





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Gregory Steele and Paul Mount have both besieged me with a number of questions about the Space Magnet. So, assuming Joe Worcester doesn't mind the free advertising, here are a few facts about it.

There are two models of Space Magnet, the SM-1 and SM-2. The main difference between them is that the SM-2 can be tilted vertically as well as rotated horizontally. This is a rood feature to have as locals can be mulled much better and other interference, such as from a TV set upstairs, can be reduced. The tilting feature also compensates for re-radiation from nearby metal objects such as nines, heating ducts, etc. The cost is 336.00 for the SM-1 and 36.00 for the SM-2, plus nostage and insurance. They can be gotten from Worcester Electronics Lab, R.D.1, Frankfort, N.Y. 13340.

What veries are being referred to when you see something like 266/174, 32/30, 3/3, 5/4? Greenry Steele.

Why are cx better in winter? Paul Mount. The main reasons are 1) there are more thunderstorms

in the summer, causing a higher noise level and 2) there are more hours of darkness in the winter.

Won't your "easiest to hear stns in" column directly conflict w/Soll & PoM? Jon Pearlins.

I home not! Actually, Pol and Sol are supposed to go into depth and focus on each state at a time. Uhat J hope to do is give a quick and dirty look at all states which only picks out the ensiest ones and leaves the rest for PoM & SoM. Hopefully it will be a uneful reference when finished.

OUTSIDERS OPINION ON THE PAUL DAPLYN SUPER-LOOP

I was in Ottawa during the first stage of construction of the Paul Danlyn h foot box loop and witnessed some of the results of the early tests during May and June 1973. Paul was using his newly purchased National HRO-500 in conjunction with the loop and the results were just short of fantastic. I'm sure Paul will eventually publish exact statistics when he has a chance to make them in Brockville, but I thought a few preliminary views from another party might be in order. First, the loop is extremely expensive, as it is built using plexiglass (a h'zh' sheet is a good 350 as I recall) and litz wire (about the size of #14 only very finely stranded) ordered from the UK. Since Paul has virtually given up photography, he used his tripod to mount the loop on. At the time he was making the tests I witnessed, it was not mounted and had to be tilted by hand (a job requiring mucho patience and 8 arms). The selectivity of the loop supercedes even the Space Magnet with litz wire and the effect was extremely clear on the frequencies near the bottom end of the band. Consequently the adjustment of the variable capacitor was a very touchy matter. Goupled with the URO-500 and all its knobs, you felt like you were setting the phasing of a very unautomated mntr. As with the Space Tarnet, inser rejection, selectivity and sensitivity were all very poor if the loop wasn't tweeked up

just right. The nulls were very tight as well, but they were worth it. GFGH-1310 in Richmond Hill, Ont. was possible most mights w/ CKOY (10 kw local) buried. Similarly, the other locals could be virtually climinated with careful adjustment. On the DX side, WBZ could usually be nulled enough to get XE)R-1030 w/a minimum of effort. An ME on 360 was the most interesting. Four stns were separable with WUN dominating on an omni-directional antenna. HILR and HRU and either KEMO or CFTR (FE w/soul) were noted on an average night in June. This loop, with no amp at the loop end, left all the work to the RF amps in the HRO-500. It delivered more gain than the Space Magnet and nulls were basically symmetrical. It was very carefully built and the lack of completely symmetrical nulls can be at least partly blamed on the metal objects in and around the room (rx, house wiring, etc.). OK, you say, it's great, but ... Yes, now the cruncher. Unless you are very patient, have access to an assistant (or a wingspan of at least six feet (e.g. Tric Floden), can afford 3150-200, have good mechanical abilities, access to a drill press (Paul threaded the wire on the loop instead of winding

it on) and are excellent at soldering, you are much better off with the Space Magnet. Resides, the loop takes up a lot of space. The big-est problem, I believe, is soldering the wire, as litz wire (samples available from bp) is many strands of individually insulated wire. In other words, this is a loop for perfectionists, and has one main advantage over other superloops: you don't need to be an electronic genius to build it (i.e., no FTT preamps or the like).

