Bill Harang, 811 Nevada Ave., San Jose, CA 95125 A large number of articles have appeared in Billboard Magazine lately concerning the successes of KIQI-1010 and KIOI-FM (commonly called "K-101"). During April, 1974, C&W station KSAY sold out to K-101. The AM stn is simulcast with the FM stn during the daytime. The format includes oldies, some current Top 40 mx & "cuts" from various albums. Some of the popular DJs include Cliff Saunders (formerly of KYA) and Don Kelley (formerly of KRFC). The new AM stn has tremendously increased K-101's ratings. As a result, Oakland's traditional oldies stn KNEW-910 fell behind in the ratings. KNEW's new C&W format is the only C&W AM stn really in the S.F. Bay Area ratings with the exception of Sacramento's mighty 50kwer KRAK in the northern parts of the Bay Area. KIQI's signal probably nulls toward the east. KIQI does not really come in very good for a 10 kwer when one is about 25 or more air miles east of San Francisco. KIQI does <u>not</u> have an SSB on their sunset s/off. KIQI signs off with a part of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony and 2001 Space Odyssey. I hope this information is useful to those who may want to give KIQI a try during SSS DX. However, those who may try will probably face interference problems from KCHJ and other stns on the same frequency. 73s.

Bisquera, 86-123 Kakaiapola St., Waianae, HI 96792 Made a fast spin of the dials this Sun. morning 12/29/74, from 0631-0705 HST, to see which oriental stns operated past midnight their time. I found these: Korea-635 & 710; Unid on 1000; Chinese on 1020, 1120; Japan-1240; and the two reliables, HLDA-1570, and VOA-1580. The only South Pacific island still on the air was Marshall Islands-1220. Also made a fast survey of the band Mon. morning between 0006-0041 HST, 12/30/74. One unid on 710 had Indian type music; the rest were mainland stns - nothing outstanding. Conditions were generally poor.




