Paul Mount and Russ Edmunds reported a typo--the station testing was WJLK, not WJKL as we had listed. Paul didn't hear them, even though he's only 50 miles away, so they might not have been on. Not heard by Karl Forth.

KLFL heard with fair/good signals by Karl Forth (outside Chicago). Had Gospel music, IDs, and info on station.

KKIN--heard by Forth with IDs and mostly C&W music. "
WTCA--poor under CHUM with 1 kHz TT, IDs, every minute. Heard by Forth.

KSGT (not KGST as listed here) not heard by Forth; a TT at 0340 and 0344 EST however. Portzer (Seattle) heard with fair signal under KMEL and KATA. Voice IDs were unreadable, so Bruce called the station about 0350 and had them try a code ID (not too successfully); they then put a lot of breaks in their tone. BP IDed them on that basis.

PILIPINAS: According to a letter from FEBC-Whittier, the Radio Control Office has licensed the new high power FEBC xmtr at Barrio Bolotan, Iba, Zambales (about 90 km N. of Subic Bay) to serve PRC and other countries in SEAsia. To be 250 kW, this is to be on 1470 kHz. However, the Mass Media Council is going to allocate 1590 or 1600 kHz to the station, according to Frank Matias, CE of FEBC-Manila, on the condition that the pattern could be reversed to cover the Phil. when requested by R.P. government. The letter says the transmitter is being manufactured at Cedar Rapids, Iowa. (Collins Radio Corporation). I hope to receive clarification from Manila, R.P. on this soon. NORWAY: Oslo Student Radio Club together with the Norwegian Student Association, operates Radio Susie on 1313 kHz with 1kW from 9 Nov til 23 Nov 2300 0100. DX Condition Report

The period of MM 12/2 was not that fruitful, so we have few reports for this issue. MM 12/9, however, was fantastic for "tropical" reception, with DSA reception the best in years. Geomagnetic flux (28-mHz), normally o/100, was a very low 72 both 12/9 & 12/10, which could have a direct connexion with the excellent multi-hop condx. Even TM 12/10 was a cornucopia; hearing Record-100 on a weekday AM is very rare, even in Florida. Adding to the abundance were many Latin Xmas AN'ers, & my personal use of the cardioid array, my "artificial aurora". Minor auroral condx WERE in progress at the time, but even the worst ones hardly make notice in Miami. § No 12/9 reports for this issue, other than mine, received here by deadline, but next week - look out!

Qué Pasa en Colombia?

There seems to have been a major frequency-allocation revision in Colombia, & we still await the complete story. Here are some of the changes I have gathered:

- 540 "Radio Mundial" here from 1370. Fate of "Horizonte" unknown.
- 550 "Radio Ya", Medellín, here from 1470.
- 710 "Radio Súper" in Medellín. See 1170.
- 750 Reportedly now "R. Veinte", but unconfirmed.
- 870 "Voz de la Selva" in Florencia. Fate of Ibagué unknown.
- 960 "Voz del Progreso" in Cúcuta from 1490. Delete "Sutatenza" in Magangué. See 1010.
- 1010 "R. Sutatenza", Barranquilla, has increased power somewhat, covering for ex-960.
- 1050 "Voz del Centro", Espinal, back from 1055.
- 1170 "Ecos del Combeima", Ibagué, here from 710.
- 1220 "Radio Visión", Barranquilla, ex-"Radio 15".

How to ID Japanese Stations (Cont.)

NHK stations tend to announce their hourly newscasts in standard fashion. Immediately following the pips:

"Kónban-wa ... NHK Nyûsu des'". (Good evening ... this is NHK News)

... or, say, at 8PM LT:

"Hachí-jinó ... NHK Nyûsu des'". (This is the 8-o'clock NHK News).

Weather reports are common; listen for "o-ténki" and numbers.

Japanese doesn't officially have a stress "accent" as such, & most dictionaries leave it out, but there is enough of one to make it important. In the examples above, the acute accent indicates that stress, while I used the circumflex to mark "long" vowels. § Japanese short "U" isn't pronounced exactly "OO"; it's closer to German "ü" or FF "u", & almost identical to Dutch or Swedish "u".

This is also why many stations are heard better at some distance from them, altho skywave-groundwave interaction is the primary cause. § I just purchased the latest edition of "Atlas Moderno Universal Hammond" for \$1.50 at a local Cuban "librería" downtown; it has very detailed maps of CA & SA w/departamentos", etc. in different colours. Now I can answer Hauser's query of last week: The Honduran dpto. of Olancho comprehends a territory of some 100-kilometers radius about the town of Catacamas; Juticalpa is its capital. The town of Olanchito, however, is in the departamento of Yoro.

