EDITORIAL -- Father Jack Peiza

It is with a great deal of personal regret that I must announce that, effective July 6, I am resigning as Executive Editor of DX Monitor. The Augustinian Order, of which I am a member, has appointed me to be principal of Central Catholic High School, Modesto, CA, some 400 miles NW of San Diego.

It was not easy for me to make the decision to accept the offer of this new position. I have greatly enjoyed teaching in San Diego for the past five years. My parents and friends are here. I really had no in-clination to get back into school administration, as I had several years of that in Ojai. However, the needs of my Order and the challenge of the position outweighed other considerations, and I look forward to the new job.

Certainly one of the factors which I had to consider in making my decision was its impact on IRCA. It is not immodest for me to say that it was on my urging that the San Diego Publishing Committee was formed two years ago, when Don Erickson decided to look for a replacement as publishing committee. For the past two years, I probably have done the lion's share of work on the publishing crew. It will be quite different for SDPC to operate without me.

Grant Manning has agreed to take on the post of Executive Editor, at least for the time being, so that DX Monitor will continue to be published in San Diego. Grant's ideas on some of the phases of publishing differ strongly from my views, so I would ask you to adjust to a new editor with patience and consideration.

As for me, I will continue to do what I can for IRCA, in whatever time I have available. I will try to write articles from time to time, and I also will try to take on an editorial position, for some column which appears on an irregular basis.

Thanks for all the cooperation which I have received as Executive Editor during the past two years. IRCAns are great people, believe me!

REPORT FROM MEXICO - Mike Worst

May 24, 1975

Our rowing reporter send the following notes on a recent trip scath of the border. All DXing was done on an ARS Astronaut-6 portable w/calibrated BCB dial.

Mexico City 1/9. This would be a lousy place to DX from but I did hear 2 weak stns on 1000 & partial "Músical Radio" ID

from one but I think it was just a sour.

The next day I paid a visit to XEVIP-1560 (the EE language stn there) & talked w/the pgm manager for awhile. It turned out that they had bou ht out XERCN-1110 & the RCN network last year and changed it to the RPM network (Radio Programas de México). ERRON was also changed to XERED (Red means "network" in SS) and they ID as "X-E-Red." RPM has nx every hour on the hour, which I confirmed several days later on XEZ-600.

The following is a list the PM gave me of the netwk stns. He mentioned that they have 15 affiliates, so something tells me that this is incomplete, but here it is anyway: XEOA-570, XEUE-580, XEZ-600, XECK-620, XEFB-630, XETK-630, XEKQ-680, XEBI-790, XERPC-MEGA-OUU, AERK-OZU, XEFE-O3U, XETX-O3U, XERW-OGU, XEBI-79U, XERPC-790, XEVA-790, XEFE-790, XEFE-190, XEBI-970, XEBI-980, XETU-980, XEDX-1050, XERED-1110, XEFN-1130, XEJS-1150, XEBN-1210, XEMC-1210, XEDX-1250, XERPI-1270, XECAN-1280, XEC-1310, XETB-1350, XESA-1360, XEKJ-1100, XEI-1100, XEXU-1180, XEPR-1180, XEQI-1580. (Maybe the rest are FM & Shortware PD)

XEVIP-1560 also feeds CBS mx to 20 other stns but I think they are all PM.

Mérida, Yucatán, h/12&18. XETRAN-690 & WYUC-1270 not on the air yet. Even though it doesn't look like one, the Yucatan is really a jungle as HCB DXing was zilch.

Akumal, Quintana Roo, h/16217. This was more like it! Alrevery frequency sounded like a graveyard. The jungle was still making itself felt, tho, as there were no signals from the west. The only Nexican I could hear was EROO-960 very weak during the day. Belize-83h was the only reliable local area station day and night, but the strongest station during the day was VOA-1180. If anyone is interested, here's what else I logged: Cuba - 550, 590, 600, 780, 1000 (def "R. Cuamá" ID), 1010, 1010 (def. "R. Caribe" ID). Honduras (usually the best signals & the most pro-Caribe" 1D). Honduras (usually the best signals & the most professional sounding) - HRDN-750, HRBS-850, HRU-860, HRXN-1060 (which had an EE speaking DJ), HRID-1070, HRPI-1110, HRON-1115, HRQ-1250, & HRH6-1340. All gave slogan ID's as listed in 75 WRTH and no call signs. U.S. - KYOK-1590, WLAC-1510, WABB-1180, WUNI-110. Others - YSS-655, YNX-750, PJB-800, TIOS-825, HJAE-920, HJGB-940, YST-1140 & TGFF-1150.

