More on XEROK

Last bulletin it was announced that XELO-800, Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico, had sanger changed to XEROK on (it seems) a permanent basis. During MM 2/19 monitoring, they were noticed having some difficulties in the studio or at the transmitter as audio was ( on and off for at least half an hour around 0700 FST. Likewise, a taped "Oldies But Goodies" show 2/19 PM LT (0100 EST 2/20) was ongand off without explanation. One was correction on last issue's info: one common slogan is Radio 80, not Radio 800. Another is X-Rock. The call is given sporadically, but often, is Spanish, then English, or the just one or the other. When it is given in SS, it is slow and very clear, unlike Island XETRA's presentation by a female voice. Like XETRA, though, XEROK does have Mexican travelogues, or at least one for Guadalajara, heard several times. A Who will be the safe first to report a XEROK verie on XEROK printed letterhead or QSL card? The tremendous signal in SoCal (audible on anything) more than 50 miles from Los Angeles and KABC and repeated Los Angeles phone numbers for various commercials indicates they are probably looking for a Western USA audience.

## Commentary

Member reaction to 5.2-3 (refusal to send gov't. or commercial interests IRCA bulletins or to send them at high rates) coupled with the Directors' own personal views lead to defeat of this proposal.

The Board may re-examine 5.2-25 as it does not specify what makes an office vacant. According to IRCA's Constitution and By-Laws, membership does not, for example, terminate upon the death of the member.

The Board and myself encourage you to participate in the nomination and election of a new club government. Details appear in this issue or have already appeared.

Last semester I had a course in Constitutional Law. In the case of Keyishian v. Board of Regents, 385 U.S. 589 (1967), the US Supreme Court held that the due process clause does not permit a state, in attempting to bar disloyal individuals from its employe, to exclude persons soley on the basis of organizational membership. There must be also a showing that the person (1) knew of the illegal aims of the organization and (2) he had a specific intent to further those illegal aims. This seems related to denying a DXer gov't employment or promotion just for having a verie, say, from Radio Loscow. It all equals guilt by association. One of the reasons I favored (and still do) letting FBIS continue to receive DMT is the belief the information so obtained would not be used to harass Dkers. Any comments? I've been back for quite some time, typing stencils, and comments, and getting my stencils returned for petry reasons. Why have I run into such intense QRM in getting things printed. If one were to speak solely with DEE, one would conclude that it was my inability to put the date and page # on the stencils that caused their return. Other editors have followed the same form I have, so what is the reason for my getting singled out? I can only conclude that it is DEE's disapproval of my policy of non-censorship. Since I announced my policy I have been subject to all sorts of unwarrented threats and criticsms. Simultaneosly I have had all sorts of insults passed around about me and the San Jose area, thus seriosly reducing the chances for a 1973 San Jose IRCA convention. # RADIO HISTORY OFTEN PRESERVED IN CALL LETTERS by Gene Martin

Some of the nation's largest and best-known radio stations have call letters which recall a former slogan once used on the air or which preserve the initials of the station founder.

It has been the general rule among the nation's older stations to preserve the original call letters as they pass through changes of ownership, for each new owner recognizes the value of the original call.

Thus, WLS, founded by Sears Roebuck and Co. in the early 1920's, has remained WLS, though the ownership changed first to "The Prairie Farmer," a magazine, and later to ABC. But the call letters still carry a reminder that they once meant "World's Largest Store," as intended by the station founder.

And the radio listener of forty years ago and more may recall the Deep South accents of Lambdin Kay on WSB giving the station slogan, "Welcome South, Brother." He also would use another slogan, "The Atlanta Journal covers Dixie like the dew."

And WOW began life in Omaha as WOAW in the middle Twenties, but the A was dropped out of the call just a few years later when the Army (or was it the Navy?) surrendered its use of WOW as a working call someplace in the world. In any event, WOW signified Woodmen of the World Life Insurance Co., the station founder.

WCCO Washburn-Crosby Corp., a flour miller

WEEI Edison Electric Illuminating Co.

WKRC Kodel Radio Corp., now extinct

WGN World's Greatest Newspaper" - maybe it still means that

KWKH W. K. Henderson, probably the most picturesque station owner in radio history. He used to go on the air daily and nightly beginning "Hello World," and then he'd spend 15 or 30 minutes denouncing the "Dad-blasted Federal Radio Commission."