- 700^c AUSTRALIA, Grafton, NSW, 2NR noted 1300 11/11 -14 & 20. Rarely get any readable audio here, other than 6 very clear pips on the hour. 1302 seems to be regular DST s/off for this, as is never detectable after that time. Have heard snatches of anthem twice at 1302 (Rittenhouse, above two)
- ... ? UnID noted 11/16 1300. Spirited oriental mx across the hour w/no pips. CC or KK after hour. Prob. the CC in Nanking (Rittenhouse)
- 708^v KOREA-S, Seoul, HJKA must be the one heard in KK several AM's here. Seems to go as low as about 706 at times, & as high as 709. Fair
- 840[?] 1336 11/8 in KK w/typical oriental mx. UnID TP has been noted here 11/4 & 11/22. On 11/4 at 1309 had operatic singing & fair strength o/JOQK. 11/22 noted 1259:45 w/chimes not too different from the Kremlin Bells. 6 pips were heard at 1300 which might have been this or 4RK (Rittenhouse, last two) (Rittenhouse):
- 844 GILBERT & ELLICE, Tarawa noted in one way or other almost every night 11/8 to 11/24. Seem to fade in as a carrier about 0800 w/audio shortly following. Very good 11/19 0830 w/YL in vernacular. Again w/apparent s/off 0930.
- 877^c KOREA-N, 1519-29 t/out classical type singing w/chorus. 11/30 KK anmts 1529. Good signal. // to 775.5, 785, 820 (Williams) (Williams):
- 1040^c CHINA, Shanghai, R. Peking 1456.1501 t/out 12/1, JJ service. YL JJ anmts. 1500 ID, JJ pgm continued. This stn was heard to s/off at 1734 11/30, that the latest I've ever heard it. (Williams) § This stn will never cease to amaze me. It has been audible every AM I have listened since late Sept. I've even noted it after 3 days w/A indices in the 30's. Heard 1330 11/20 w/ID as "Kochiro-wa Peking Hoso de" & "The East is Red" (Rittenhouse)

- 1160 JAPAN synchros w/NHK pips at 1500 12/1, taking a severe beating from KSL (looped). 30 possible //s!! Only 2600 watts combined power, new (Peterson)
- 1178 JAPAN, Okinawa, VOA heard 1255 12/1 w/EE lessons in CG. Excellent signal (Peterson)
- 1190 JAPAN, Kitami, NHK2, JOKF, NHK pips beat the severe QRM at 1300 12/1 to sneak in. New. (Peterson)

- 1550 WRHC "R H C", EE religious s/on to 12 LT, SS 12 to s/off LT, daytimer. Cuban-owned. Carries "Alpha-66" & other political stuff Castro doesn't like. Good daytime signal in Cuba, but surprisingly not jammed.

Only split audible on that part of the band at this time & freq did seem to be 655 rather than 656. Faded soon but apparently same stn in again at 2213 w/commentary by YL. By this time other splits had begun to appear. Threshold copy, so I'm not claiming anything for certain (Stanbury) This claim is potentially "controversial", so I checked out the signal path, which runs just within the terminator. While I may disagree strongly with his comparing MW reception condx to those on higher frequencies, this, and ALL of Stan's contributions to these Roundups during my editorship of DXWW have been legal & valid & reliable, & his reports are welcome here (RFS)
- 1525[?] UnID. Seemed to be a carrier here at 2225 12/6 but all-powerful local WKBW made positive detection impossible, let alone making out modulation (Stanbury)

- 540 NICARAGUA, Managua, R. Corporación 12/2 1020 adstring, 1024 EST (or CDT -RFS) TC "... en R. Corporación", Nica. folk mx. Good reception (Hauser) Now AN for Xmas (RFS)
- 550^C JAMAICA, Montego Bay, RJR, newbie heard at 0500 s/off 11/24 w/anmt "You're listening to RJR - we now conclude our transmissions", mention of return 0935. Way o/Cuban, etc. NA heard 0501. Prob. Jamaican. Same anthem heard 0501 11/28 in domestic QRM (Fader)
- 570 CUBA, Santa Clara, great signal w/usual "R. Habana Cuba" ID 0000 11/29. Heard in Flushing w/WMCA nulled (Fader)
- 580^t PUERTO RICO, San Juan, WKAQ becoming a pest! Blasting in w/SS mx 0515 12/1, later on too. Not // 590, so not Cuban (Fader)
- 600^{h?} MEXICO. On 1800 kHz 12/6 1259, ID w/600 kHz, "... (radiazo?) mexicano, una estación hecha a su gusto". Maybe XEDN, Torreón. Also 12/5, not 12/7 (Hauser)
- 645 PARAGUAY, Cnel. Oviedo, ZP19, R. Caaguazú. Country no. 58 from Denver pinned down for me by a "Caaguazú" on the tape 0812 MM 12/9 after a year or so of trying for it. Anybody versed in SS would surely hear more, but even I can make out that vital ID. Though I had noted the ID at the time it was recorded but not until I rechecked the tape 10 hours later was I certain about it. KFI nulled, & I failed to notice whether WSM was testing at the time, but it may have been. The carrier here has been found as early as the 0500-0600 period. Audio here in high summer in Paraguay has been at its best several AM's soon after 0730. On 12/9, the signal was too weak for taping by about 0841 & I think 0900 is too late for Caaguazú in December. Also carrier U. of Miami "Hurricanes" football in SS, as well as "simul-translates" WTVJ-4's "Ralph Renick Report" (TV news) at 1800 LT, w/Manolo Reyes at the mike. 24 hours NSP (Schatz)

- 1220 WCMQ "CMQ - Radialegre", daytimer. SID's per WKAQ-580. Pop SS mx - mainly Cuban & Puerto-Rican. "Noticentro" nxcasts. Hi-pressure "Drake" format w/personality DJ's. Use of unique calls once challenged by former owners of CMQ in Habana.
- 1450 WOCN "Ocean Radio", NSP. Soft LA mx, & even many Americans listen in. See above for more details.

