FCC RELAXING ID RULES The FCC's much-heralded "re-regulation" process gets underway December 15th, 1972, with seven rules changes designed to make life easier for broadcasters, both radio and TV. At least one change will have a profound effect on DXers everywhere.

At present, AM and FM stations are required to identify themselves at the beginning and end of the broadcast day (actually, a legal ID is all that's required in a sign-on or sign-off; the other stuff, like licensee, power, etc. is thrown in more by tradition than anything else), and within 2 minutes of the hour and half-hour. (The TV rule is identical, except it's on the hour only for TV.) It is not necessary to interrupt a program in progress (such as an opera, classical music selection, or other continuous event) except at a natural break; the FCC considers that if you can break for a commercial, you can break for an ID first.

The new proposed rule for December 15th provides for all stations, AM, FM or TV, to make hourly ID's, as close to the hour as possible, at a natural break in the program offering. Thus, the ID on the half-hour will be eliminated, and the ID on the hour need not fall within the 2-minute limitation. Thus, DXers may have to rely more heavily on other program information to ID a station. Some stations may continue to ID at the bottom of the hour; our local KXRO-1320 ID's each 15 minutes!

This information on the new ID rule is paraphrased by Broadcasting in the lead story of its 11/6/72 issue. IRCA Special Features will reprint the complete new rule as soon as the rules and regs are reprinted to include it.

The Broadcasting story also lists six other rules changes, most of which will be unnoticeable to DXers but which will affect mainly technical operations inside the stations. For those interested, they are the following:

Transmitter meter readings, currently taken every 30 minutes, will be taken only every three hours. (It's common knowledge that many decjays don't really read the meters every half hour anyway!)

AM and FM stations will be inspected by a first-class engineer once a week, at intervals not less than five days, instead of the present five days a week.

Operating (meter-readings) and maintenance logs may be combined in a single log.

The "mechanical reproduction" rule is simplified to assure only that the public is not misled. Many programs are recorded in advance, but this fact is not important enough to announce. If a program gives the impression it is live and the event is timely, such as a delayed broadcast of a news or sports event, it will be identified as such in simple language. Also, the daily mundane announcement that "some of the network programs on XXXX are delayed and played back at a more convenient time" will now disappear.

Stations rebroadcasting other stations by off-the-air pickups need only get permission of the other station, and not the FCC, as long as the written consent is kept on file at the rebroadcast station.

The seventh change relates to filing of certain contracts.

FCC Commissioner Richard E. Wiley is supervising the task force on re-regulation. None of the more controversial issues bothering broadcasters, like political spending rules, the fairness doctrine, counteradvertising and cable-TV regulation, were touched on.

THE FCC "AM FREEZE" MAY BE ENDING The last paragraph in the above-mentioned 11/6/72 Broadcasting article may be as significant to us as anything else therein. To quote:

"Mr. Johnson (FCC Broadcast Bureau Chief Wallace Johnson) also disclosed that a long-pending proceeding involving a fundamental rule change is finally drawing to a close. It is a rulemaking aimed at tightening AM allocations rules, and has kept AM applications in a freeze since it was initiated -- in July 1968. Mr. Johnson said the commission 'hopes' to end the freeze 'before the end of the year.'"

The AM freeze was instituted on July 21, 1968, because of the heavy crowding of the AM band. Under the freeze, no major changes have been permitted in existing stations, except that class IV (graveyarder) fulltimers have been permitted to up their daytime power to 1 kw from 250 w, or to 500 w from 100 w. Generally, no applications for new stations have been accepted, although applications for specific

"AM FREEZE" (cont.) class II-A assignments have been accepted, such as KRVN-880. (Two such facilities are still available - 720 khz in Nevada or Idaho, and 890 khz in Utah.) The freeze has not affected minor changes like a change in transmitter location, slight changes of directional pattern, or issuance of pre-sunrise authority. Meantime, the Broadcast Bureau has continued processing hundreds of applications submitted before the 1968 freeze. Certain remote areas, such as Alaska and Guam (570), have received exemptions permitting new facilities. And of course, no limitation was imposed on new FM facilities. But basically, for the past 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, the only way to get into AM radio was to buy an existing station. We'll see what happens now, if and when the AM freeze is dropped. --BH.

Special thanks to Vern Maxham in San Francisco, who sent clippings from the San Francisco Chronicle and Wall Street Journal, respectively, covering the two stories above. Since most of the information was duplicated in Broadcasting, I ended up not using Vern's clippings. But he is the one who brought to my attention the potential ending of the AM freeze, which will of course affect us all.