KPRC "Kotton Port-Rail Center"

KFH "Kansas! Finest Hotel," the Lassen

WCSH Congress Square Hotel

KMBC Midland Broadcasting Co. (has become KMBZ now)

WRC Radio Corporation (of America) (RCA)

KTRH Rice Hotel

WAPI Alabama Polytechnic Institute, was located at Auburn, Ala. in 1926

WMAL M. A. Leese

WSMB Saenger Theatre & Maison Blanche Co.

WREN Jenny Wren Flour Co.

There is even hidden meaning in the NBC station break chimes, now rarely used, although I have heard them recently on KNBR. (They're still used at station-break time on weekend "Monitor" and a few other NBC radio features, and the G E C theme is

(Call Letters cont.) expanded in Monitor jingles. -ed.) NBC was founded by General Electric but was soon sold to RCA. But the chimes had already been introduced on the network and RCA kept them through the years. In musical terms, the chimes are G E C and they mean General Electric Company.

Special Features reported in the 11/25 DXM (pp. 17-18) that the FCC's "AM freeze" should be ending soon. When it does, new allocations rules can be expected. They're supposed to be tighter than the rules in effect when the freeze began in July 1968. But if you recall the FCC rulemaking in 1967 for new presunrise rules, you remember that the new rules were stricter for some stations and much more liberal for others. So if the FCC is true to form, the new allocations rules will be tighter for many stations (more liberal than a total freeze, of course), but a little looser for some classes of stations. As soon as the new rules are announced, which could be days, weeks, or months, Special Features will fill you in.

Freeze or no freeze, KIXI's application could not be accepted under present regulations. 880 is a I-n channel for WCBS New York. It is one of the channels where II-h assignments are available, but only in North Dakota, South Dakota, or Nebraska, which tends to exclude Seattle, hi! (In fact, the II-h station is already on the channel, KRVN Lexington, Nebraska.) KIXI's pattern would protect KRVN and thus also WCBS in the same direction, and would be perfectly acceptable if 880 were a I-B channel like 810. But the FCC will not grant new assignments (except the II-h's) anywhere in the 48 adjacent states on the U.S. I-h channels, not even for DAYTIMERS, so obviously KIXI's fulltime application must automatically be turned down.

One can only speculate what KIXI has in mind by filing an application which is doomed before it's filed. Your editor can think of two reasons: one, it is possible that information on the post-freeze rules has been leaked to KIXI and their assignment would be possible under the new regulations. I tend to doubt this. More likely KIXI is hoping for an automatic FCC denial, and then will pursue the matter in the courts, hoping to have the FCC's automatic denial ruled arbitrary and upset the whole allocation setup. KIXI has the financial backing to pursue it. Stay tuned! --BH.

WAIT-820 NOT GETTING NIGHTIME The Supreme Court declined an invitation to decide whether the Federal Communications Commission is excessively protective of clear-channel radio stations.

Under FCC policy, certain radio broadcasting channels are set aside for the exclusive nighttime use of a single station in the Continental U.S. Other stations operating on the same channels during the day must go off the air at nightfall. As broadcast signals generally travel farther at night, the purpose of the FCC policy is to allow the nighttime clear-channel stations to reach distant listeners without undue interference.

WAIT Radio in Chicago challenged what it said was the "monopolization" resulting from the policy. WAIT, a daytime station, wanted a waiver of the policy so it could broadcast at night. WAIT planned to use a directional antenna it said would prevent interference with the clear-channel station assigned to the same channel on which it operates during the day.

But the FCC turned down WAIT, an appeals court upheld the commission and the

Supreme Court without comment refused to hear the case.

THE BOLIVIAN BISHOPS MEDIATED WITH PRESIDENT HUGO BANZER WHO ORDERED THE FINE LIFTED BECAUSE HE WANTED "TO KEEP CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS ON THE PRESENT CORDIAL LEVEL." THE BISHOPS ALSO INTERVENED EARLIER WHEN PRIESTS, SISTERS AND LAY LEADERS ACTIVE IN SO-CIAL ACTION PROGRAMS WERE DETAINED DURING AN ARMY CAMPAIGN AGAINST ALLEGED SUBVERSION.

I THINK THAT RENEWING MEMBERS CAN BE SIMPLY LISTED BY LAST NAME -- THERE 'S NO NEED TO PRINT ALL THE OTHER INFORMATION. IF SOME MEMBER WOULD VOLUNTEER TO TYPE UP A NEW MEMBERSHIP LIST, ALL SUCH INFORMATION AS ADDRESSES AND DATE JOINED COULD BE LISTED THERE.
