The following was received from Bill Moriyama and confirmed by Bill Harms:

O.K., guys---read & weep...this story moved on the United Press International wire @ 7:33PM, 12/19/78. (Washington) -- The Federal Communications Commission has approved a plan to establish up to 125 new AM radio stations by limiting the projected range of powerful "clear channel" stations to 750 miles.

Says FCC Chairman Charles Ferris, "It's the final action leading toward the breakdown of the so-called 'clear channel' radio stations in the country-stations established to have little or no interference when there were few radio stations in the country". Ferris says that under the new plan, the maximum protection afforded present "clear channel" stations---some of which can reach coast to coast--will be about 750 miles.

Ferris estimates the FCC action will allow the establishment of 100 to 125 more AM stations nationwide.

After a final period of comments from interested parties, Ferris said those desiring new AM stations will apply for them in particular areas. He estimates the process should take another two to three years. Said Ferris, "We're envisioning stations of comparable quality as those that are listened to now--in the 200 to 500 watt range."

Of the nearly 45-hundred AM stations in the United States-about 25 of them are 50-thousand watt "clear channel" stations. In 1925-27, Westinghouse owned KFKX 3kw (288 meters, 1040 kc) in Hastings, NE and KYW Chicago, 3.5kw (535 meters, 560ko). In late 1927, the first big freq. shake-up by the Federal Radio Commission, assigned both KFYK & KYW to 294m, 1020kc. By 1928, Westinghouse was phasing out KFKK, having discovered no good reason to retain it in NE. For a year or two afterward, radio logs listed KFKX & KYW as both being in chicago but I can vouch for the fact that the call "KFKX Chicago" was never heard by anybody. Instead, KYW operated on the freq and was a first-class radio station of that era. But the FRC had assigned 1020 for use in the Mid-Atlantic states, not the Midwest, and by about 1932-3, Westinghouse packed up in chicago and moved to Philadelphia. Faturally, they took the call letters along for the KYW call was and is one of the most venerable in broadcasting. (Under NARBA, 1941, 1020 stns shifted to 1060). In the early 30's, Westinghouse acquired WJKS gary, IN. (560), moved it to chicago, remamed it WIND, & it now occupies the same spot on the dial where KYW Chicago existed so long ago. Perhaps almost no one in the present westinghouse organization would be able today to trace this link between the old KYW and the present WIND. (Cont next WDXF)

REPORT FROM BERMUDA - Charlie Taylor

I've been rather inactive over the 11/23 changeover. A check-in time of around 0200Q (Q equals AST) for Skylab support at NASA being one reason. We're beginning to "gear up" for projected Shuttle support. Because of an unexpected expansion of the upper atmosphere, due to sunspots,

Skylab is slowing down & may begin uncontrolled re-entry as early as next summer. Shuttle, among other things, intended to push Skylab into a higher trajectory. ATTENTION: My Heath 1M-4110 freq counter & my Palomar MW loop antenna are up for sale or trade. The IM-UllO includes the tech manual & goes for \$150 or best offer. The Palomar loop goes for \$100. I'm pressed for space & a smaller counter is in the pipeline (I hope). The Palomar loop is inferior to my SM-2 in every respect except appearance. I'm currently looking for a secondary freq standard module. Desireable characteristics are a stability of around 0.01 ppm per week, cutput an even multiple of 1 MHz, operability from 12 or 28 VDC, & small size. I intend to build a portable battery powered standard that can be taken to NASA for calibration against the stns rubidium standard. REPORT FROM HAWAII - Gene Martin

(The following is combined from two postcard and one letter reports of stations heard by Gene while on vacation. bp)

From the West Coast of Maui, 100 miles SE of Honolulu, Asiatics & their hets against WCNA stns are conspicuous by 0900-1000 nightly. By 1100 & 1200, Asiatics dominate the band; JJ, CC, Filippino, etc & many I can't ID make it difficult to locate the WC powerhouses hrd a few hrs before. Even Honolulu stns have Asiatic hets crowding in each side of their freqs. No LAs hrd & only a few DU signals. Tahiti738 quite strong. NA hrd & taped: KNER, KBOI, KFI, KIRO,
KGO, KOA, CJVI, KOMO, CBR, KTNQ, KNX, KFAX, KRIA, KPNW, KSL,
KEX, & CJOC. Many unids noted 1510-1600 are which is empty
in Hawaii after the early s/off of 1540 here. Signals above 1540 are quite strong and a mishmosh of conflicting audios.

on 1458 or 1467 (more likely 1458) I heard an extremely powerful station 1154-1320 MM 12/11, soprano w'"Iittle Town of Bethlehem" before the hour w/JJ lady ancr. Language w/man ancr sounded more like Polynesian, maybe Filippino after the hour. "Church" flavor in mx portions & may be some missionary stn. Nothing looks likely in the new TP freq lists. Has blockbuster signal & is far stronger than any NA stn hrd here, even stronger than the JO's on 774, 756, 774, etc. (How about DWRF-1458 in the Philippines, listed as having 250 kw? bp)