So, if you are enough of a perfectionist to have an HRO-500 (in my opinion the best rx to ever be commercially available for BCB DX) and fulfill the above requirements, this is your loop. HOW TO LOG EVERY STATE AND PROVINCE

ALABAMA: WERG-960 hrd regularly w/rr in fair w/W/DJ//LOF ORM (GA). WWOK-690 & WBAK-7hO best bets nationwide (RJE). WWOK-(GA). WVCK-690 & MBAK-7hO best bets nationwide (RJE). WVCK-690 best at SSS u/KTE/MAGO/3BF one hr.after SS, MAPI-1070 at SSS u/MIBC, WNA-1590 after 1900 FLT u/MAKE for about 1 hour (III). At night, WSGN-610 good u/WTY/MIP mulled, MEC-960 after ISBT goes to nite DA, WAK-570 good nites for 500 w., MAX-1590 often good u/GFT/EMJO nulled, ME pest, MAPK-1600 usually in mess, WHEY-1hho usually fair, WWA-1590 good sig but rough due to MAR; on SSS, WFCA-1110 during gurora, MAFI-1070 u/MIBC, WVCK-690 excellent signal, WDE-850 like MAPI best before pattern whence (MCK). Mother receives here. Foot bet is when guroral change (JCK). Nothing regular here. Best bet is when auroral ex is strong. Have had WEBG-960 DK Test on auroral ex; also two r/c, MGOK-900 first friday Ohh5-0500 and MBTS-1h80 on third NI 0315-0330. Good sign on all three (RCM). Only two regulars are WHMY-1000 clear IN's w/rr & sometimes on weekday AM's, and WHTS-1080 r/c (bp). WHRC-960 best around 0130 TIT fair w/slight fading every 3 mins (GS). WYDE-850 best bet esp. during slight fading every 3 mins (GS). MYDK-350 best bet esp. during winter SSS, often vry gud to xint sig o/jumble, only ntime reception is WAAY-1550 alone before midn. on auroral (TW).

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I home not! Actually, PoM and SoM are supposed to go into denth and focus on each state at a time. That I hope to do is give a quick and dirty look at all states which only picks out the easiest ones and leaves the rest for PoM & SoM. Hopefully it will be a useful reference when finished.

OUTSIDERS OPINION ON THE PAUL DAPLYN SUPER-LOOP

I was in Ottawa during the first stage of construction of the Paul Darlyn h foot box loop and witnessed some of the results of the early tests during May and June 1973. Paul was using his newly purchased National HRO-500 in conjunction with the loop and the results were just short of fantastic. I'm sure Paul will eventually publish exact statistics when he has a chance to make them in Brockville, but I thought a few preliminary views from another party might be in order. First, the loop is extremely expensive, as it is built using plexiglass (a h'zh' sheet is a good 450 as I recall) and litz wire (about the size of #lh only very finely stranded) ordered from the UK. Since Paul has virtually given up photography, he used his tripod to mount the loop on. At the time he was making the tests I witnessed, it was not mounted and had to be tilted by hand (a job requiring mucho natione and 8 arms). The selectivity of the loop supercedes even the Space Marnet with litz wire and the effect was extremely clear on the frequencies near the bottom and of the band. Consequently the adjustment of the variable caracitor was a very touchy matter. Coupled with the MRO-500 and all its knobs, you felt like you were setting the phasing of a very unautomated untr. As with the Snace arnet, image rejection, selectivity and sensitivity were all very poor if the loop wasn't tweeked up

just right. The nulls were very tight as well, but they were worth it. GFGM-1310 in Richmond Hill, Ont. was possible most mights w/ CKOY (10 kw local) buried. Similarly, the other locals could be virtually eliminated with careful adjustment. On the DX side, MBZ could usually be nulled enough to get X3 MR-1030 w/a minimum of effort. An MBI on 360 was the most interesting. Four stns were separable with KTUN dominating on an omni-directional antenna. HILR and HPU and either XEMO or CFFR (EE w/soul) were noted on an average night in June. This loop, with no amp at the loop end, left all the work to the RF amps in the HRO-500. It delivered more gain than the Space Magnet and nulls were basically symmetrical. It was very carefully built and the lack of completely symmetrical mulls can be at least partly blamed on the metal objects in and around the room (rx, house wiring, etc.).
OK, you say, it's creat, but... Yes, now the cruncher. Unless you are very patient, have access to an assistant (or a wingspan of at least six feet (e.g. Fric Floden), can afford 3150-200, have good mechanical abilities, access to a drill press (Paul threaded the wire on the loop instead of winding it on) and are excellent at soldering, you are much better off with the Space Magnet. Resides, the loop takes up a lot of space. The bigrest problem, I believe, is soldering the wire, as litz wire (samples available from bp) is many strands of individually insulated wire. In other words, this is a loop for perfectionists, and has one main advantage even other.

for perfectionists, and has one main advantage over other superloops: you don't need to be an electronic genius to build it (i.e., no FET preamps or the like). So, if you are enough of a perfectionist to have an HRO-500 (in my opinion the best rx to ever be cornercially available for BOB DX) and fulfill the above requirements, this is your loop.
