Next plans include getting a tape recorder, running coax to the house, adjusting the potentiometer, & continuing the antenna 1500' past my house to the SE. Goals include WA, OR, & my 1st TA. John seems to think that Inuvik, N.W.T.-860 with 1kw is perhaps the best bet at this time for logging the N.W.T. He says the nightly s/off comes at 4 a.m. EST. Inuvik lies in the lowlands east of the Rocky Mountains, hence the geographical feature which makes Alaska such a tough DXing target in the eastern two-thirds of the nation, is missing in its case. By the way, is any information available on existing stations anyplace which still use the old-fashioned flat-top antennae as Tarawa does? All of these ought to be identified, if known, because the chances of hearing such a stn are many times better than if a vertical antenna is used.

The following proposals are hereby submitted to the membership for vote. Enclosed you will find your official ballot, which should be sent to Dave Prather, 1711 6th St., Apt. 14, Woodland, Calif. 95695. Deadline for receipt of ballots is Jan 17, 1972.

<u>Proposal 4.2-38</u>. Time standards. Amendment to Editorial Policy, II. B. 1-f and II. B. 2-e. Submitted by Michael B. Northam.

Proposal 4.2-38 places the issue of time standards for the Domestic DX Section and the Foreign DX Section before the membership. There are three alternatives for each section: (1) Eastern Standard Time (EST); (2) Eastern Local Time (ELT); (3) Greenwich Mean Time (GMT). If any alternative shall receive a two-thirds majority of the votes cast on its Editorial Policy section, that Editorial Policy section will be deemed to have been amended. If no alternative shall have received such two-thirds majority, a run-off special election shall be held beween the two selections having the largest number of votes cast for that Editorial Policy section. A simple majority of the votes cast for that Editorial Policy section in the run-off special election will be deemed sufficient to amend that Editorial Policy section.

Proposal 4.2-45. Effective date for taped verifications. Submitted by Larry Godwin. "Proposal 4.1-58 (which approved taped verifications) shall be retroactive without limit, and shall pertain to tape recordings made in any year, past, present, or future, provided they meet the approved criteria."

Proposal 4.2-51. Bylaws amendment. Submitted by Michael B. Northam.

Delete the following Articles:

Article VII - PUBLISHING COMMITTEE

Article VIII - OTHER COMMITTEES

Article IX - EDITORS OF CLUB BULLETIN

<u>Insert</u> a new Article VII, as follows, and renumber Articles X through XV to VIII through XIII, accordingly. The new Article VII to read as follows:

ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

The Board of Directors may, from time to time, establish various committees to carry on the activities of the IRCA. The Board shall have the power to establish guidelines and policies relative to the functions, operations, and authorities of any committee, but, in all other respects, committee chairmen shall have complete authority over the operations of their committees. For purposes of these Bylaws, the editors and publishers of the <u>DX Monitor</u> and any official agents of the IRCA are considered to be committee chairmen.

Proposal 4.2-52. Bylaws amendment. Submitted by Michael B. Northam.

Article V, Section 2, Part 1 (duties of the President), the indicated subparts to be amended to read as follows:

- a. (The President) Shall preside at all official club functions, including the annual business meeting, when in attendance. If he is not to be present at an official club function, he will, whenever possible, appoint a member who does plan to be present to preside at the official club function; this appointment is not subject to Board approval.
- d. Shall have the power to appoint the chairman of any committee, with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors.

In addition, the following subparts shall be deleted, redesignating subsequent subparts as appropriate:

- f. Shall have the power to appoint any contest managers, with the consent of the Board.
- g. May create any additional committees which he may deem necessary with the approval of the Board.
- h. Shall have the power to bring action to appoint and/or remove editors of the club publication <u>DX Monitor</u> with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- i. Shall have the power to appoint or remove the Publisher of $\overline{\text{DX Monitor}}$ with the final approval of the Board of Directors.