The combination of the TRF feeding into the Sony AM-FM-Cassette recorder from the best location in our condominium on the west coast of Maui produced more than 5 hrs. of DX from Hawaii 12/6-13. It will take me days & days to check out everything I have on tape & there are some mysteries there that will probably escape any solution. I brought back IDs & bits of pgm from every stn in the islands, located 3 Alaskans, 780, 750, & 670. No Australian was hrd the first 5 nights on Maui, but they were showing up on the 6th & 7th nights on Maul, but they were showing up on the tall the right on 771 & 702 & perhaps other places to be revealed w/ further tape monitoring. So far as I can'tell right now, not one New Zealander was heard. The farthest east in N. America was KFAB, second farthest KOA. The strongest, most consistent US stn was KPNW-1120 & it seemed my location strongly favored reception from the Pacific Northwest, was less favorable for San Francisco area, and poorer yet for southern California. Not one Mexican was hrd & I failed to get a peep out of WOAI, which surprised me no end for 1200 was quite clear for hours each night. Japan, China, the

Philippines, & similar TP areas seemed to dominate reception from the west, & I can say for certain that VOA-1143 in the Palippines & VOA-1575 in Thailand were listened for repeateally but were never heard. As I analyze the tapes, I will report further.

Well, there you have it....your choice of two island paradises, Hawaii and Bermuda. Which sounds more enticing, daytime DX from Bermuda or nighttime DX from Hawaii? Take your pick bp

"AM of 12/6, TP cx fair-good, 12/7 great cx to China, 12/8 weak TP carriers though KFAR strong til sunrise. On each day signals at best around 1530-45." (Hall-Patch, BC) "Cx remain pretty poor in general. The last few days have been pretty quiet (geomagnetically)..." (Eckman, PA) "12/5-8 medium skip w/oppressively loud signals from Great Lakes area. Short distance low-latitude low-band TAs were in at respectable levels, but were pestered by above-average domestic QRM." (Connelly, MA) "There was an incredible opening to Japan Saturday 12/16 M/audio from even a couple of 5 kwers. Oddly enough, the A-index was 23, a drop from a high of about 40 a few days earlier. 12/17was poor overall w/only a couple DU carriers hrd. 12/18 was good for low-band DUs. During the past month I've noticed that both DUs and Asians peak during the 1030-1230 period and then deteriorate quickly. From 1300 to local sunrise, I've only hrd a few of the stronger stns, even when the band was alive with audio, hets, and carriers a few hours before. Somehow, I think TP DXing will be immensely more interesting now that the DX is on split frequencies." (Portzer, WA)



PART 2 - CLASSES OF STATIONS

In Part 1 of this series (10/28/78 DXM, p. 67), we explained how each of the 107 broadcast band (BCB) channels from 540 to 1600 kHz is defined as "clear," "regional," or "local."

The <u>stations</u> themselves operating on these channels have also been assigned classifications.

Class I stations. The FCC definition: "A Class I station is a dominant station operating on a clear channel and designed to render primary and secondary service over an extended area and at relatively long distances."

Class I stations may be broken down further into two sub-classes, as follows:

Class I-A. These stations are mostly "unduplicated" at night (with no other nighttime operation on the same channel, or a limit of one or two nighttime operations; plus, they receive nighttime protection from foreign countries). Until 1961, each Class I-A station could be heard from coast to coast U.S. Class I-A stations use 50kw at night. power. (Mexican Class I-A stations use up to one Canadian Class I-A station, CBJ-1580, is using 10kw, but the others are 50kw; the Bahamas Class I-A station is 20kw

clear channels, with two or three Class I-B stations serving large groundwave and skywave areas at night, plus in most cases a number of other fulltime stations (not Class I) located so that they won't cause interference to any of the Class I-B stations at night. Class I-B stations in the U.S. use 10kw to 50kw power day and night; most are 50kw fulltime (although KPMC-1560 is 10kw), and most have nighttime directional patterns that protect the other Class I-B stations on the same channel.

"Primary service" means groundwave; "secondary service" means skywave, which is more commonly known as "skip" to hobbyists such as hams, CBers, and us DXers. It is worth noting that while all AM stations are protected from interference within their primary (groundwave) coverage areas, only the Class I stations are also protected from nighttime interference within their secondary (skywave) coverage areas.

Class II stations. Quite simply, any station operating on a "clear channel" that is not a Class I station, is a Class II station. Power levels (day and/or night) of Class II stations (except Class II-A) range from 250 watts to 50kw. Thus, not every 50kw station is Class I. Some stations using 50kw at night might get out well, but unless they are Class I. Their skyways coverses area is not motocted. their skywave coverage area is not protected from nighttime interference!

