Burton Wheeler, a U.S. Senator from Montana, in 1941 introduced a bill which limited U.S. CGB stations to 50 kw. As Gene Martin related in one of his excellent articles, the only U.S. station with more than 50 kw at the time was WLW-700. With 500 kw of power, WLW was heard throughout the world, but if other stations had followed suit, it might make the wide open spaces on the radio dial considerably narrower. Senator Wheeler's motives, of course, lay in the fact that people actually preferred listening to a distant station if the programming were superior, but local businesses could not advertise on such stations conveniently. WERI Starts 25th Broadcast Year

WESTERLY - One of the big boasts that radio station WERI Program Director Bob Canty likes to make on behalf of his station is that "we're the heaviest play-by-play carrier east of the Mississippi River."

Canty says that emphasis on sports in one of the biggest selling points for WERI, which he says "actively covers 14 communities."

When he talks of active coverage, Canty is referring to WERI's news department, which is an entirely separate entity from the music department.

WERI, according to its program director, operates its news department "by a newspaper's rule of thumb." That is, to have station personnel at each and every major news event that occurs in the station's prime coverage area. That area says Canty includes eight communities in Connecticut and six in Rhode Island.

"We physically attend" says Canty, public meetings, school boards and town councils.

The year 1974 is the 25th Anniversary for WERI. It was founded as an AM station in 1949, operating at 1000 wette

daytime power and 250 watts at night. Today, it is a 24-hour operation, including the 16,000 watt WERI-FM.

The communities that WERI "actively covers" are New London, Waterford, Montville, Norwich, Ledyard, Stonington and Groton, in Connecticut and Westerly, Hopkinton, Carolina, Kingston, Wakefield and Narragansett in Rhode Island.

The broadcasting format both stations follow is one of up-tempo, middle-of-the-road music, with heavy emphasis on local and regional news. The stations consider themselves to be "regional" because of the two-state constituency of their coverage.

They carry the Boston Red Sox and New York Mets baseball games, the Patriots, Giants and Notre Dame football games, as well as three high schools and the Coast Guard Academy in New London. They also carry pro college and high school basketball, pro hockey and the thoroughbred race of the week and the Daytona 500.

Westerly Broadcasting Co. the parent company for WERI AM and FM, also owns and operates WNHC-AM in New Haven.

On the subject of LW items in DXM, I tend to agree w/Foxy that such items would improve DXM rather than degrade it. There is a much closer similarity between MW & LW than between MW & SW. And occasional LW items would add much to DXM. We must keep in mind however that LW must always remain a secondary item. The establishment of a regular LW column would likely lead to further expansion into SW, VHF, etc., eventually ruining DXM. Foxy's proposal (6.1-65) takes this into consideration and therefore gets my support. In reference to comments by Hauser in CAT's column of

12/14, I agree that the only proper way is to count xmtr/ant locations in reference to foreign stations, but when it comes to domestic stns, I feel that in all cases the city of license should count. At present, at least, this is the only practical system since determining stn antenna locations is rather difficult, especially for the smaller stns. If antenna locations were counted rather than cities of license, it would only lead to further confusion, especially among novice DXers. As far as the common practice of counting stns like TWR as Monaco, this is at present the accepted method in virtually all DX clubs, SW as well as MW. Perhaps this is due for a change, but if it is to be changed, it should be changed on a hobby-wide basis, through ANARC. 73.

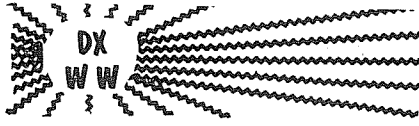

Sensitivity is good, but selectivity is very touchy. The R-388 Collins is the tops w/me. I had a hint of Turkey-1016 twice this season, but the Spanish stns won out. Hopefully I can catch them yet. All DX time so far has been on tests & TAs. 73s & support your DX Monitor.

de Ghoti (Dave Fisher) - Hickory, NC
There is a phenomena which occurs on the daytime BCB which few DXers have reported or experienced to my knowledge - much so due to the fact that not very many day DX. Gordon Nelson discussed it in his article in DXN on Midday DX - partial reflections from the D-layer. It amounts to this: DX via this day "skip" or skywave can net new stns out to 1200-1300 miles w/1000+ stns more probable than those closer to the rx! The time to look for it is 1100-1300 local time ("high noon"). Start on the clear channels if you've not experienced it before. You'll note absence of a good null of your "regulars" & DX over or under them w/pretty steady signals that can last a good time, at least to take a log, and then rapidly die out. My excellent experience w/this phenomena says to expect stns at or N. of your latitude and that if you live in low latitudes you may not experience the mechanism at all! Nebraska is an excellent location as I well discovered 1968-1974! In fact Dabelstein and Nittler in E. & W. Neb. are observing this noon DX w/some regularity. It would be quite valuable to your DX log as well as to the BCB data gatherers to try for some of this DX - it takes a little time and patience since it tends not to occur every day. Report any such DX to DXM for others to know. Reflection points at 47 miles up or so limit "skip" to 1200 miles or so. Try it and report to DXM.

SWITCH TO FM TURNS THEM OFF

Mercury Reporter

MANY Durban residents, particularly pensioners, have been hard hit by the SABC's dropping of English, Afrikaans and Springbok radio programmes on mediumwave since January 1.

