RADIO DIRECTION FINDING: A Practical Approach on the BCB with an Algorithm for Manual or Computer Evaluation.

The BCB presents DXers with numerous opportunities to pinpoint distant transmitters by using loop antennas to take local azimuth bearings of such stations when the signal is placed in the loop pattern null. In general, to uniquely pinpoint a distant station requires observations (bearings taken with a loop antenna) from three distinct points on the Earth's surface not lying on a common great circle path. However, on the BCB, considering propagation conditions and other factors, the number of observations in practice can be reduced to two. For example, if a Midwestern DXer takes a bearing on a station and obtains a reading of 135° (or 315° since the loop is assumed ambiguous and thus symmetrical in pattern response) and an Eastern DXer takes a bearing on the same station and finds the angle to be 175° (or 335°), then the signal is more likely to be coming from the Caribbean area (determined by the bearings of 135° and 175°) for the other location of the station is in the Indian Ocean several hundred miles southwest of Perth, Australia and there appears to be nothing but water in that vicinity. But the deduction is based upon a more significant fact, viz., that one can most likely discount signals from that distance in most (but not all!) cases.

Accuracy of bearing is of the greatest importance and here lies the essential difficulty for the BCB DXer. Bearings taken with most loop antennas are subject to errors and limited in accuracy by null width and the compass used (on the loop) to read the bearing. Accuracy required in the azimuth bearing is most dependent upon the distance between the transmitter and the DXers' receivers and the separation between the DXers! locations. As a rule of thumb, bearings must be accurate to within 1° or less to locate with reasonable accuracy stations more distant than 500 miles. Such accuracy is asking a great deal of a loop antenna! Accuracy to within I° is the best that can be expected from a given collection of DXers using loop antennas whose patterns are not skewed or rotated -i.e., patterns whose nulls appear at right angles to the loop plane and are symmetrical in their response. However, it is more likely that most loops have some null skewing due to numerous causes (these causes have been and continue to be discussed at length by the DXing fraternity) so that accuracy of bearing is not sufficient, in general, to allow a single pair of DXers to accurately pinpoint a distant station. This difficulty can only be overcome by the efforts of more than two DXers working together and calculating from among all possible pairs of these DXers the distance from each DXer to the distant station. With this concerted effort and the information it gives, an area on the Earth's surface can be isolated in which the station can be correctly assumed therein. The geographical distribution of these DXers is significant (i.e., the distance between any pair of DXers) since the more widely separated they are, the more likely the results with be accurate.


To allow the reading of azimuth bearings with a loop antenna, perhaps the simplest and most convenient way to accomplish this is to add a compass (0 - 360°) at the base of the vertical mast holding the loop. Drilling a hole near the bottom end of the vertical mast just above the compass face will allow a pointer to be inserted in the mast for reading the bearing off the compass. The pointer is most conveniently set in the mast somewhat perpendicular to the loop plane. The compass should be made with great care and should be of sufficient diameter (12" minimum) to allow marks to indicate each degree from 0 thru 359 (clockwise) and the pointer should be very rigid and not "thicker" than the markings used to show degrees on the compass.

A few suggestions on setting up ("calibrating") such a loop: It is not likely that the pointer is exactly perpendicular to the loop plane and even if it were, null skewing will "rotate" the plane again. Also, to use a magnetic compass to line up O° (on the loop compass) with the North Pole (True North) will not suffice. The only effective way to approach the degree of accuracy desired is to calibrate the azimuth bearings of all your local stations and numerous semi-locals (it is assumed that the correct bearings of these stations are known—See Footnote) by rotating the base compass so that when the null is placed on the known station at the known bearing, the pointer indicates the correct angle on the loop compass. Not all stations will "line

up", but by knowing bearings of numerous stations throughout the BCB, re-calibration can be made at various frequencies across the BCB.

Consider now the algorithm that can be used to calculate the distance from each DXer to the distant station. This algorithm is designed to allow only the use of the sine and cosine trignometric functions and is derived from the fundamental identities of the general spherical triangle. (Another approach which offers some advantages but involves additional trignometric functions can easily be derived from Napier's Analogies). Thus, let F be the far or distant station to be located, H1 denotes the location of one DXer and H2 the location of the second DXer. The great circle distance between H1 and H2 will be denoted by DX. The great circle bearing (azimuth angle) of H2 as measured at H1 will be denoted by B1 and, similarly, the great circle bearing (azimuth angle) of H1 as measured at H2 will be denoted by B2. It is assumed that B1, B2, and DX are known quantities—see Footnote). For the record, azimuth bearings are taken with the following conventions: 0° = True North, 90° = East, 180° = South, 270° = West and 360° is equivalent to 0°. Thus, azimuth angles are measured clockwise from True North.

Let D1 denote the bearing (in degrees) of F as measured at H1; D2 denotes the bearing (in degrees) of F as measured at H2; DX1 denotes the distance (to be calculated) between H1 and F and DX2 denotes the distance (to be calculated) between H2 and F.





ALGORITHM FOR DISTANCE CALCULATION IN BCB DIRECTION FINDING

Angles A1 and A2 of spherical triangle H1,H2,F are calculated from the pairs of bearings (B1, D1) and (B2, D2) respectively. Choose H1 so that A1 is the larger of the vertex angles at H1 and H2.

Welcome to all the new reporters; always glad to hear from you. Keep up the reports.

