Back in the early days of radio it is true that the KFI's, the WJR's, and the WGN's did stand out as excellent stations, and yet, they still do, but I very seriously question whether these stations are so much superior than their competitors even within their competit. The advantage the clearest of the their own market. The advantage the clearest of the clear stations have and want to protect is their signal, which I can't fault them for at all. But I would point out that many small town stations do provide an excellent service within their own right and many of the so-called exclusive programming features found on the class 1-A clears can also he heard on stations with less power within specific be heard on stations with less power within specific programming. No one is going to tell me that WSM is the only station in Nashville or its surrounding environs to provide country and western music overnight. Doesn't WKDA? As far as the beef that overnight. Doesn't WKDA? As far as the beef that WEM and the Grand Ole Opry have regarding the FCC proposal, it seems to me they both are being somewhat petty. One, WSM and the Opry can always feed the program via a sort of network hookup and, yes, if a Toledo station carried the show I would hear it better than I could ever hear it on WSM! Two, the specific FCC proposal of 750 miles from the individual station's transmitter is not at all a ridiculous restriction. Nowhere do I see all a ridiculous restriction. Nowhere do I see where the present 1-A clears would have to where the present 1-A clears would have to directionalize to protect any new station beyond the 750 mile radius. Does WABC protect KOB? Does WCBS protect KRVN? Does WGN protect KDWN? I could go on and on, but I think this makes my point. I don't see the FCC as desiring to turn any class 1-A station into a "lowly" class 3 or class 4 signal. I would say that I would be vehemently opposed to a 150 mile signal restriction as the amount of interference generated against both the old 1-A facility and any new facility would be totally intolerable. It occurred a little too soon after sunrise to tell if anything I heard was due to the eclipse or if some of it was normal sunrise skip. However, I did hear several things I feel were due to the celestial event. I turned on the rx around 0745 PLT and had a few CA stns (KKHI/KFBK/etc) but nothing exciting. But by 0800 the band was alive w/signals where there had been none a few minutes earlier. KBLW was dominating 1390, what I assume was KSRV was noted u/local KRKO 1380, and either KCCK or KLO was u/semi-local KBRC 1430. KTLC 1270 and KSEI 930 were booming in around 0810-0820 when the area of totality was halfway between Seattle and southern ID. A few minutes later they faded out. About that time I also heard CW mx u/KGAR which I assume was KRGO. Around 0830 KXLF 1370 was in well. By 0845 the band calmed down considerably but many stns in eastern WA and OR were still coming in, including some that weren't audible before 0800. Generally, reception resembled nighttime cx if totality was between here and the stn and SRS/SSS for the rest of the WA, OR, ID, UT, & MT stns hrd. On another note I received a verie from China a few weeks ago!! I hrd China 1035 in late Jan & debated whether to send a rpt. I eventually decided all I had to lose was 22¢ for the aerogram. A couple wks later in popped a QSL card showing the date and "1030 kcs". I was amazed that they answered at all, let alone mention the date and freq. (Congrats on the v/q. That indeed is a rare verie-RtH). Chinese BCB veries for many years have been few & far between and extremely vague. It looks like China's new policy of thawed-out relations w/the rest of the world may

have filtered down to the level of the verie filler-outers. Now if someone would only tell them that China switched to the 9 kHz spacing, hi. (Picky, picky, hi-RtH). In case anyone is wondering why half the stns in the country seem to the switching to disco mx, there's a very good reason. WKTU-FM in New York switched to disco a few months ago and almost overnight became the #1 rated stn in New York and the most listened to stn in the US unseating WABC from the spot they'd occupied for 16 yrs. (And to think KSFX-FM, S.F., started it all. They are #5 in Bay Area, Arbitron ratings-RtH). That should do it for this week. 73 and good DX.

Alaska. CP for station at Homer with 5/5 kw on 1250 khz. (NRC via ARctic 2/23)

KABN-1150, listed as "not yet on the air" in NRC Log, may now be operational. 1979 Anchorage phone book lists them with business and 24-hour request numbers. Address given as Radio Road, Big Lake, AK. The station is located in the Matanuska Valley, just north of Anchorage. (Portzer)

<u>Australia</u>. 2WEB-576 operates from Bourke High School by Western Educational Broadcasters. Uses 2 kw into 300 foot top loaded mast. Tests started 9/78 and fulltime began on 580 on 11/13/78. Operates daytime only. (NZDXT 3/79)

Canton Island. Verification letters say that they will probably cease broadsting in June or July because of a phase-down of military activity on Canton Island. (NZDXT 3/79)

China. MW frequencies definitely being used: 702 //3360;729// 3220; 792//3360; 837//3950 sometimes; 846//3360; 882//2340 and 3220; (32//3500; 867//3500 Sometimes; 846//3500; 882//2540 and 3920 at different times; 930//4045 and 2490; 954//3400 and 3360; 981//3220; 1080/3220, 3360 and 4380 at different times; 1040; 1062 //3220;1089 //3360; 1116//3360; 1178//3220; 1260//3220; 1377//3200; 1395//3220; 1431//3360; 1437.5//2340 and 3220 at different times; 1512//3360. Tentative Chinese loggings are on 585, 927, and 1285. (Hardester via SCDX 1/16) 1521 now being used by the Foreign Service, probably ex 1525. (Arctic 3/23)

The new orthography (system of spelling) for Chinese words is now being used. Called Pinyin, the system standardizes the Romanization of Chinese names. Kampuchea (apparently the new name for Cambodia). Radio Demo-cratic Kampuchea, operated by the Pol Pot government, last heard 1/7 on 918/4907. Later resumed operation from south China, on 760, 9730 and 7350. Announced location was Phom Penh and would be on 2200-1700. (SCDX 1/23)

## FCC PULLS PLUG ON K-DOR SIGNAL

BY JAMES BROWN

I t looks like they've shut down K-DOR for good this time. On Feb. 18 the FCC issued the order and officially pulled the plug. Dick Dorwart, K-DOR's feunder and guiding light, staged a marathon breadcast in hopes of raising support. But it was too late. This time, the commission meant business. And so at midnight, Dowart signed K-DOR off the air for the last time. The 530 frequency on the AM dial fell silent. It seemed a quiet burial for an outlaw.