Durban radio dealers report an increased demand for FM sets now that these programmes are being broadcast only on FM and shortwave.

"Many of these customers have been pensioners with very old sets — still in good working order — and they have been shocked at the cost of a new radio," said one local salesman.

Comments from pensioners yesterday were:

"We all like the early morning service at 6.30 but we can't get it on shortwave. Matron has been letting us listen to hers on the FM."

"I only listen to the A Programme. Lourenco Marques Radio is for the young folk and that is all I can get on mediumwave now."

"What do we do with our old radios? Just throw them away?"

"I tried shortwave like the radio said but the reception was so bad I couldn't hear."

Mr. Theo Greyling, Head of Information and Public Relations, of the SABC in Johannesburg said yesterday: "While the SABC has sympathy for the aged, we must point out that the FM network was established at tremendous cost. Since 1960 it has been our stated policy that when the FM network was completed, mediumwave would go off the air."

"It is simply uneconomical to run duplicate transmissions."

"Frequencies are allocated by an international body and the SABC is bearing in mind that if they do not use the mediumwave frequencies allocated to it, it may lose them."

With this number of DXWW II, we would like to toss out to you a new concept—that of a precision frequency monitoring survey. PFMS would cover through DXWW, frequency measurements of foreign stations. Measurements would be performed by DXers who possess the necessary frequency measuring equipment, and would be published at frequent intervals in the PFMS list. Such a survey would be a very valuable tool in aiding the identification of unknown foreign stations. Any DXer who possesses the necessary equipment, who receives an unknown station and measures its frequency, could refer to the PFMS to get an excellent idea of which station he is hearing.

The IRCA Spanish Report Form

This is the second edition of the IRCA Spanish Report Form, revising the one published in 1964. Grammatically the Spanish should be flawless, as the form was carefully checked by the club's good friend, César E. Quiroga of Santiago, Chile (now living in Denver). The English translations are only approximate, but the Spanish does convey the message we wish to present in our reception forms.

A few comments on the form are in order. First, on both the definite and tentative forms, you must choose between paragraphs (1) and (2), depending on whether your report is by tape or not. Each time parentheses appear in the forms, a choice must be made. For example, on the first definite report, you must choose the adjective which best describes the reception conditions, etc. : strong, fair, or weak.

Here are the translations of the months of the year, for use in the first paragraph:

January	Enero	April	Abril	July	Julio	October	Octubre
February	Febrero	May	Mayo	August	Agosto	November	Noviembre
March	Marzo	June	Junio	September	Septiembre	December	Diciembre

Also, in the first paragraph, when reporting the time, it is best to use the zone of the station. Mexico has three time zones: most of the country is on CST, but Sonora, Sinaloa, Nayarit, and Baja California Sur are on MST, and Baja California Norte is on PST. All the Central American republics except Panamá are on CST. Panamá, Colombia, Ecuador, Perú, Cuba and the Dominican Republic are normally on EST. Venezuela, Chile, Bolivia, Argentina, and Paraguay are normally EST plus 1 hour. Uruguay is 2 hours ahead of EST. Note that some South American countries observe DST from approximately October 15 to April 15, making the time 1 hour later.

Also in the first paragraph, you will see a blank followed by the word "hora," and it should be filled with the adjective that corresponds to the country in question. Below are the Spanish words that should be used to fill the blank:

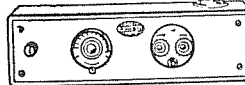

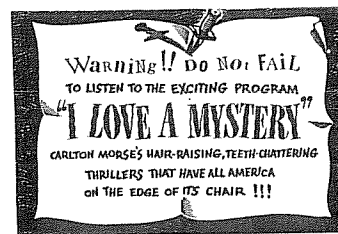
Looking back to January, 1934 and a letter to Radio News and the Shortwave, a DXer from Winston, Mo. reports: "Reception conditions on the broadcast band have improved this month. The Australian, New Zealand, and Japanese stations can now be heard quite well when conditions are favorable."

Other items: "On the DX Calendar the first Monday of each month try the 1000 watt station in Elmira, N.Y., WESG-1040kc. It should boom in over the 100 and 50 watters.

Radio News for April, 1931 had an interesting note for all you DXer-Technicians. It seems a Mr. R.L. Woolley of Seattle, Washington, ran into a queer one with a Crosley, model 706. The complaint was poor volume and distortion. When one of the -71 power tubes was removed the volume was normal and the quality cleared up.

In the 30's many DXer's built their receivers from kits. One such kit was the Ultradyne, model 1-32 which claimed that "operating in New York City it easily tunes out WOR, Newark, and brings in WLW, Cincinnati without a trace of interference. Likewise, WMAQ, Chicago is brought in without interference from WEAF, New York. KGO, Oakland; KSL, Salt Lake City; KFI, Los Angeles; KOA, Denver; XEN, Mexico City have been logged regularly." The price of the receiver. Well \$32.95.

I hope you have enjoyed reading these few trivia tidbits. In coming articles we plan to look at: KDKA's 500 Horsepower Voice, Florida's First Station-WDAE, The WRR Story, many early DX reports, ekko stamps, and as much information as this "radio-nut" can revive. Comments always appreciated. 73's