One special category of Class II stations is known as "Class II-A," and was established by the FCC in a 1961 rulemaking proceeding. Class II-A stations are assigned to specific clear channels in specific states, and must have a minimum nighttime power of 10kw (up to 50kw). The Class II-A stations are designed to fill in groundwave coverage holes at night, mostly in the Western and Mountain states. All are on channels formerly occupied by only one station (Class I-A) at night. The station on 890 kHz in Utah may be operational soon. All other Class II-A stations are now operational, and they are as follows: KB0I-670 KRVN-880 KPN

KPNW-1120 KDWN-720 KOB--770* KCRL-780 KBCQ-1020 KOFI-1180 KTW0-1030 KREX-1100 KGYN-1210

KOB is contesting the II-A assignment and has requested to be Class I-A.

All of the Class II-A stations must protect the Class I-A station on their channel at night, to the closest point on the nighttime skywave coverage area of the Class I-A station. (This is a nontechnical article so I won't elaborate further.)

Any station on a clear channel that is not Class I-A, Class I-B, or Class II-A, is simply Class II. Some Class II stations are fulltimers, protecting the other stations (especially the Class I's) on their channels at night. Other Class II stations are daytime-only. And there are a handful (fewer than 20) of "limited time" stations, which will be explained later. Class III stations. Most of the stations on regional channels are Class III. Some are fulltime; some are daytime only. Class III stations, for some reason, have a minimum power level of 500 watts (rather than the 250-watt level permitted on clear and local channels). So, any station using 250 or 100 watts, day or night, on a regional channel is not Class III (more on that when we explain Class IV stations in a moment).

Class III power levels range from 500 watts to 5kw. Among the fulltime Class III stations, there are two sub-classes:

Class III-A. Permissible power is 1kw to 5kw.

Class III-A. Permissible power is 1kw to 5kw.

(Any station using 2.5kw or 5kw nighttime on a regional channel is automatically Class $III-\bar{A}$.

to 5kw days, and 500 watts or 1kw nights.
Thus, any station on a regional channel using 500 watts (day or night) is automatically Class Class III-B.

There is also a slight difference in permissible interference levels to the nighttime groundwave areas. Put simply, Class III-A stations get out a few more miles on nighttime groundwave than do Class III-B stations. It's often hard to tell whether a station using 1kw nights on a regional channel is Class III-A or Class III-B (unless it uses 500 watts days, which would make it III-B). My experience leans towards presuming III-A status for Class III stations using 1kw-NDat night (plus those using 2.5kw or 5kw at night), and presuming III-B status for Class III stations using 1kw-DA at night (plus those using 500 watts at night). (plus those using 500 watts at night).

I believe that Broadcasting Yearbook lists the difference between III-A and III-B, for those interested. It really doesn't make a heck of a lot of difference in your DXing anyway (as compared, say, with the difference between I-A, I-B, or II), so if you don't understand this paragraph, don't worry about it! Since daytimers on regional channels don't operate at night, they are called simply Class III.

Class IV stations. All stations operating on local ("graveyard") channels are Class IV stations. Many years ago, the FCC also assigned Class IV stations to regional channels. That practice is long gone, and most of the old regional Class IV stations either moved to local channels or else upgraded their facilities to Class III. However, a small number of Class IV stations remain on some

a small number of Class IV stations remain on some regional channels. They are easily spotted by their low nighttime power (250 watts or even 100 watts at night, compared with the Class III minimum of 500 watts at night), plus their nondirectional mode at night (usually "U1" in the NRC Log).

Also many years ago, the nighttime power limit for Class IV stations was 100 watts. The limit was eventually raised to 250 watts, which is now the minimum Class IV power. Today's Class IV stations use 250 watts, 500 watts, or 1kw during the day, and 250 watts at night. However, the FCC rules say, "Stations which are licensed to operate with 100 watts day or night may continue to do so." (Most of the old 100-watters managed to upgrade to 250 watts, with many using 1kw daytime now; but 250 watts, with many using 1kw daytime now; but there are still some stragglers using 100 watts night and even 100 watts day, including some of the aforementioned Class IV stations on regional channels.)

Note that in part of southeastern Florida, the limit for Class IV stations remains 250 watts day as well as night. (This is obviously to protect one of the Caribbean countries under a treaty.)

Although there is no rule specifically forbidding Although there is no rule specifically forbidding directional operation at night on the local channels, you just don't find nighttime directional operations among Class IV stations, because it isn't very practical. So just about all these "graveyard" stations shoot out 250 watts nondirectional at night. A few do use directional antennas daytime to allow 1kw daytime power; they revert to 250 watts nondirectional at night ("U5" in the NRC Log).

There you have the U.S. assignments for the various classes of stations. Maybe the following table will help you put it into perspective:
