Guidelines: Please report promptly; old DX is discarded. Please use one side of the paper and double-space between stns. Frequency order is of no importance. To give you some idea of what is needed, remember that every report is cut apart and the reporter's name, address, and equipment is stapled to one card. Each stn is stapled to another (punched IBM cards). The reporter and stn cards are then hand sorted and the section typed from this. If you fail to list the freq. each stn (whether 1 or 5 stns reported on the freq.) or if you don't use initials, this info is difficult to fill in. Those reporting this issue were 100% in following all requests except for prompt reporting. A number of items 6 weeks old.

# Peoples Republic of China -- C. Alan Taylor

Although the high-power foreign service transmitter sites ID as Peking, they are almost certainly not located in Peking. My best experience is with the 1340 kHz outlet which floods the Philippines at segments after sunset. Although the carrier is steady, the modulation is subject to intermittent phase shifts, so the evidence is that the modulation is taken off SW, just as VOA-1140, 760 and 1580 does.

Directional antennas are used. Services to different areas were heard in the Philippines with differing average signal intensities. In addition, as a service to one area is completed, the carrier is cut and reappears at a different intensity after a pause of 0.5 to 1.5 second. This is the length of time likely to complete phasing component changes. A mere transmitter power change could be completed more quickly, or even with no interruption as in the case of a single transmitter being switched for different power outlets.

The 1040 outlet would appear to be along the NE coast of PRC, judging from its target area. The 1340 outlet would appear to be somewhere in Fukien province.

As I expect to return to the Philippines inside of a month, I hope to research this interesting matter to a greater extent.