IA PAZ, B.C.S., h/25&26. This would be a very good place to DX from except that the commercial power dips too much for my

to DX from except that the commercial power dips too much for my liking. Wouldn't trust an expensive rig on it except with a voltage regulator & then nothing says the frequency won't vary. I hrd 27 stations in the daytime but only the 2 Ia Paz stns were strong enough to receive w/o any noise. XETE-1310 & XENSM-1380 were not on the air.

The only other interesting things were XWHO-010 IDing as "R. Centro", different from WRTH, YETRA & YEPRS booming in both nights like they belonged in Le Paz: and KUWN-720 in nicely both nights. Couldn't get anything on 1000 to see if KOMO does indeed cover the entire coast at night.

Other miscellaneous stuff from the DX-W Bin of Knowledge:

MEXICO. both territories of Baja California Sur & Quintana Roo were admitted as states around April 5, 1975 (Worst) THATIAND. Owing to recent political developments in this country, several 50-100 watt AFRS stns will probably not be around much longer. It's also very possible that VOFA-1580 will either stop relaying the VOA or go off completely, depending on whether or not it's a CIA front...... VIETNAM. Along the same lines, it seems safe to assume that VOA-760 is now either off completely or is now proclaiming the Good News of the reunification of North and South. T.X. Thrush has undoubtedly launched a full-scale investigation into the matter. (Portzer, last two speculations)

FOGUS ON THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

Broadcasting in the People's Republic of China is unique. For the mediumwave DXer, the PRC broadcast configuration may appear an enigma. One reason for this may be the language barrier. Another is likely the relative paucity of information commonly available on that configuration. A third reason is certainly the Occidental askance view of Oriental culture, deriving from Medieval superstitious dread of the then technological superiority of the East. Nevertheless, the Chinese eats and sleeps, and puts on his pants one leg at a time. Likewise, his system of broadcasting ceases to be shrouded in mystery once one sets one's mind to understand it.

This Focus on the People's Republic of China seeks to dispel some of that mystery. An article which would do the subject more total justice might well preempt three full numbers of DX Monitor. Four primary sources of information provided the basis for this Focus. One source is my own monitoring and observations during sojourns in the Philippines from April 1970 to September 1971, and from November 1972 to November 1973. Another source is the reports of our members which have appeared in DXWW and in the IRCA Foreign Log, Volumes I and II. A third source is international publications such as FBIS and WRTH. The last source is other articles on the subject, most especially Medium Wave Broadcasting in China by Gordon F. Nelson. The serious MW Sinophile who lacks this last reference may write to me for a source.

All powers are in kW, except 1040 and 1525 FS, which are in MW. Powers of 645 CS, 760 CS, 835 PS, 1040 FS, 1060 PS, and 1525 FS are from WRTH or Medium Wave Broadcasting in China by Gordon P. Nelson. Fowers of remaining stations estimations only, drawn from my own observations.

Before going into more technical aspects of the PRC broadcasting configuration, I will touch upon the more pragmatic matter of identifying the PRC stations. To more adequately acquaint yourself with the language tune to Radio Peking's numerous shortwave broadcasts. Station identification of ZRGD seems to occur immediately after the train of time pips upon the hour. With some practice, the words zhong yang rén min guang bo dien tai' will be discerned. Zhong yang means Central; rén min means People('s); guang bo, broadcast (or program, approximately; and dien tai, station (or more exactly, station tower). The above is Mandarin, or Standard Chinese, the language that you will most likely heard used on frequencies reaching North America.

Most stations appear to open (I avoid the term signon' since strictly speaking, they don't have callsigns) with a choral rendition of East is Red followed immediately by individual station identification, often repeated. At close-down, the Internationale (Anthem of the Communist International Movement) is played followed immediately by station announcement, again often re peated, followed by cutting carrier. In the individual station announcement, the name of the municipality (in the case of a Municipal class station) or province (in the case of a Provincial class station), precedes rén min guang bo dien tal.

For instance, the Shang Hai Municipal at 795 kHz will announce simply Shang Hai ron min guangbo dientai". The Hé Nan Provincial at 1000 kHz will announce "Hé Nan ron min guangbo dientai".

Occasionally the station announcement may be heard in other than Mandarin, as on the Guang Dong Provincial at 1060 kHz: "Canton Yen Mun Gangbo Dientoi".

