

Craig Healy says he runs antenna calibration tests about once a week on both stations that he is the Chief Engineer for. He puts WRIB-1220 Providence, RI, on the air generally thursday mornings probably around 0000-0200 EST for a half hour or so. WNRI-1380 Woonsocket, RI, is generally put on wednesday mornings from 0000-0200 or so for a half hour. He runs open carrier with a cluster of IDs occasionally, and might even use code sometimes. For those of you who haven't heard Rhode Island yet, this might give you a chance, if you are lucky enough to be listening at the time he puts one of the stations on the air.

Former DXer Gayland Darnell called long distance to let us know that he will put KBBB-1600 on the air for their PoP test the morning of February 12, which is too late for most members. But if he cannot finish the test, it will be rerun February 19, from 0100-0500 or 0600 EST. He will use tone and IDs, and will run 5kw. He promised that KBBB will now verify good reports. REPORT FROM OKINAWA - Mike Hardester

Okinawa is a most unusual place from which to DX from. The TVI is at a minimum as is local QRN. However, rather than let anyone believe this is an ideal DX location a point should be made: the band is jammed! For the majority of 10 kHz spaced freqs (540,550...1600), there may be found 2 to 4+ stns all fighting to be hrd (sounds like Seattle, hi.bp). Many freqs are like the NA GY freqs, but w/less of the fading characteristics. Also, it isn't a simple matter of listening to 1 or perhaps 2 different langs. Here JJ, CC, KK, etc langs are on a single freq. W/all the jumble, IDs are not that easy, tho fortunately the JJ stns most often give a vocal EE ID. Presfortunately the JJ stns most often give a vocal EE ID. Presently there are 7 active AM stns on Okinawa: JOAP-550, NHK 1 w/10 kw; JORR-7h(0, commercial w/5kw; JOXR-780 commercial w/5 kw; JOTF-1150, commercial w/5 kw; JOAD-1360 NHK 2; & the 2 USA stns: AFRTS-650 & VOA-1178. Most recently, the FEBC stn (JOFF-1020) closed down permanently in accordance w/the 1972 Japan/USA Reversion Agreement, & by 5/15/77 VOA-1178 will be off the air leaving only AFRTS-650 "an experience in listening." The latter 2 stns are presently using 1000 kw & 10 kw respect-JORR-740 (and its stronger harmonic on 1480) utilizes pips almost identical to NHKs! However, JORR gives a def EE ID on the hour w/the initials of its company, so a mis-ID shouldn't occur...besides, there are no NHK stns on this freq (which I know of). 73.