Because K-DOR was, in fact, a bootleg radio station—unlicensed by the FCC and, as such, in violation of the Federal Communications Act. Yet Dorwart had kept K-DOR on the air since last April 18, running the show from his own garage, most nights between 6 p.m. and midzight. Three times the FCC regional office visited Dorwart, made an inspection and asked him to stop broadcasting; three times Dorwart stopped only to go book on the air again.

times Dorwart stopped, only to go back on the air again.

According to Jeff Young, from the FCC's investigation division in Washington, this apparent kid-gloves treatment had very much to do with the fact that the 31-year-old Dorwart is severely handicapped. He suffers from osteogenesis imperfecto, commonly called "brittle bones," a disease that impairs normal growth and has kept Dorwart confined to a wheelchair for most of his life.

"His handicap did put a different complexion on this case," Young said. "We handled him very gently, hoping that he would lose interest. In nine out of 10 cases, illegal stations are run by teen-agers who do lose interest after a while. But Dick is serious. He's applied for a license. It just reached a point where we knew he wasn't going to give up, which is when we issued the memorandum asking that he stop breadcasting."

Young added that should Dorwart go back on the air, "we'll be forced to issue a cease-and-desist order. If he violates that, we'll have to go to the U.S. attorney for a violation of the Communications Act, which carries a maximum of a \$10,000 fine and a year in jail. I hope we don't have to. I hope this is the end of it."

Dorwart says that he will comply with the FCC's order. "I have shut down," he said. "I never meant to bug the FCC and I certainly don't have anything against them. They've treated me fairly. They've been tice. I stayed on because I felt I had something to say. This signal wasn't interfering with anybody and I always played things in good taste. I wasn't acting out any fantasies. I wanted to make K-DOR real."

Dorwart had, to a degree, already achieved that goal, With a homemade transmitter pumping out 50 watts, he claimed listeners in such faraway boroughs as Sunland, Tujunga, Whittier and Pomona.

In Hollywood, K-DOR came through loud and clear. In its 10 months on the air, the station had, in fact, developed a small but avid cult following—some who listened for the novelty of it all, others who found in K-DOR's unrelenting amateurism a refreshing tonic.

On most nights between 6 and midnight—give or take an hour here or there—one could listen to Dorwart or engineer Don Saunders or any of the other K-DOR regulars, like old KRLA alum Roger Christian, spin through an eccentric record catalogue that ranged from old MOR to vintage Dr. Demento.

Occasionally, someone would forget to throw a switch and there would be dead air. Or people talking in the background. Or dogs barking. Or doors being opened and closed. Saunders, who went on the air as "Comite Francis," dispensed some of the worst one-liners this side of vaudeville. To K-DOR afficionados, this was all part of the station's charm.

K-DOR's makeshift transmitter, which Dorwart and Saunders built from scratch, occupied one corner of the garage:

Dorwart speaks openly of his disability, once even joking that any FCC penalties could hardly be worse than "breaking 195 bones in my body." That's the current count. Dorwart has broken his arms and legs so many times that he had stainless steel pins inserted for support. He also has his own plastic cast to set some of the breaks himself.

"The breaks take about a month to heal," Dorwart says.
"They take longer as you grow older but they're no less
painful." It is, he says, something he must hive with. It
isn't, he added, something one ever gets used to.

Dorwart's interest in radio began at age 7, spurred on, interestingly enough, by a bootleg station. "I remember listening to Sandy Nelson doing a show from his garage," he said. "And I eventually got quite a lot of equipment from Sandy." Dorwart estimates the value of his broadcasting equipment to be somewhere in the neighborhood of \$10.000.

"T've been doing radio for about 15 years now," Dorwart said, "mostly cutting public service spots for the American Cancer Society, March of Dimes and other organizations."

Indeed, the K-DOB bulletin board is more or less a pictorial trophy room with plaques, certificates and pictures with the likes of Johnny Carson, Jack Lemmon, Kay Lenz and others with whom he has worked.

"I was cutting a public service spot with Ralph Bellamy during one of the FCC inspections," Dorwart said, smiling. "I didn't think they were quite ready for that"

The genesis of K-DOR began, he said, after a visit to a, fellow "unlicensed" operator—Dorwart's preferred term—in San Francisco. "That motivated me to try to build my own transmitter," he said. "And Don Saunders and I scoured L.A. for about a month before we found the right parts to put it together."

Once on the air, K-DOR's format was no format at all. Dorwart played records from his own collection, or those friends had given him. The mix was usually either amusingly celectic or downright disastrous. To the end, he was unsuccessful in getting any of the major record labels to supply product.

"That much I could never understand." he said. "Be-

"That much I could never understand," he said, "Because I was m a position to give new artists a break. If no one eise gave the records a play, I could," Now, Derwart has to go through proper channels to get

Now, Dorwart has to go through proper channels to get K-DOR—or at least a reasonable facsimic—back on the air. "I have my application on file and I don't think it's a million-to-one shot," he said. "I'll be back ...."


