XEROK IS BACK! XELO IS ONCE AGAIN XEROK! XEROK IS BACK!

The first IRCA member to advise of their change to XEROK again was the same who provided the information that they were waiting government approval to officially make the change ... Jeff Brasier, Northridge, Calif. Jeff first heard the new call Friday evening around 2100 EST, 2/16. Riverside DXer Dave McElroy had just minutes prior to Jeff's call also advised IRCA HQ of the new call. Dave reported ID in both SS and EE. DEE and Jeff both noted only EE IDs, but presumably they do indeed ID in both SS and EE as XEROK. Unlike XETRA which hides (?) its location by using the call X-TRA, XEROK spells it out in EE. At least one slogan appears to be "Radio 800" which was used quite often. A check with El Paso telco directory assistance (555-1212) netted the following: they had never heard of XEROK at any time. Even funnier, the "special assistant" (?) said the only "new" stations were XELO and KAMA. And, of course, XELO has been around many, many years. An attempted call to the stn go no answer around 2200 local time, though the number is probably nothing more than a request line or business office. Those who read DXM will remember that during the first week of Dec. 72, through a tip from Dave Shapiro, we learned that XELO had changed to XEROK for about 2 or 3 days, apparently doing so in error, without waiting liexican govt. approval. In a letter to Jeff Brasier, they also said they had been operating with lower power until late Dec. because of transmitter failure. Also, they planned to increase power in the future. Based upon an excellent signal in this area (SoCal), they may have even done that now. Next issue we'll have more information.

Buenos Aires appeared first as a bit of tango music about 0806. At 0813, there was a TC on the tape saying "Cinco trece," so BA is not on DST. BA appears to be almost 100% talk after 0815, alternating 2 male voices, but a female voice filled the minute before 0900. A 3rd LA seemed to by trying to arrive a couple of times during this hour, but it never surfaced. It seemed to take the air at 0820. Believe LS10 would be stronger than LRA-870 if the frequency were ever truly clear. Better get this one before XEQR becomes 50 kw, for that is in their plans. (GM,C)

ANARC REPORT

ANARC Executive Secretary -- The 9/15 deadline for nominations for Exec. Sec. for the next two years passed with no one who had been nominated allowing their names to be condidered. Finally, Al Reynolds, has accepted the nomination. Member clubs of ANARC are asked to vote on this nomination. Allen H. (Al(Reynolds, of Jackson, Tenn., is a member of NASWA and ASWLC. His primary areas of DX interest lie in shortwave broadcast, and utilities, but he also does some MW DXing. He is 35 and is Director of Christian Education for First Presbyterian Church of Jackson, Tenn.

1973 ANARC Convention

A second bid to host the 1973 ANARC Convention has been submitted by Father Jack Pejza and a group of other Southern California DXers, to have the convention in San Diego, in late July or early August. The site would probably be the Fabulous Inns, where the 1972 IRCA Convention was held.

European DX Council -- Wolfgang Scheunemann has been elected to serve a one-year term as Secretary General of ANARC's European counterpart. His new address is D-6 Frankfurt 90, Alexanderstr. 122, West Germany.

ANARC Financial Report -- To summarize, ANARC received \$269.22 this past year for club dues, Newsletter subscriptions, Abbreviation List sales, and profits on the convention. Expenses for postage, stationery, and supplies, committee expenses, and Man-of-the Year plaque totalled \$181.27. ANARC now has a balance of \$429.33, an increase of about \$90 from this time last year.

On behalf of the "Article X Committee", that portion of the By-Laws is being reprinted:

ARTICLE X - IRREGULARITIES, REPRIMANDS, DISMISSALS

Section 1 - Irregularities

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors and the President. A statement of the irregularity and the member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charges, and shall be submitted directly to each Director and the President; all shall determine any action which shall be taken.

Section 2 - Reprimands

In case of irregularities, the IRCA President must, with the approval of the Board, issue a letter of reprimand, to be sent by registered mail, to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense.

Section 3 - Dismissals

If the nature of the offense is serious enough to cause further action than a reprimand the President must, with the final approval of the Board issue a letter or letters clearly stating the nature of the offense and that dismissal proceedings are being taken. The aforementioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time must be allowed for the accused to answer the serious charges. If the reply is not forthcoming of ir it does not meet with the satisfaction of the President, a letter or letters of dismissal may be sent with the final approval of the Board of Directors, removing the membership of the accused.

