Never be afraid to admit that you don't know exactly what station you heard. On some frequencies there are a number of stations which are likely; if you don't know which one you heard, don't stick your neck out by claiming positive identification.
- 3. If you are not certain of the language used (for instance, on Oriental stations) don't definitely state that the station was broadcasting in a particular language, even though you are pretty certain of the identification of the station (because of pips, it is the only one on the split frequency, etc.). Some stations are Foreign Service stations and broadcast in languages other than their native one.
- 4. Try to check back on what has been heard on that particular frequency in back issues of DXWW. Very often people do not do this; they might be able to get their unidentified stations into the category of a tentative reception by a little research. DXWW recently changed its format to aid DXers in the process of IDing their unknowns. Make sure that your sources (WRTH, FBIS, etc) are up to date. There was a DXer a couple of years ago who was reporting obscure Venezuelans because they were all that was listed on certain frequencies in his out-dated MW Guide, when actually more recent publications listed other possibilities.
- 5. Above all, don't try simply to impress by the quality or quantity of your reports. All of us like to brag about our catches, but remember that your reputation as a a.DXer depends on the ability of others to use your information.

A good time was had by all at the Riverside DX get-together, I believe. About 20 showed up in the course of the weekend. Brian William's distance record for a SCECPSDDX meeting was easily broken by Big George Kelly and Marc DeLorenzo of the Boston area. I finally got to see Toyland. Despite all I had heard about it before, I still found it hard to believe. It's impossible to describe in fifteen lines.

#### NRC Latin American Log

The National Radio Club has published a companion volume to its domestic log. The NRC LA log not only lists all Latin American and Caribbean stations, but also has a number of articles on methods of identifying them, by music, time checks, advertising, etc. The book sells, at least to NRC members for \$2.50 and the number published is limited. If you try, perhaps you can get a copy by writing to Box 99, Cambridge, Mass. 02138. My only complaint about the log is that it doesn't indicate drifters, at least not very often. All the other needed information is there: frequency, call and slogan, address, and schedules and verie signers in some cases.