The Fújien Front Broadcast Station announces "Zhong guo remmin chiehrang jun, Fu Jien Chienxien guangbo diental" ("Chinese People's Liberation Army, Fu Jien Front Broadcast Station")

Similarly, the special Táiwan Service announces "Zhongyang rén mín guặngbo điền tặi, Tái Wan guặngbo"

All stations tend to closedown at 20 minutes past the hour, as their relay of ZRGD news from Beijing terminates at :15 followed by the 5 minute International (to be continued next number of DXWW II)

I work 25-35 hrs a week after school at IEM and use occasional spare time there to make all varieties of computorised logs, etc. Interests aside from DX'ing include creative writing (have you met John Walton yet, Eric? RtH), computor programming, bicycling and numerous others which elude me at the

moment. I've been DX'ing the BCB since 12/72, actively since 8/73. I am interested im both foreign and domestic DX, tending to concentrate on TP's & rare domestics in the Winter and catching up on the rest during Summer vacation. Best state is CA w/143 hrd but no veries, followed by WA 26/4 and OR 21/2. Best Provinces are BC w/20/7 and AB 17/7. Best veries are v/l KKAA for 1kw ET, v/q KFQD, v/l KYAK, v/q VOA 1140 Philippines, VOA 1580 Thailand, 2NR 700 Australia (Grafton, NSW-RtH), Dakar 764 and BBC 1214, 881. Think I've used my 20 so will s/off now. Remember, speaking fluent Sanskrit will not help you ID outer Mongolia on 666 (Huh? RtH). Until I'm again motivated to report, probably about 1983, hi, 73 de ECR.

At the time of writing this Forum report, Ron Harper is the evening DJ for KDWN. But since so many changes are going on at the stn, who knows there may be another evening DJ there? I'm sorry to see that Jack London is no longer doing evenings, instead he's on during the day. Jack's voice and style fitted in very well w/the time. And he does fit in very well w/stn. and format. Fri nite 1/18 he thanked me for my ltr o/the air. He did make the mistake of saying that I hrd about the stn f/Gary Parton. Actually I revd the tip f/Albert Lobel, not Gary. (It's just that Gary got so many of us to call, he got confused, hi. -RtH). From the impression I get of Jack & rest of staff @ KDWN, it appears that KDWN will be friendly towards DX'ers. (I'll second that-RtH). KDWN is a bit of a blow to KMPC, though they knew that KDWN would make it to the air someday. KDWN's 10kw night signal is aimed right at L.A., & KMPC @ 710 kc/s has some coverage problems at nite, and KDWN won't help at all. As for KDWN's format, I fell it's a good sounding format. Jeff Richmond left KMBY to become the on camera anchorman for KMST-TV ch 1/46 Monterey. KDON's pattern is same day & nite, you can see it in NRC Night Pattern book if you have it, but it's slightly wrong. The N. lobe is actually peaking WNW over Santa Cruz, & SE lobe is actually due S., peaks between Salinas & Monterey. Their XR is @ Palm Beach, just W. of Watsonville, in Santa Cruz County. It's the same location and pattern as when stn was built in '1/48-1/49 as KRUZ Santa Cruz. (I always wondered why XR was so far from Salinas and how they got away W/it-RtH).

Also, SR skip should be fairly good on regionals, say MM since in many areas SR will be right at s/on times. Nick Hall-Patch, I sympathize w/you, wasn't DX great 10 yrs ago? Can you i-magine 20 and 30 yrs ago? Remember all those clear regional channels every MM and s/on EC to WC? MM 5/12 must have been a field day for S. This is the second time that IRCA Special Features has listed the stations carrying the weekly three-hour "American Top 40" syndicated program. The first listing appeared in the 4/22/72 DXM. It was arranged by state and city, and unfortunately did not include any information as to day or time the program was carried. Eric Fader obtained this information directly from Watermark, Inc., and special thanks are due to Eric for the time-consuming task of arranging this information in frequency order.

AT40 is airmailed to stations on three 12" LP discs each week. Consequently, stations carrying the program at the same hour may not be 100% synchronized, unless taking a feed from another station. ALL COMMERCIALS IN "AMERICAN TOP 40" ARE SOLD LOCALLY AND INSERTED BY THE LOCAL STATIONS. So if you hear a station carrying AT40 and wish to send a reception report, be sure to send details of the commercials (including names and addresses of sponsors). Don't bother sending details of the actual program - "American Top 40" is sufficient.

One more caution - just because a station listed above is the only one on its frequency listed carrying AT40 at a given time, do not conclude that it's definitely the station you hear on that frequency at that hour. The station may have dropped AT40, or another station on the same frequency may have subsequently added it. The only way to be 100% sure is to stay tuned for a commercial break! -BH.