- 690 JO.. Japan, parallel to 770 with NHK2 programme with female in JJ 1010 11/2.(PP)
- 710 HLKA South Korea, Seoul over KMPC 11/22 1005. Radio play with little child speaking at 1015; crowds cheering at 1025, folk music at 1032, music interlude and talk in KK by woman. KIRO off and lucky break, whew.)PP)
- 720 ... China, Peking in apparent home service, all CC talks and commands 1046 10/22. (PP,W)(10/22 or 11/22? Ed)
- 770 JOUB Japan, Akita bombing in with EE language lesson after IS 0920 10/22. 'Home on the Range' was the topic. (PP,W)

New DX Country?? A news item on ABC TV evening news indicated that the eight independent Trucial States were banding together, now that the British are moving out of the Near East. Anyone have any further information on this?

<u>Peru</u> The Peruvian government has announced that it is taking over the country's radio and television stations. The new military government says it is for reasons of "security and mass education." (UPI via Dave Alpert)

Swan Island, the home of the well-known and widely heard Radio Americas which folded its tents about 4 years ago, has been ceded by the US government to Honduras. A New England farmer, Sumner Smith, of Lincoln, Mass., claims the government has no right to do so, since the island is his. A companyir which his father had an interst, the Swan Island Commercial Company, took title from Capt. Alonzo Adams, who sailed out of Mobile, Ala., in 1893 and came upon Swan by accident. In the early 1950's, the U.S. was paying Smith \$300 a year in rent for a weather station. Radio Americas also paid Smith rent. Finally the government claimed full sovereignty over the two tiny islands, by reason of a previous visit in the 1850's, by George V. White, who landed in the name of the U.S. Regardless of who it belonged to previously, as soon as the Senate approves the treaty, and the president signs it, the islands will be taken over by Honduras, which has claimed them for years. The negotiating has been going on since 1963. (N.Y. Times, via Tom Sundstrom)

South Korea A new MW station will replace KSBU, Okinawa, when the islands are returned to Japan. The station will operate from Cheju Island, and will be operated by the Far East Broadcasting Company. It will beam to mainland China. (SCDX)

International Waters Mr. Abe Nathan, the Israeli who flew in 1966 to Egypt to meet Nasser, and later bought a ship to use as a floating peace radic, has announced he will start broadcasts from his ship in the Eastern Mediterranean on January 1, 1972. Programming will be for peace between Israel and the Arab nations; it will broad cast with 50 Kw 24 hours a day, with pop and underground music. The broadcasts will be made by an international team in English, Hebrew, and Arabic.

Another off-shore station, Radio Sovereign, began broadcasting on November 20 from 2100 GMT on MW. This is not connected with a previous station of the same name. It is based at a sea fortress, and will be tended from England, according to the British paper, Disc and Music Echo. (SCDX)

Hoax A British paper carried an item to the effect that Radio Sweden was going to set up a new service in the Thames Estuary, from a sea fortress, on 259 meters; it was supposedly to be called Radio 259. (SCDX)

Japan According to a letter received by Grant Manning from NHK, JOSAD, the experimental station on 530 kHz, will not be verified because it is an experimental station. Despite this disclaimer, the station has been verified; Grant has a verie hanging on his wall. If you hear them, at least try.

The SCECPOSIX get-together last weekend (Nov. 27) was a great success, with about 20 people showing up. Three from the Bay area got this far-Bob Karchevski, Paul Welka, and Ben Veio. Others came from L.A., including Stu McKenzie, publisher of ASWLC, and Ruff Sanserini, with his new double-spiral loop, still in the experimental state. Even Randy Seaver was there, and admits having DXed a little. He played a tape, made in 1965-66 of TPs and DUs by Gray Scrimgeour, Larry Godwin, Art Peterson and himself. People were turning sick with envy. The bid for the 1972 convention has finally been formally submitted to PRK; the place-Fabulous Inns, Mission Valley; the time-June 30-July 3. This early date for the convention was chosen because of the Republican convention here in August. Start making your plans now and saving your shekels.