The Article X Committee requests comments on that article from the membership, particularly with regard to proposed changes. Comments should be sent to the Chairman of that committee, Jay Murley. One copy will be sufficient; Jay will distribute the comments to members of the Article X Committee. Jay's address is: 1733 Candlestick, Newport Beach, Calif. 92660.

Dave Schmidt, a top domestic DXer and very active in CPC work, has volunteered to write an article on "How to Write a Reception Report" for publication in DX Monitor. While the problem has improved greatly in the past 12 months, IRCA members still are responsible for some pretty awful reception reports. Many of them come from members who have no obvious excuse. They've received their MMPs with the 'DX Booklet' and its article, "Writing Reception Reports." Yet, among recent reception reports at KOB in Albuquerque, N.M., was one report so lacking in detailed information that it was not verified. The reports ranged from very bad to exceedingly good with one of the best being a report by Bob Foxworth, New York City area, editor until recently of NRC's "Monitor Reports" portion of the foreign DX section. Dave Schmidt is in a good position to write about the art of reception reports. Please watch for his article, read it, and try to get some ideas from it. IRCA has a lot to lose, individually and collectively from poor quality reception reports. -DEE

A card, purporting to be soliciting support for two of the candidates for the Board of Directors seat vacated by Lynn Brooks, has been sent to a large number of IRCA members. Knowing their expressed goals are not popular with very many members, they pretend, in this offset-printed note, to support two candidates. Thereby, they hope to confuse you, the membership, into voting for someone other than those two. Those two can logically be considered front-runners. Your publisher is voting for one of those two; both of them have put in much effort to make IRCA a better club and both deserve better than to be victim of this under-handed trick. If you planned originally to vote for one of those named in the card, don't let the card trick you into changing your vote. Further, let the mailers of the card know you you feel about their fraud; maybe they will get the message that such frauds will get them nowhere. -Don Erickson

Elections for President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Board of Directors

Nominations will be open for President, Secretary-Treasurer, and the seven members of the Board of Directiors from March 1 to April 15. Only one nomination each for President and Secretary-Treasurer, and only seven nominations for the Board, shall be allowed each IRCA member. All nominations must be submitted in written form to Dave Prather (address below) by April 15, 1973. Note that a member may nominate himself if he or she so desires.

Dave will notify by letter all eligible candidates concerning their nomination(s) by May 1, 1973. The nominee must reply in writing if he or she accepts the nomination, and may submit a campaign statement for publication in <u>DX Monitor</u> if so desired. An IRCA member may be nominated for more than one office, but the member must decide which he or she prefers to run and so notify Dave Prather. A nominee who has indicated his/her intention to run for an office may not be considered as a write-in candidate for another office. Letters of acceptance of nomination must be received by May 20, 1973.

Ballots for the election of officers will be mailed by first class mail(separate from the June issue of DX Monitor) and will be postmarked June 15, 1973. Ballots must be received by Dave Prather, Elections Committee Chairman, on or before

July 31, 1973.

The Presidnet, Secretary-Treasurer, and the seven members of the Board of Directors shall be elected by the membershi-at-large. Each member in good standing shall have one vote each for President and Secretary-Treasurer, and may vote for seven of the candidates seeking Directorships.

Qualifications of nominees: Any member in good standing, regardless of where he lives, shall be eligible for election to any office provided he has held one year's continuous membership in the IRCA as of April 15, 1973.

The letter should have pointed out the advantages to the general public, not to just a few hundred hobbyists. The FCC's job is to protect the general public and maintain order on the radio band, not to protect perhaps a thousand DXers scattered across the country. Don't forget that Canada has had a similar rule for years, yet nobody is screaming about that. The biggest effect is that the stations playing long cuts of classical music will not interrupt a selection for an ID--and who would have stuck around for it on SSS, anyway! Most stations will still ID on the half hour and at odd times. Response to my query on reporting standards shows that everyone who bothered to comment feels I am justified. Another question: Do you prefer the state listed before or after the calls? Silence means approval of the way it is currently being done. Bill Harang to the contrary, one does not run a serious risk of being mugged in Hammond. Has anyone else noticed a shift of MM pests over the past few years? CKY and WPNX used to bomb in here, now they're rare. Must go. 73.