- 840[?] UnID w/FF rel pgm, gospel mx u/WHAS 11/29 0112. Haiti likely, but Castries also possible, right Ron? (Fader) Right (RFS)
- 854 PERU, Lima, 12/4 0224 good carrier, then some female vocal mx. 0229 TC for 21:30, chimes, believed mentioned Perú. I can't imagine it being anything else than R. Nacional del Perú, Lima (Hauser)

885 MONTSEFAT, ZJB, 12/4 0117 a taped report on UN activities, in EE. Fade before ID. 0224 check, mx. Likewise, anything but ZJB unlikely (Hauser)

920+ VENEZUELA, Maracay, R. Maracay here from 930 kHz, tho still announced as such. S/off 12/10 0700 w/NA following full ID. Fair-good on LSCA (Schatz)

980 BRASIL, Brasília, DF, "Nacional", 300 kw, noted very strong 12/9 & 12/10 AM's. Apparent s/on 0700 12/9. Simple "Nacional - Brasil" ID 0723. Also 12/10, still strong, from t/in 0550. Complete ID 0555, mentioning 980 in Brasília, also other MW & SW outlets, & one FM (tho not copied - Murley's Law). Also mentioned "um programa experimental", a significant statement! Another "Nacional - Brasil" ID 0702 12/10 (Schatz)

1000 BRASIL, São Paulo, SP, R. Record noted w/PP talk in passing 12/10 0723 o/Miramar. Not heard here in years (Schatz)

1004? UnID, something hetting Colossal-1005 badly nightly until 0600. Little audio, but SS. Colossal much too strong to do much w/it (RFS)

1020 VENEZUELA, La Asunción, R. Margarita is the cuckoo str, per clear ID 12/2 0743, giving TC in AST for 3:45. The 3 cuckoos follow TC's. Fighting KGBS turned out to be more productive than fighting KDKA modulation other nights. However, the ID taped at 0730 sounded a lot more like "Radio Paraguaya". This one's so weak compared to R. Calendario that I wonder if it's directional away from Maracaibo, & to some extent, us (Hauser)

1030 ARGENTINA, Bs. As., R. del Plata, a surprise, blasting o/Pacifico 12/9 0548 w/weather for Bs.As. & Mar del Plata (Said 27°C in Bs.As. at the time). ID 0550, also mentioning FM (Possibly 95.3 - if I recall right). Locutor's Italian-like Pampa accent quite notable. (Schatz) § R. del Plata ID o/u XEQR w/5-Hz SAH 12/2 0832, mentioning Bs.As. 2 alternating ancrs w/weather, patter (Hauser)

1041 COLOMBIA, Barranquilla, R. Tropical is joining XECC in the elite club of 1041 stns, on 12/2 at 0748 w/Cuban-sounding mx. 0750 ID as "R. Tropical, la emisora de importancia para un público importante ..." (Hauser)

1045t NED. ANTILLEN, Curaçao, R. Hoyer MAY be here from 1010 to avoid Sutatenza, but this is only a guess, deducted from 12/9 DXN (RFS)

....t PANAMA, Las Tablas 12/5 0214 tropical mx, mention "Sistema ... Santo Domingo ...". 0218 low het of about 200 Hz. 0220 giving phone numbers. Lots of talking o/mx (Hauser)

1050 COLOMBIA, Medellín, "Voz del Triunfo" noted AN 12/9 w/ID 0722. Big deal, compared to other stuff on the band! (Schatz)

.... COLOMBIA, Espinal, V. del Centro noted AN 12/10 w/ID 0625 & RCN. Fighting it out w/Triunfo above. Formerly 1055 kHz (Schatz)

....? UnID. Could have been Centro above, but played almost solid tangos & zambas, & faded like a DSA. Little talk. Hoping for Electrica, Montevideo. Noted 12/9 0500-0740 t/out. (RFS)

1170+ COLOMBIA, Ibagué, "Ecos del Combeima", here from 710 kHz, per ID 12/10 0633, also mentioning "Super" net (Schatz)

....? COLOMBIA, Valledupar, 10 kw, apparent data on 279 0630 hearing. No more info (Schatz)

1180 BRASIL, São Paulo, Globo here 12/10 in FP 0607, blasting as usual (Schatz)

1187 GUATEMALA, likely R. Sonora the one 12/5 0210 w/SS ads, mx (Hauser)

1200 VENEZUELA, Caracas, R'tiempo 12/2 0758 SS bal-lad, sometimes losing out to Cuban & its lickety-split SAH, 0759 back w/ID (Hauser)

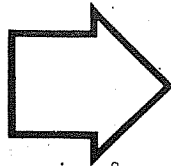
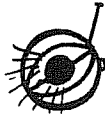