South Africa According to inromation received from TransWorld Radio by MWDXC, TWR has abandoned its plan to build a relay station in Swaziland and will instead build it in the Republic of South Africa. Initial power will be 50 kw; eventually they will be 250 kw, more than twice the power planned for the Swaziland station. Reasons for the move allegedly involve financial matters; electricity, for example, costs 2/7 the amount in South Africa that it does in Swaziland. TWR also claims that ground conductivity at the new site has beeen found to be much more suited for the antennas. Construction is already underway, with the 50kw temporary transmitter being prepared for shipment from New York. The station will be operational sometime in 1972. (Midwest DX Club, via C.M. Stanbury II).

Okinawa This is your chance to log and ver_y another country. VOA will run a test for NRC on Sunday, October 31, from 0830-0930 GMT. They will also test on November 14, also a Sunday morning. The million watt station has been widely heard on the West Coast; if geomagnetic conditions are good, it might make it even further inland.

South Korea Anew commercial station has opened on 1220 kHz; HLAA. Schedule as monitored in Tokyo is 1955-1603. Another new station is HLAQ, 1350 kHz, with one kilcwatt of power, s/on 1900 GMT. (SCDX)

Pirates Radio Caroline and sister station Channel 70 are located in Dublin. They broadcast after midnight British Standard Time on frequencies ranging from 1320 and 1350 kHz. Postal address: 8 Bristol Gate, Kempto, Brighton, England. Two IRCs requested.

Radio Free Carclire has been heard on 1315 kHz on Saturday and Sunday from 1030-1130 and 1500-1700. Address: Box 400, Scottish Free Radio Movement, 17 Eskgrove Drive, Bilston, Midlothian, Scotland. (SCDX)

Ramadan The Muslim's month of fasting begins this year on October 21 and ends on November 19. During this time, many Middle East stations are on extended skeds; many MW stations are on all night. A good time to try for some TAs.

International Waters Two of Radio Veronica's owners were sentenced to a year in jail for the attack made on Radio Northsea International. The three frogmen they hired received lighter sentences. This is reportedly the first prosecution in the Netherlands under their Piracy Act. A Dutch newspaper has reported that a merger between the two competing stations is expected shortly. Expected program director of the new station is to be Jan van Veen, former jock on both Veronica and RNI; he also happens to be the son-in-law of the Veronica Director, Dirk Verwey. RNI has a new 10 kw MW transmitter which is being installed on board Mebo II at the present time. (C.M. Stanbury II and SCDX)

WWV Format --Art Peterson

The new format of WWV is really great. Through it this morning I was made aware of a major solar flare that occurred early on 10/3. An interesting 14-page booklet about the facilities and services available will be sent free from: Frequency-Time Broadcast Services Section, National Bureau of Standards, Boulder, Colo. 80302. I also received a leaflet from the International Ursigram and World Days Service which gives information on the propagation reports on WWV. It also defintes many of the terms used. One piece of information I was not able to get is how all the various indices affect BCB propagation, such as solar flux, proton events and flars (as opposed to solar flares), and polar cap absorption. One thing that would be interesting would be to find which index corresponds to aurora conditons, DU openings, WC TA and EC TP openings, so that one could predict ahead of time what sort of DX conditions he could expect. Perhaps Gordon Nelson has some ideas on this. Anyway it is a big improvement over the mailed reports. (Gordon had a lengthy article last year in DX News in which some of these topics were discussed. Write to NRC to get a copy of the reprints they have evailable. To anwer some of your questions, a period of low Afr values is needed to get good transpolar reception, such as WC TAs. In general, a geomagnetic index of about 15 indicates auroral conditons. The higher the index, the stronger the auroral condtions. WWV broadcasts geomagnetic conditons at 18 minutes after the hour; WWVH at 45 minutes after the hour. The geomagnetic index is usually the second index given.

Jay Murley's article last issue is well worth reading carefully, for an excellent rundown on times and frequencies of DU receptions. My only question is -- how did he stay sober long enough to write it? Don't forget the big get-together here in San Diego the Saturday after Thanksgiving. Jim Critchett will demonstrate his fantastic ability to pick up rarely heard domestics; you should see his logs! Grant Manning will reveal his secret life as an undercover agent for Ma Bell; that's why DEE is afraid to be seen in San Diego. Speaking of Grant; I'm sorry to see him have to give up WCDXR because of his new job; he's done a real excellent job with it in the brief time that he had it. Let's hope the new editor does as good a job. I just remounted my altazimuth loop to get rid of the wobbles; it will get its first real test tonight. Last, but not least, don't forget to enter the big Foreign Contest. This contest is not easy, with its policy of verifications, but it is not hard to do well in. A couple of years ago, in the similar one run by Don Reynolds for both clubs, I logged and verified 5 Zedders on two successive nights; those entries alone were amough to give me 5th place, I believe, despite the fact I didn't join until about March. I'll give you all fair warning--I've already got four stations verified for this contest, and this season I plan to send out quite a few reports. 73/FJP.

JAPANESE CHANGES Nov. 1, 1971, is the date for a major change in the Japanese medium wave picture. Quite a number of frequency changes and power increases will be effective that date. These are published in the Summer Supplement 1971 to the WRTH and were recently published in NRC. VERIFY THE JAPANESE STATIONS NOW; included in frequency changes are: JOQG to 970; JOKG, JOFG, JOIQ to 930; JOTK to 1300; JOOK to 620; JOTQ to 1000; JOLG to 1320; JOHP to 1380; JOZU to 850; JOLF to 1240; JOWF to 1440; JOUF to 1310; JOLB to 980; JOGB to 870. And many power increases. See Jay Murley's article on Trans-Pacific (Asiatic) DXing from last fall for more info on this aspect of DXing. Another article from Jay Murley will appear soon. -DEE