FCC RULES & REGULATIONS The FCC is currently revising Volume III of its Rules and Regulations. This volume includes Part 73, Radio Broadcast Services (AM, FM, noncommercial FM, TV, and international shortwave stations), as well as Part 74, Experimental, Auxiliary, and Special Broadcast, and Other Program Distributional Services; and the new Parts 76 and 78, pertaining to cable TV and cable TV relay, respectively. Subscription price for the new edition will be \$10.50 domestic (U.S.) and \$13.00 foreign. The price includes an unspecified number of updatings (the last batch ran for about four years). Anyone interested in FCC rules & regs should note that the time of the revised volume is always the best time to order from the standpoint of value, as the revisions will keep the volume current for a longer period of time. The mailing in July suggested the volume would be out in September, so it could be available any day now. If you'd like to order, send check or money order (payable to Superintendent of Documents) to the Superintendent of Documents, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C., 20402. Do NOT write to the FCC. -BH.

TIJUANA FM: IT'S NOT OVER YET The U.S. and Mexico signed two agreements November 9th -- the bilateral agreement assigning FM stations within 200 miles of the U.S.-Mexican border (see 8/12/72 DXM, p. 38), and a special "arrangement" which holds that stations established under the main agreement (i.e. FM's) "within the jurisdiction of each (government) will be assigned and operated for the basic purpose of providing an effective service to nationals within its frontiers."

As the 8/12/72 DXM article notes, San Diego broadcasters are concerned about two Mexican-owned, American-operated Tijuana FM's which program to San Diego in English. The 8/14/72 issue of Broadcasting notes that Mexican authorities feel the two FM's, XHIS and XHERS, may be operating contrary to Mexican law. A Mexican investigation is underway, but was not completed before the agreements were signed.

IRCA Special Features will continue to let you know how this comes out, since it might conceivably set a precedent for the existing Mexican-border AM's.

KPHO-KHAT SALES APPROVED This goes back to the 5/6/72 issue of DXM. The Democratic Party of Arizona had opposed the sale of KPHO-910 Phoenix because the new owners planned to drop the all-news format and go country. One of the principals in the new KPHO company owned KHAT-1480, a country daytimer, also in Phoenix. The buyer of KHAT decided to go all-news, so the Democratic Party dropped its challenge, and the FCC approved the two sales in mid-September.

The unsettled geomagnetic activity that has been observed for the last six 27-day cycles did not materialize. Geomagnetic activity is now unsettled and will persist through November 18.

FBIS The latest edition of Broadcasting Stations of the World, published by the Foreign Broadcast Information Service, supposedly an adjunct of the CIA, has just been published. The latest edition, the 25th, is dated July 1, 1972. As usual, it comes in four parts, each of which can be purchased separately. Part I: AM Stations by City and Country, and Part II, AM Stations by Frequency, each cost \$2. Part III, FM Broadcasting Stations costs \$1.75, and Part IV, TV Stations, costs \$3. As usual, these volumes do not include US stations. A quick check reveals several stations which are missing--e.g., Verkhoyansk, USSR-656, Cuba-880, Vladivostok, U.S.S.R-1529. Like any other log, it has its limitations. However, it does provide an inexpensive log, a fact which might be helpful for younger DXers.

Just to throw my two cents into the discussion started by Richard Wood on the suitability of letting a government agency such as FBIS receive our bulletin--in my opinion, little harm is done in it. I agree that government agencies and/or private companies which want our bulletin should pay extra for it. In exchange for the use of information from our bulletin, we (or rather, I) receive a complimentary copy of the FBIS volumes. I do appreciate this, since they do help me in helping you identify foreign stations.

Additional comments on the SPR-4 Review Robert Fischer, Box 94, Newark, Del. 19711, has these additional comments on his review of the Drake SPR-4, published in the November 11, 1972, issue of DXM:

1. The SPR-4 is sensitive to impedance mismatch between antenna-receiver input on LW and BCB. For BCB, a loop like the Space Magnet, which has a high impedance, is recommended.
2. Using a longwire, the HQ-180 is more "sensitive" than the SPR-4 on BCB (unless the wire is very long, like 300') because of signal loss due to impedance mismatch, not because the SPR-4 is insensitive.
3. I should have mentioned that the BCB comparisons on sensitivity were made using only the Space Magnet and that SW comparisons were made using the 100' wire, where the SPR-4 performs well since the SW impedance input for the SPR-4 is low.
4. Listeners can not expect good results by sticking 50 feet of wire onto an SPR-4 and trying to DX BCB unless they have an antenna impedance matching device.
